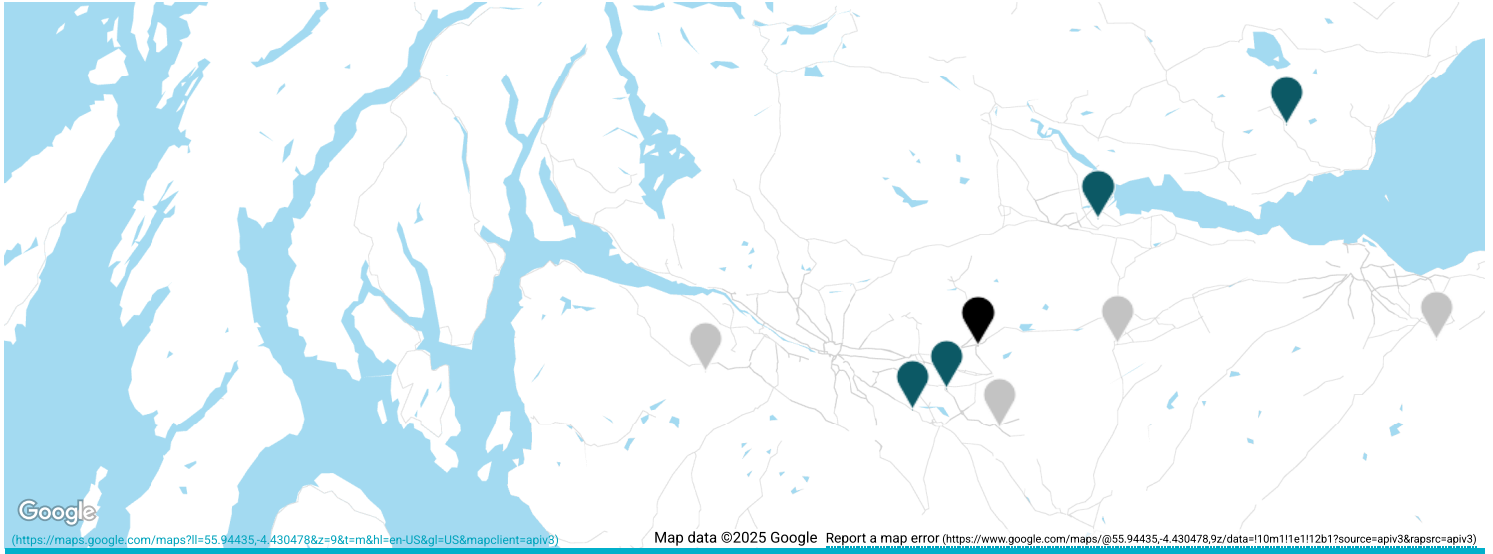




Airdrie

Airdrie in North Lanarkshire developed from a weaving village to become a major industrial town as coal and oil shale were developed. Heavy industry has now been replaced with light industries.

