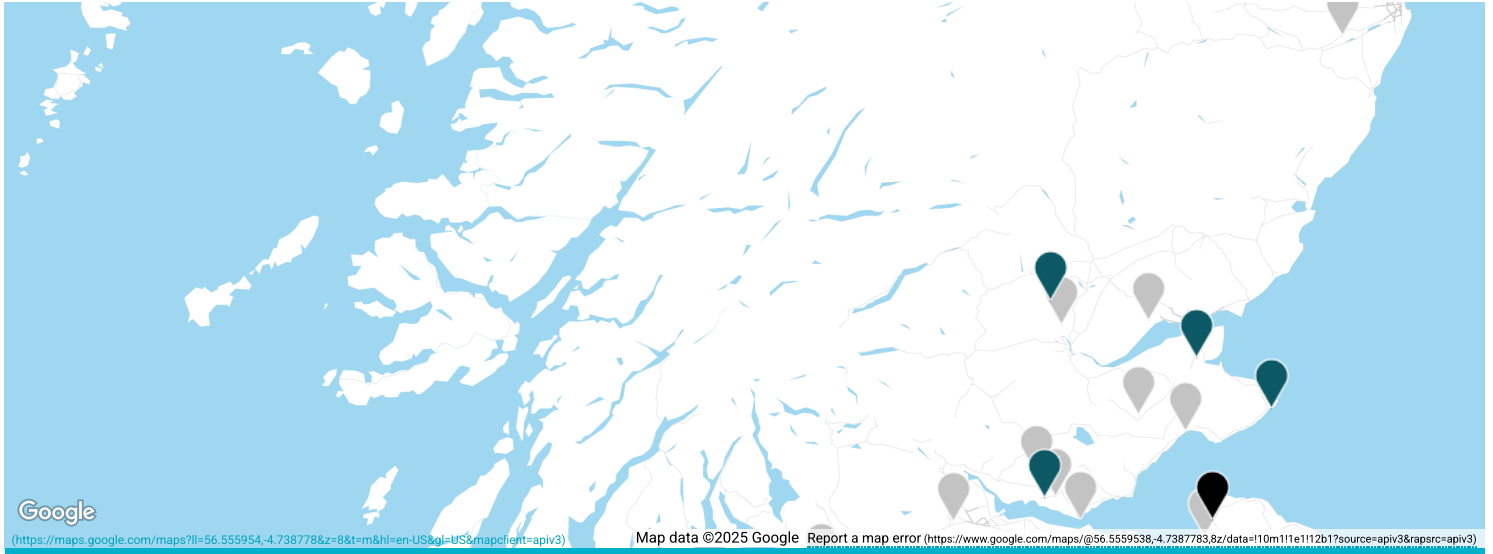




Aberlady

Aberlady in West Lothian dates from early Anglo Saxon times. It also served as the port for Haddington. The village was developed by the local estate owner in the 19th century. Today it is best known for its RSPB reserve and for its golf course.

