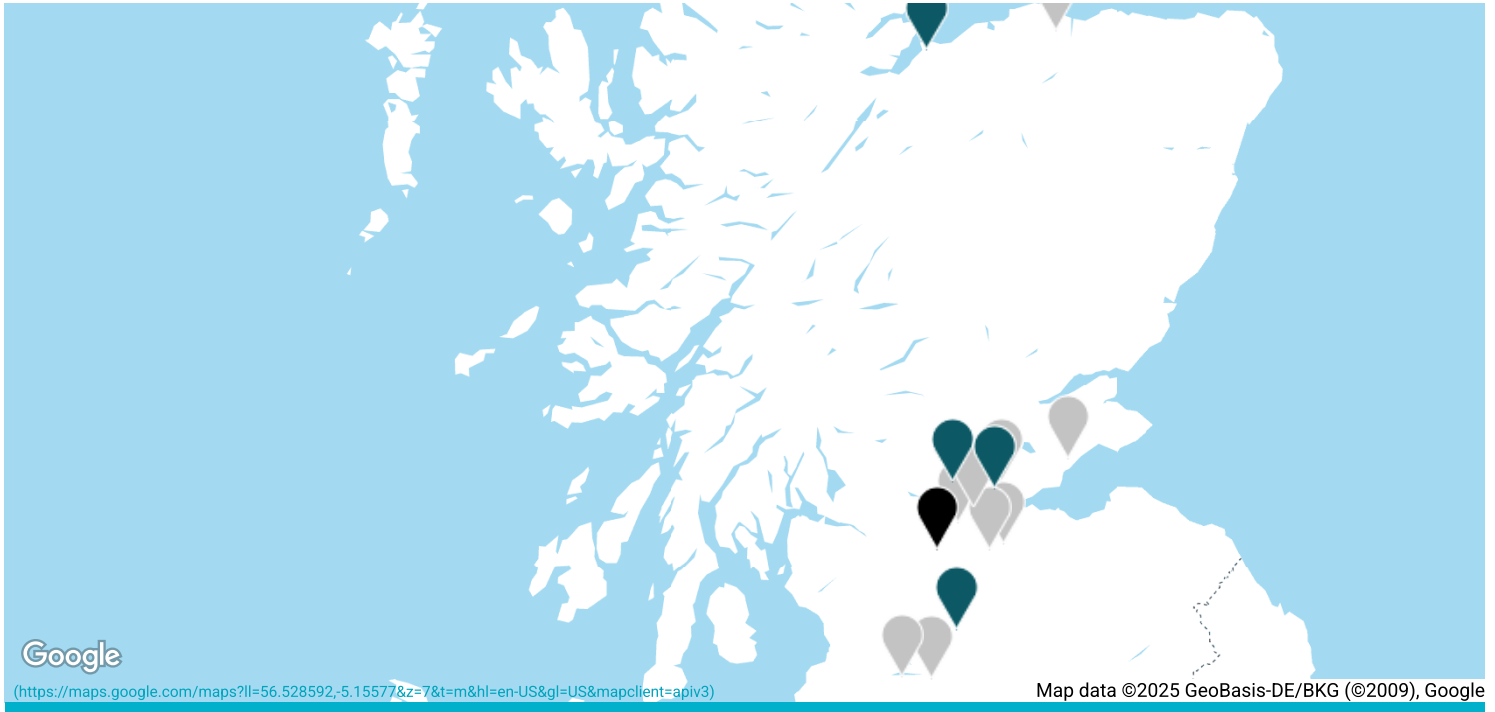




Calderbank

Calderbank in North Lanarkshire was built as a company village to house workers in the iron and steel industry in the 19th century. Production ceased in the 1930s.