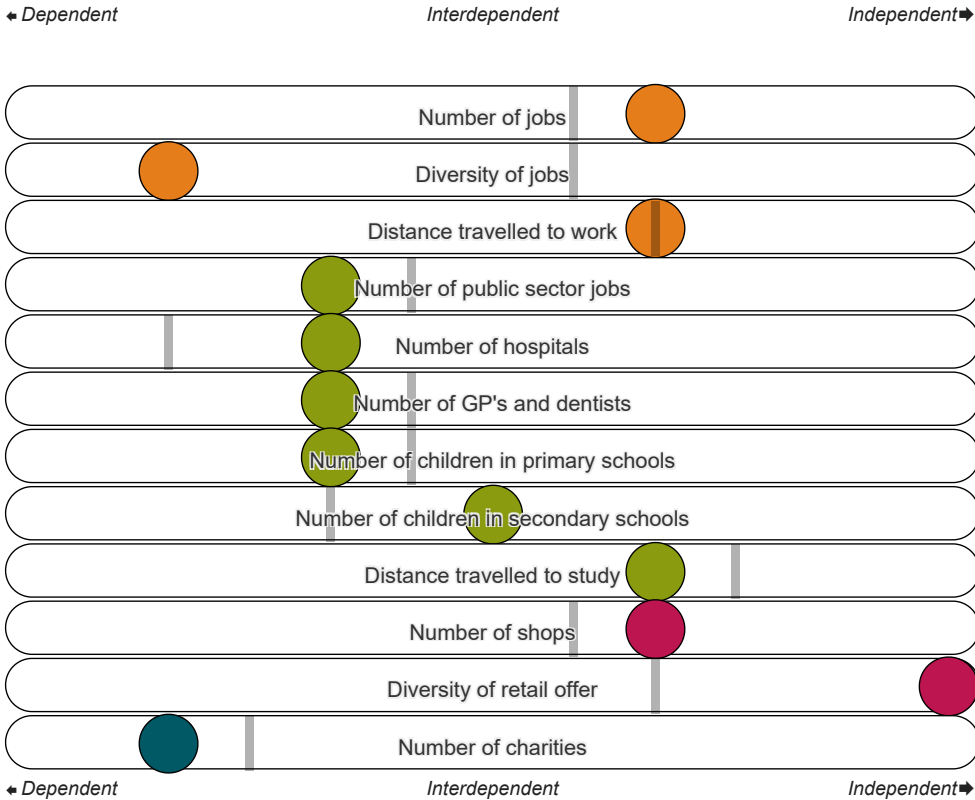
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Airdrie is an interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Bellshill](#), [Blantyre](#), [Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans](#), and [Grangemouth](#).

Inter-relationships



Airdrie is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Airdrie is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of diversity of retail offer. Airdrie differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

