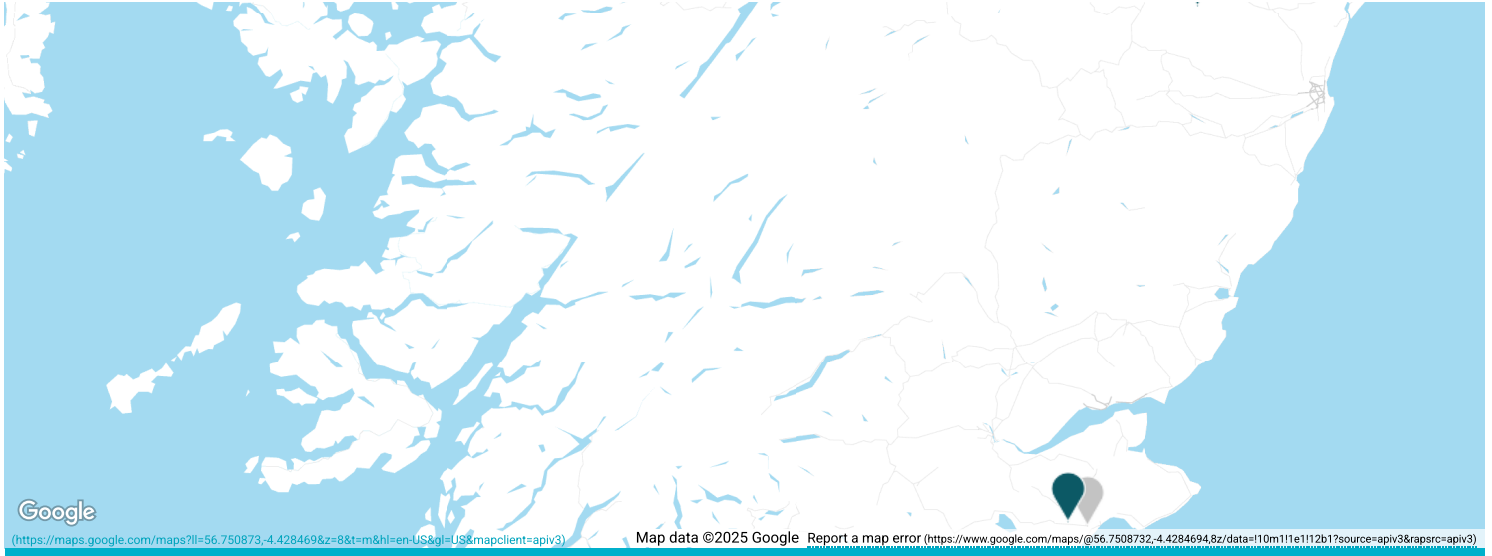




Armadale

POPULATION **12,568**

Armadale in west Lothian developed in the 19th century as a mining town with coal and ironstone and quarrying of limestone and brick clay. The town was developed Lord Armadale from Sutherland. Steel and bricks were manufactured. It remains an industrial town although many current residents are commuters.

