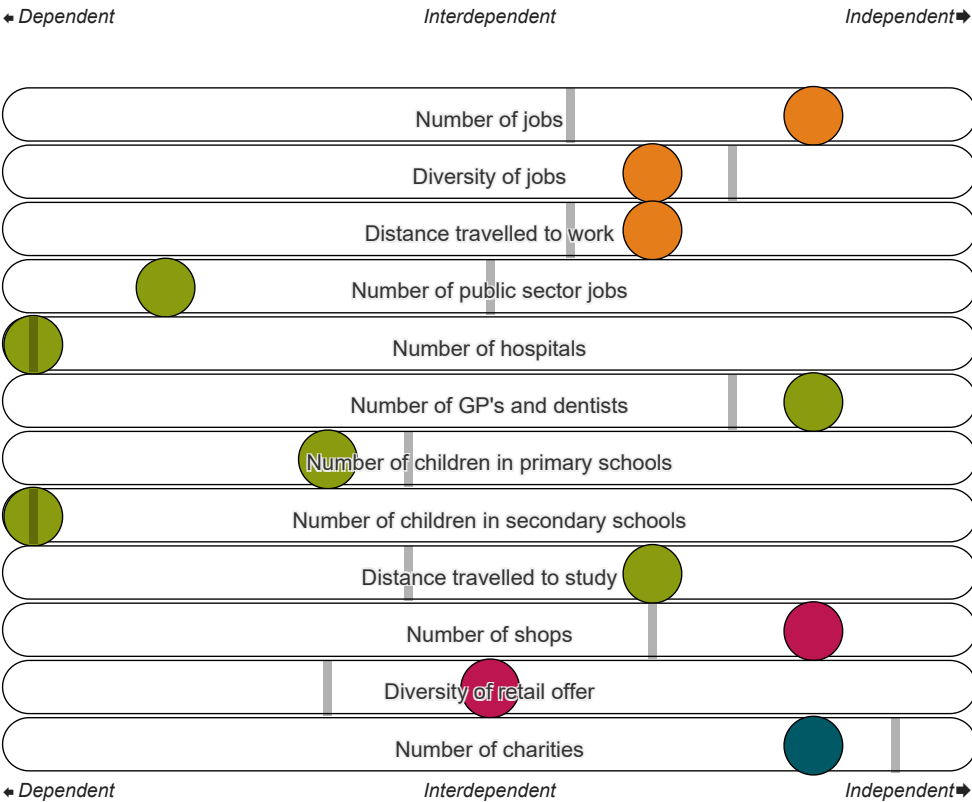
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Bridge of Allan is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bridge of Allan is grouped with 2 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

