Armadale in west Lothian developed in the 19th century as a mining town with coal and ironstone and quarrying of limestone and brick clay. The town was developed Lord Armadale from Sutherland. Steel and bricks were manufactured. It remains an industrial town although many current residents are commuters.


In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Armadale is an interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are Insch, Markinch, Mintlaw, and Smithton.

Population change 2011 to 2022






Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)




Distance travelled to work



(% aged 16-74)




