Annan in Dumfries and Galloway is a historic burgh which was closely associated with the family of Robert the Bruce. Before local government reorganisation in the 1990s it was the local administrative centre. Today the local economy is based on light industry.

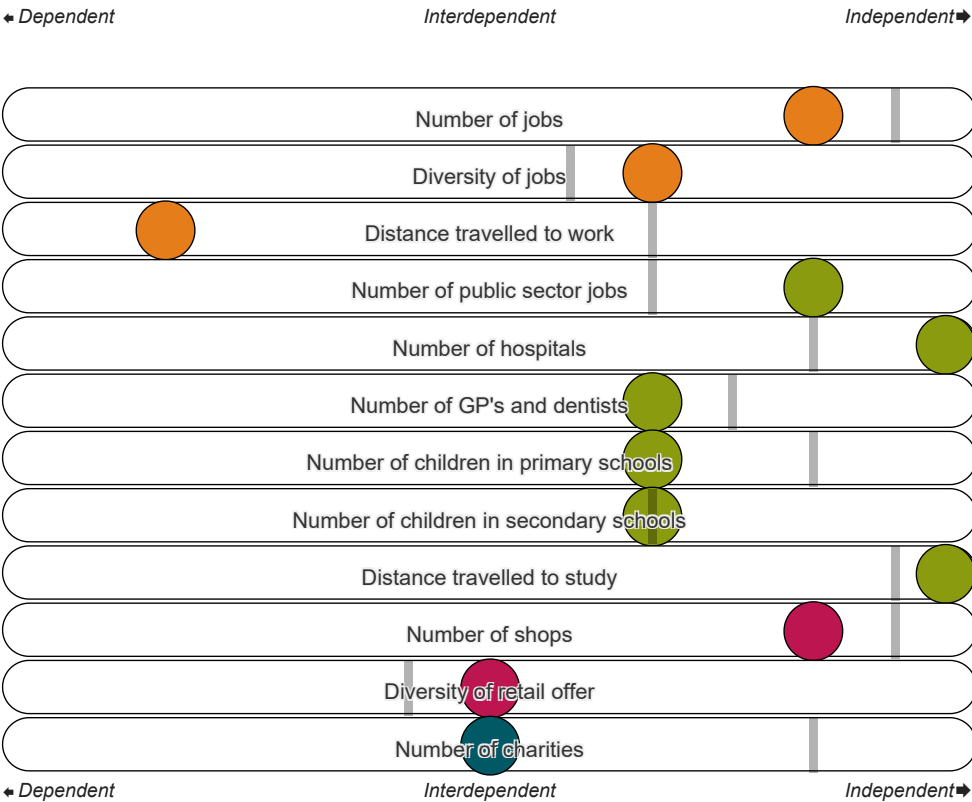
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Annan is an independent to interdependent town.

Annan is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Annan is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. Annan differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

