Bonhill in West Dunbartonshire in the Vale of Leven, was like the neighbouring towns known historically for bleaching, dyeing and textiles and very particularly for the Dalmonach works specialising in textile printing and finishing. The Glasgow overspill programme resulted in the building of public housing in Bonhill. Some regeneration of the old industrial landscape has taken place.

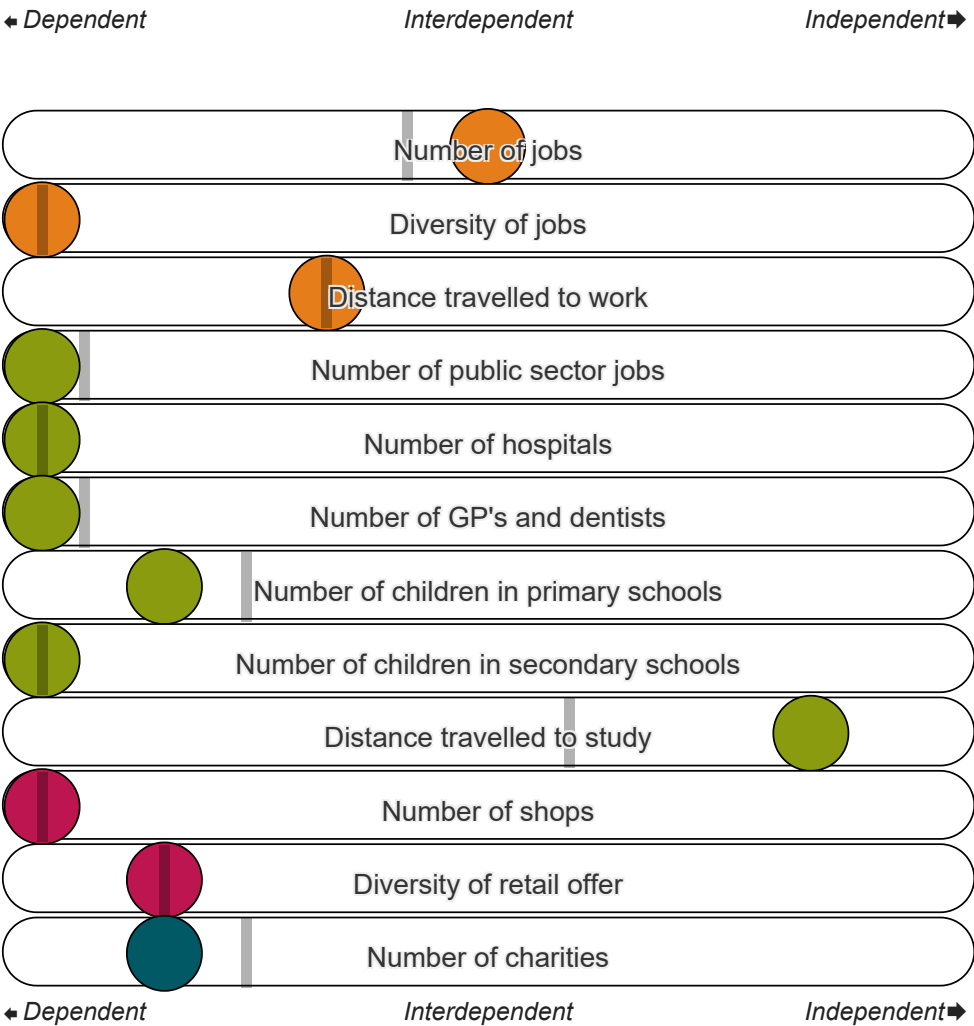
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Bonhill is a **dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bonhill is grouped with 1 other town. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

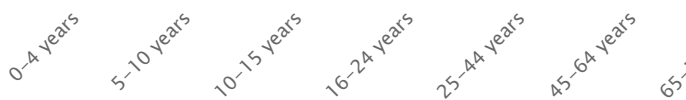

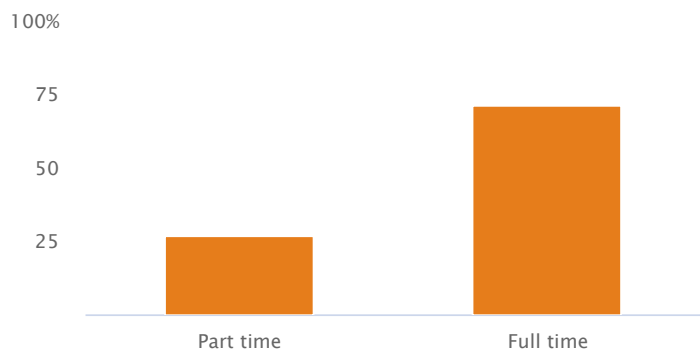

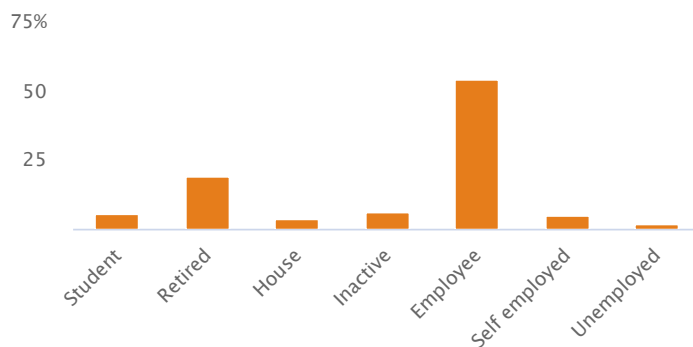
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



