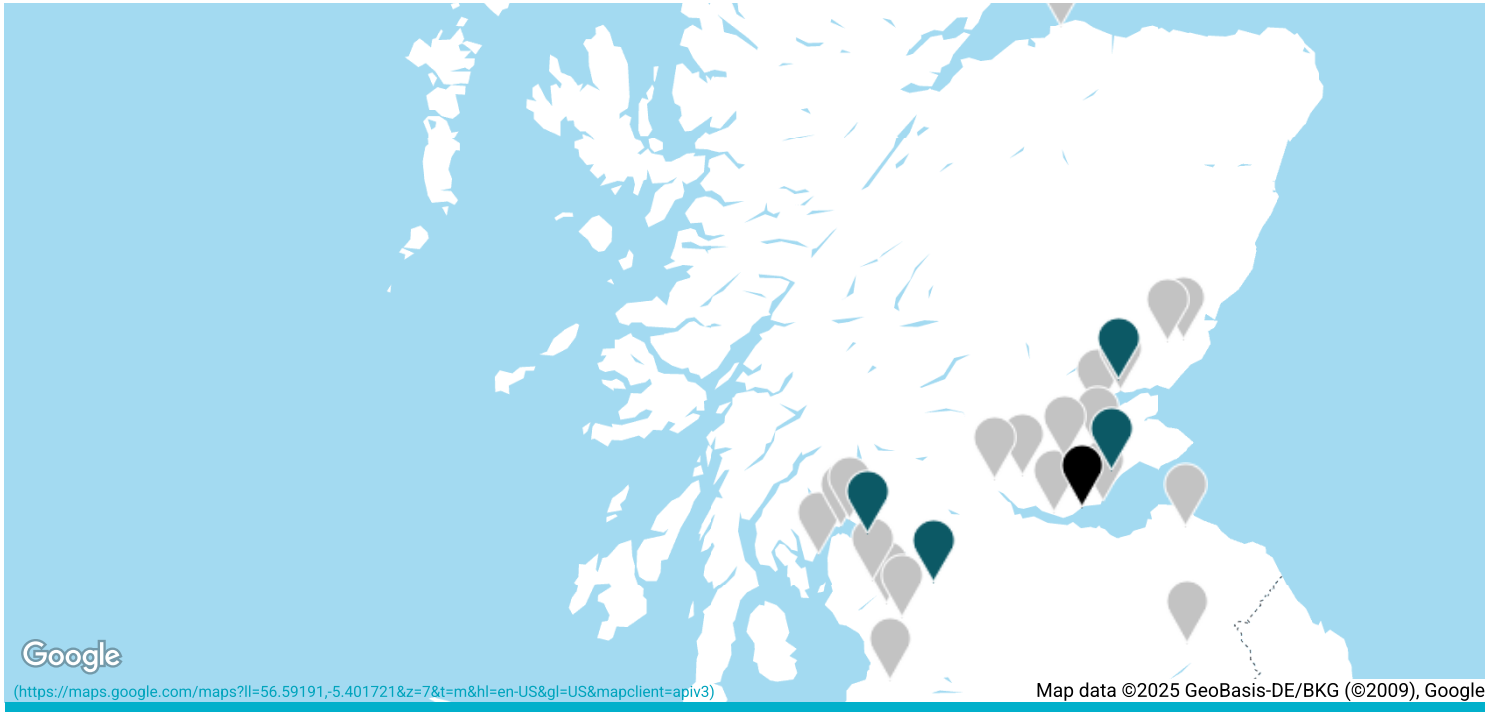




Aberdour

Aberdour is a former Pictish settlement with an economy originally based on fishing. Later it was a coal port for the Fife coalfields. Known for its beach it is now a popular commuting town.

