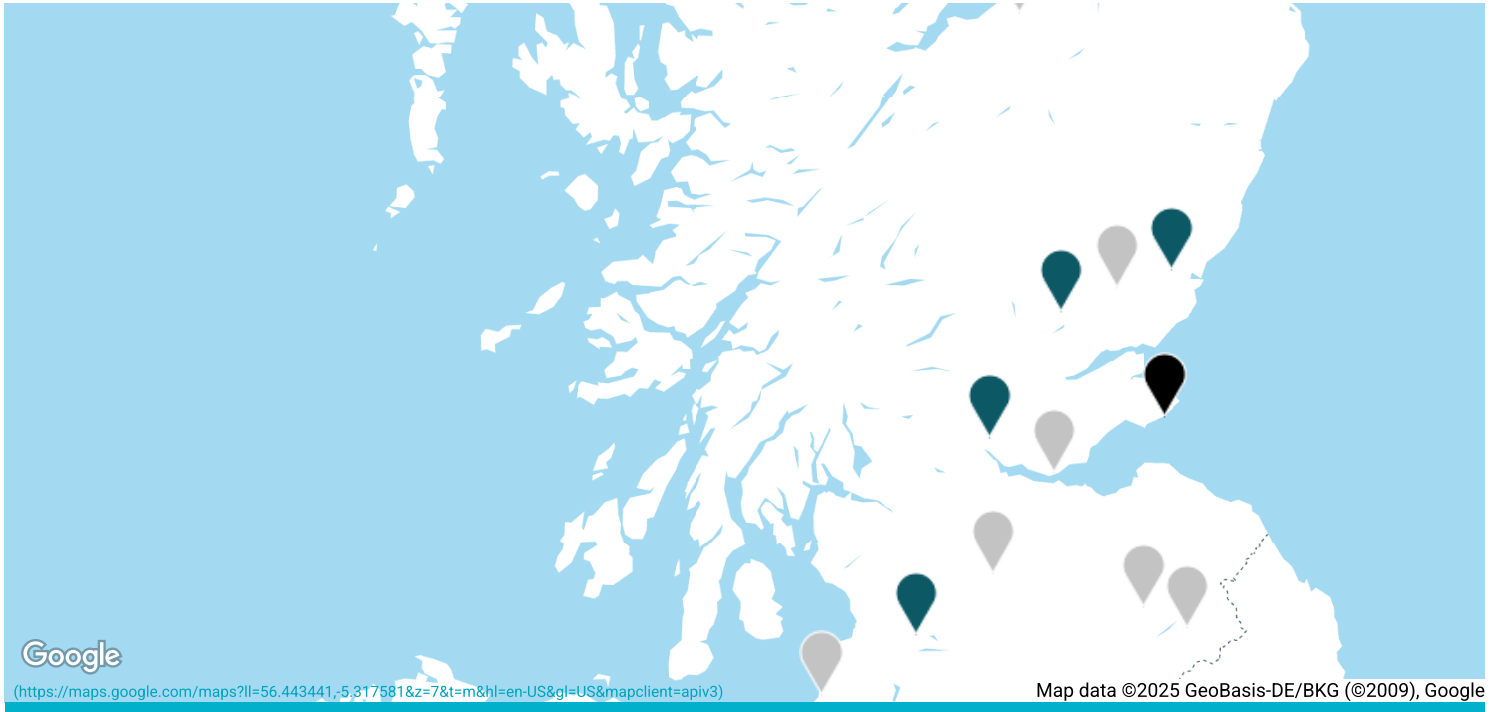

Anstruther in Fife is the largest town in the East Neuk. It was traditionally a fishing village and still retains an active harbour with leisure craft. Today the town plays a role as a local service centre for the East Neuk. Tourism is important and there is also some light industry.

