POPULATION 2,312

Banknock on the Bonny Water in Falkirk Council area was originally a mining town. It proximity to the Forth and Clyde canal was important. Other industries included a foundry and distillery but these are now closed. Increasingly it has become a commuter town with low density private housing developments.


In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Banknock is a dependent town.

Its most similar towns are Bellsbank, Caldercruix, Patna, and Salsburgh.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Banknock is grouped with 4 other towns. 








Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Occupation

(% aged 16-74)




(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity




Distance travelled to work