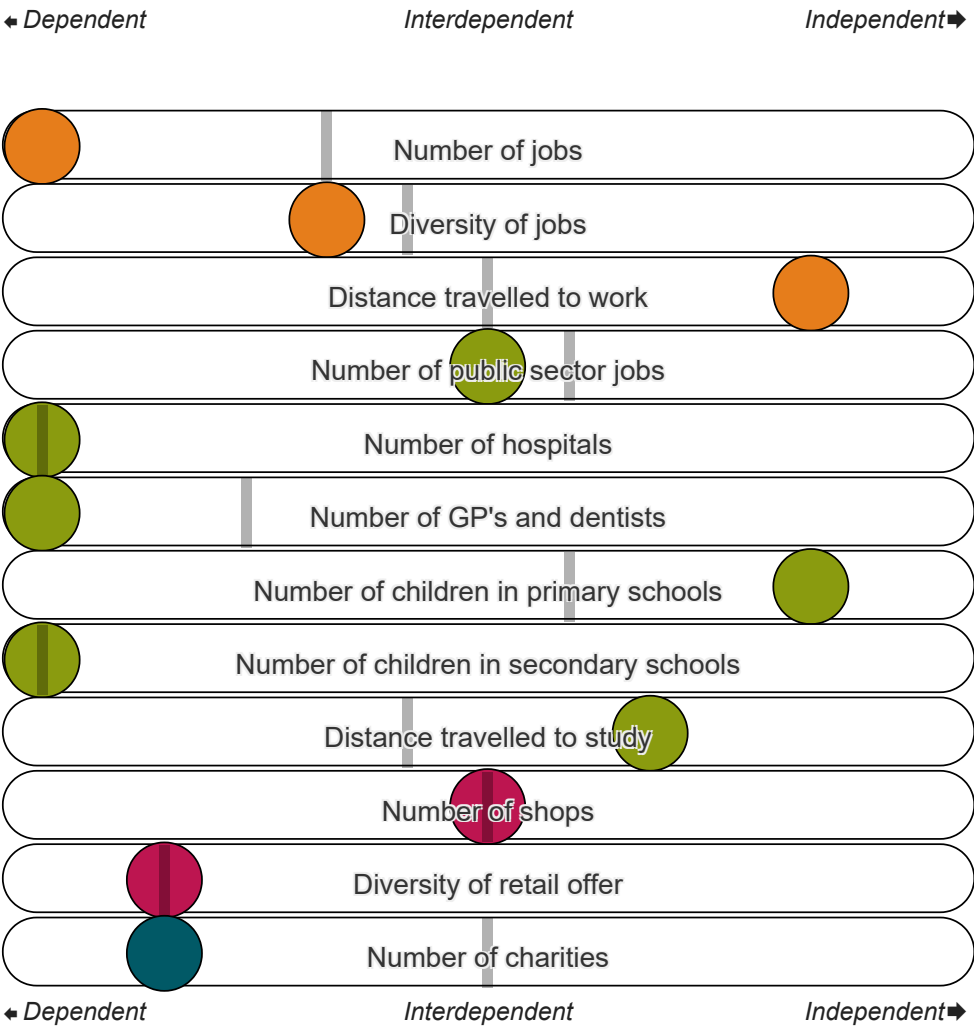
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Calderbank is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Calderbank is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Calderbank is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Calderbank differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

