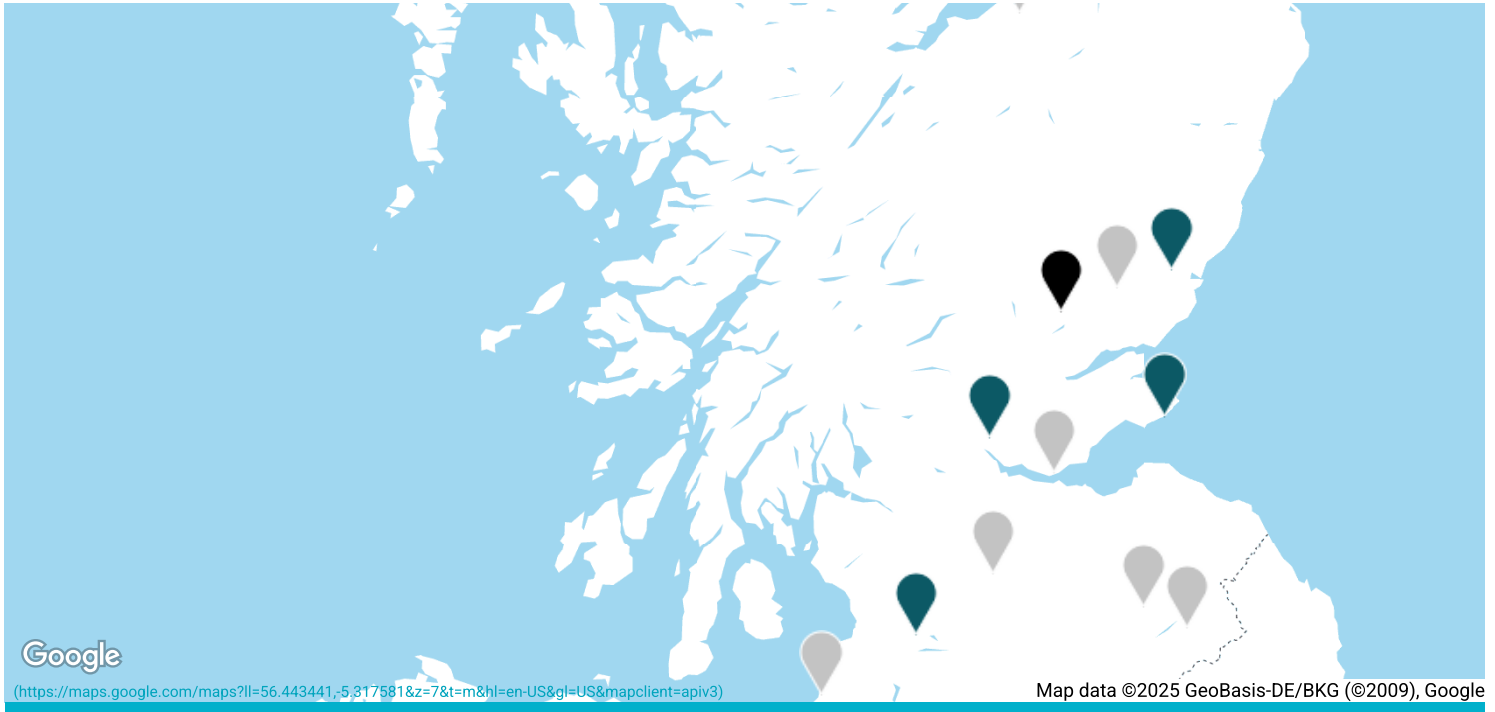




Blairgowrie

Blairgowrie in Perth and Kinross is the gateway to Glenshee. The river afforded opportunities for textile mills in the past. It is important as a soft fruit growing centre and the town acts as a service centre for the local agricultural community.

