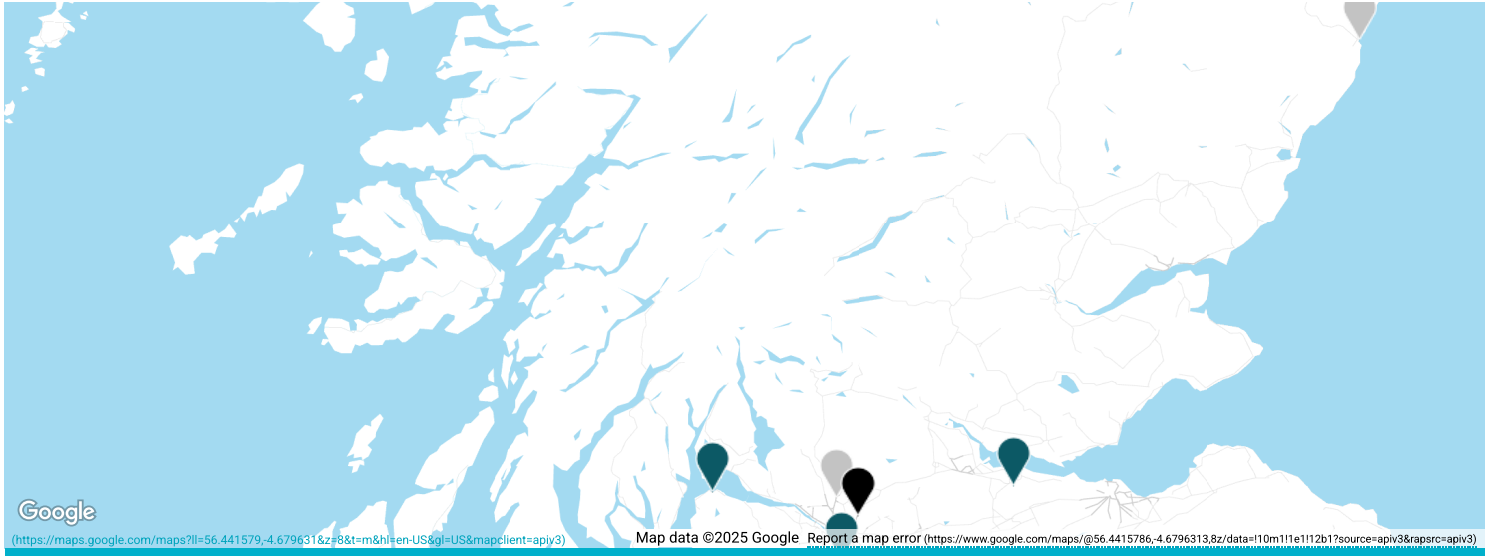




Bishopbriggs

Bishopbriggs in East Dunbartonshire is a suburb of Glasgow. Its growth from a tiny hamlet in the 17th century has largely reflected the expansion of Glasgow, particularly in the 20th century. It maintained a business profile with the Infant Formula production, Blackies/Collins publishing, Wimpey construction and others. There are still local service companies.

