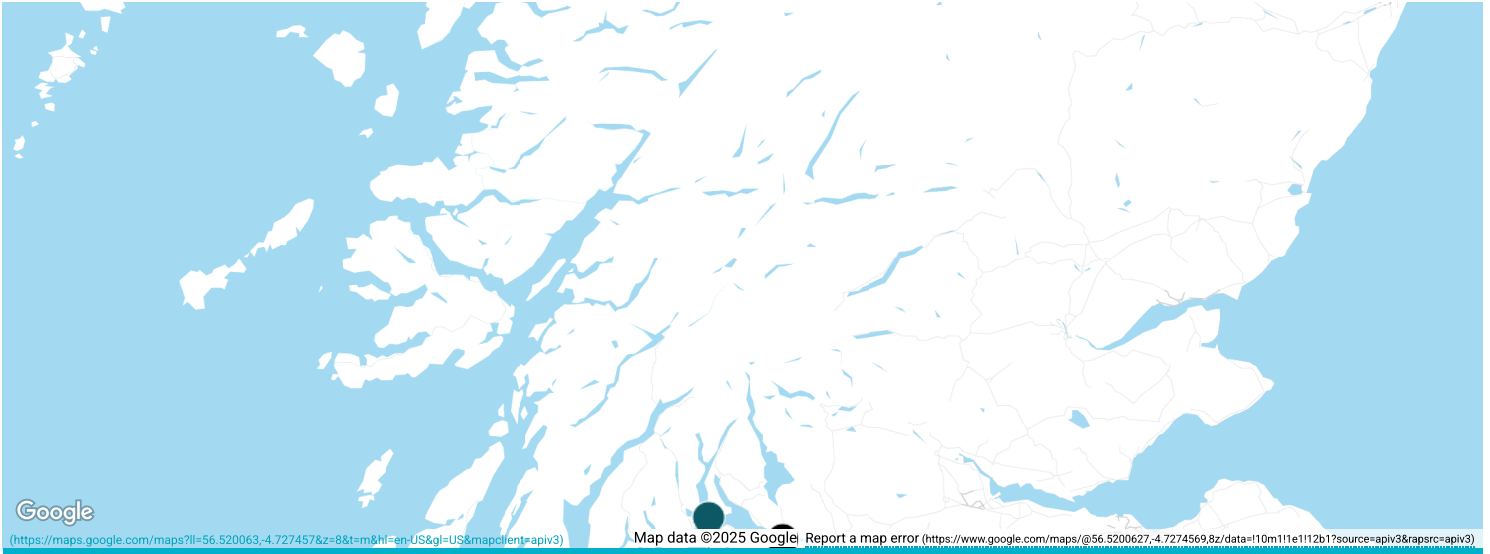




Bridge of Weir

Bridge of Weir in Renfrewshire was known for leather industries in the 19th century but today is a commuter town.