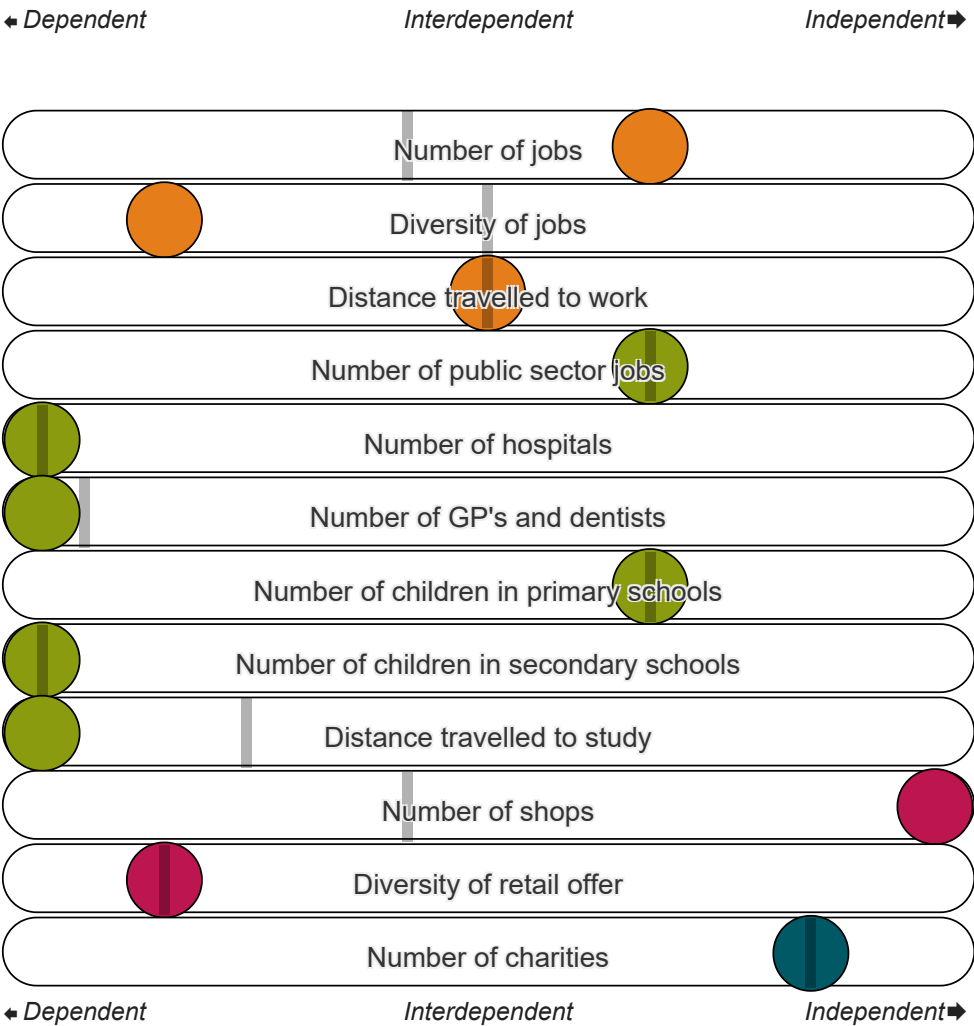
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Aberdour is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Birkhill and Muirhead](#), [Cardross](#), [Carmunnock](#), and [Coaltown of Balgonie](#).

Inter-relationships



Aberdour is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Aberdour is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, and shops. Aberdour differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

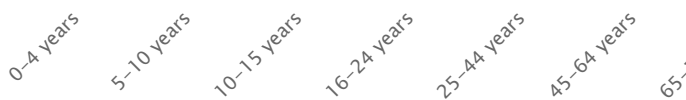

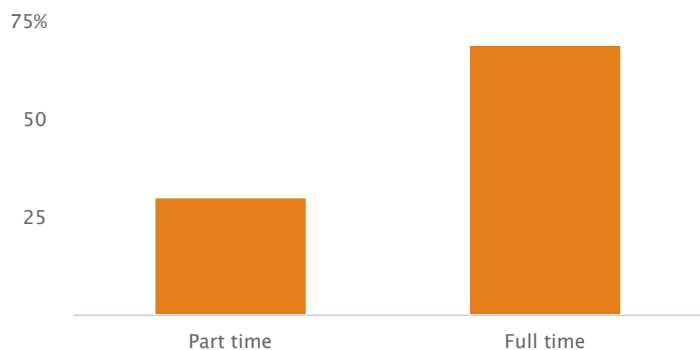

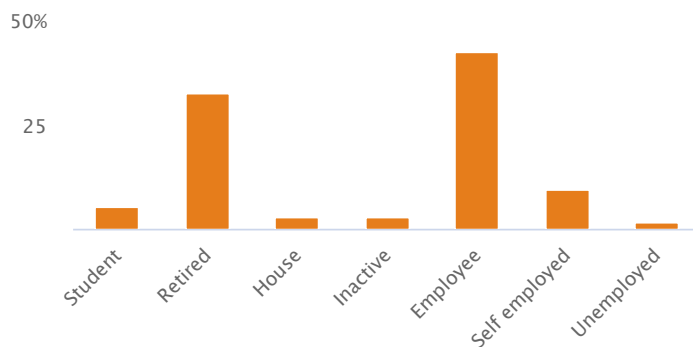
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