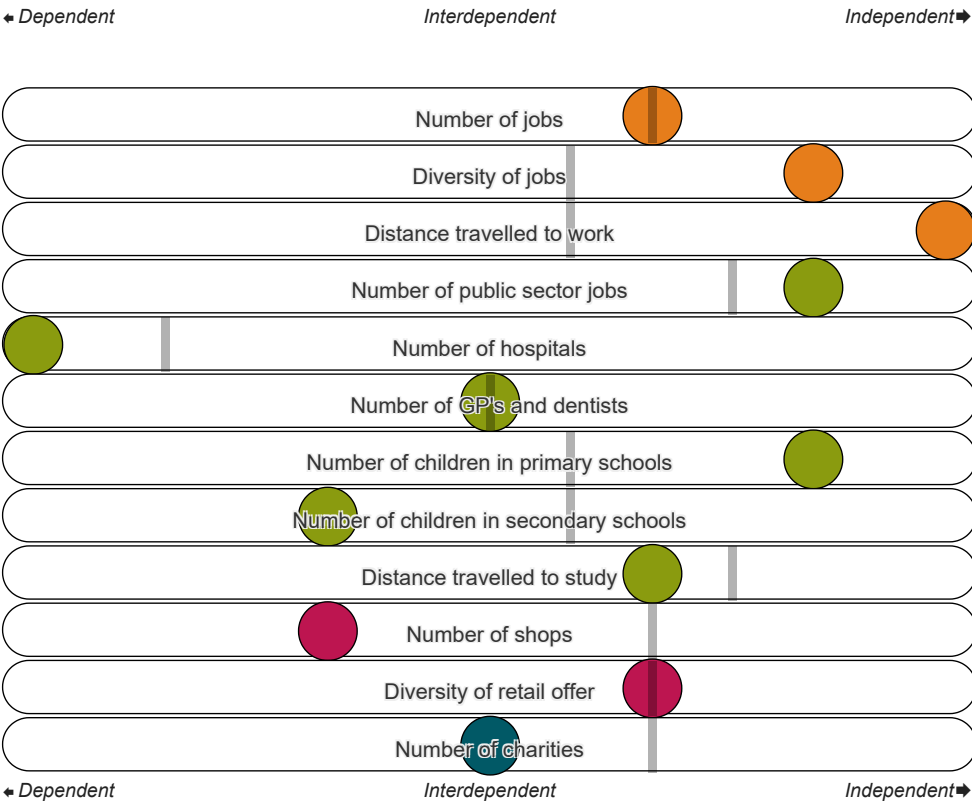
In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Bishopbriggs is an interdependent to independent town.

Its most similar towns are [Ellon](#), [Giffnock](#), [Gourock](#), and [Linlithgow](#).

Inter-relationships



Bishopbriggs is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bishopbriggs is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, jobs, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Bishopbriggs differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools, and shops.

