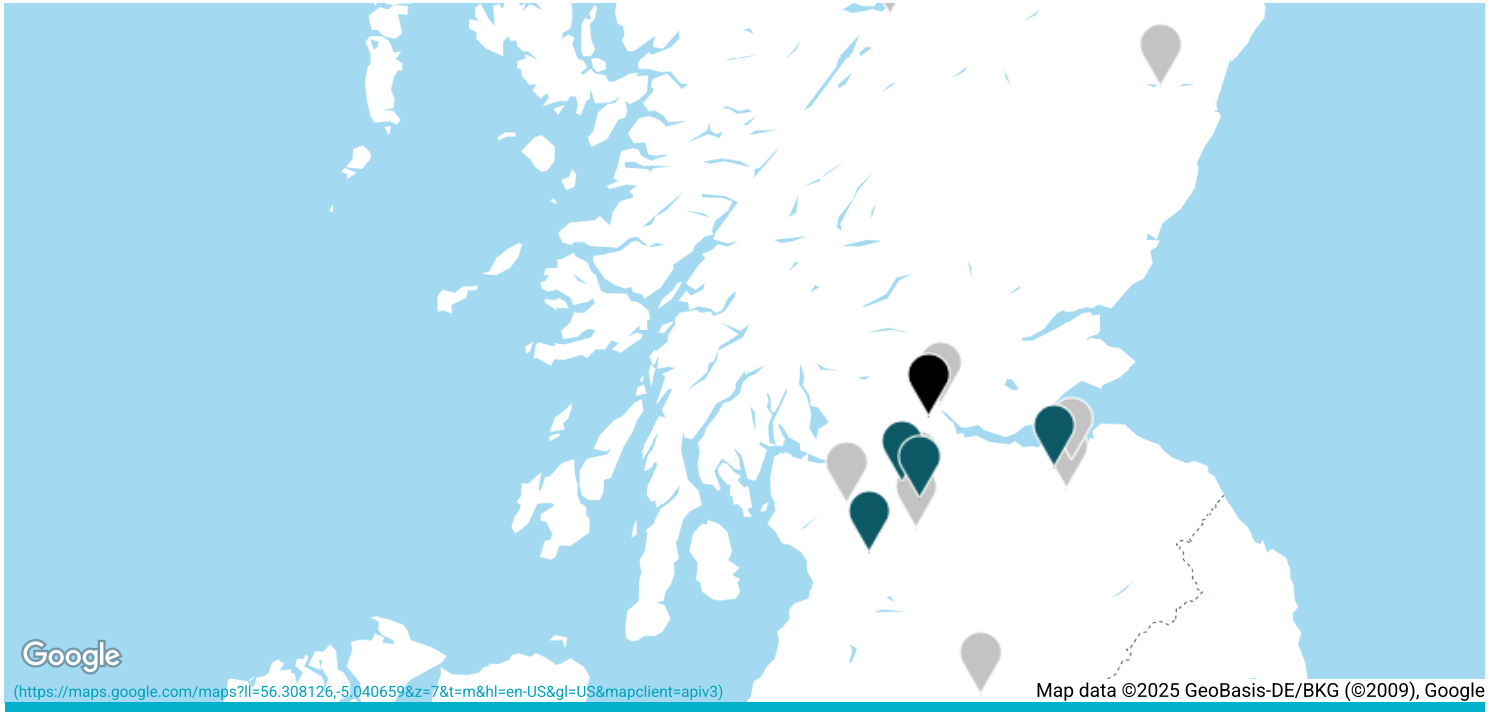




Bannockburn

Bannockburn in Stirling Council is essentially a suburb of Stirling. Its origins go back to the Battle of Bannockburn in 1314. In the 18th and 19th centuries it was a mining area with other manufacturing including textiles, especially tartan.