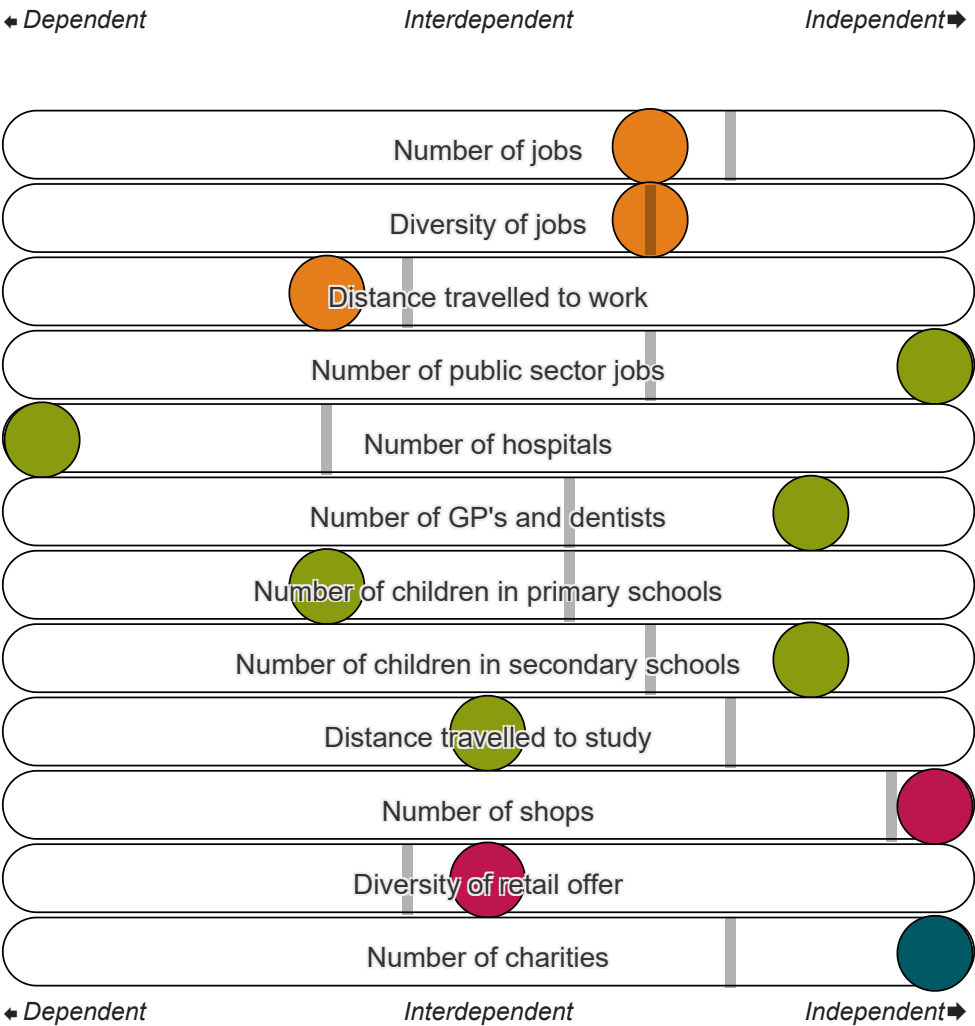
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Anstruther is an interdependent to independent town.

Anstruther is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Anstruther is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Anstruther differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