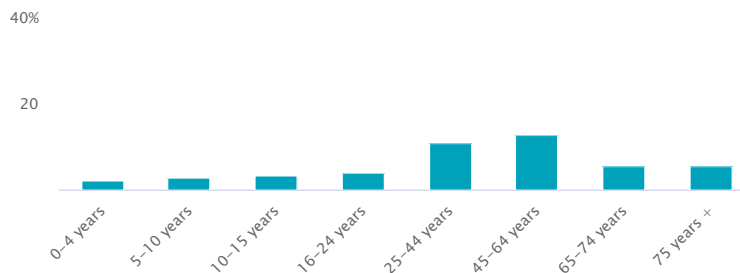

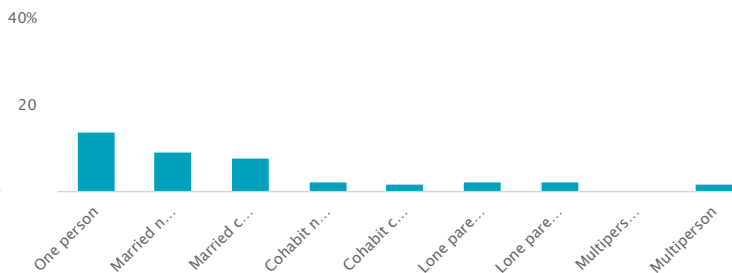

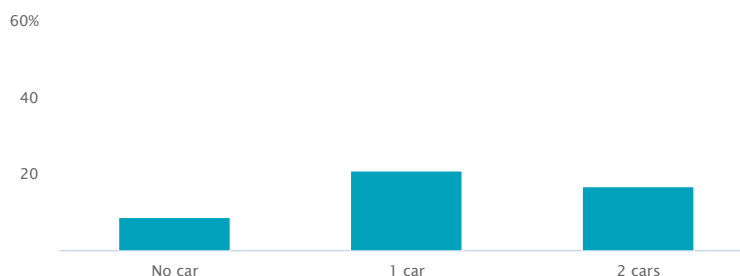

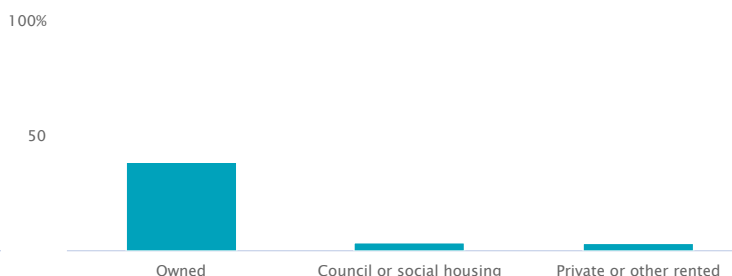

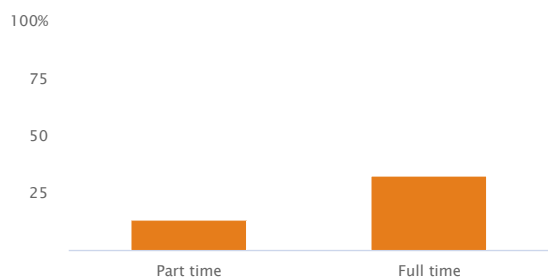

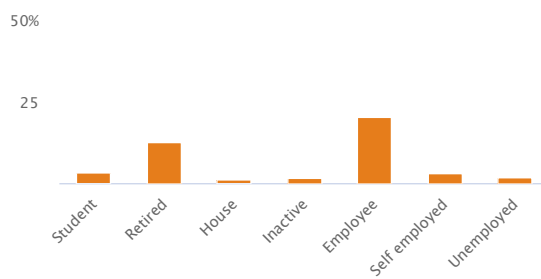
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



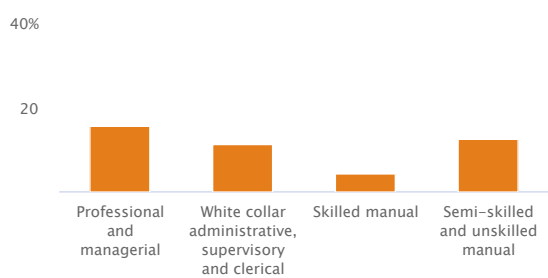
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

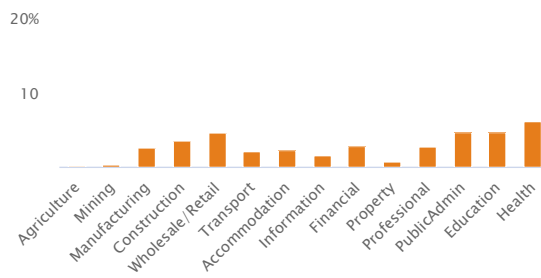


Social Grade

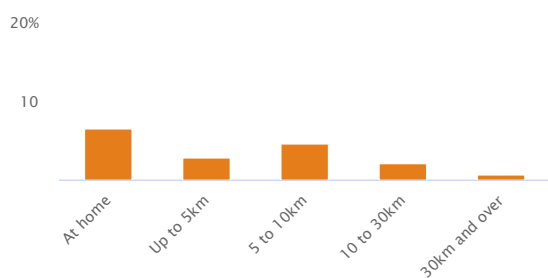
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

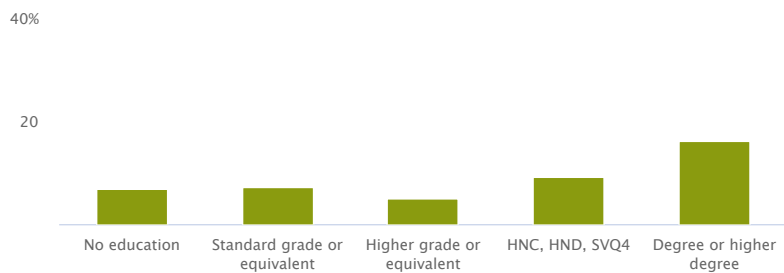


Distance travelled to work

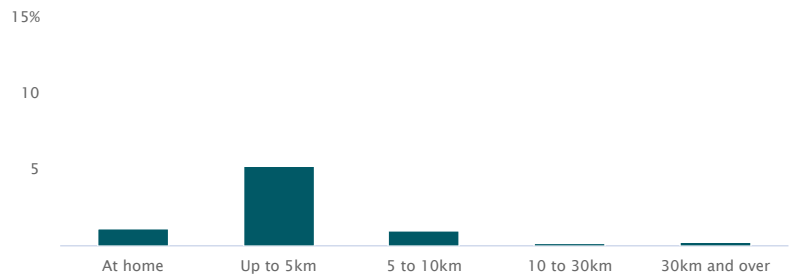