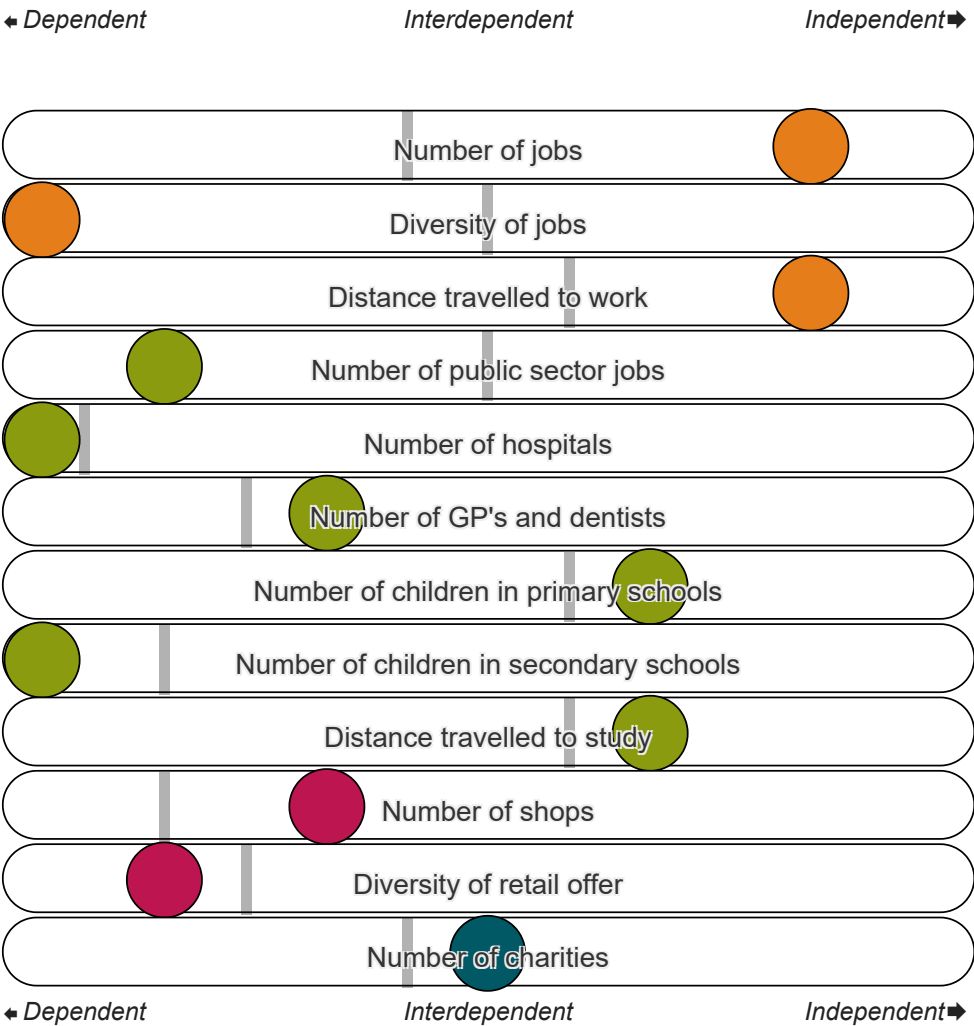
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Bannockburn is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bannockburn is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, and public sector jobs. Bannockburn differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

