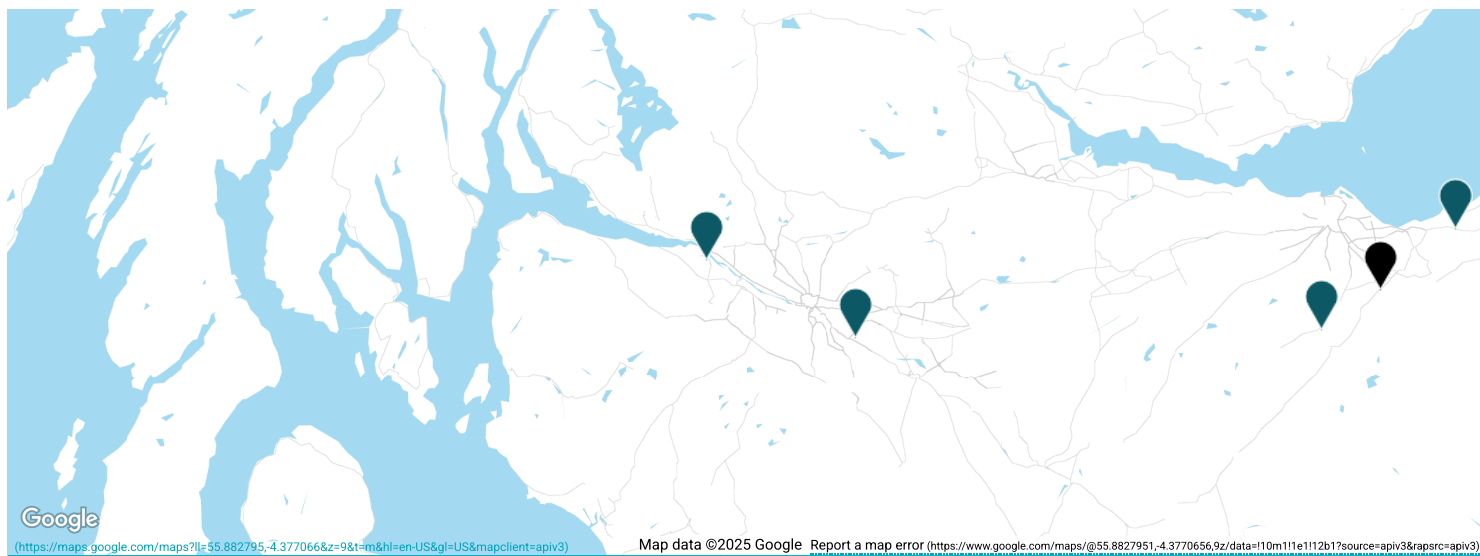




Bonnyrigg

Bonnyrigg is in Midlothian. It developed as a mining village. It retained a manufacturing base in the 20th century and there are still service (e.g. laundry, environmental services) and production companies (brewing, maps, flooring) operating in the town.