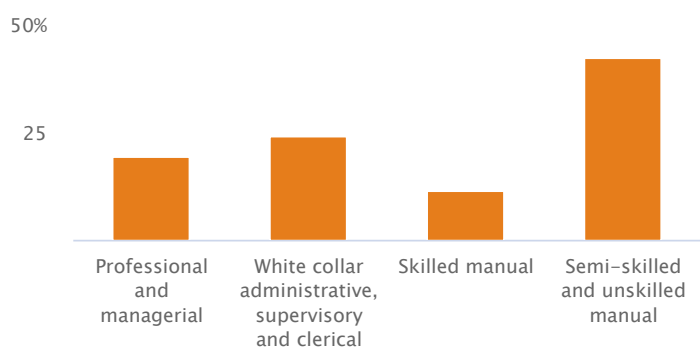
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

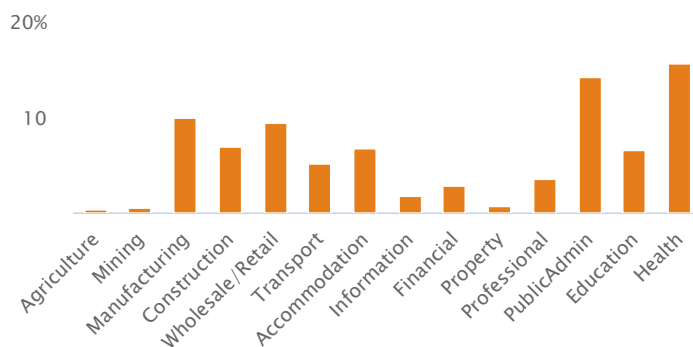


Social Grade

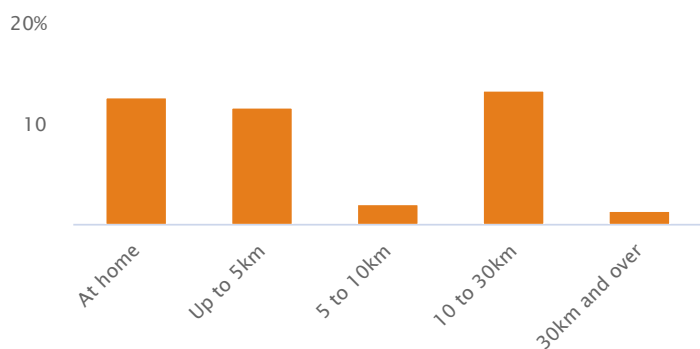
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

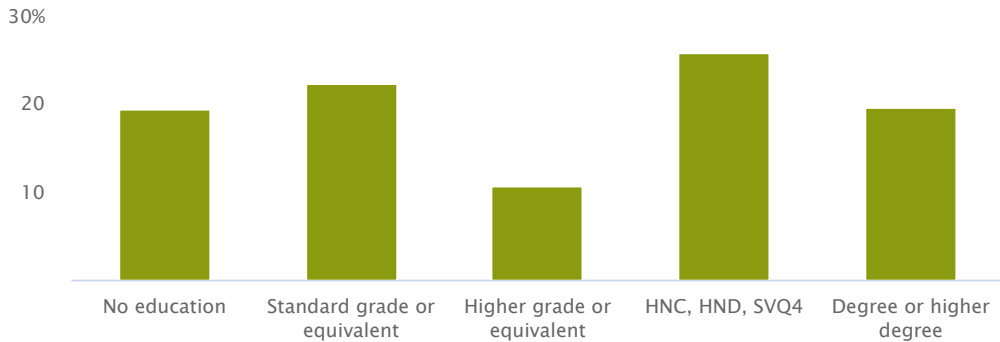


Distance travelled to work

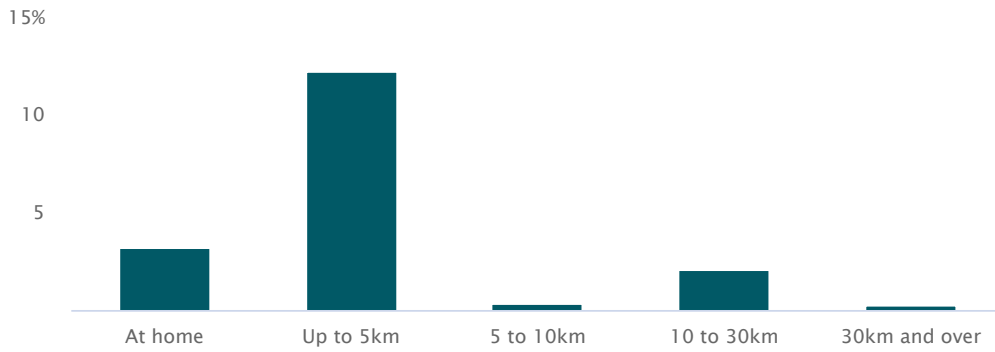
