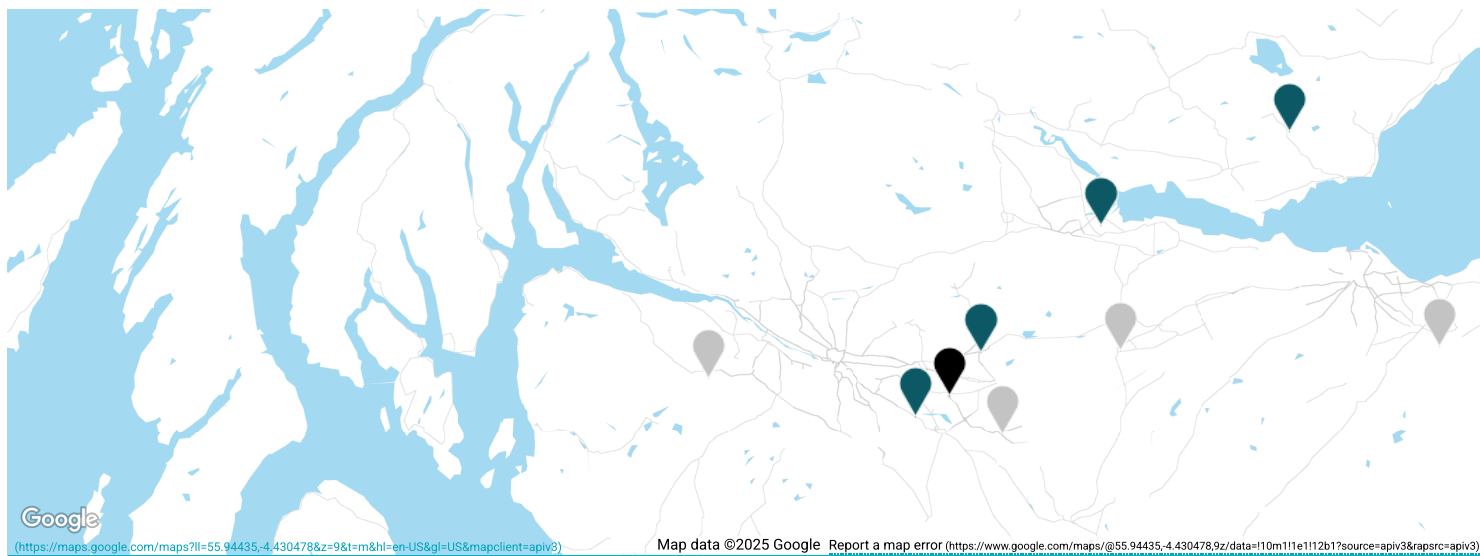




Bellshill

NORTH LANARKSHIRE

POPULATION **19,500**

Bellshill in North Lanarkshire is an industrial town. Originally a weaving centre this trade declined with the commercialisation of the industry. Mining became important but has since closed. In the 19th century iron and steel were produced. There are still light industries and manufacturing in Bellshill with three industrial estates - Bellshill Industrial Estate, Righead Industrial Estate and Strathclyde Business Park.