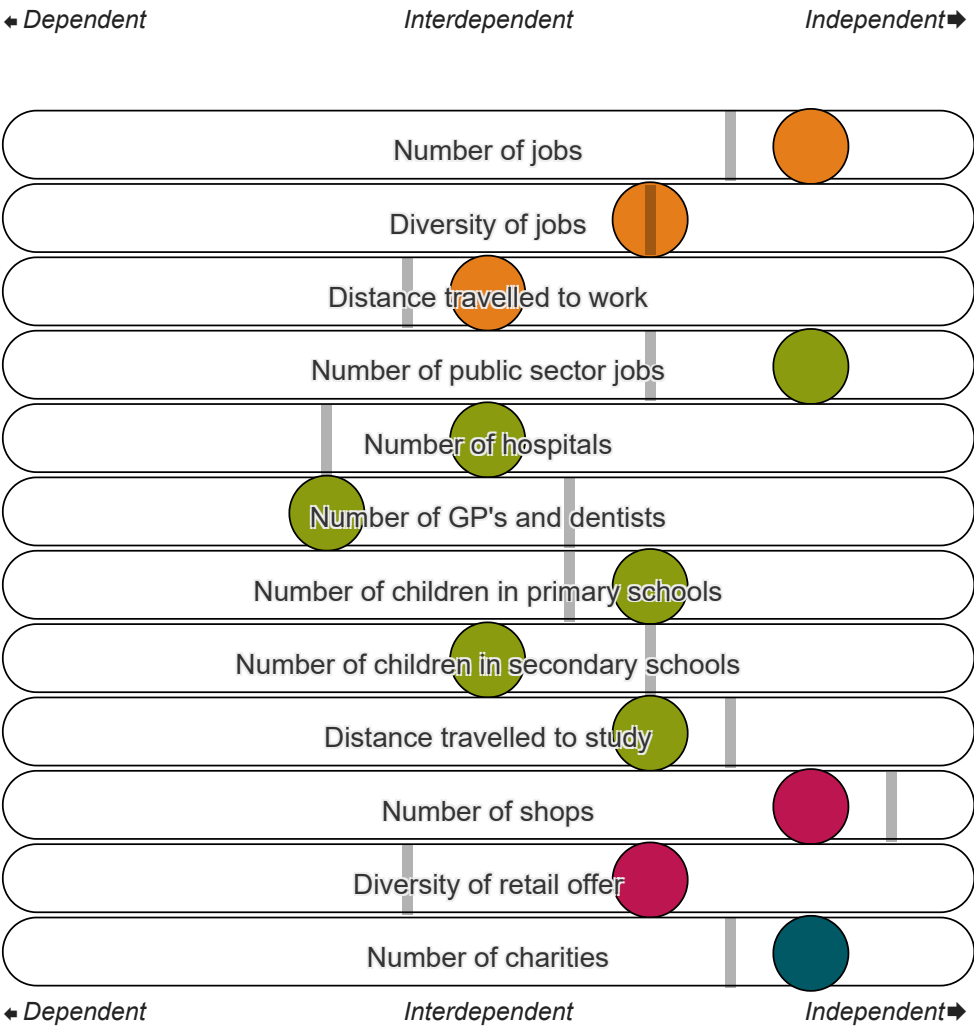
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Blairgowrie is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Blairgowrie is grouped with 11 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

