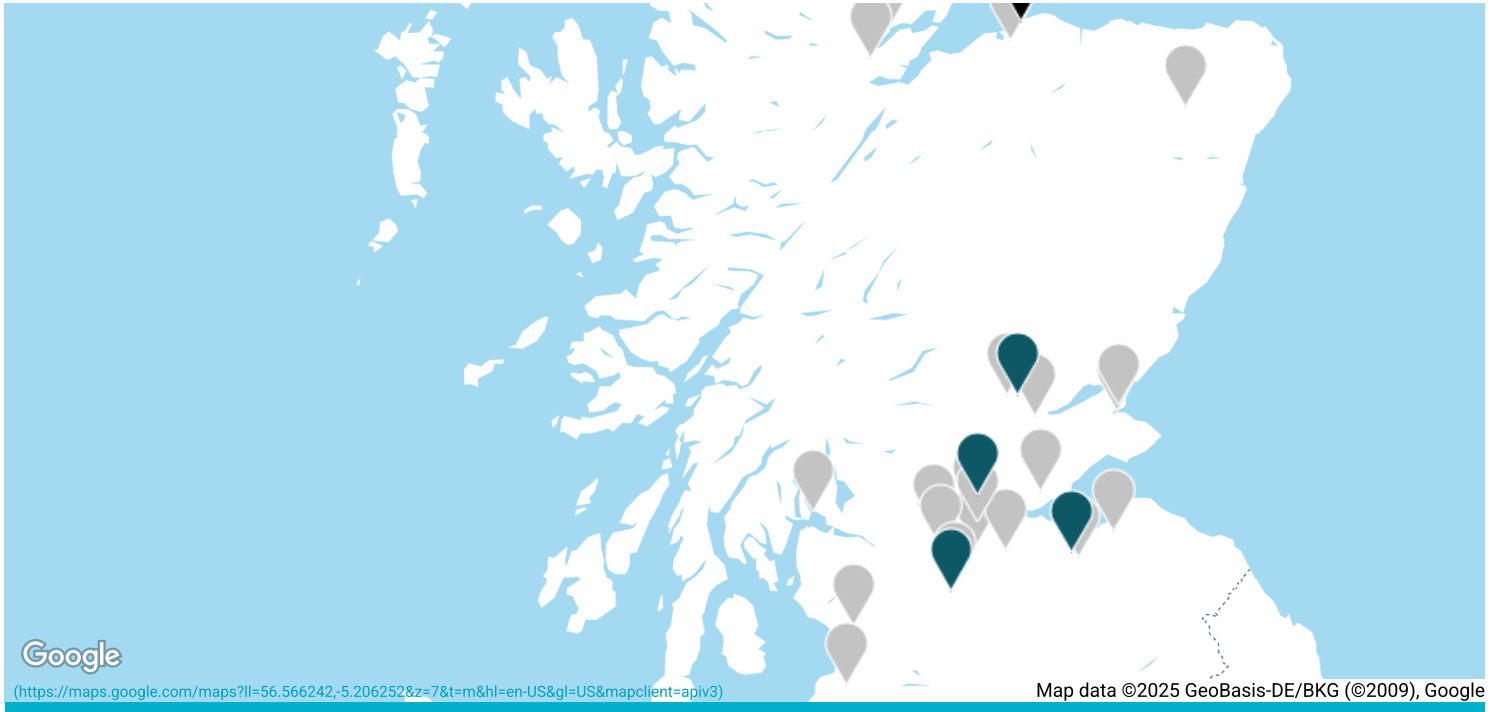

Burghead in Moray is a prehistoric site. The current town dates grew in the 19th century as a result of the building of a new harbour. The nearby air bases are important to the local economy. A large malting plant and distillery, National Grid Wireless station, tourism, business services are also important.

