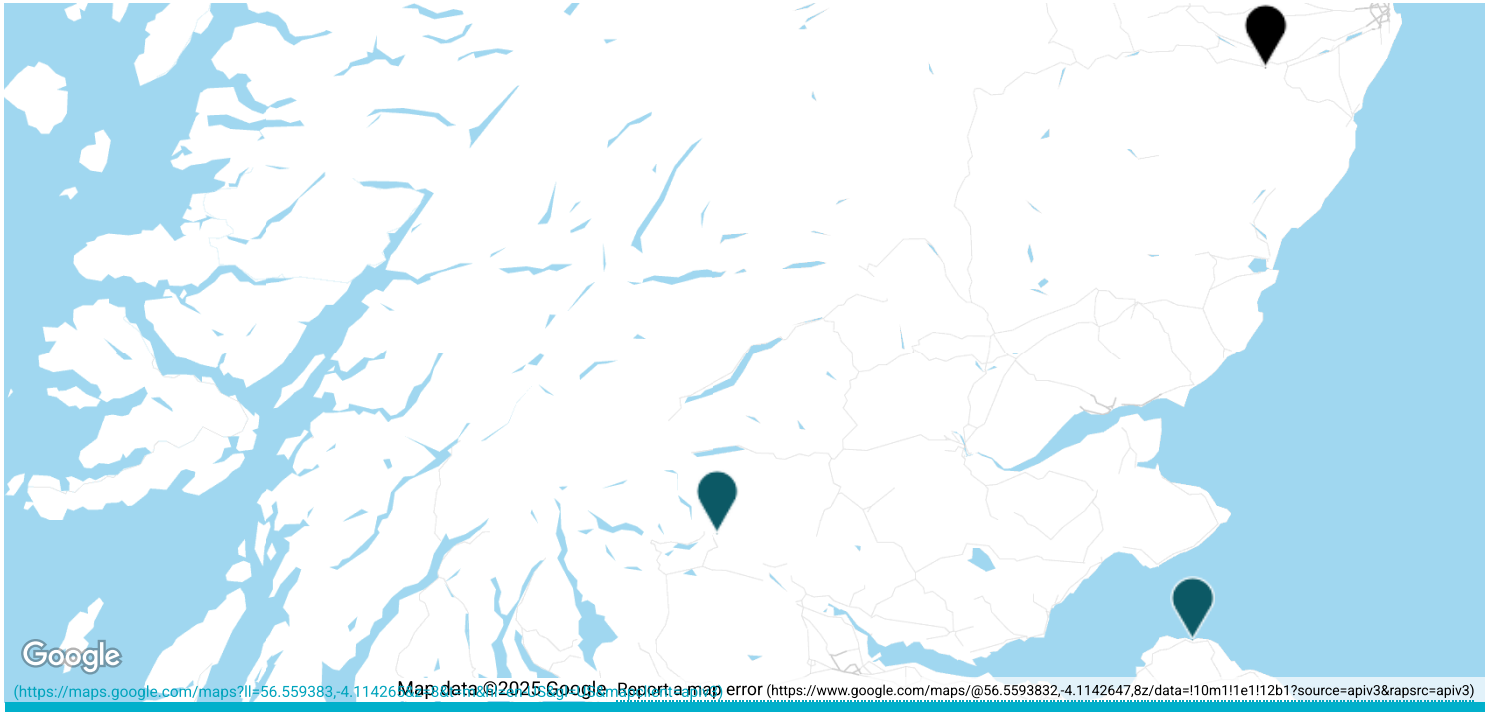




Banchory

Banchory on Deeside is in Aberdeenshire. It was an early Christian settlement. A tourist resort in the 19th century Banchory is now an important commuter settlement. It has local industries including food processing and building and timber industries. It acts as a service centre for the surrounding agricultural area.

