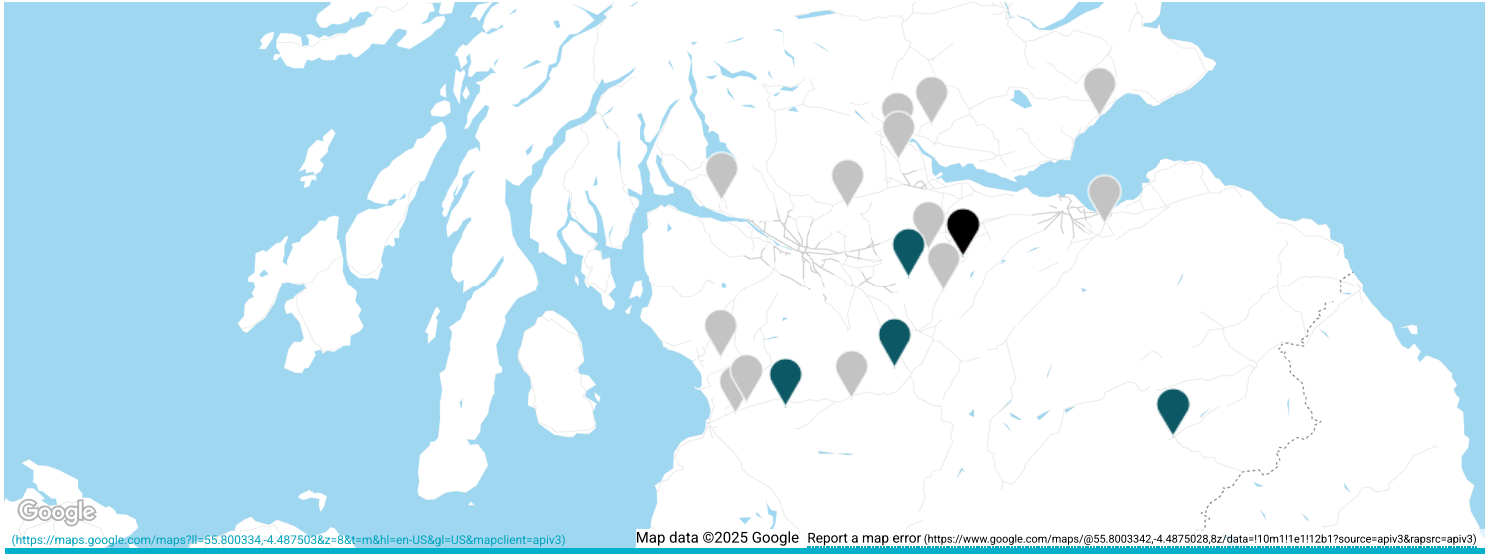




Addiewell

Addiewell is in West Lothian. It was established post World War II to provide new housing.

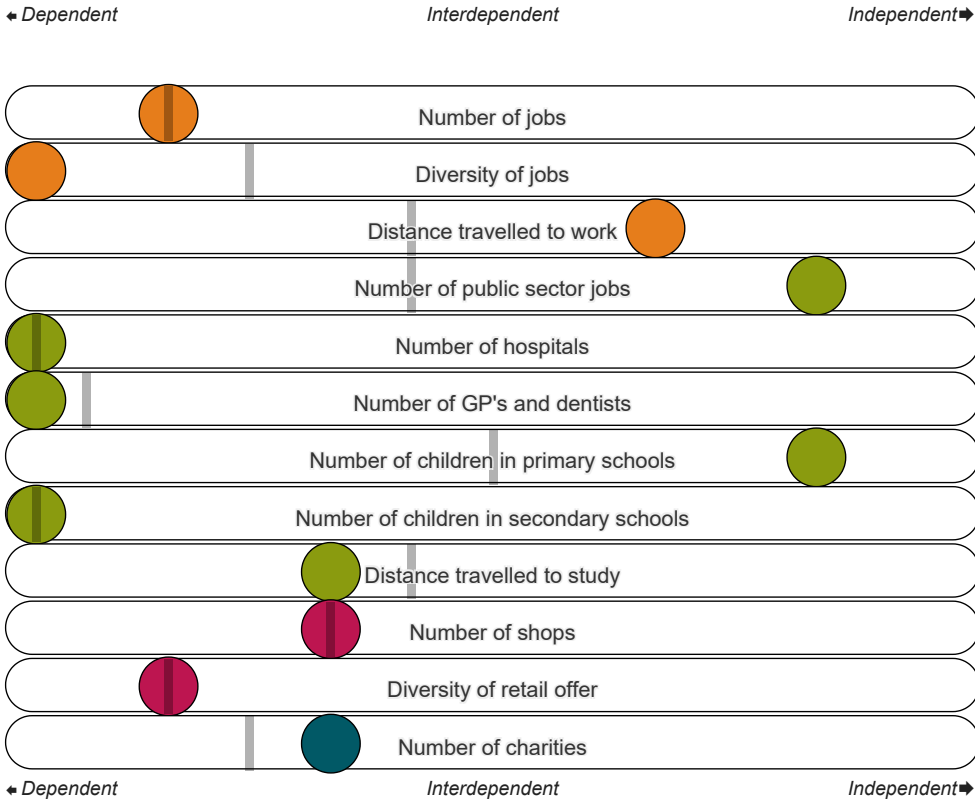
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Addiewell is a dependent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Allanton](#), [Burnfoot](#), [Catrine](#), and [Coalburn](#).