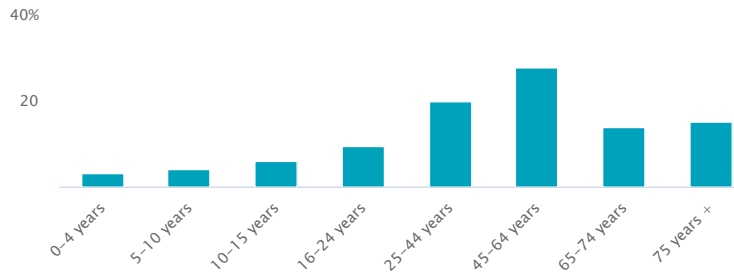

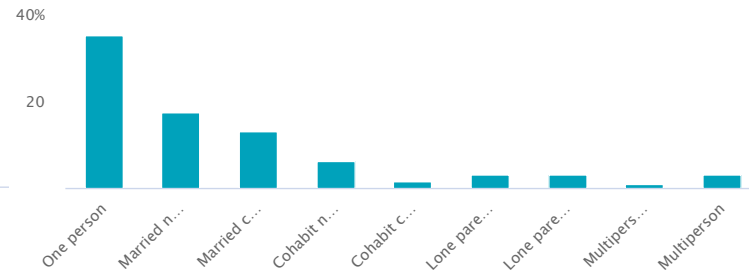

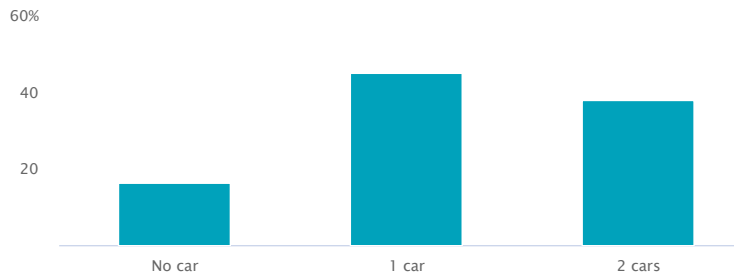

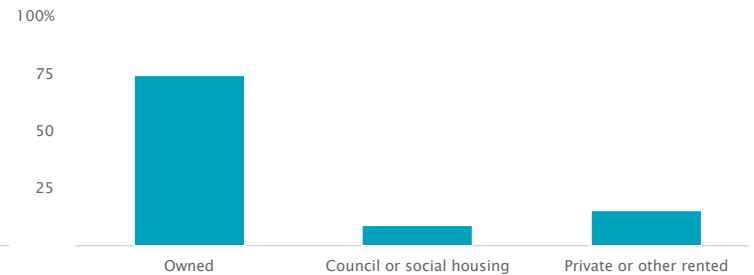

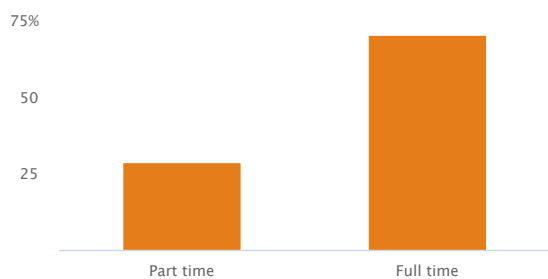

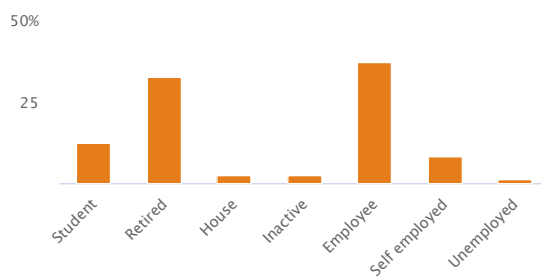
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



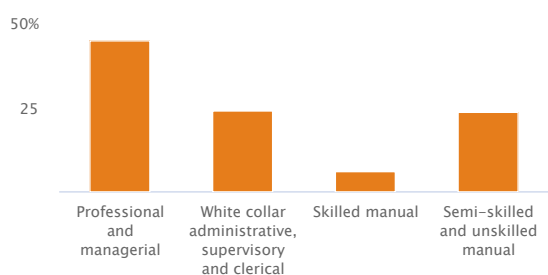
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

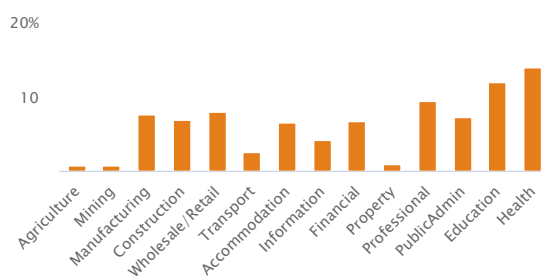


Social Grade

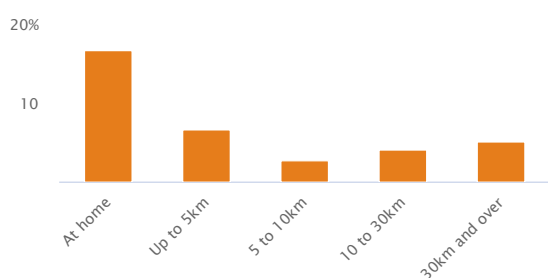
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

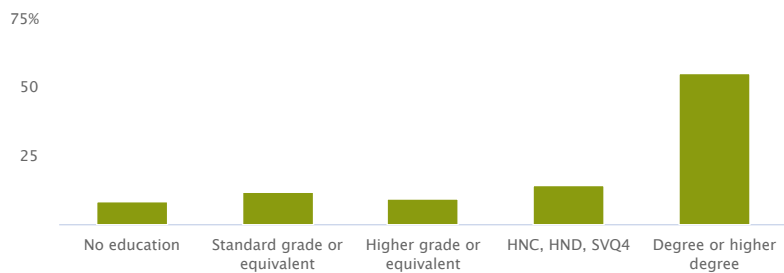


Distance travelled to work

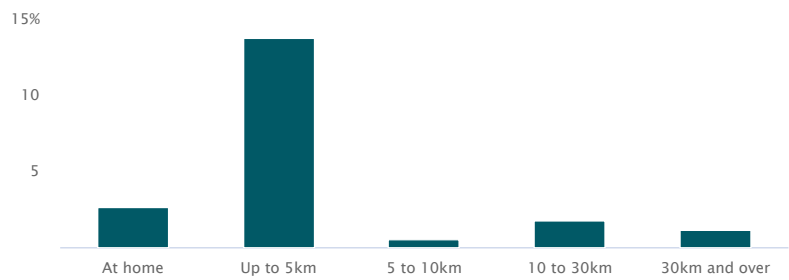
