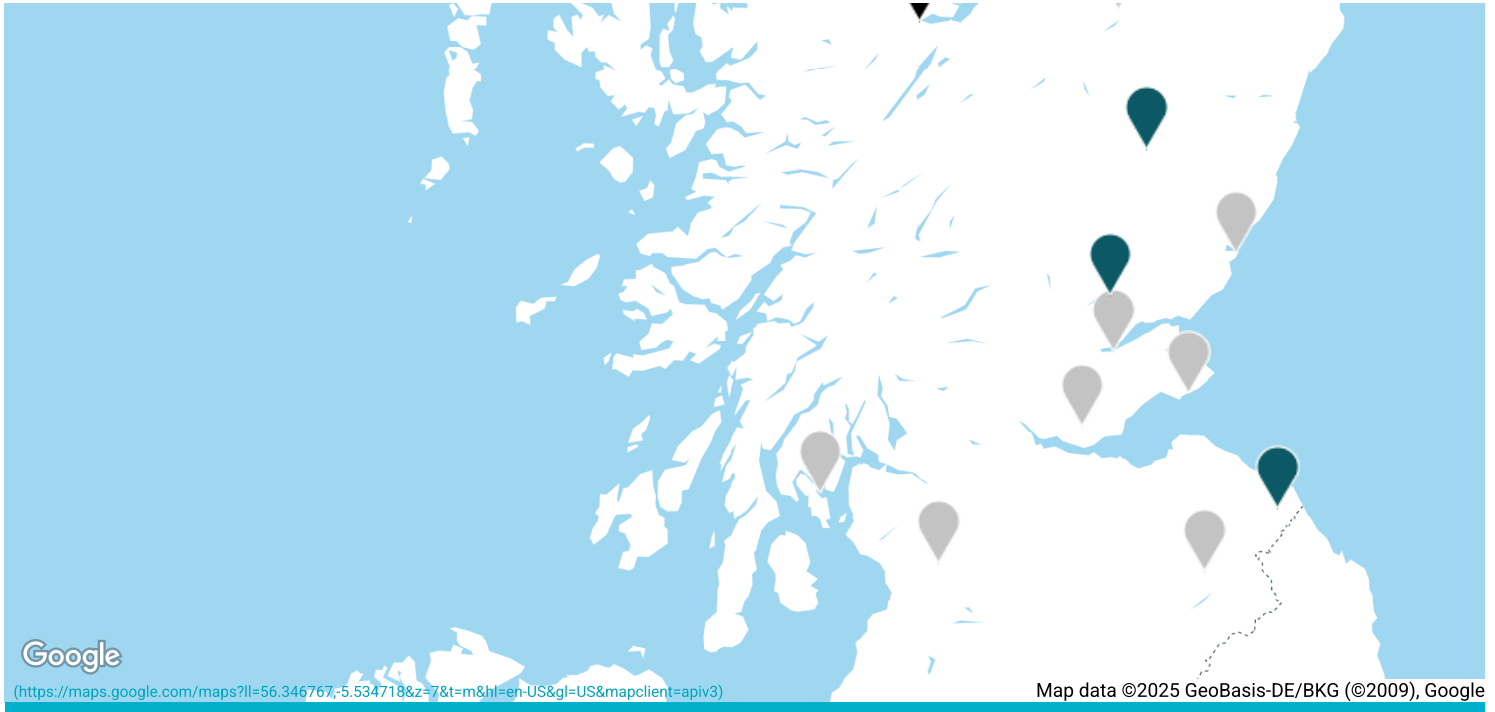




Beaulieu

Beaulieu is in Highland and its name is from the French 'beaulieu'. It was in origin a priory. Today it is a market town and commuter settlement. Situated on the 'North Coast 500 Route' it is increasingly attracting tourists.

