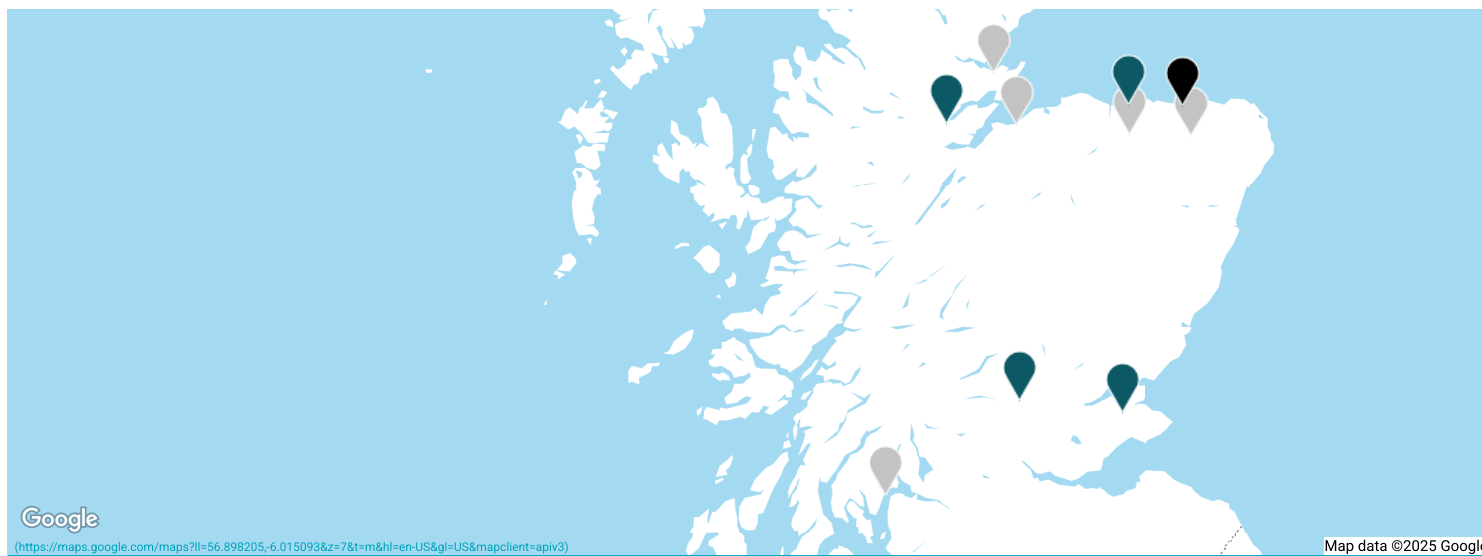

Banff in Aberdeenshire dates from medieval times when it was an important port exporting salmon to Europe. It continued to be an important fishing and fish trading port in the 19th century but today the port is home to small fishing boats and leisure craft. The historic town and boating have given it a tourist role.