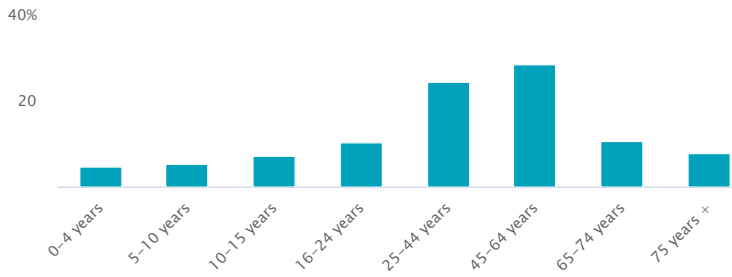

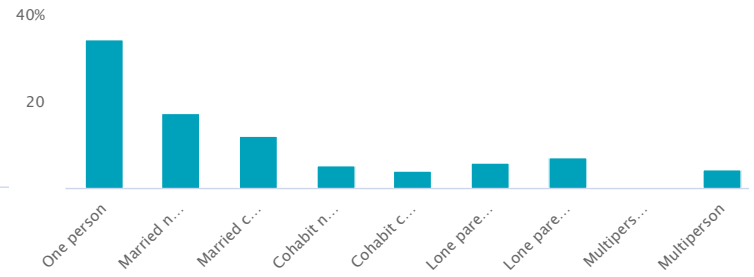

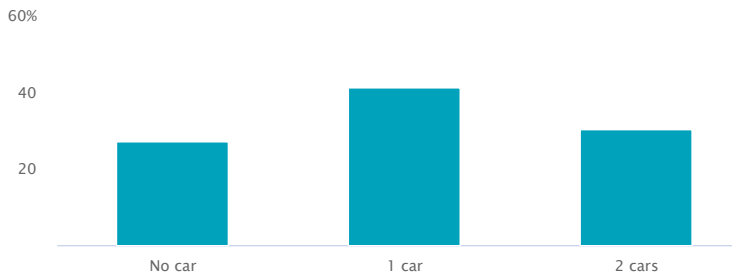

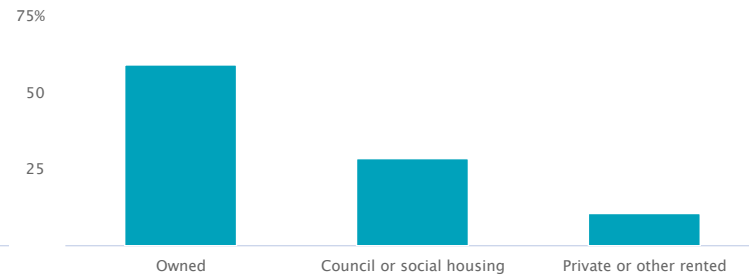

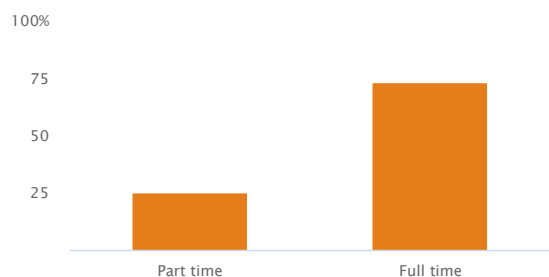

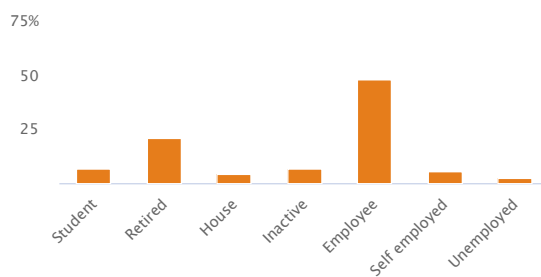
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



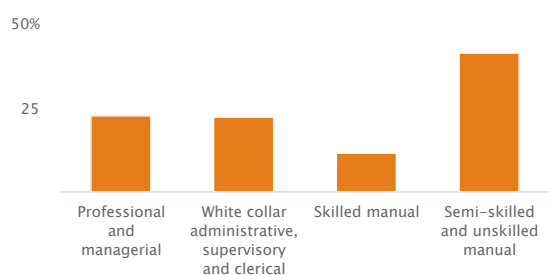
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

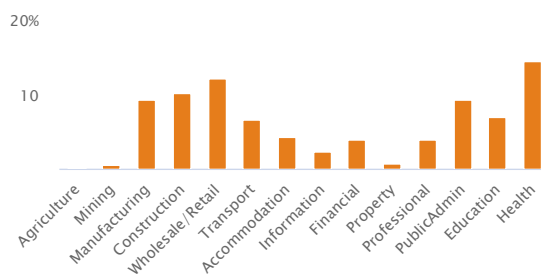


Social Grade

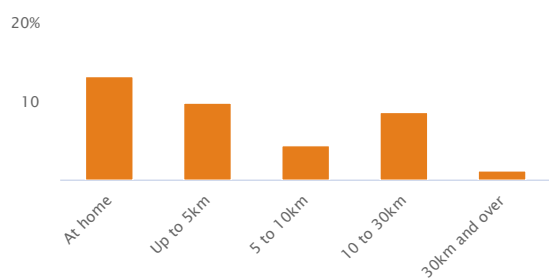
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

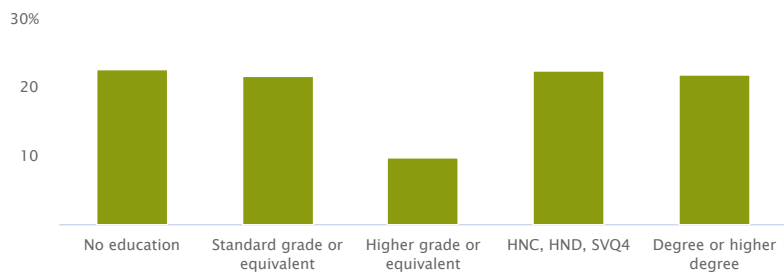


Distance travelled to work

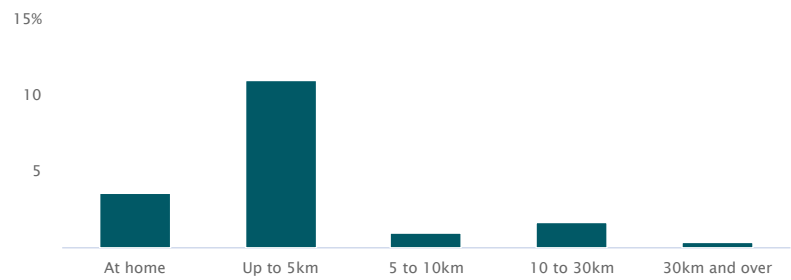
