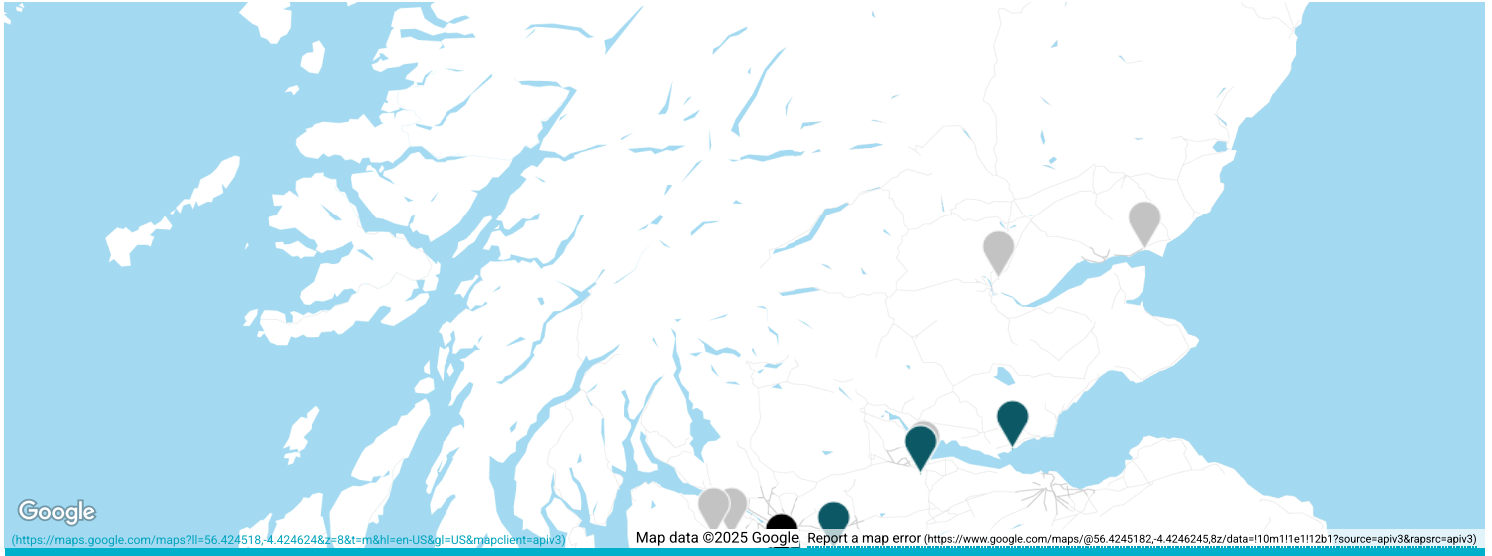




Busby

Busby in east Renfrewshire is essentially a suburb of Glasgow. It was historically involved in the textile industry but is now a commuter settlement.