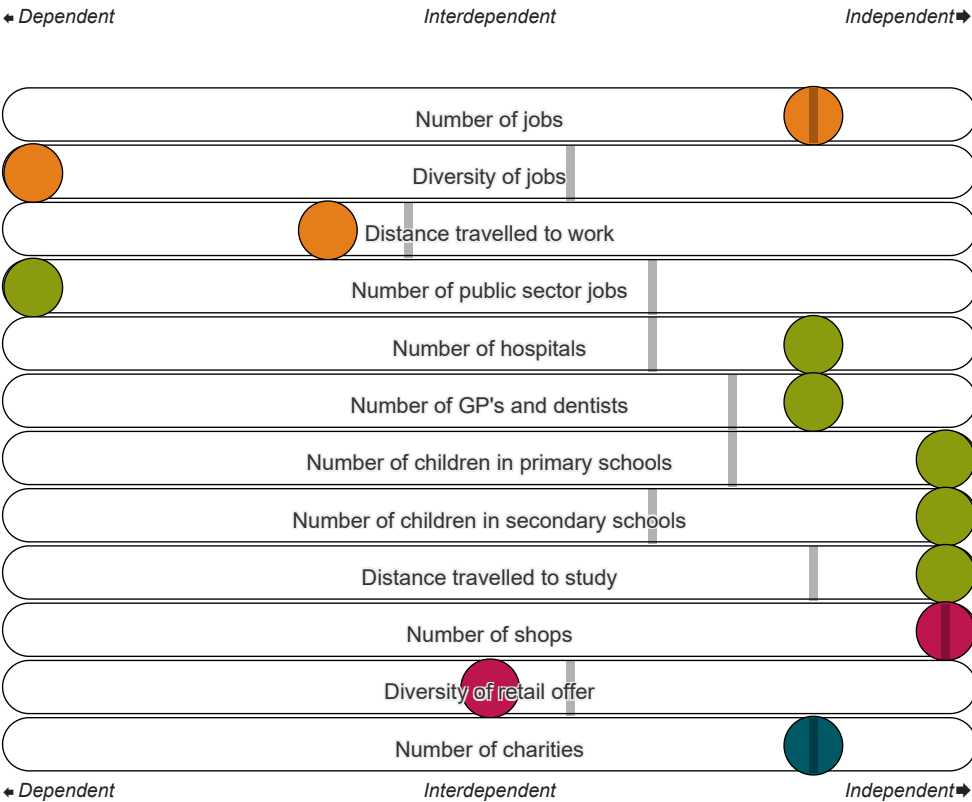
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Banff is an independent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Banff is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Banff is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and children in secondary schools. Banff differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