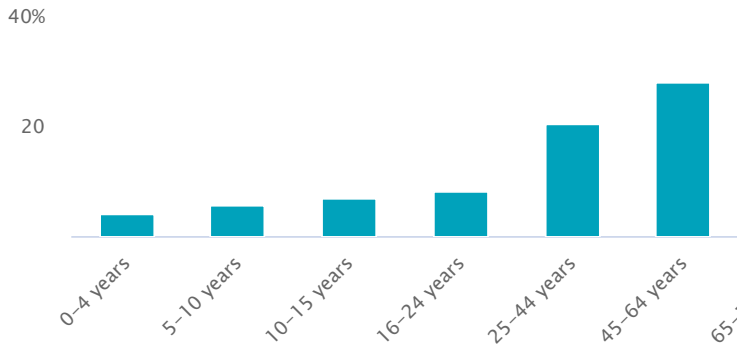

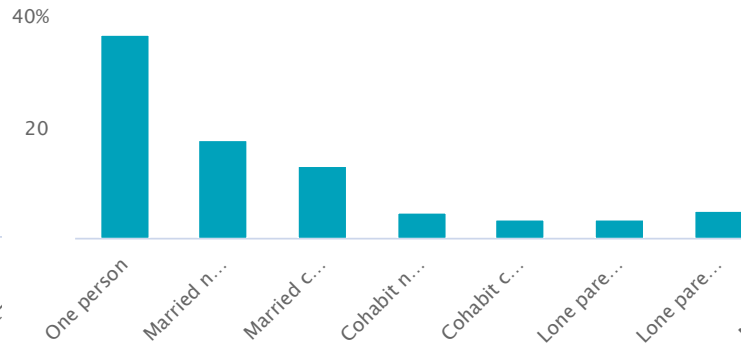

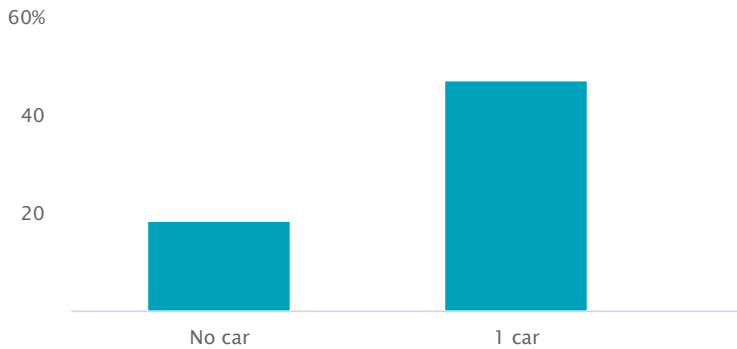

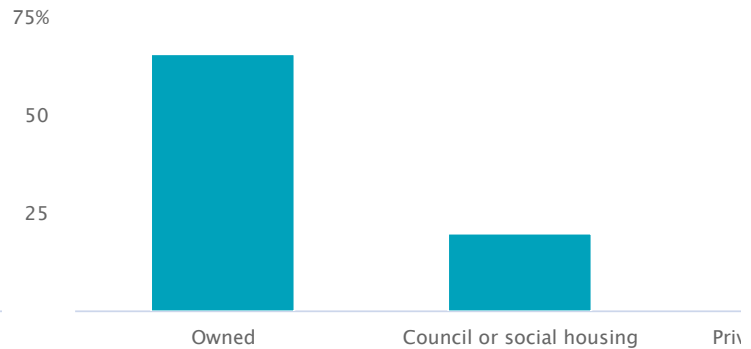

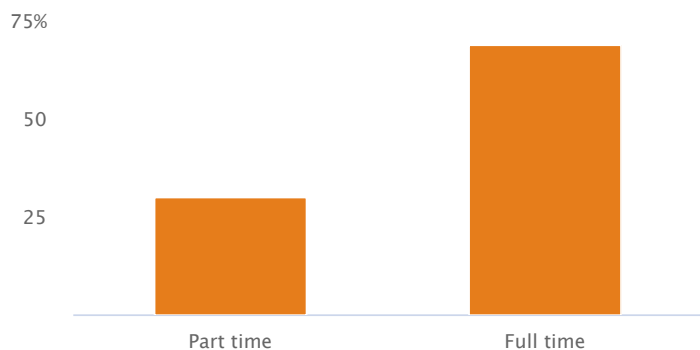

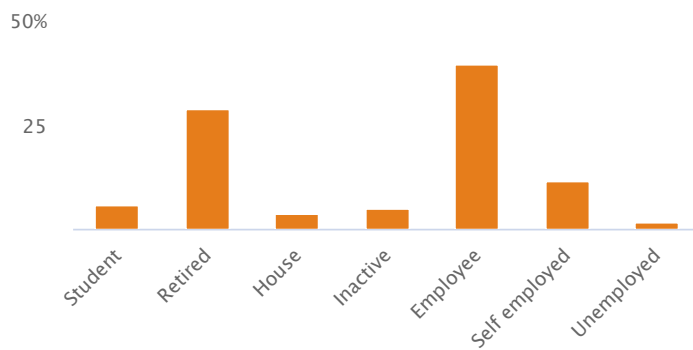
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



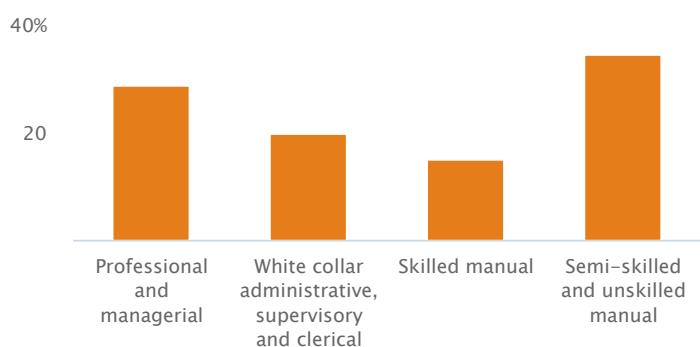
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