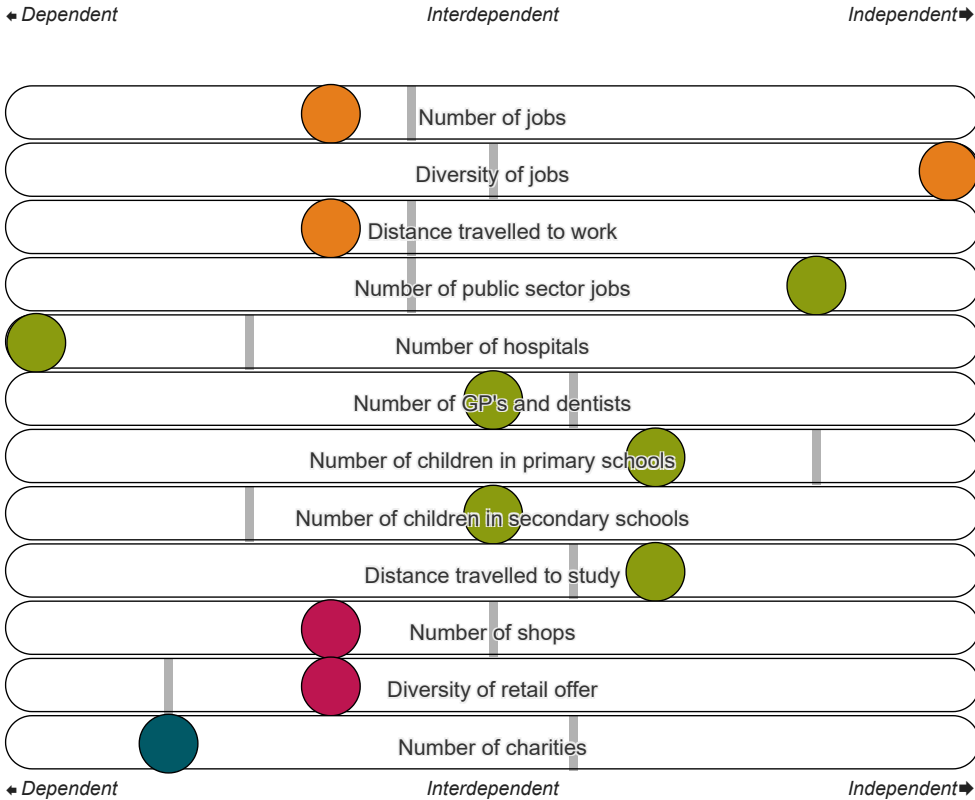
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Armadale is an interdependent town.

Armadale is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Armadale is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Armadale differs most from its group in the number of hospitals.