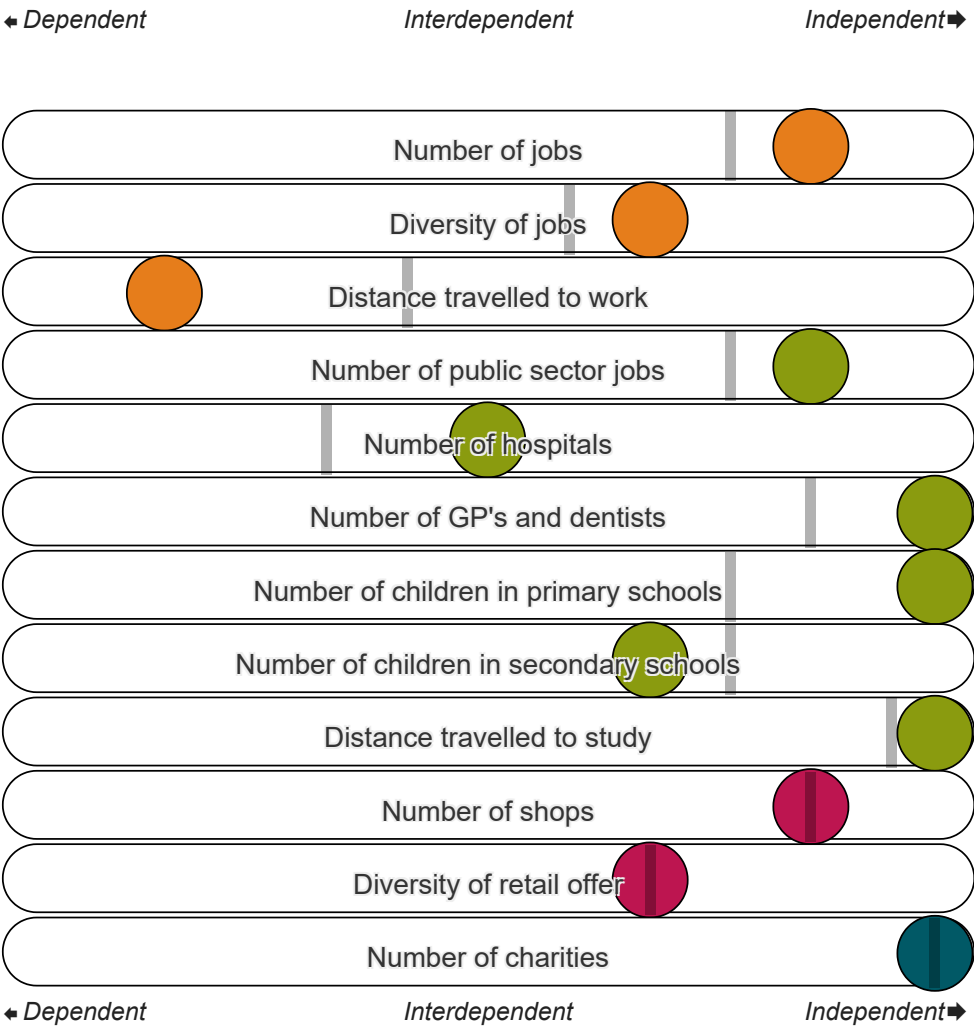
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Banchory is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Banchory is grouped with 2 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

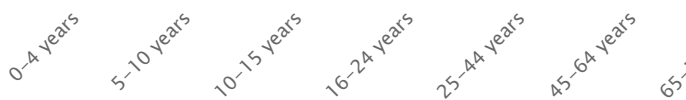

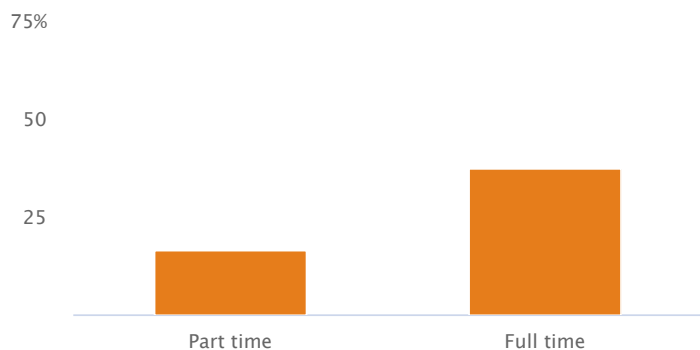

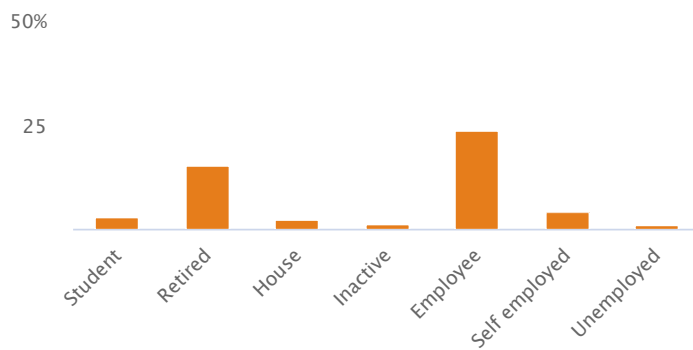
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