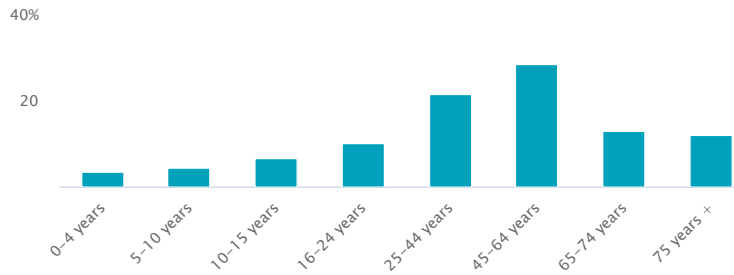

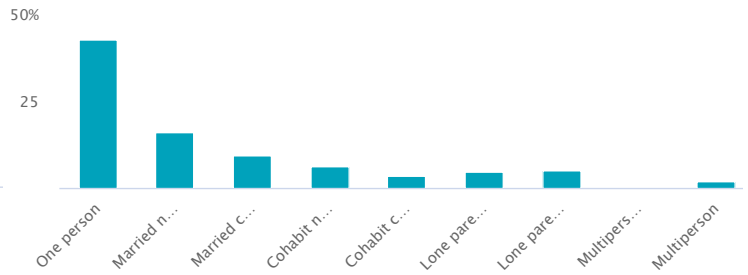

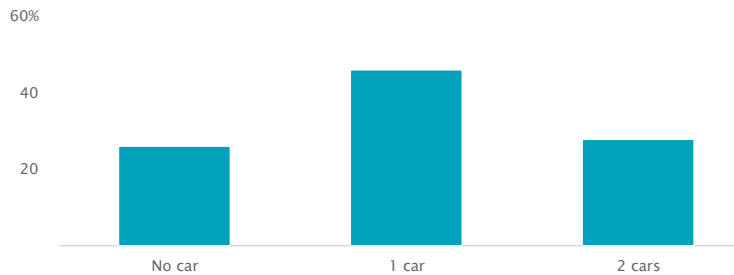

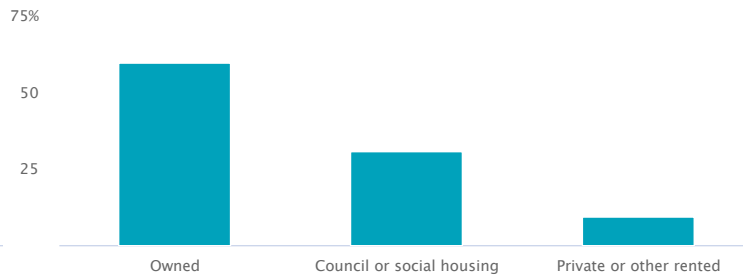
Household composition

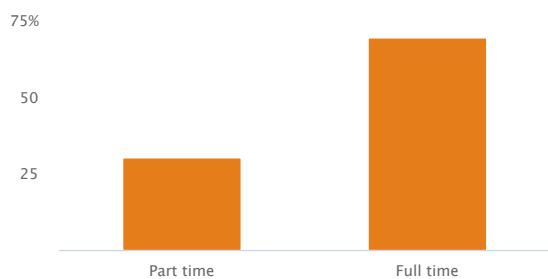

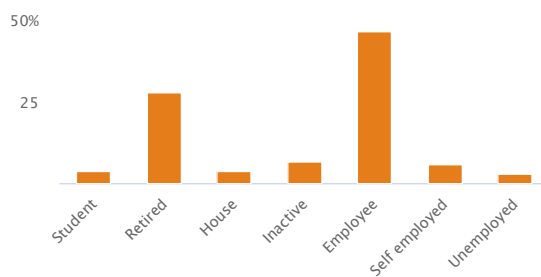
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



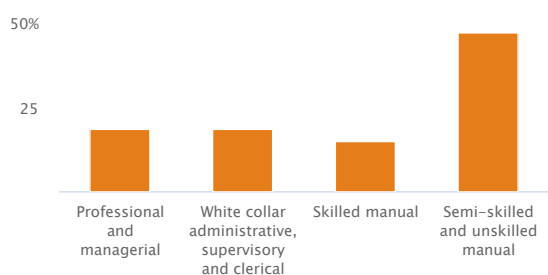
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

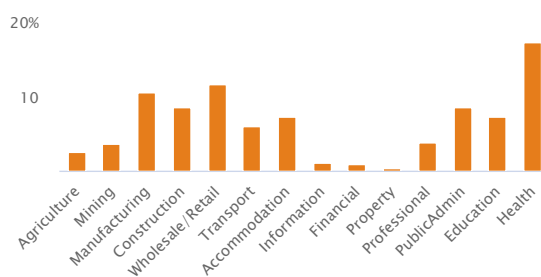

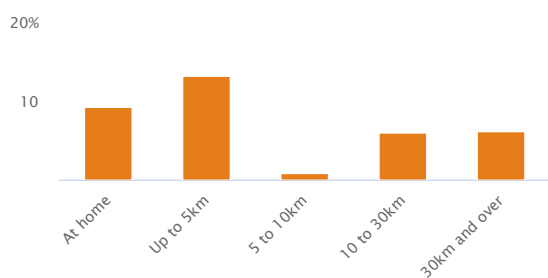
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

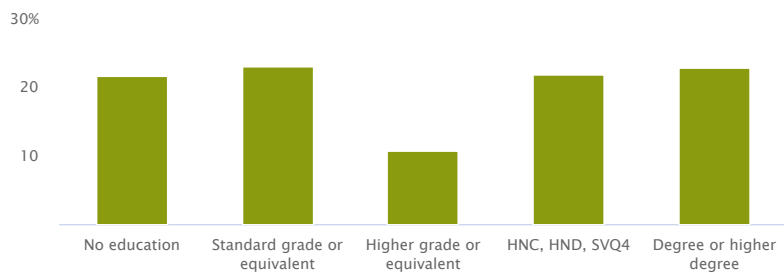


Distance travelled to work

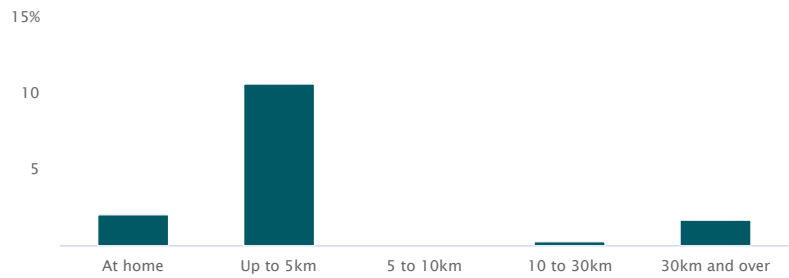