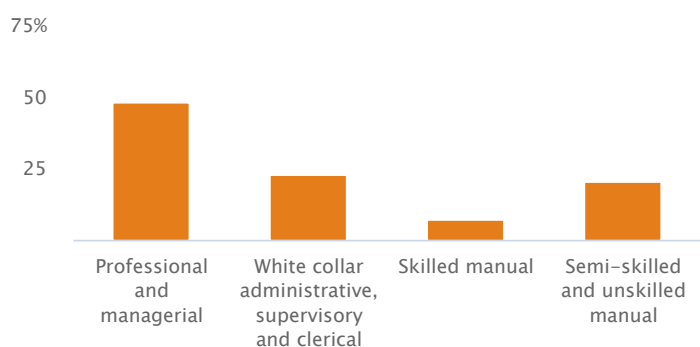
Occupation

Social Grade

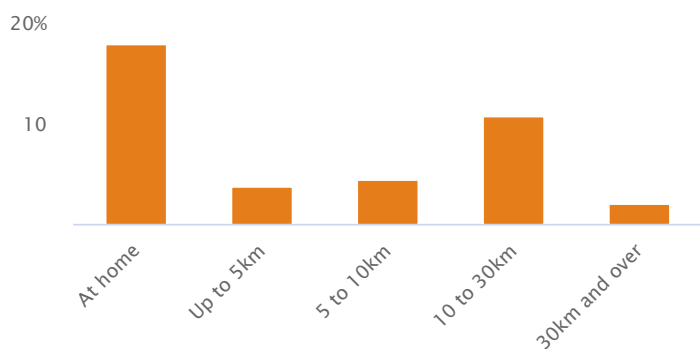
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

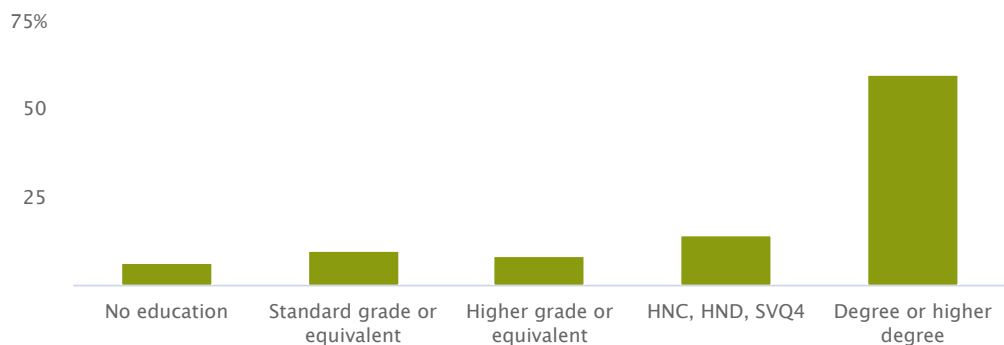


Distance travelled to work

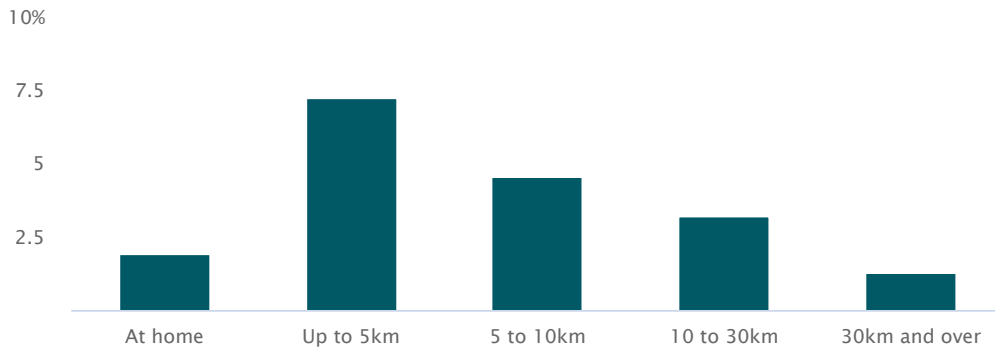