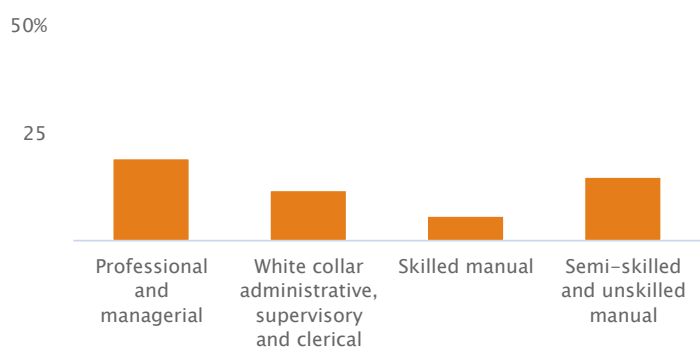
Occupation

Social Grade

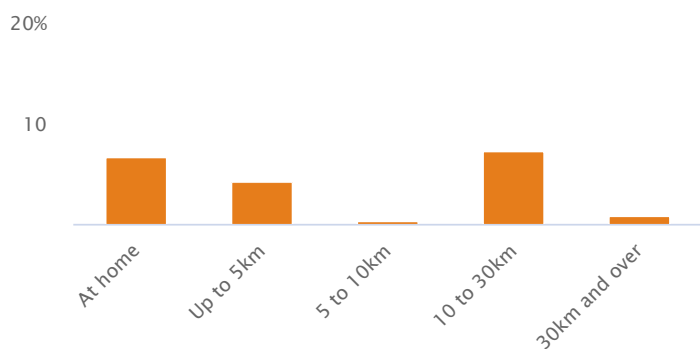
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

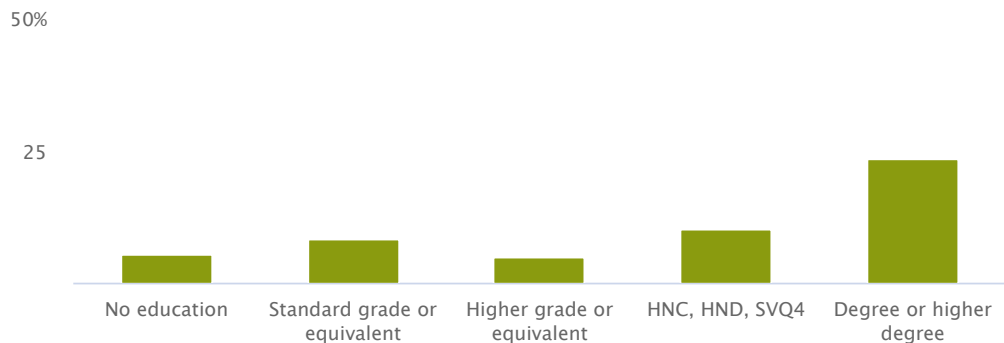


Distance travelled to work

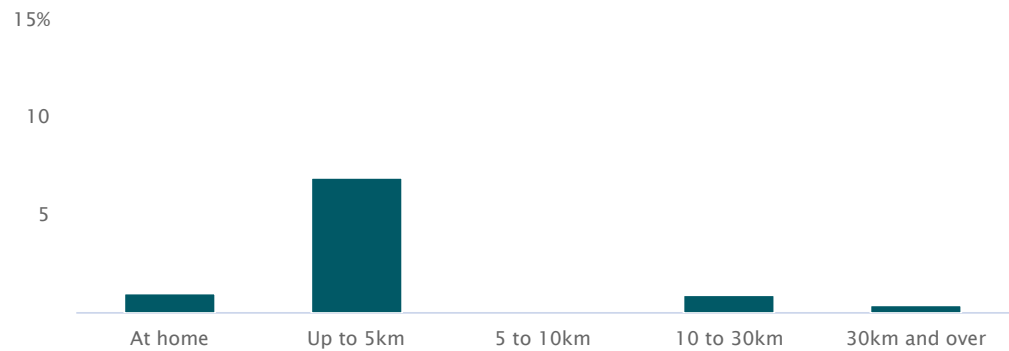