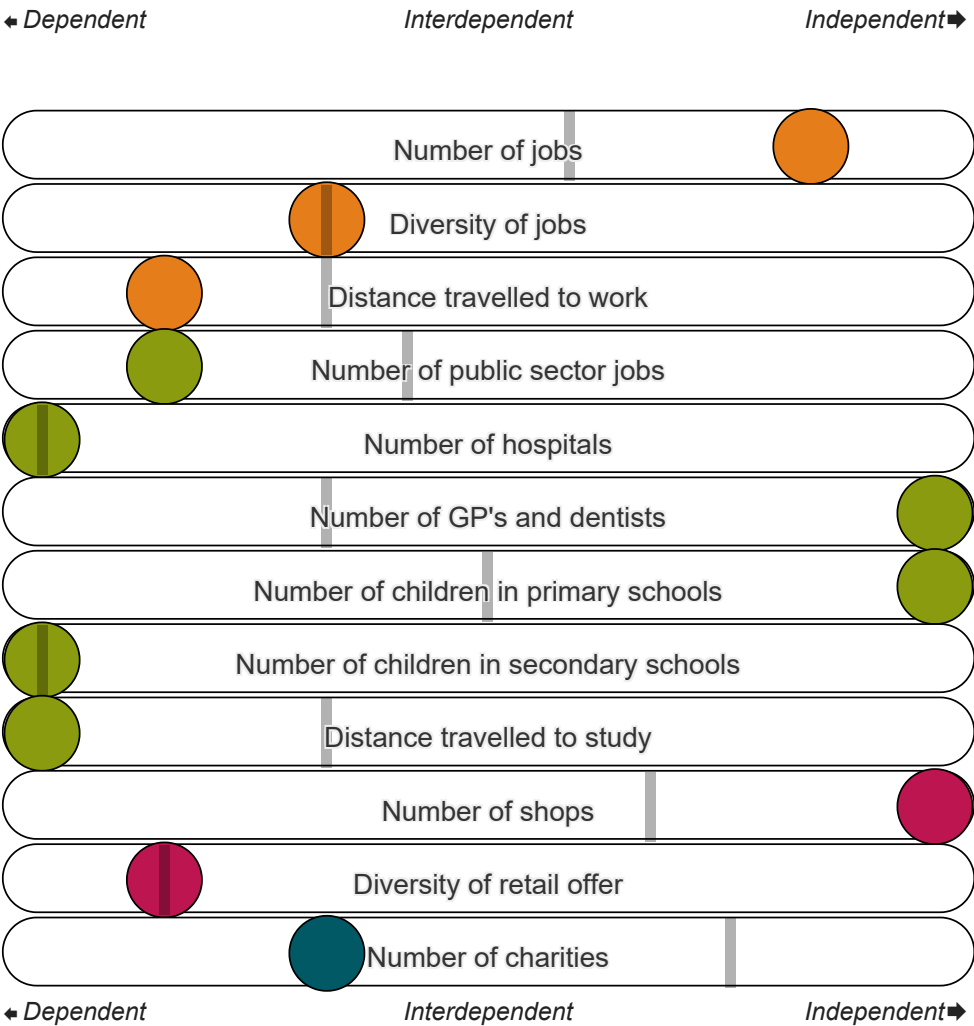
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Beaulieu is an interdependent to dependent town.

Beaully is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Beaully is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists. Beaully differs most from its group in the distance travelled to study.