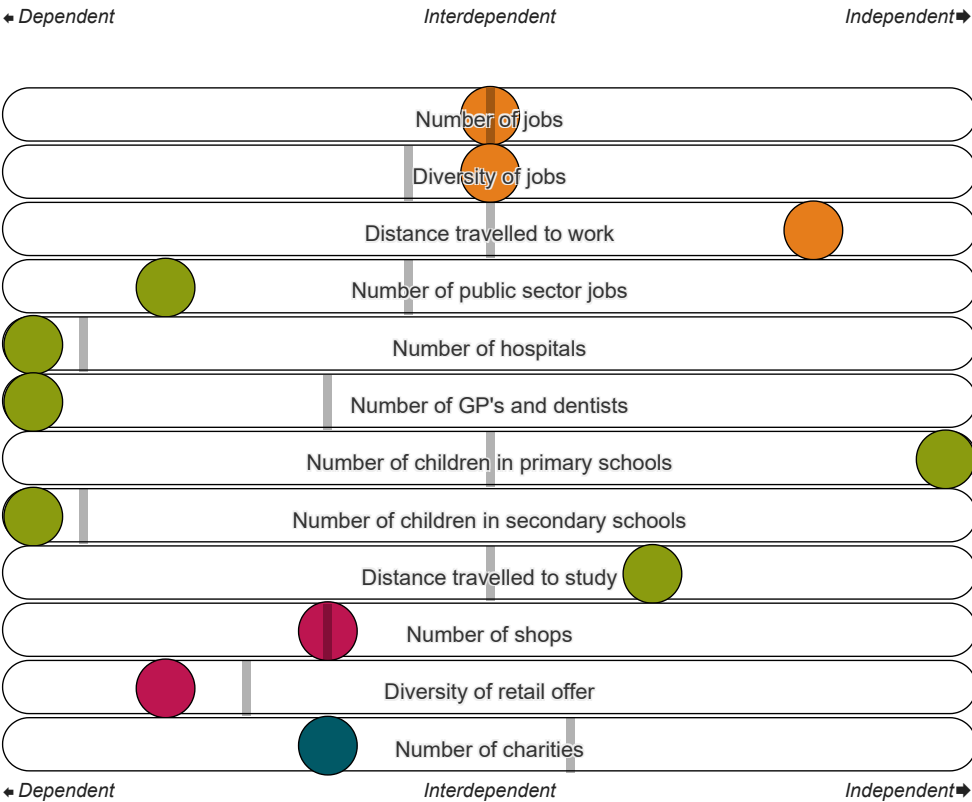
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Busby is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Busby is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Busby differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