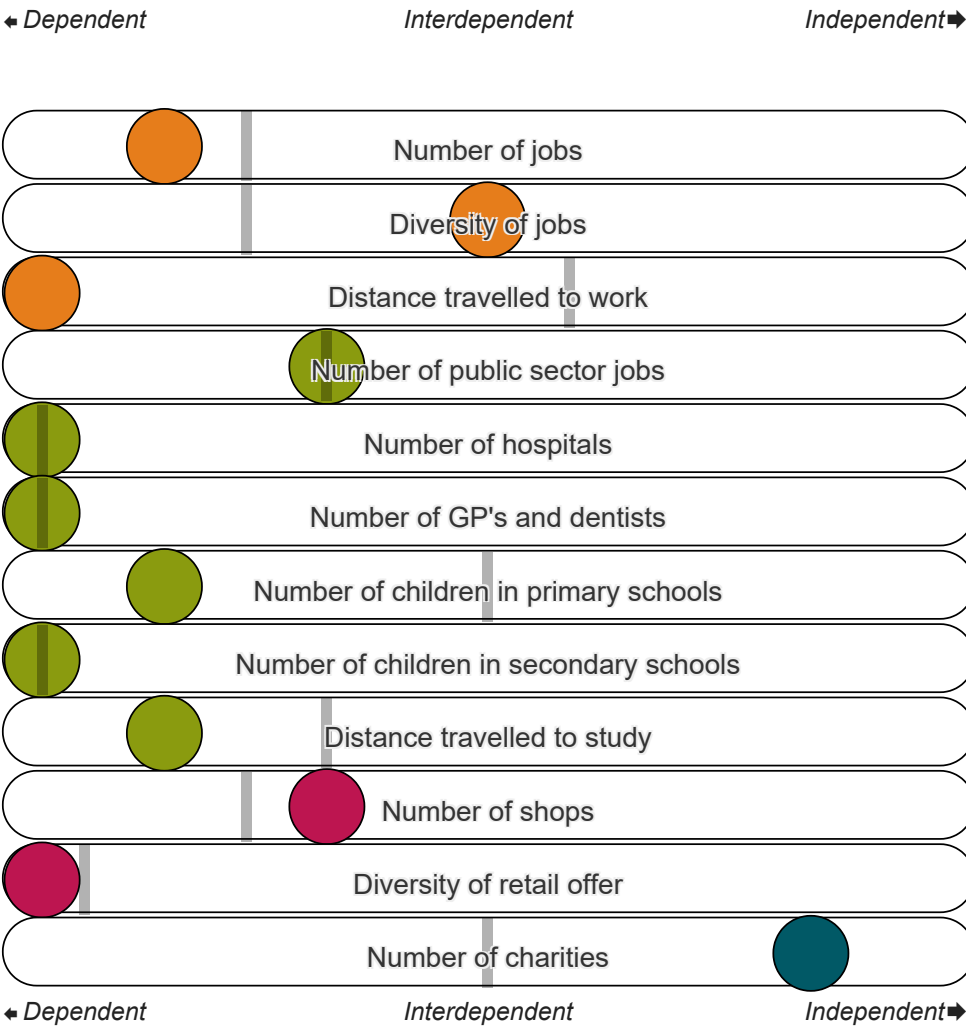
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Burghead is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Burghead is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and children in primary schools. Burghead differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