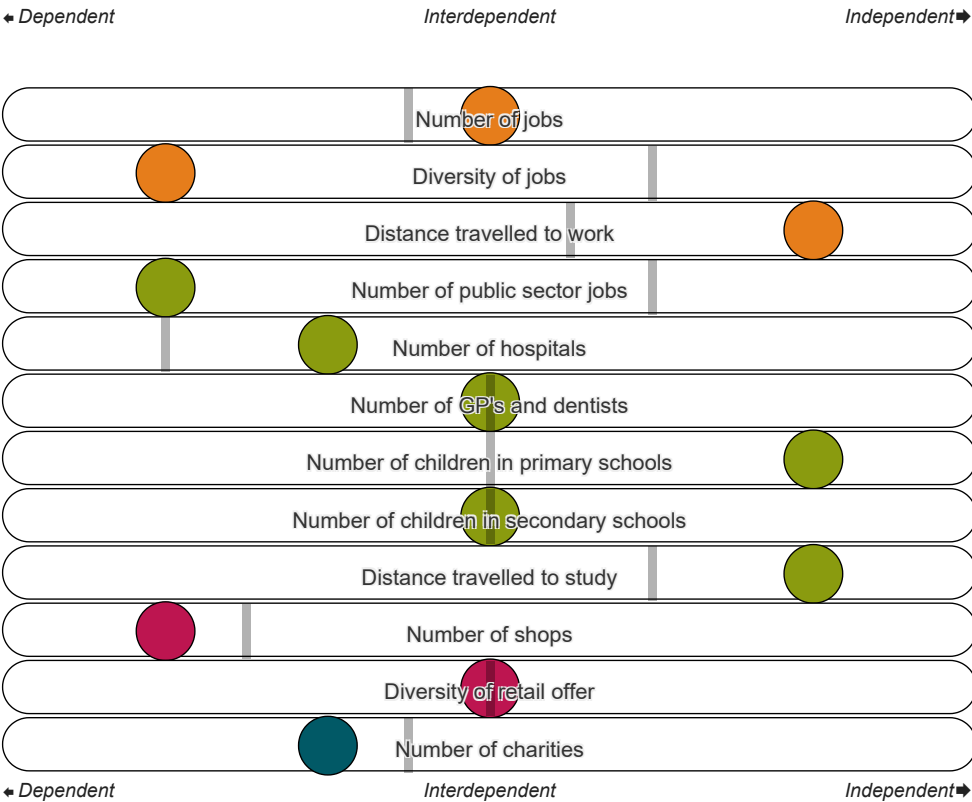
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Bonnyrigg is an interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Cambuslang](#), [Erskine](#), [Penicuik](#), and [Tranent](#).

Inter-relationships



Bonnyrigg is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bonnyrigg is grouped with 4 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. Bonnyrigg differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