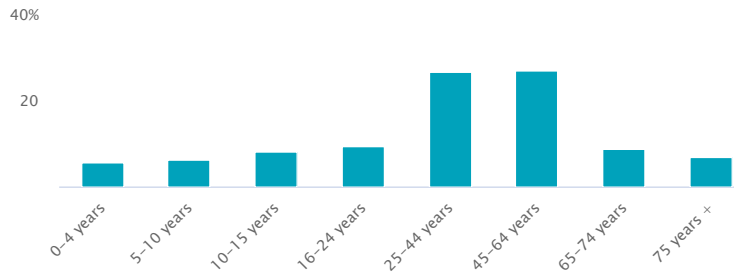

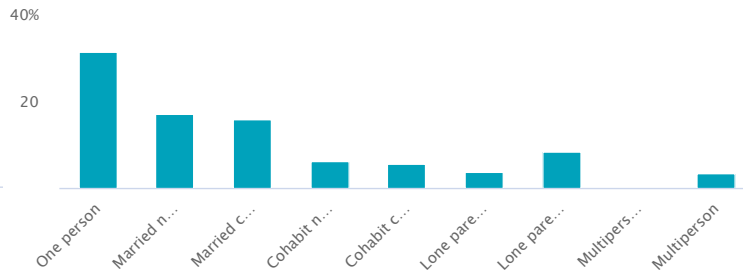

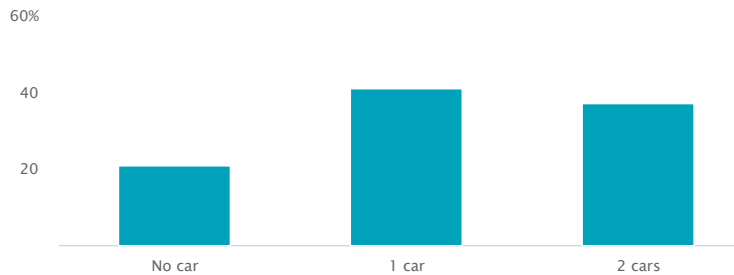

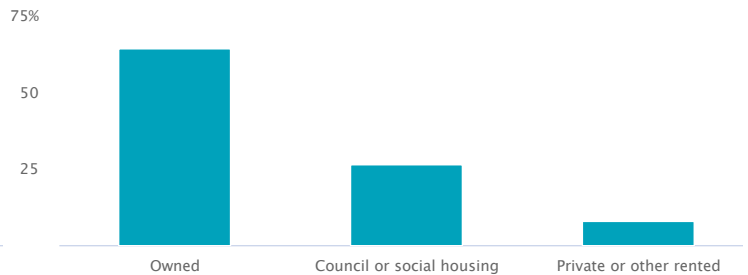

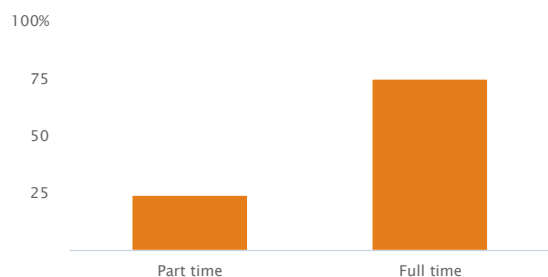

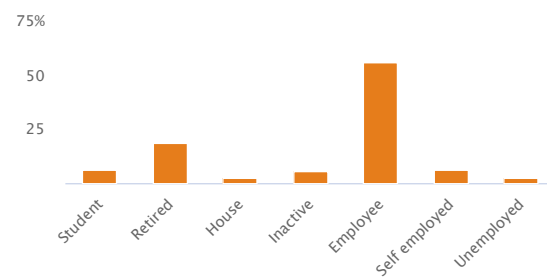
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



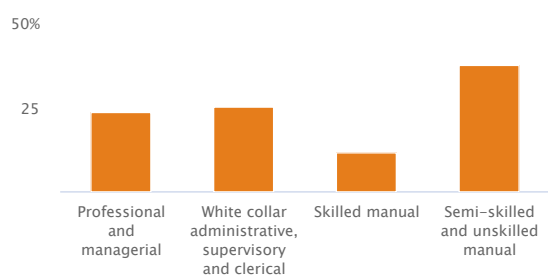
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

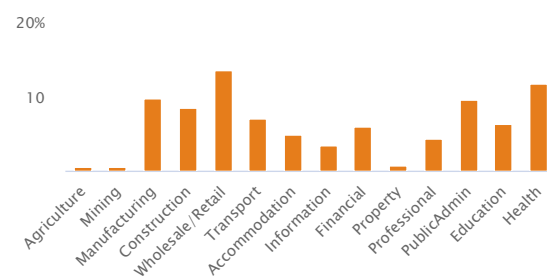

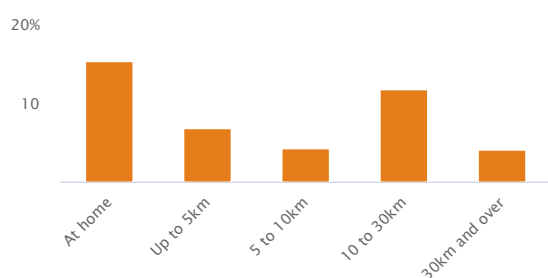
(% households aged 16-64)



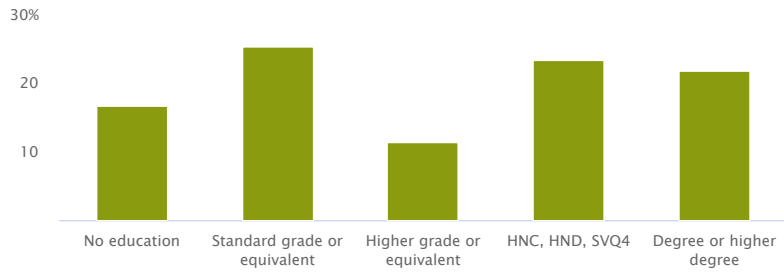
Sector Diversity

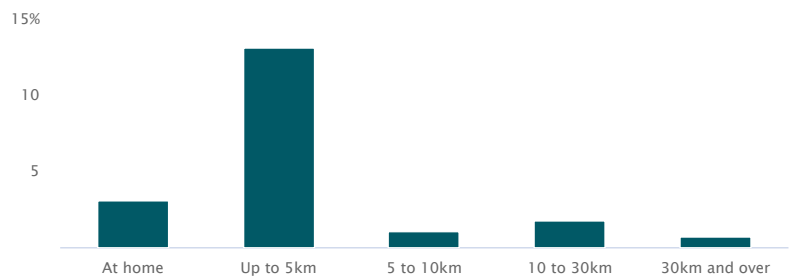