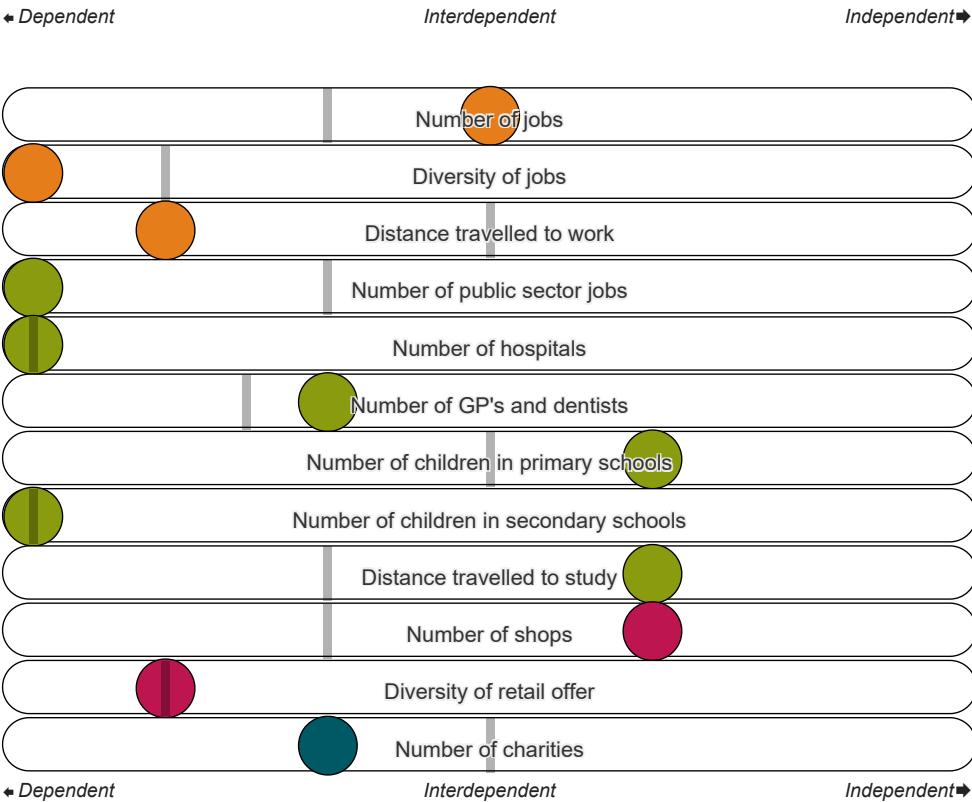

Bridge of Weir is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Bridge of Weir is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of shops. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Bridge of Weir differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