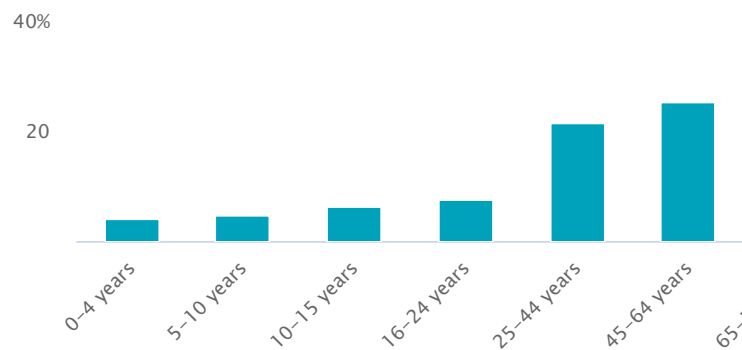

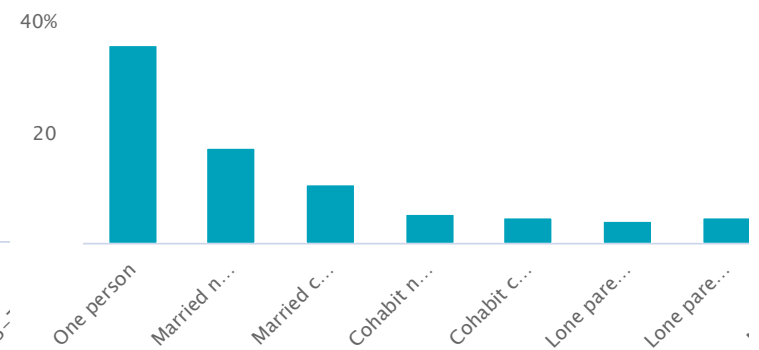

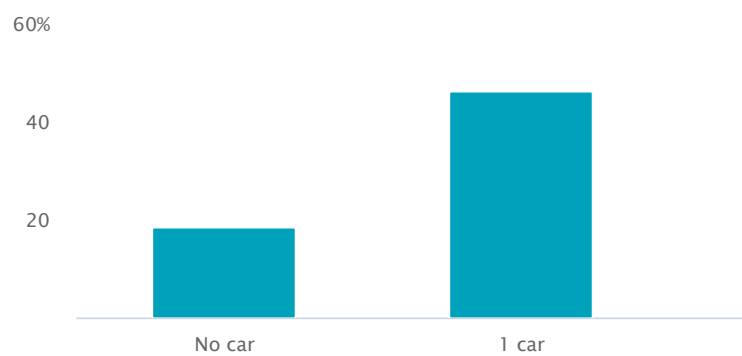

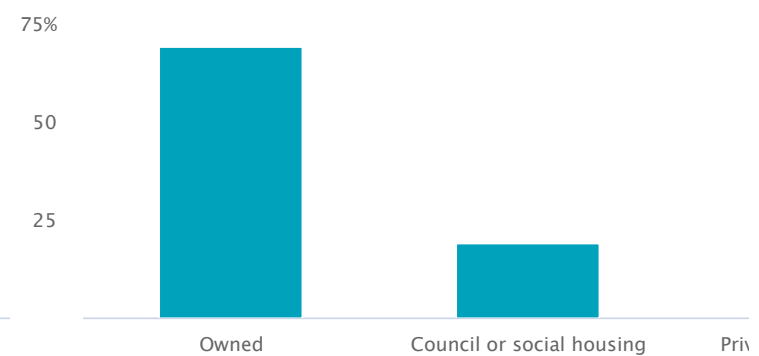

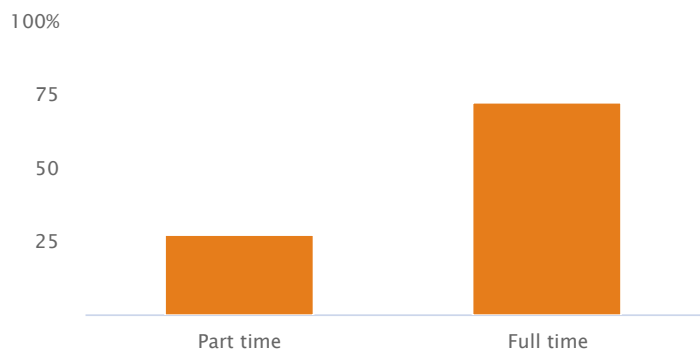

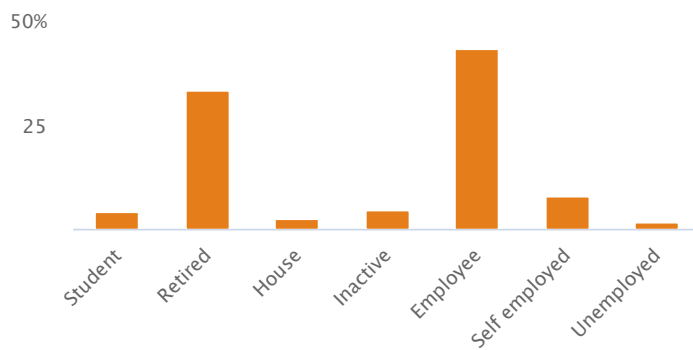
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



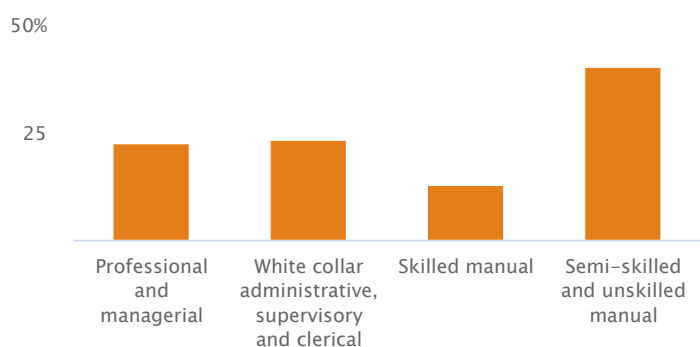
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