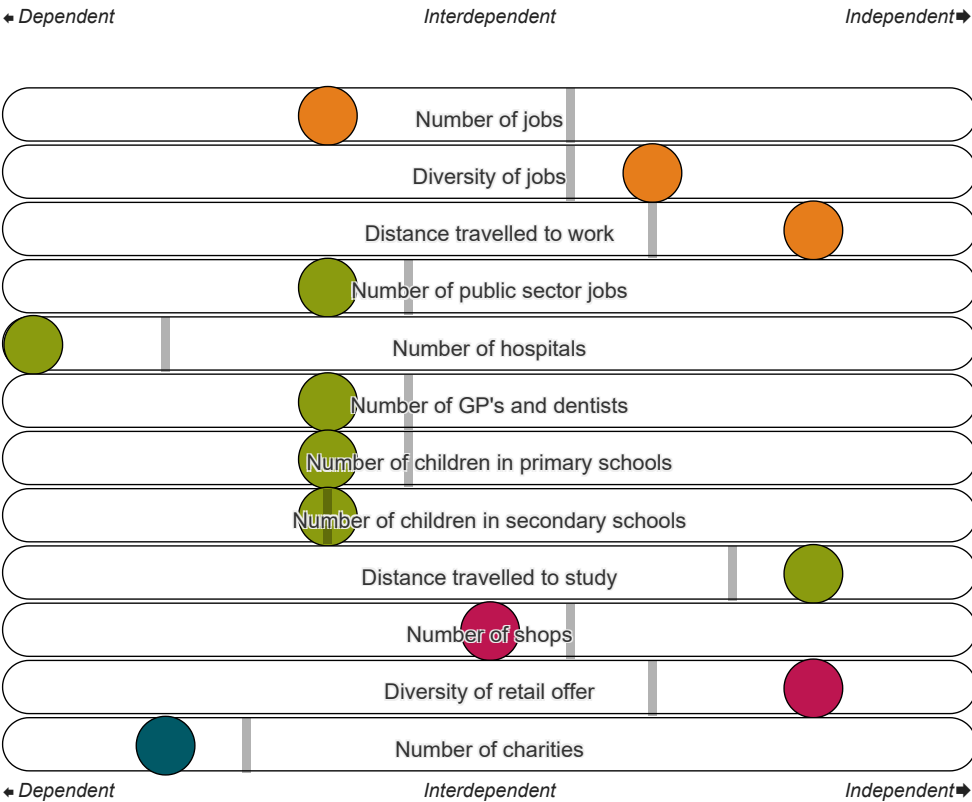
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Bellshill is an interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Airdrie](#), [Blantyre](#), [Cowdenbeath](#) and [Lumphinnans](#), and [Grangemouth](#).

Inter-relationships



Bellshill is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bellshill is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