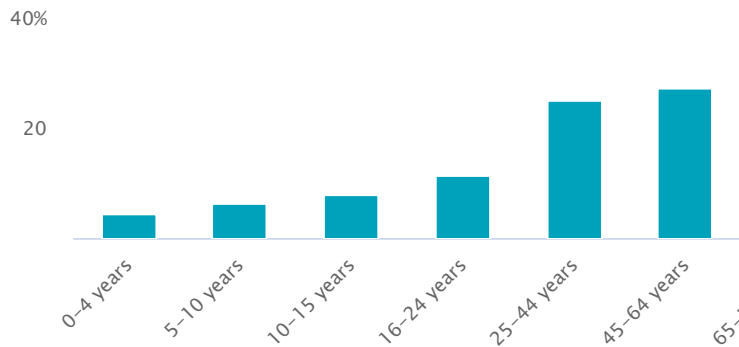

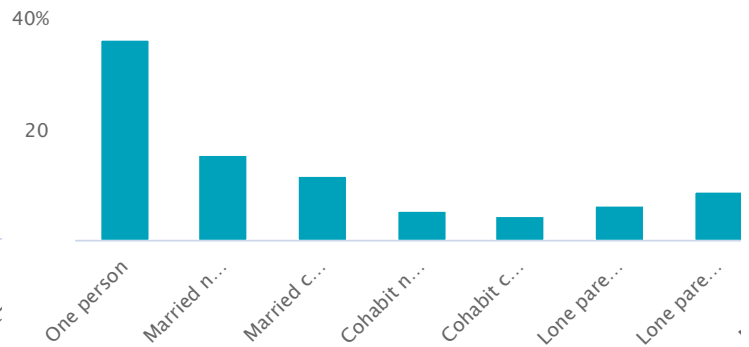

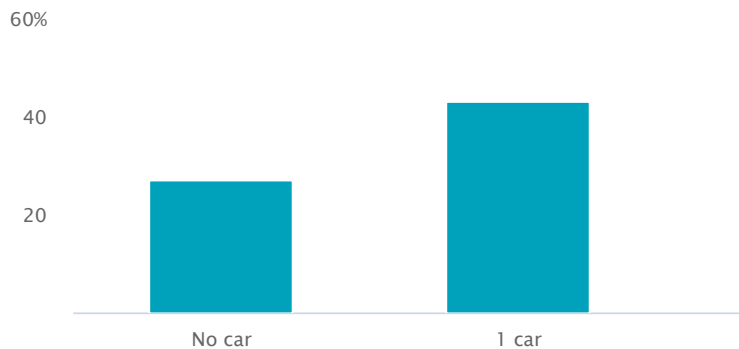

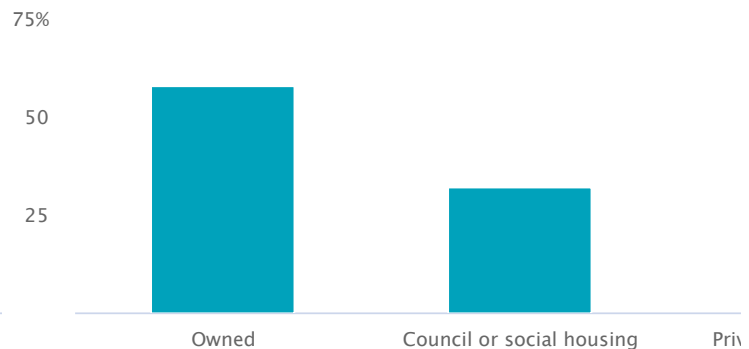

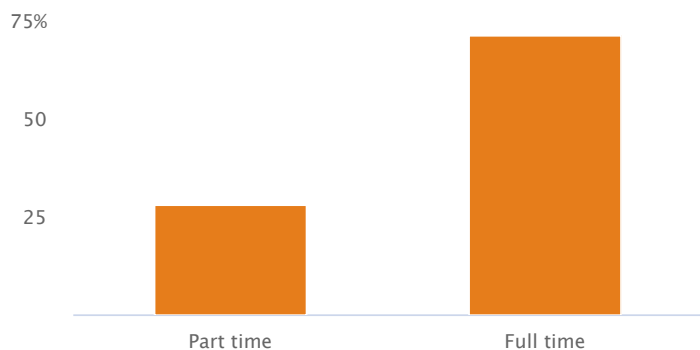

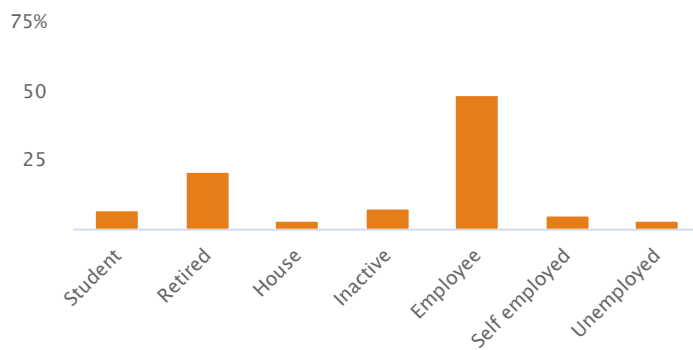
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



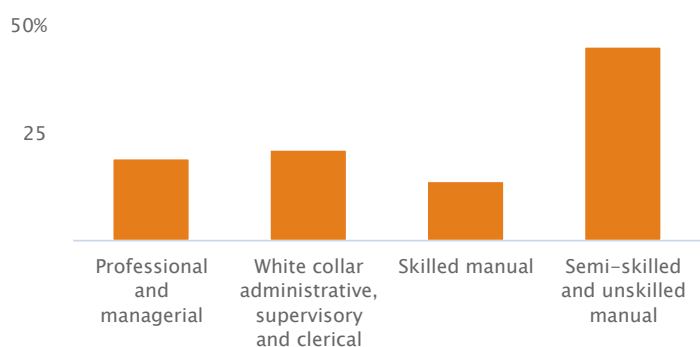
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