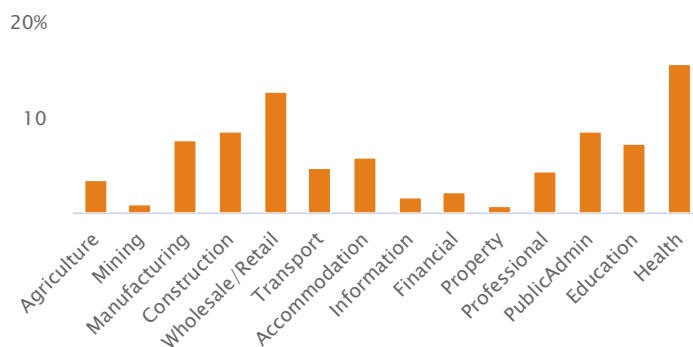

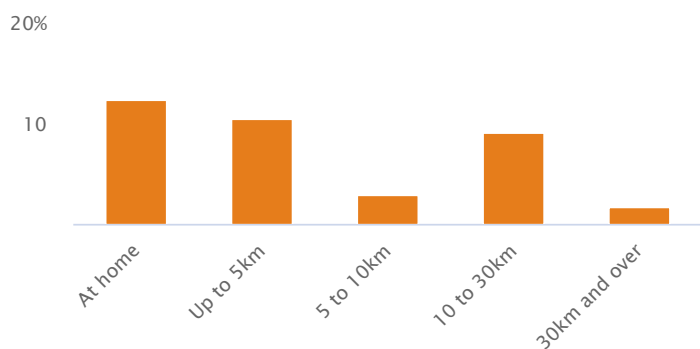
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

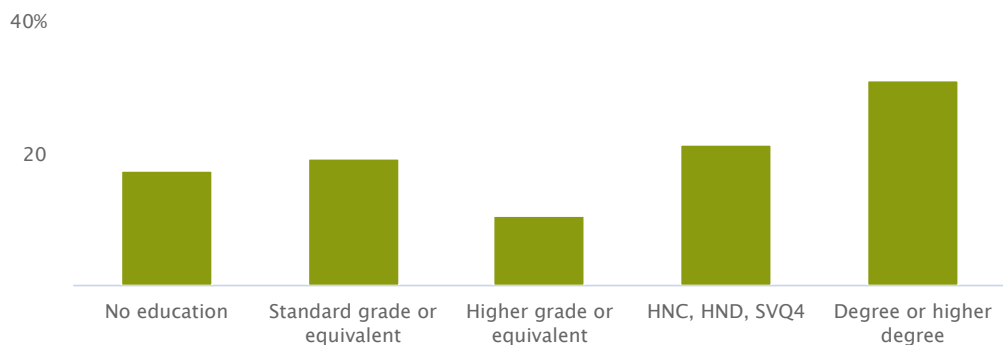


Distance travelled to work

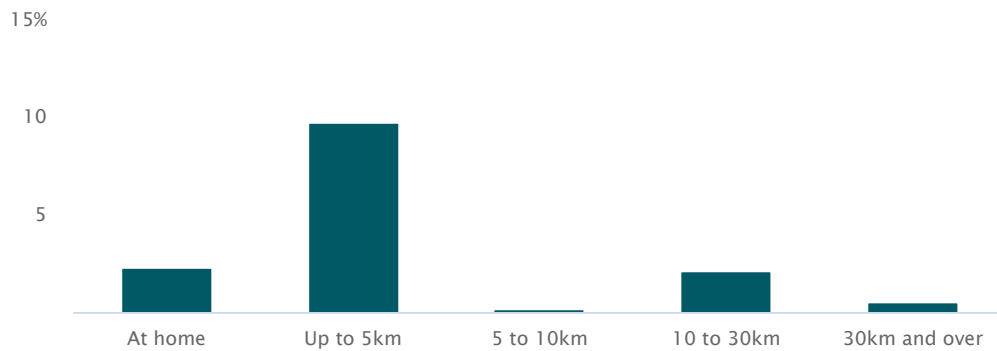