Bellshill differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

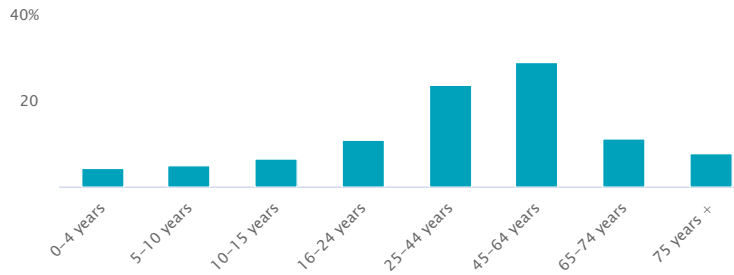

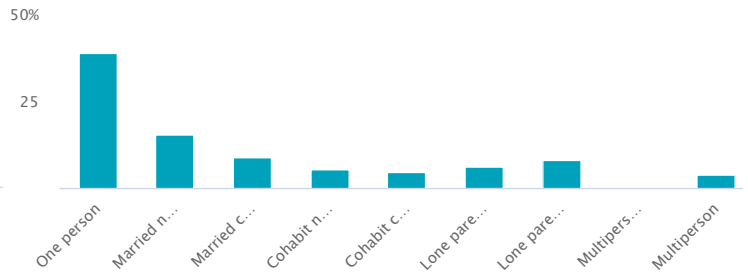

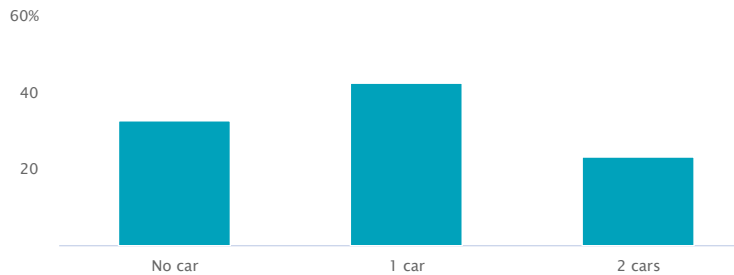

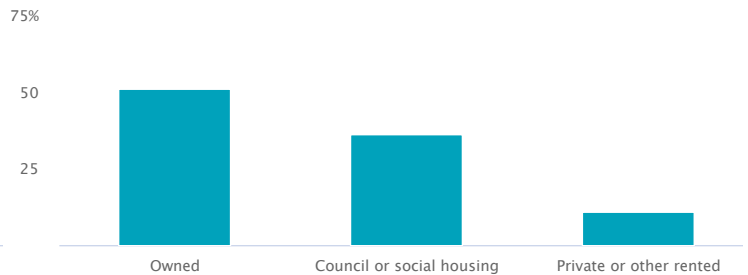
Household composition

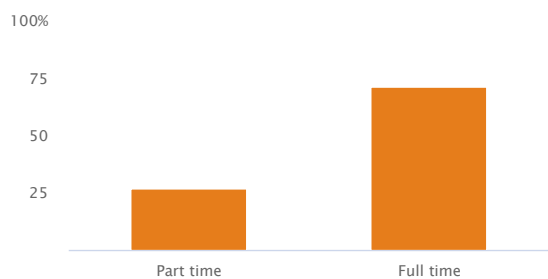

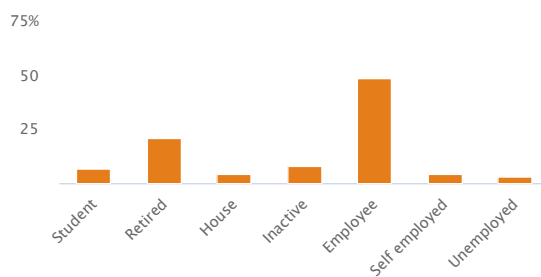
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



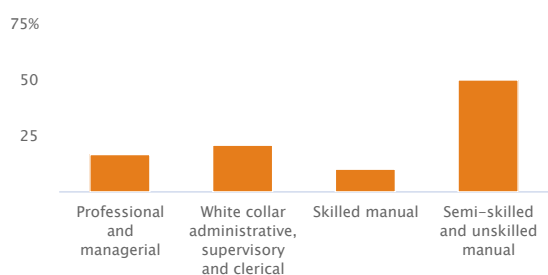
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

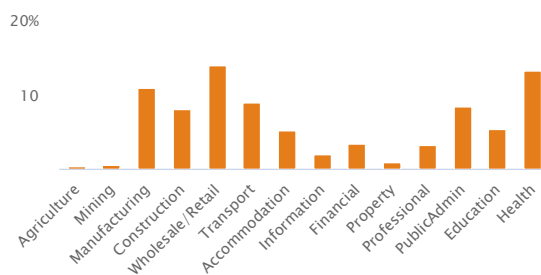

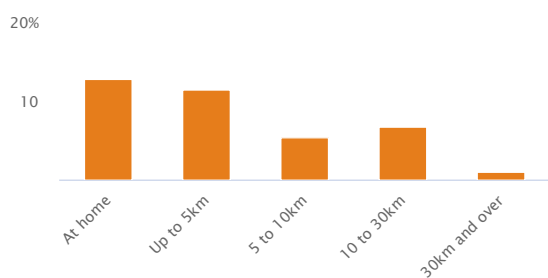
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

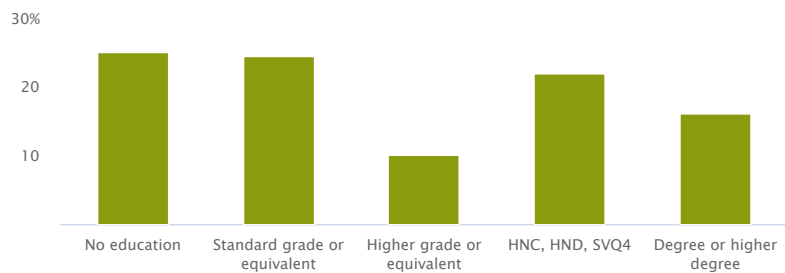


Distance travelled to work

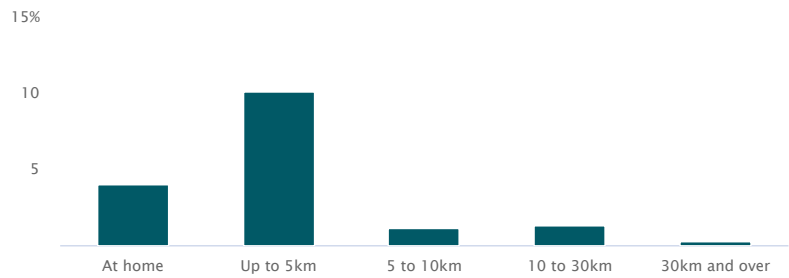