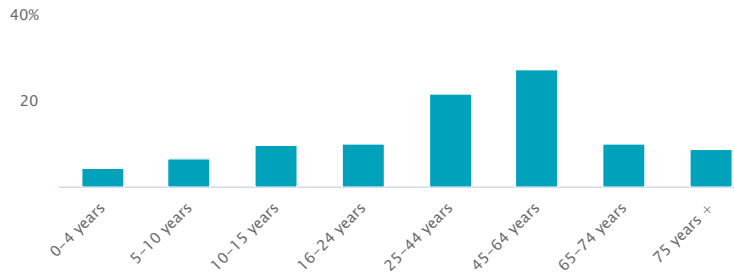

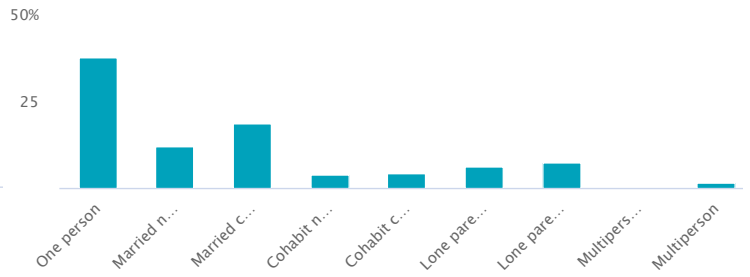

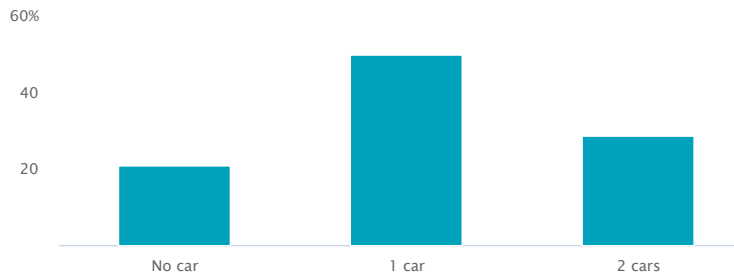

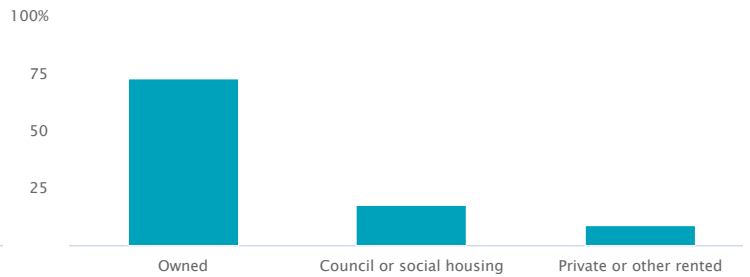

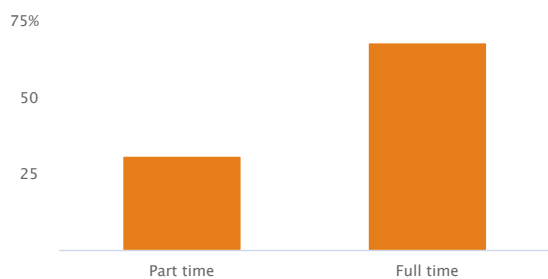

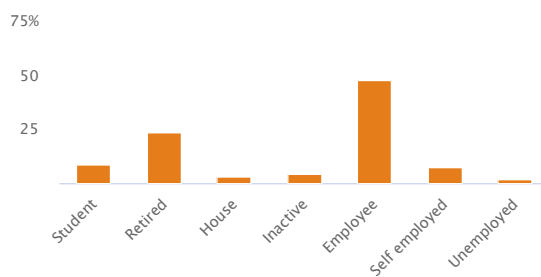
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



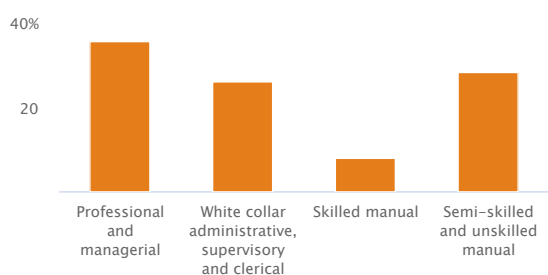
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

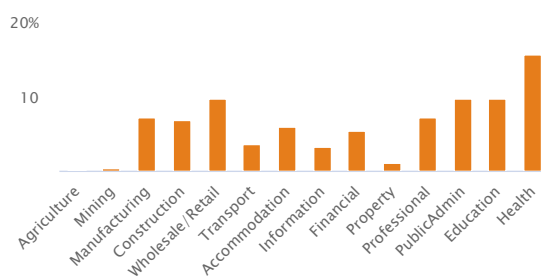


Social Grade

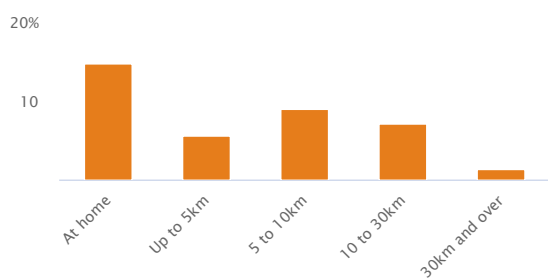
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

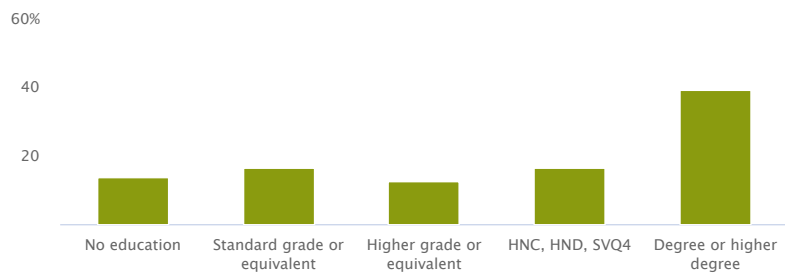


Distance travelled to work

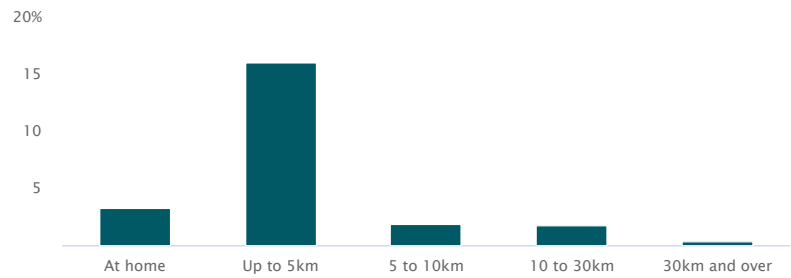