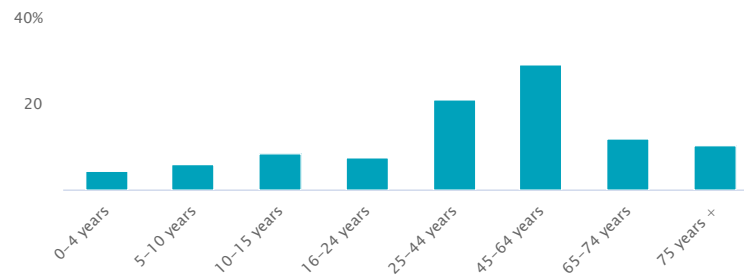

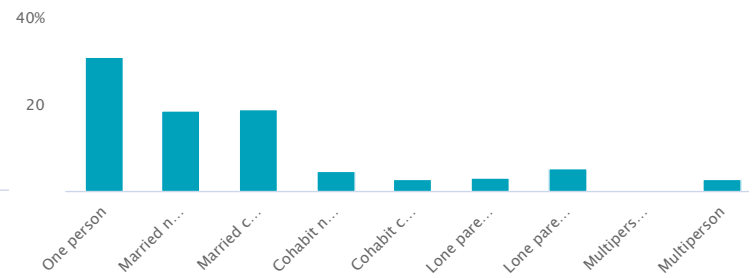

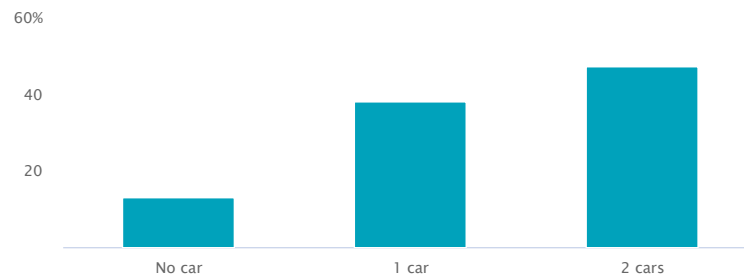

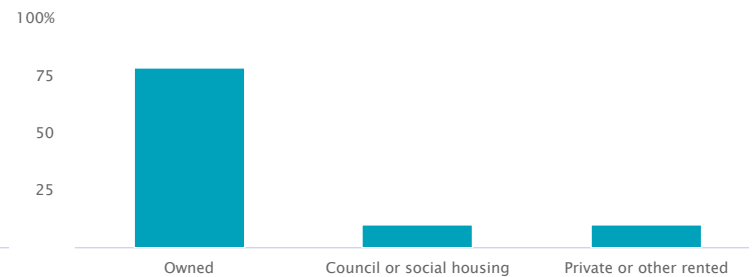

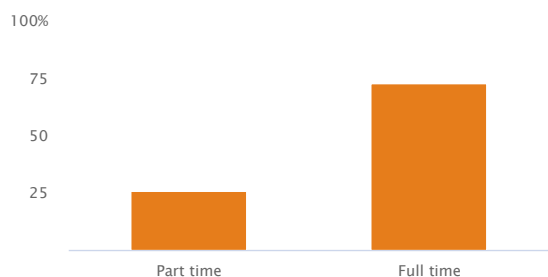

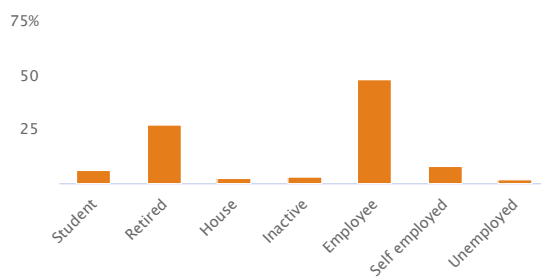
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



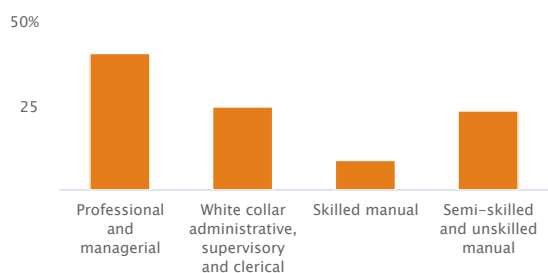
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

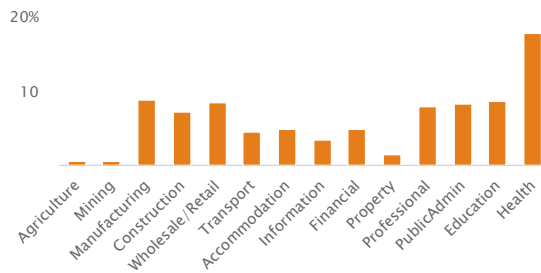


Social Grade

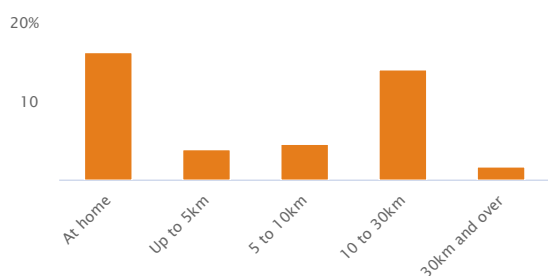
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

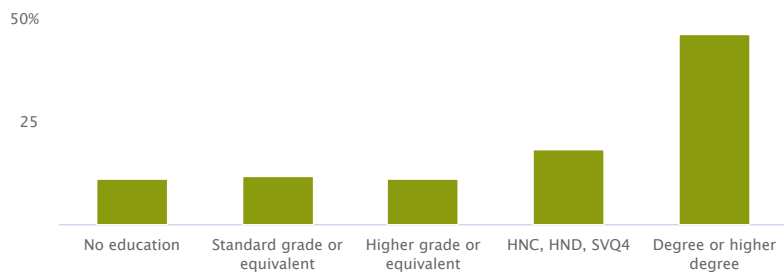


Distance travelled to work

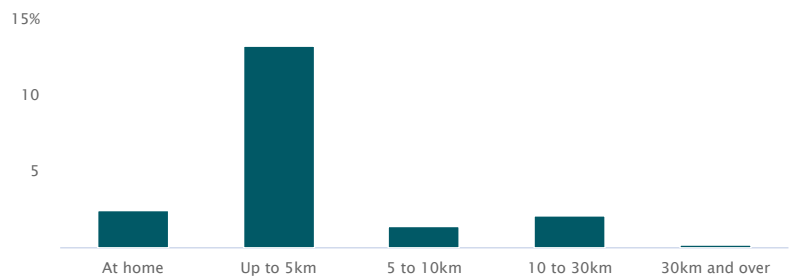
