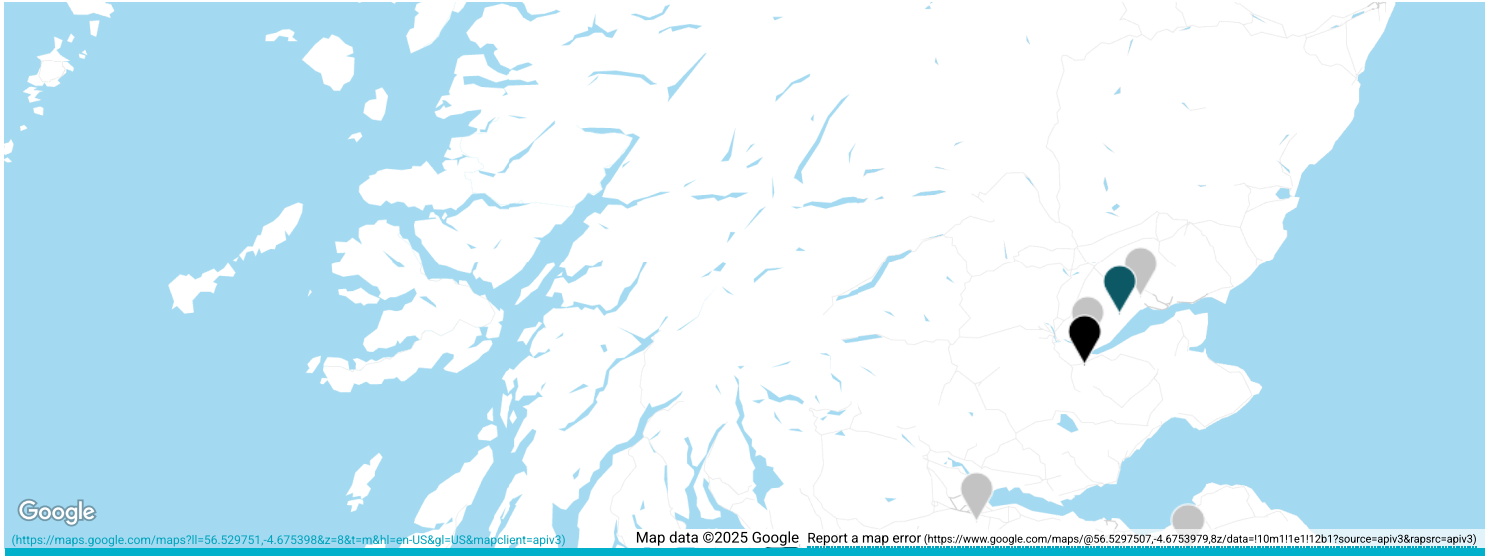




Abernethy

Abernethy in Perth and Kinross is Pictish in origin. And was the site of a priory. Today it is popular with commuters to Perth.