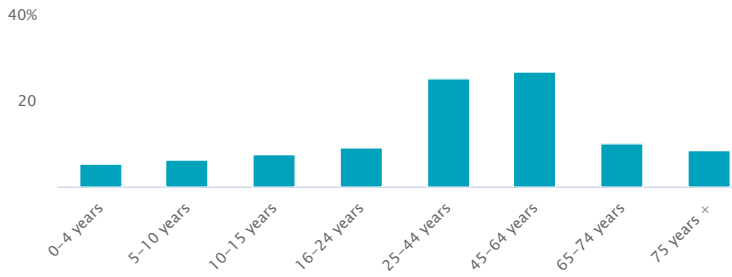

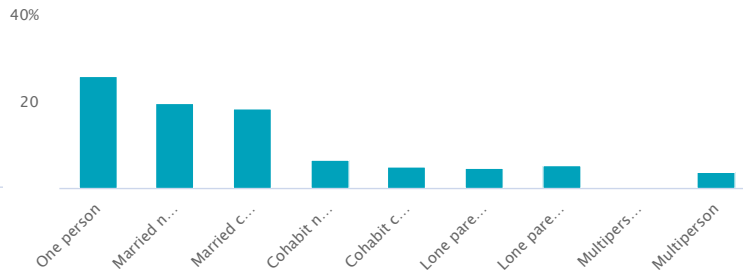

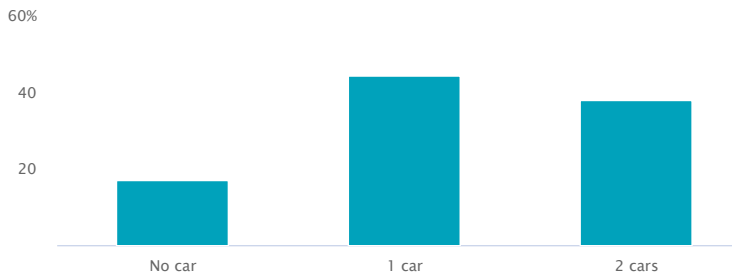

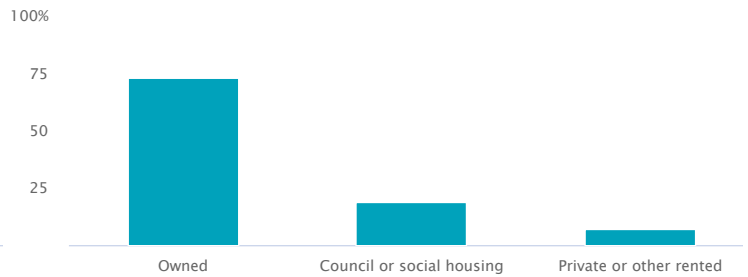

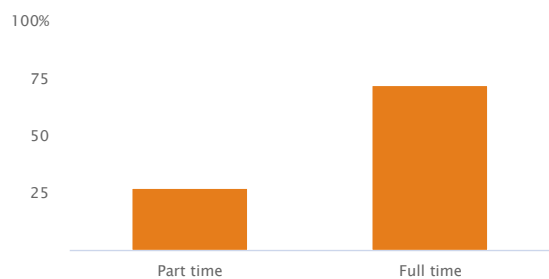

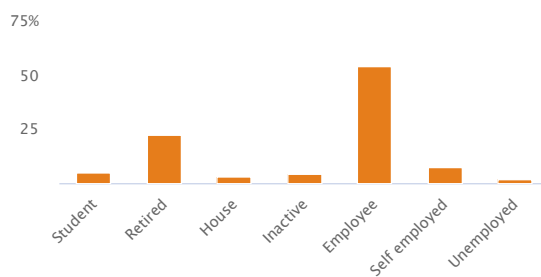
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



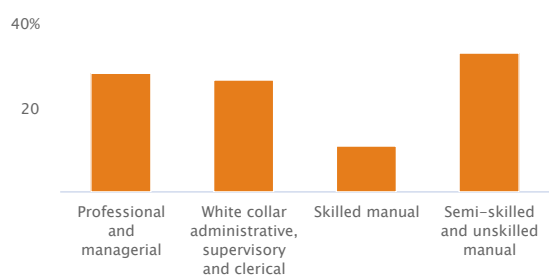
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

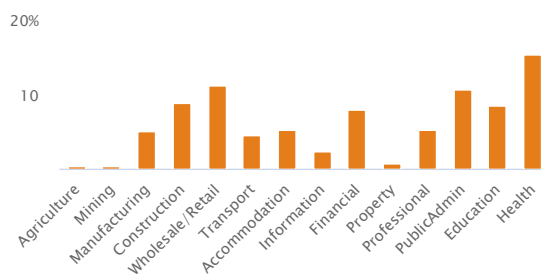

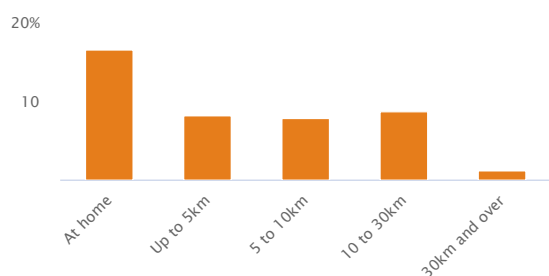
(% households aged 16-64)



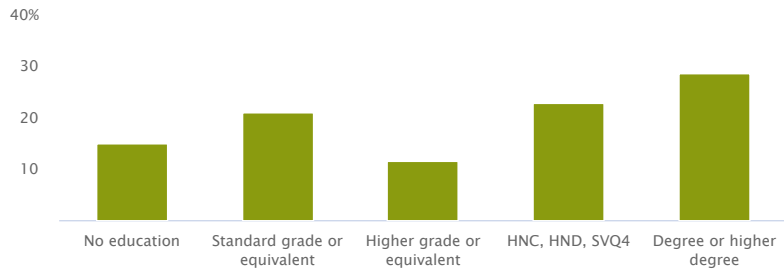
Sector Diversity

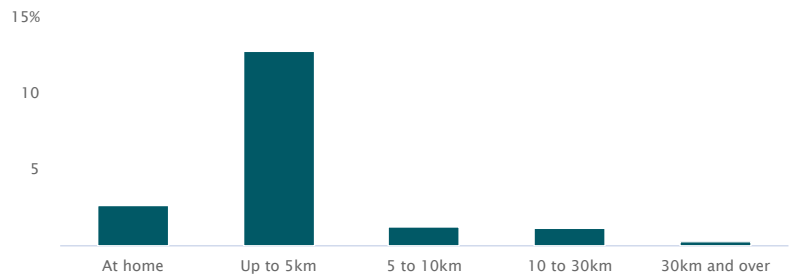