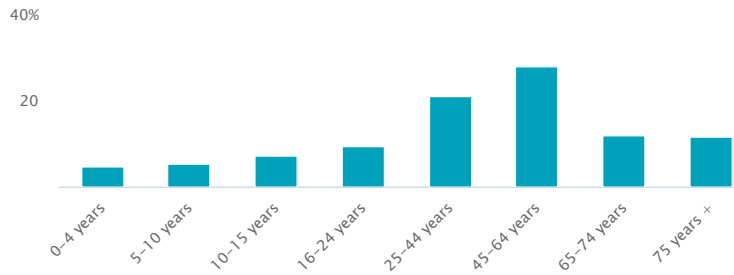

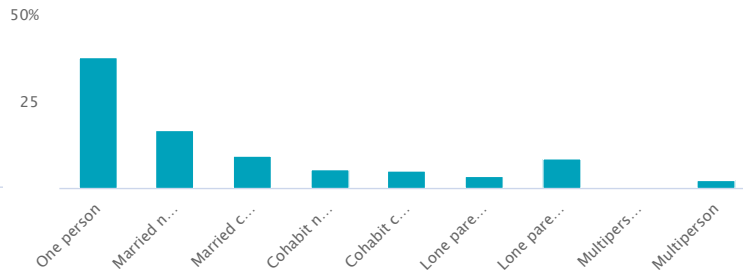

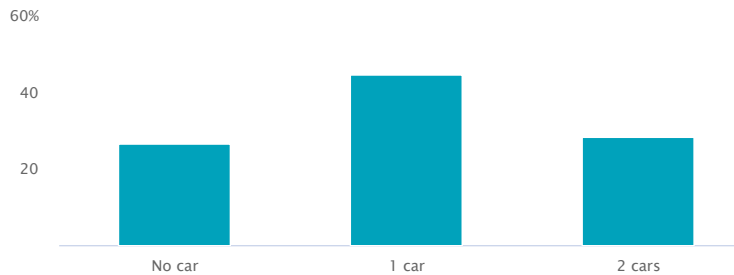

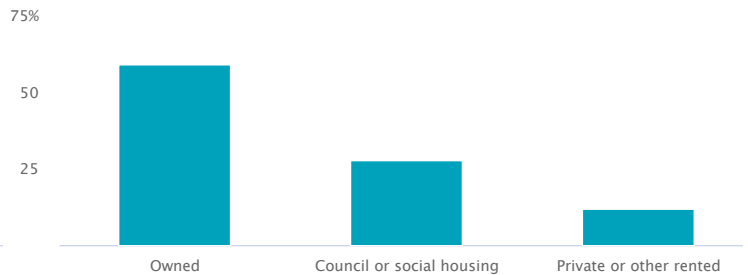

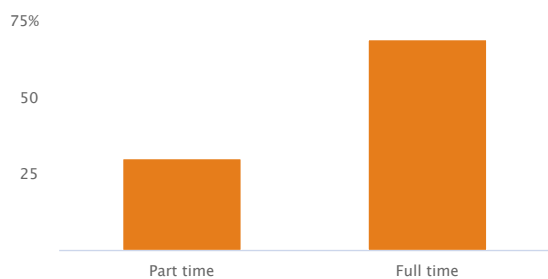

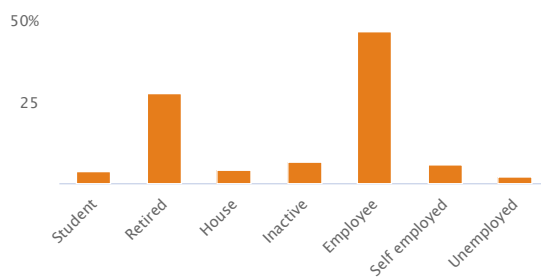
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



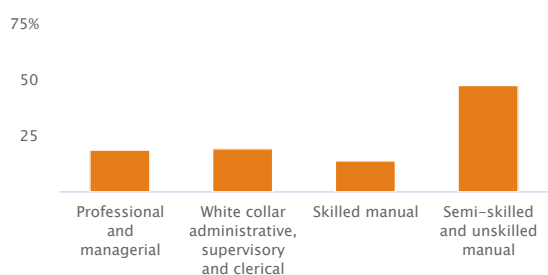
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

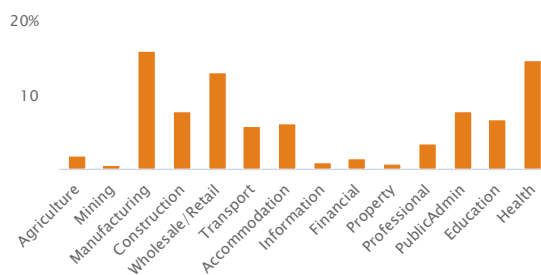


Social Grade

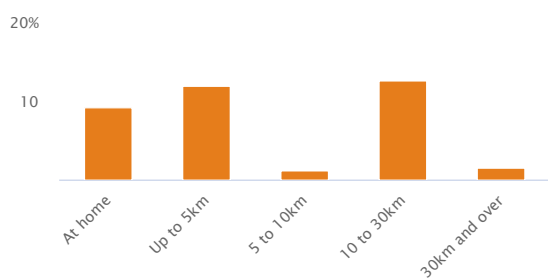
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

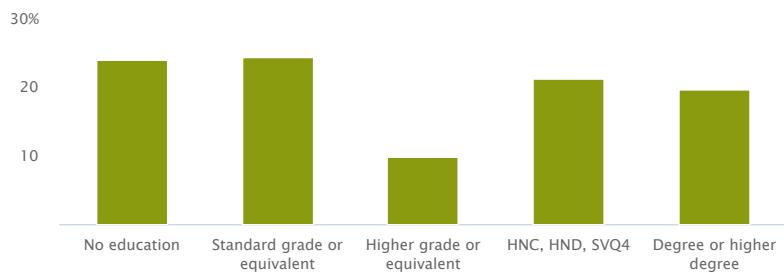


Distance travelled to work

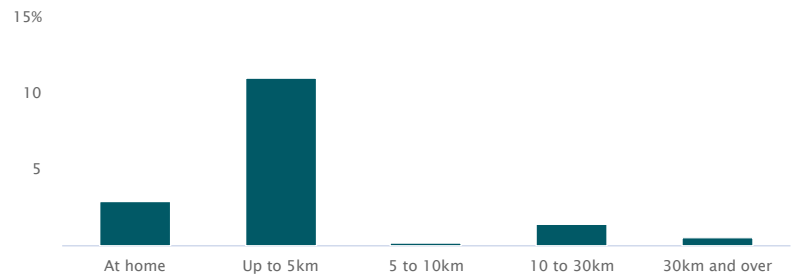