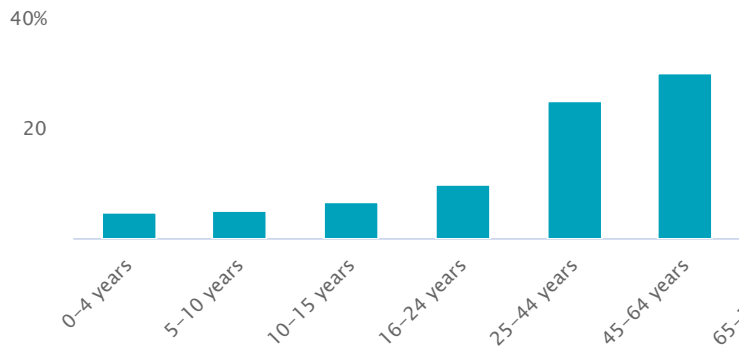

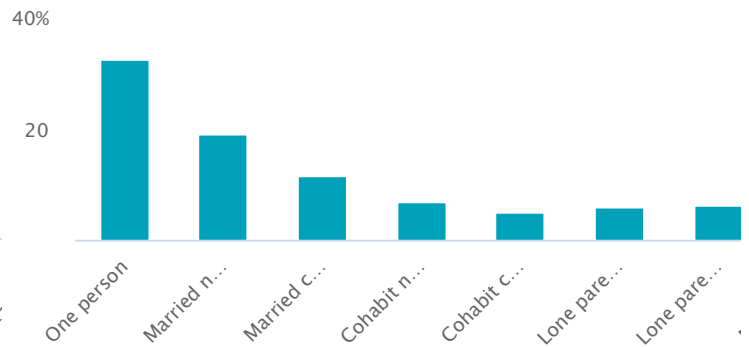

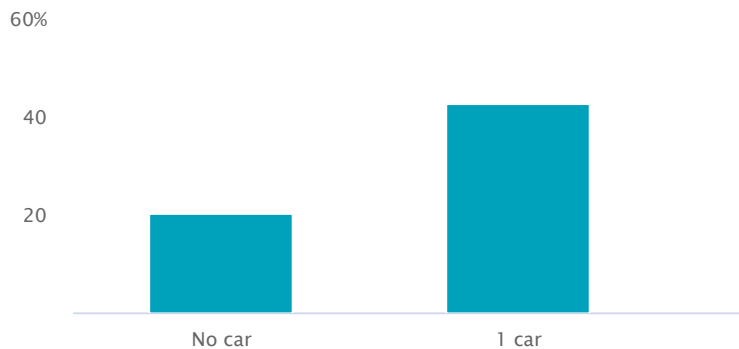

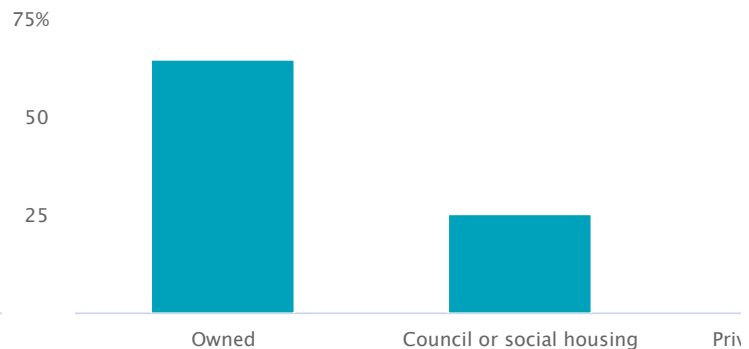

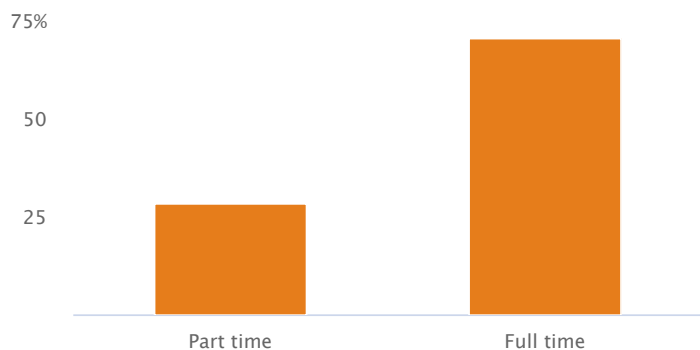

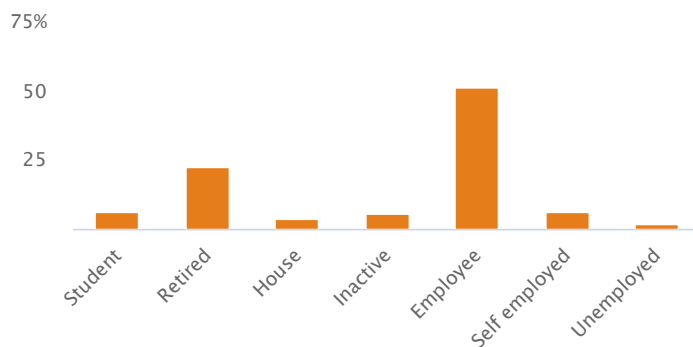
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



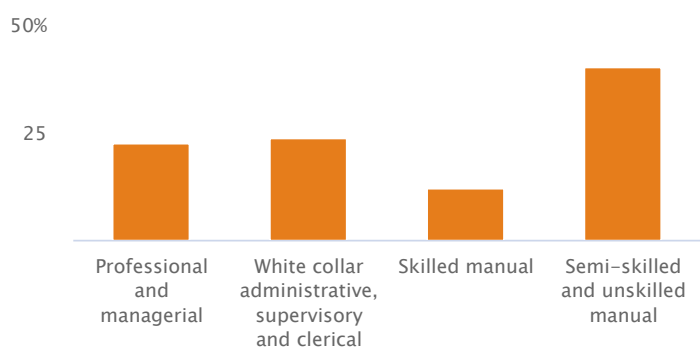
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