Inter-relationships



Addiewell is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Addiewell is grouped with 17 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

Addiewell differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs.

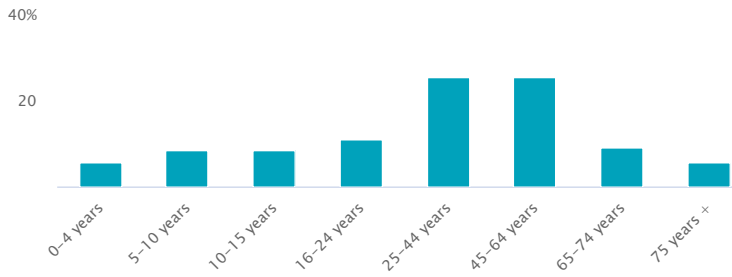

Population change 2011 to 2022**-31%**

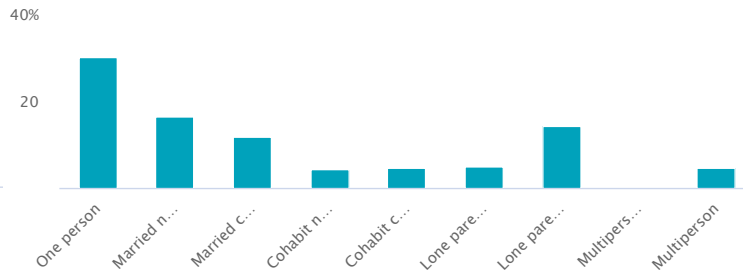

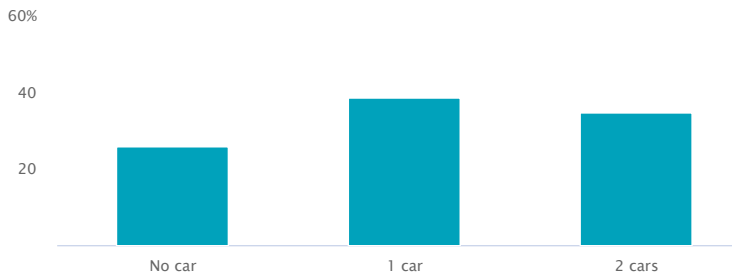

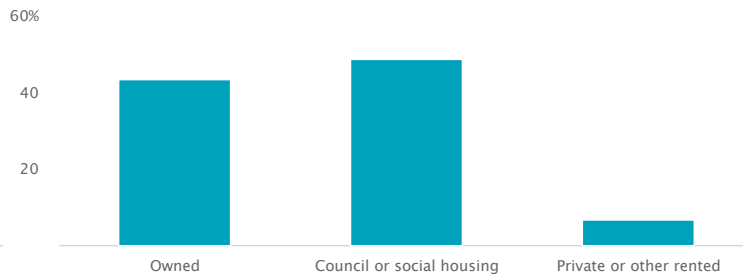