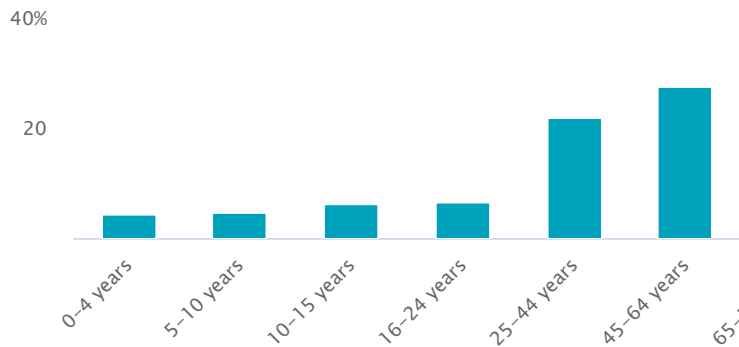

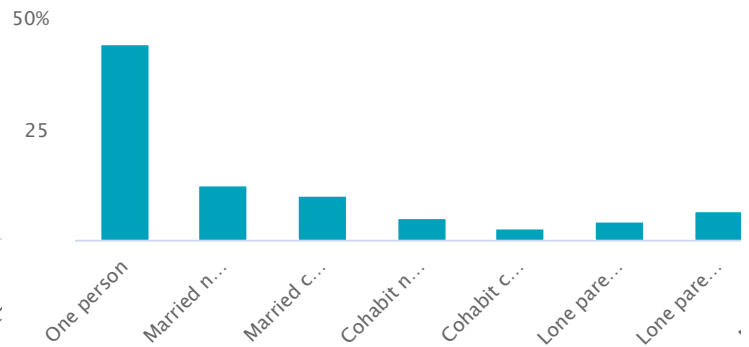

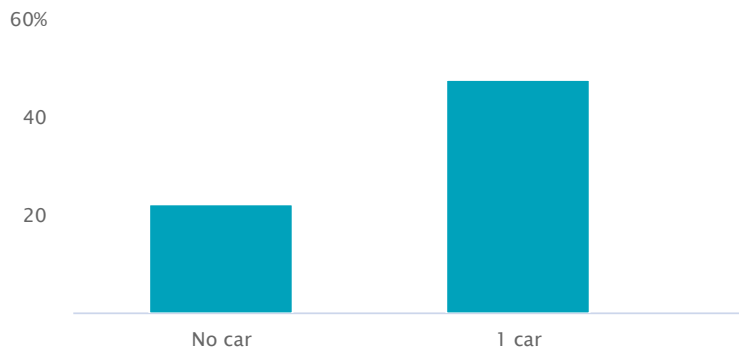

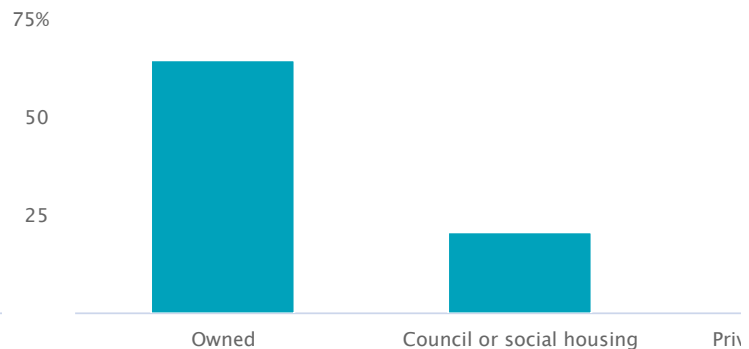
Household composition

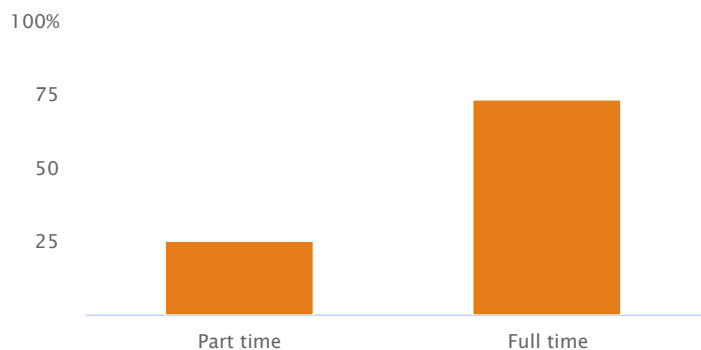

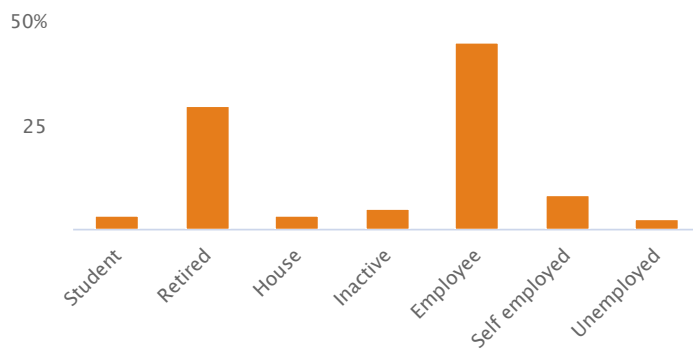
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



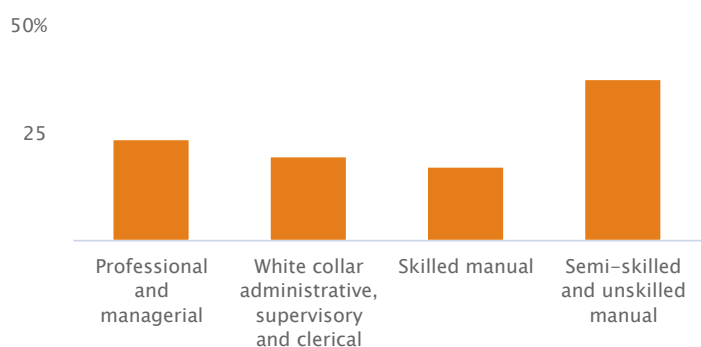
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