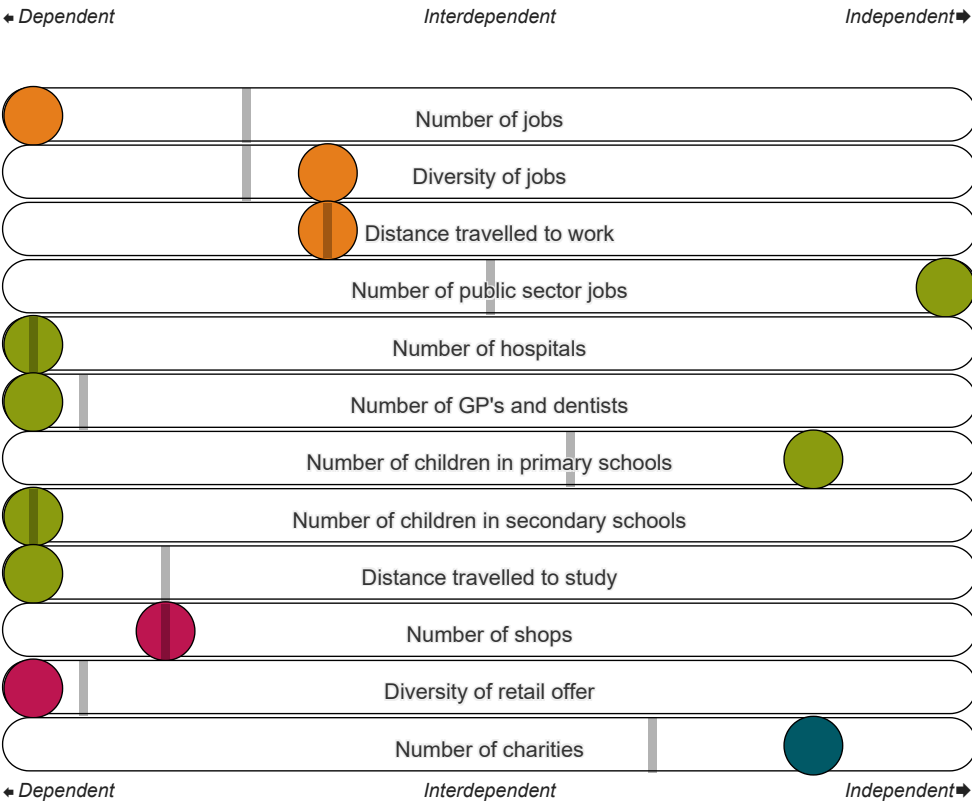
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Aberlady is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Aberlady is grouped with 19 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs. Aberlady differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