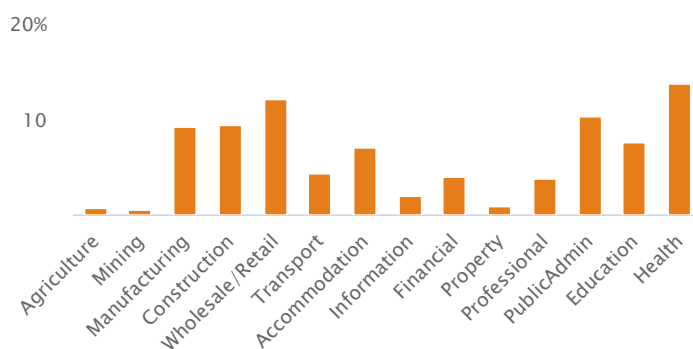

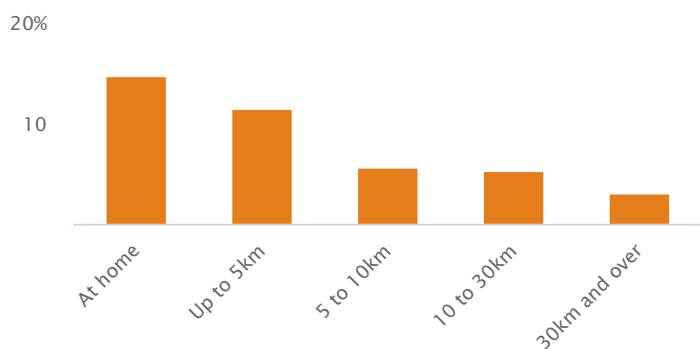
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

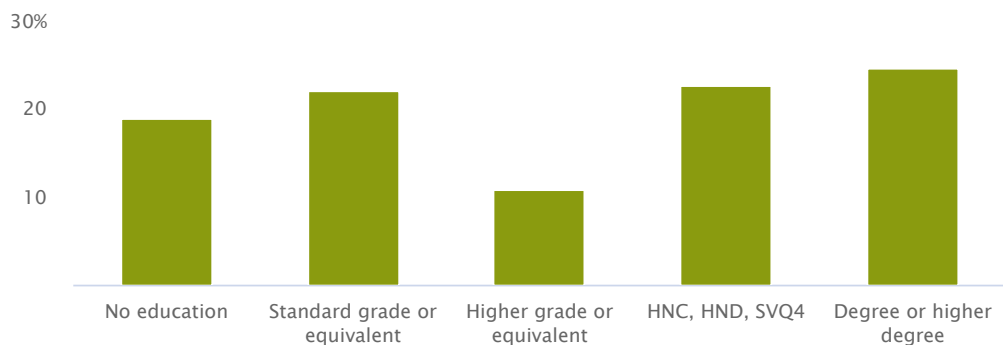


Distance travelled to work

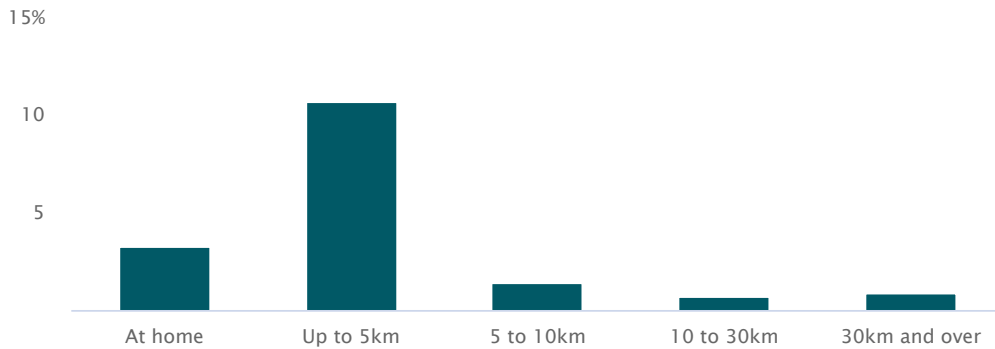