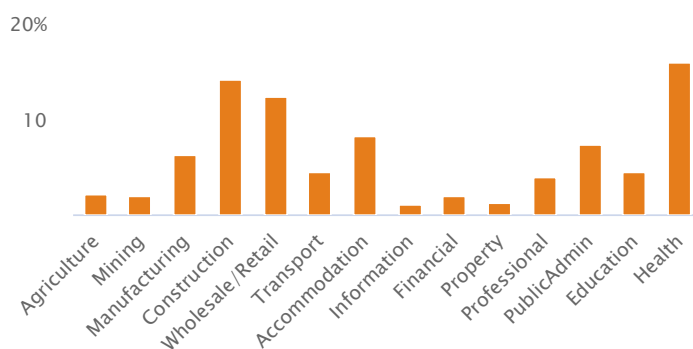


Social Grade

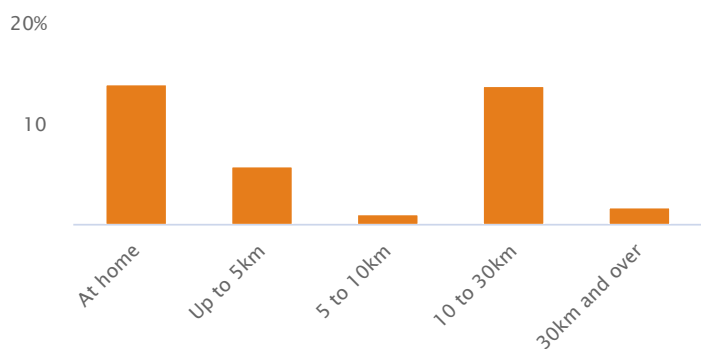
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

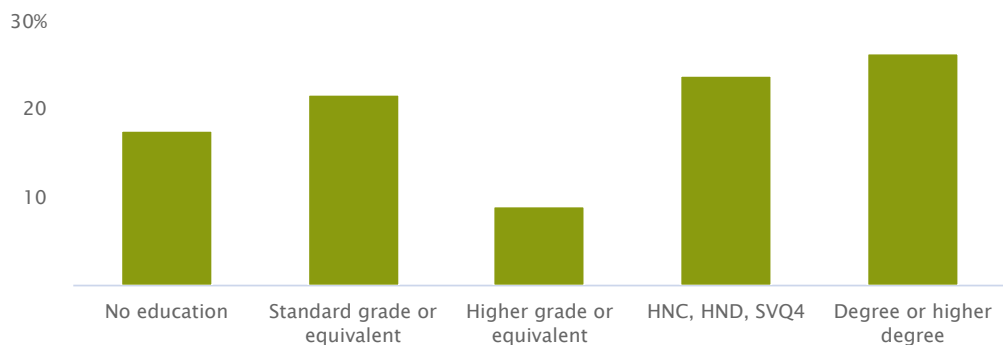


Distance travelled to work

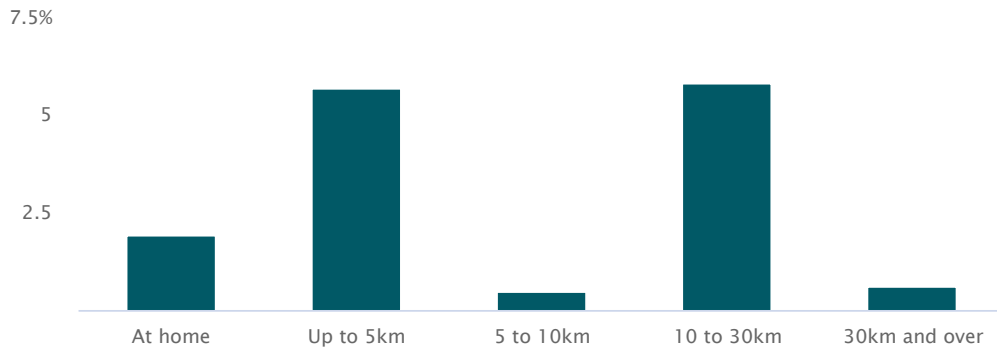