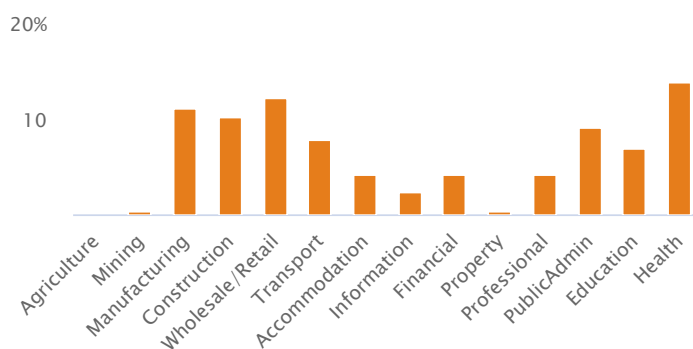


Social Grade

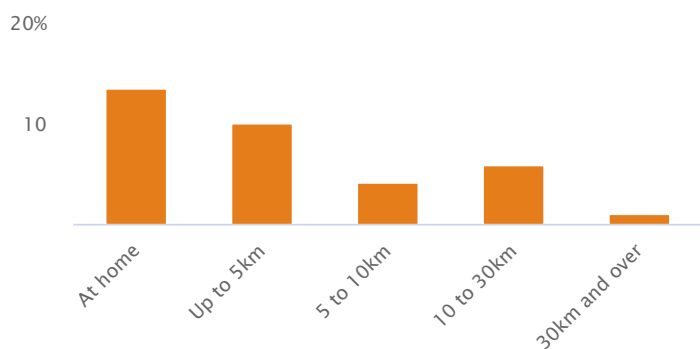
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

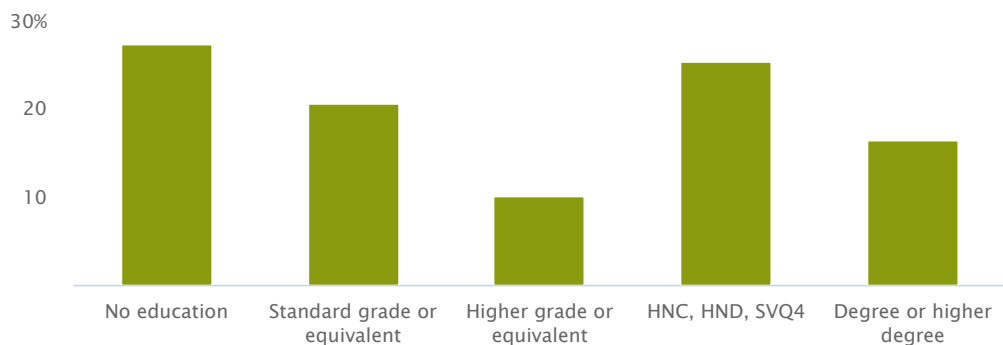


Distance travelled to work

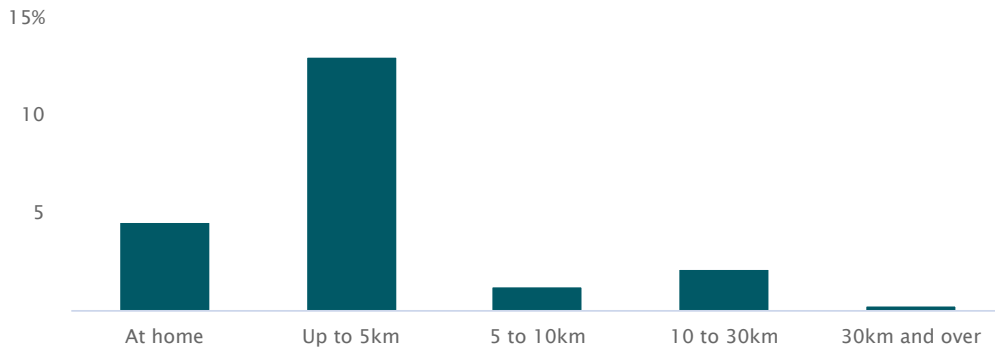