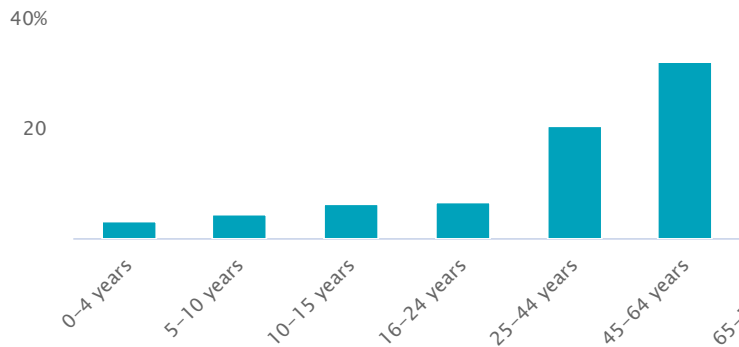

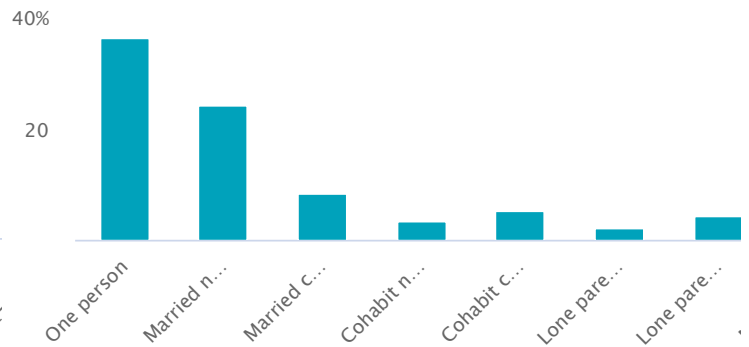

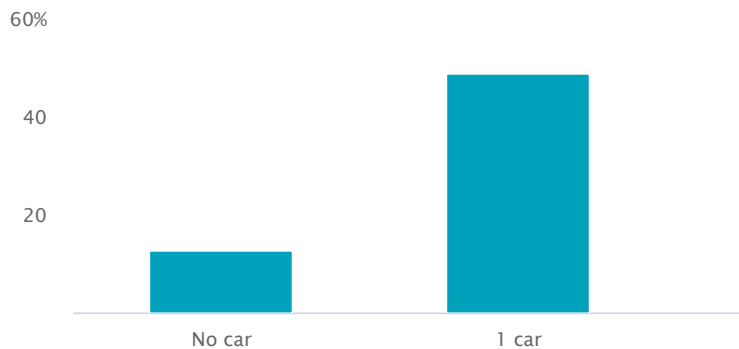

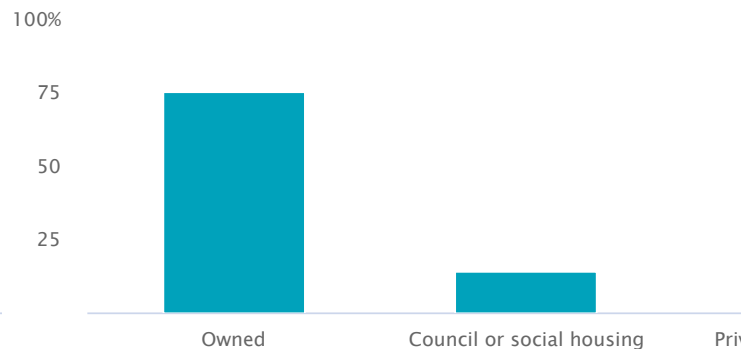

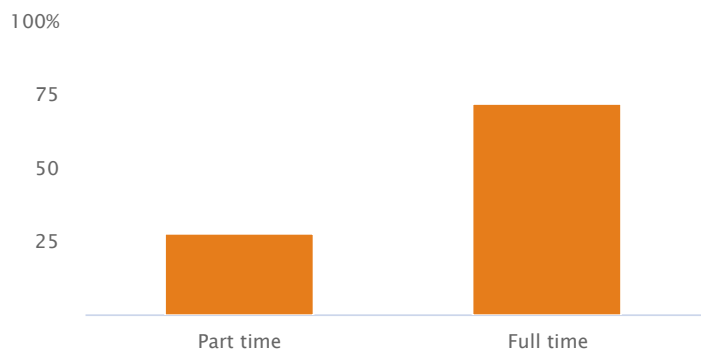

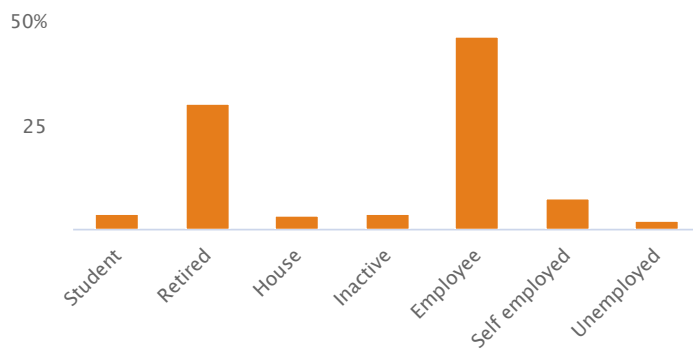
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



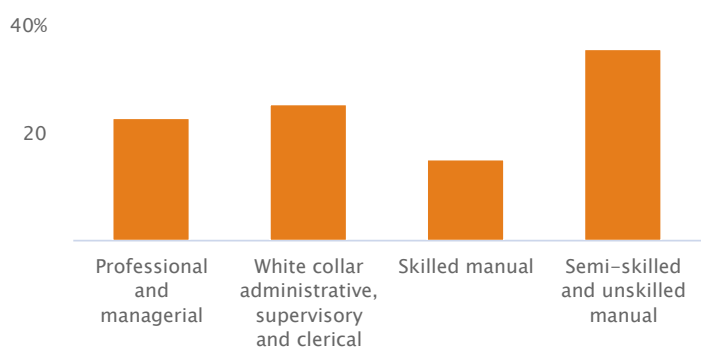
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