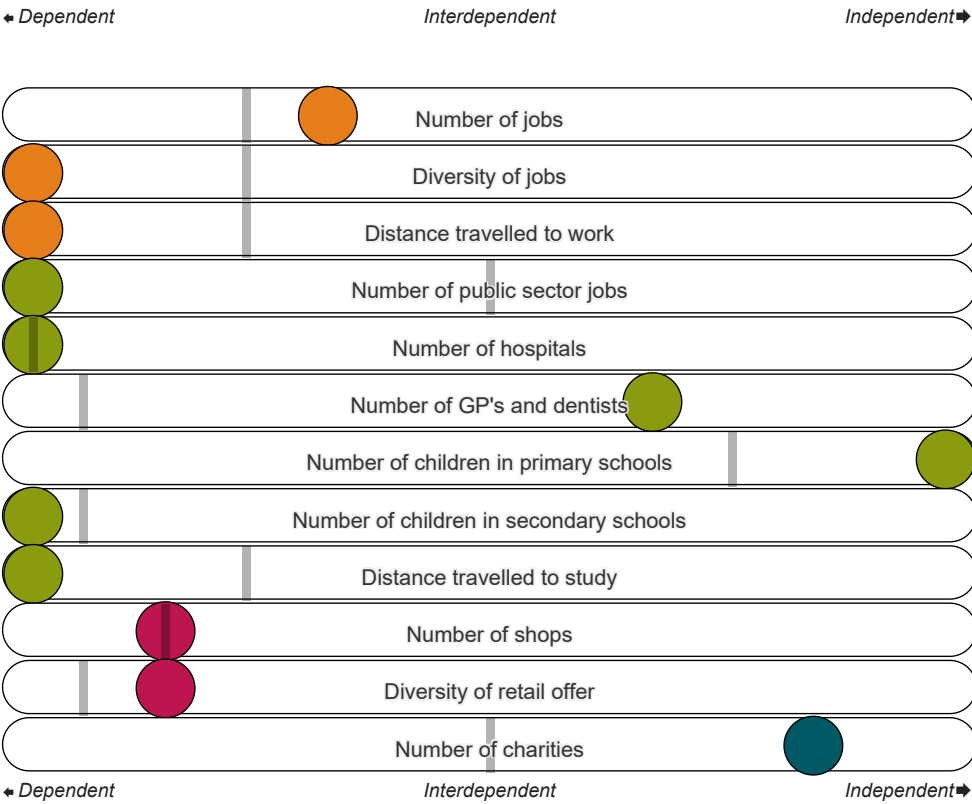
In this small town, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Inter-relationships



Abernethy is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Abernethy is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, and GP's and dentists. Abernethy differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