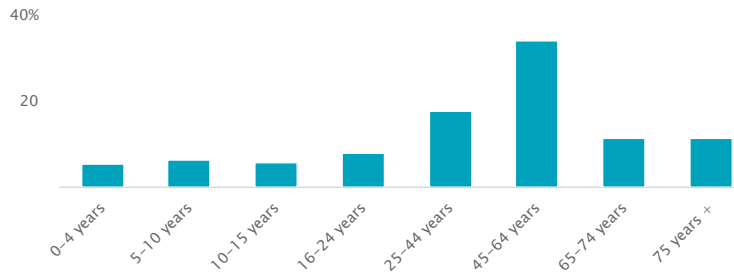

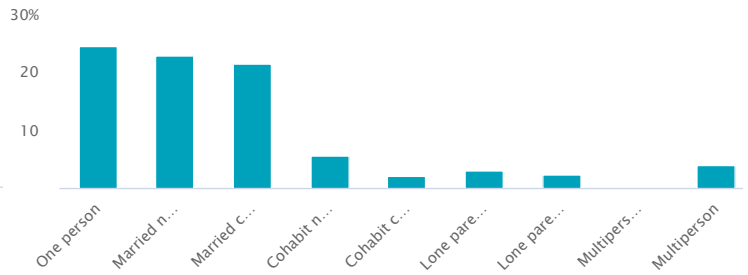

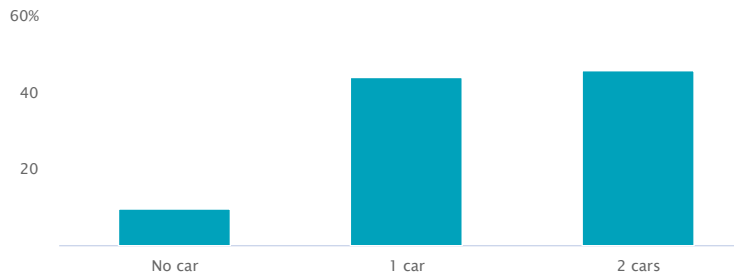

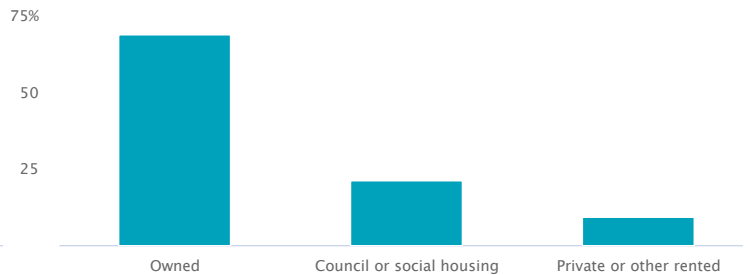
Household composition

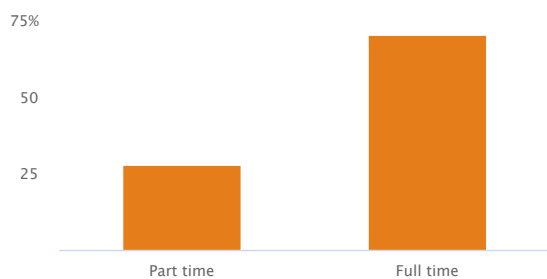

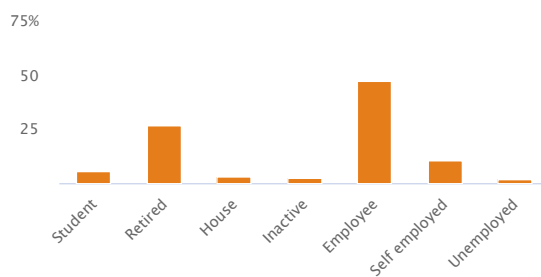
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



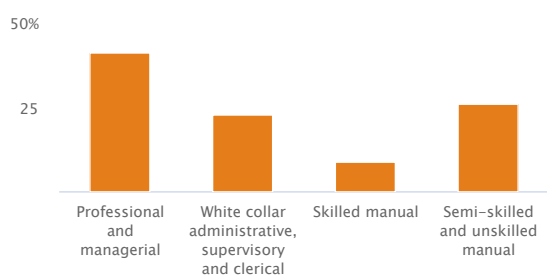
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

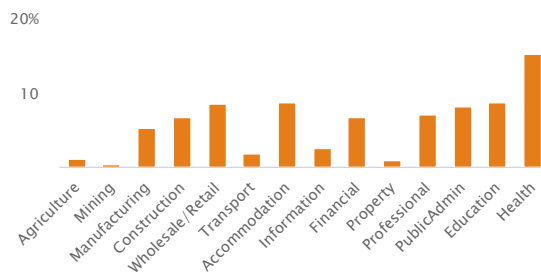


Social Grade

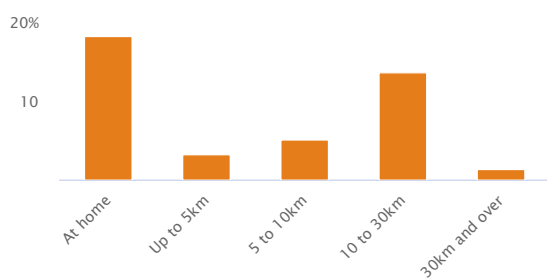
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

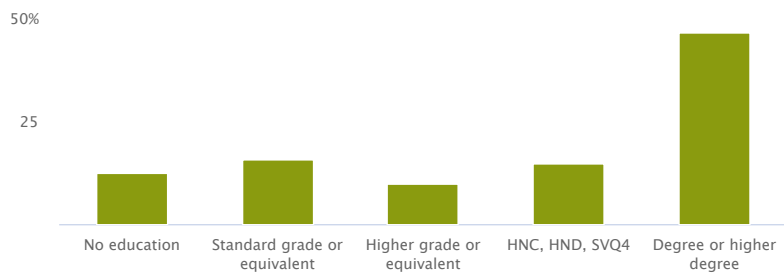


Distance travelled to work

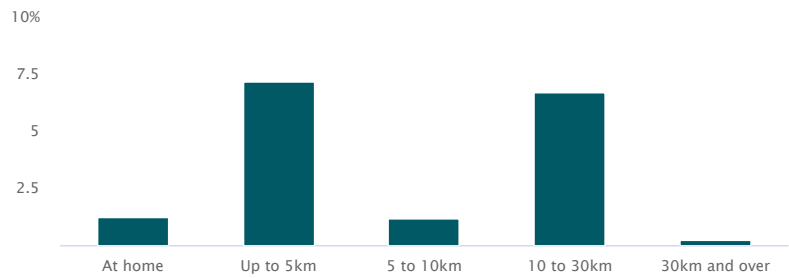