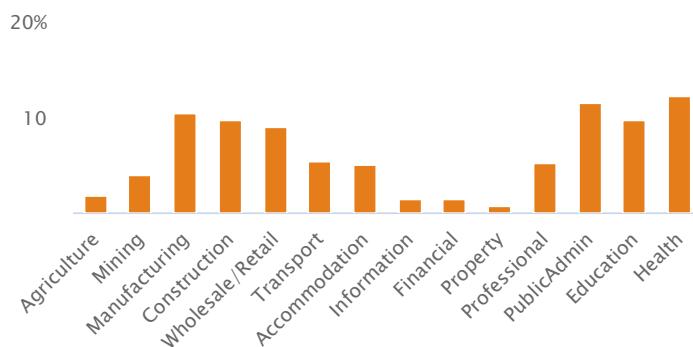


Social Grade

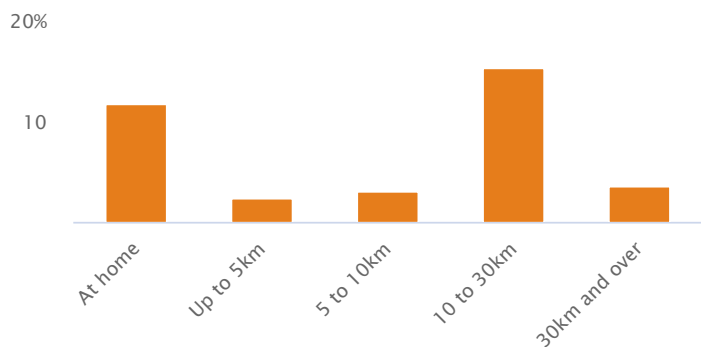
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

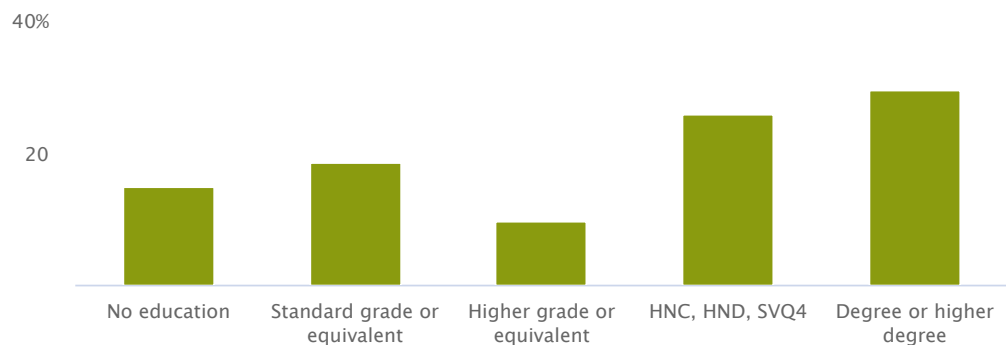


Distance travelled to work

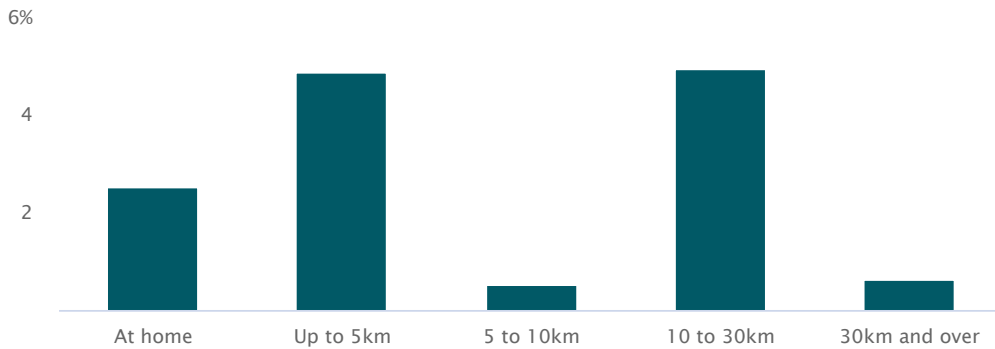