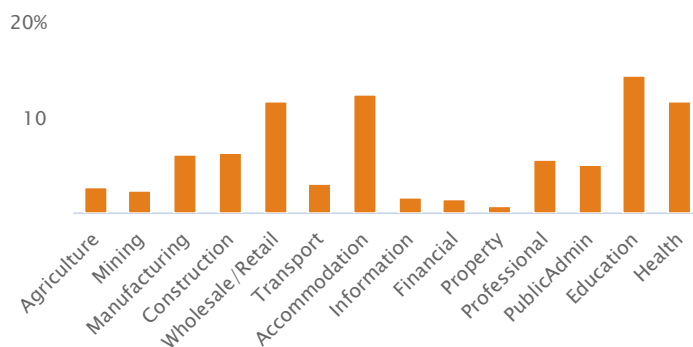

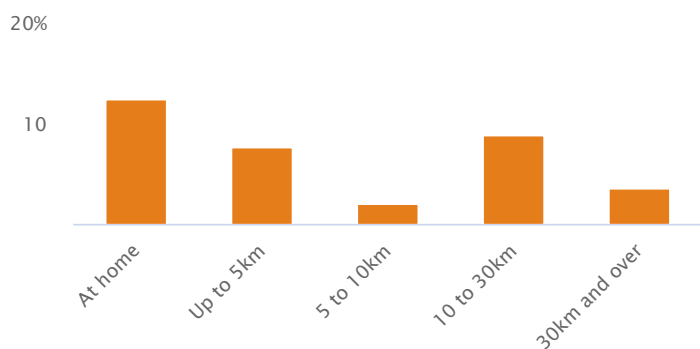
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

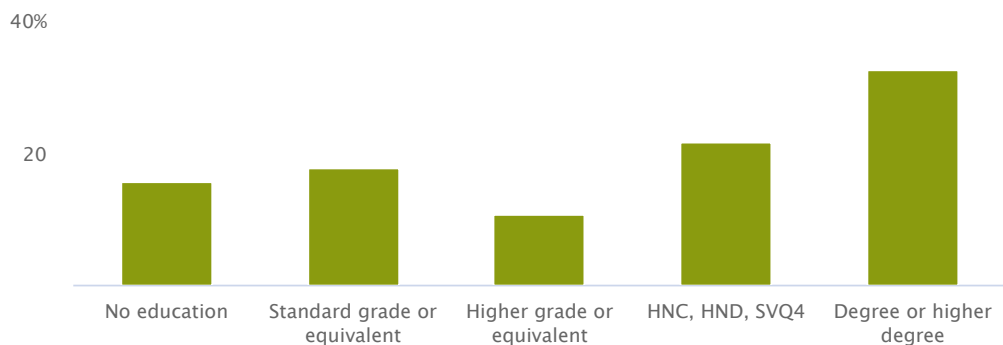


Distance travelled to work

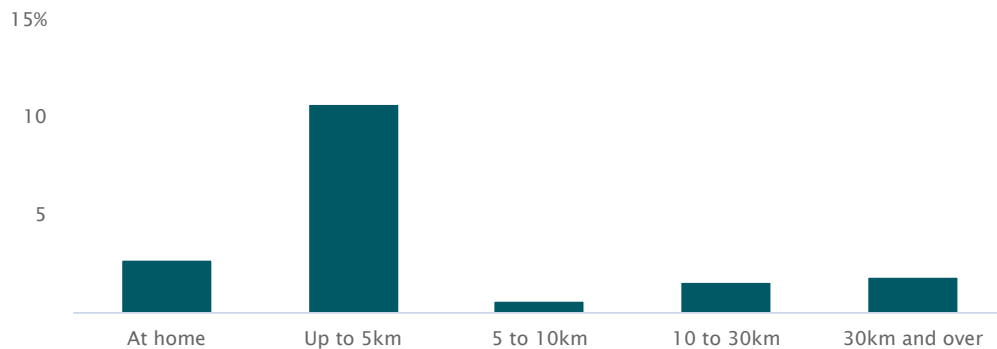