Household composition

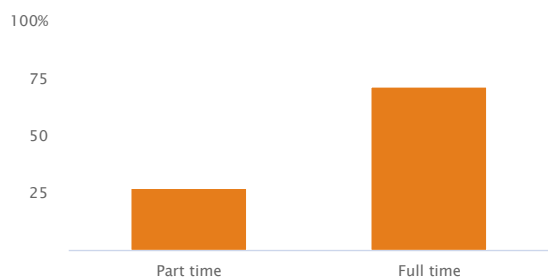

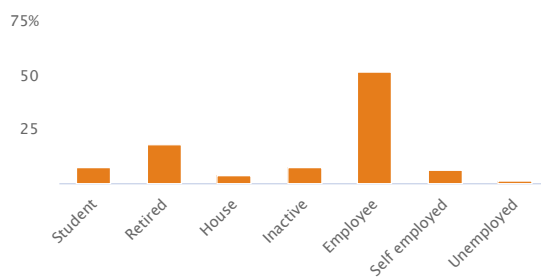
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



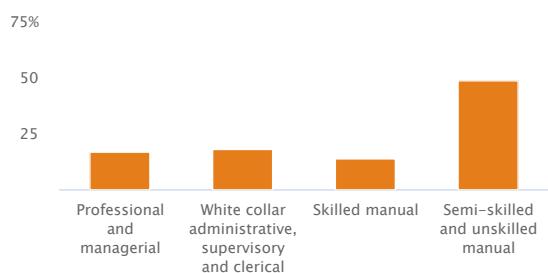
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

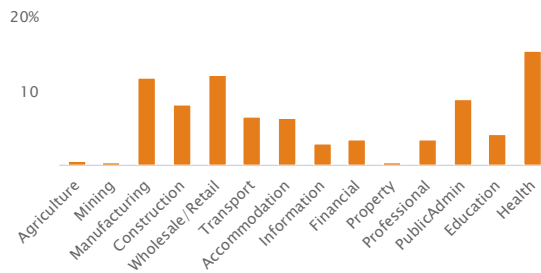

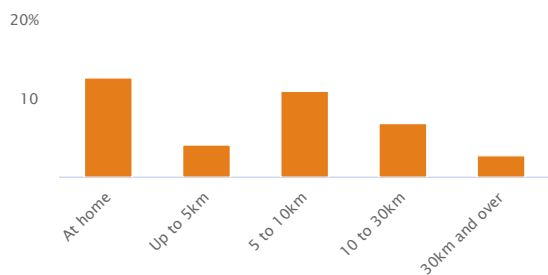
(% households aged 16-64)



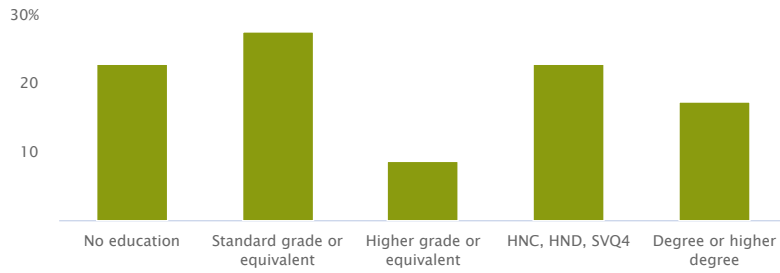
Sector Diversity

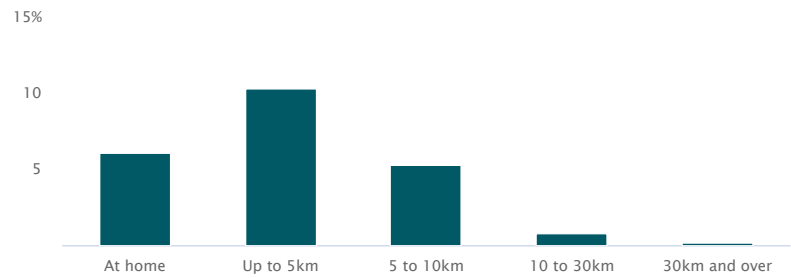