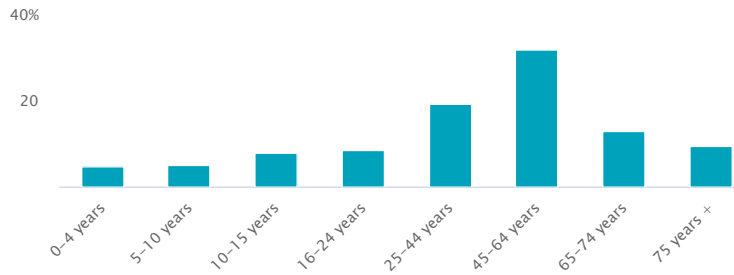

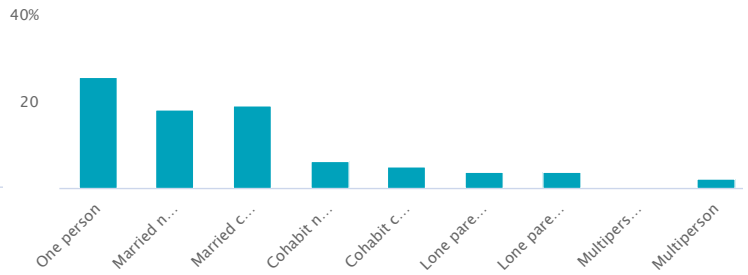

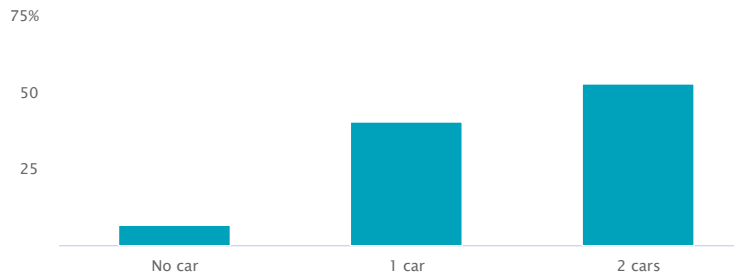

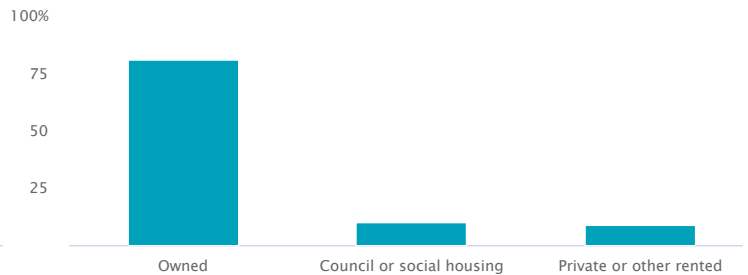

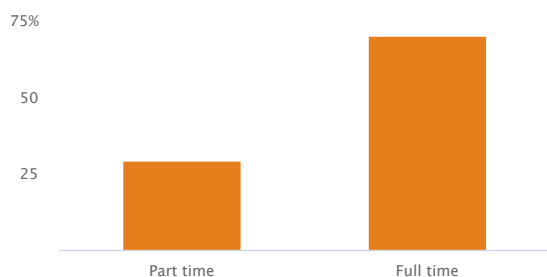

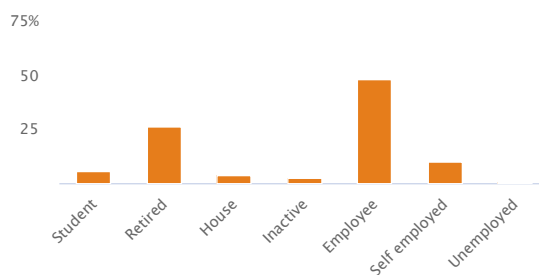
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



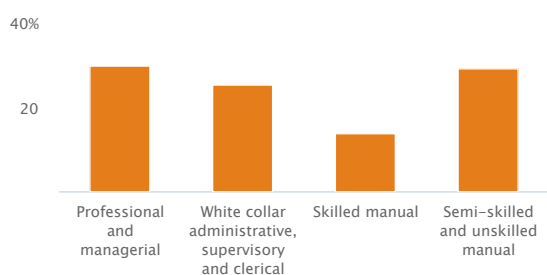
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

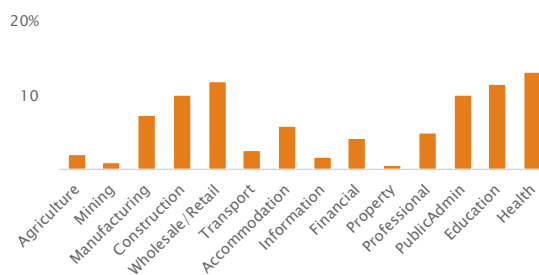


Social Grade

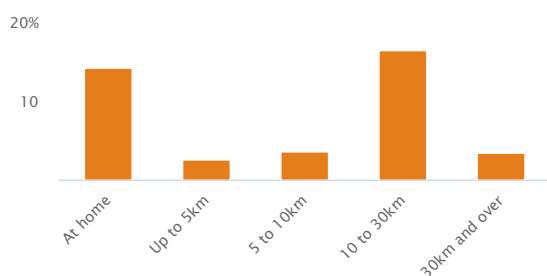
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

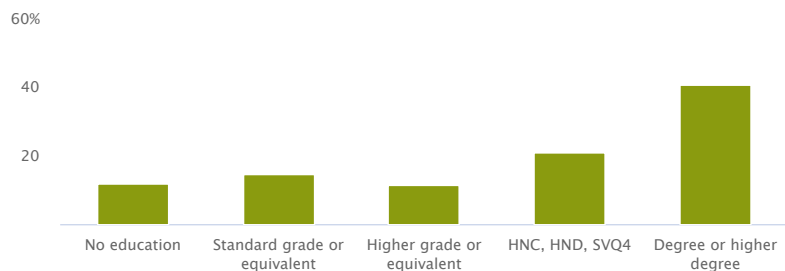


Distance travelled to work

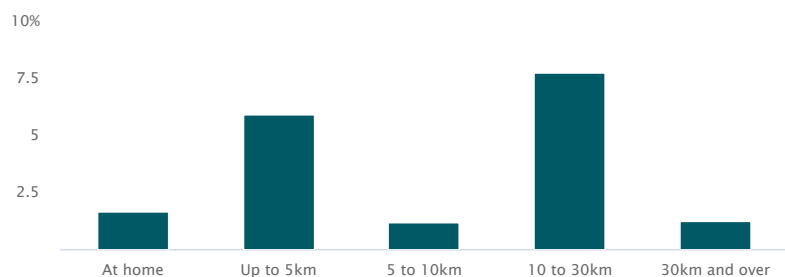
