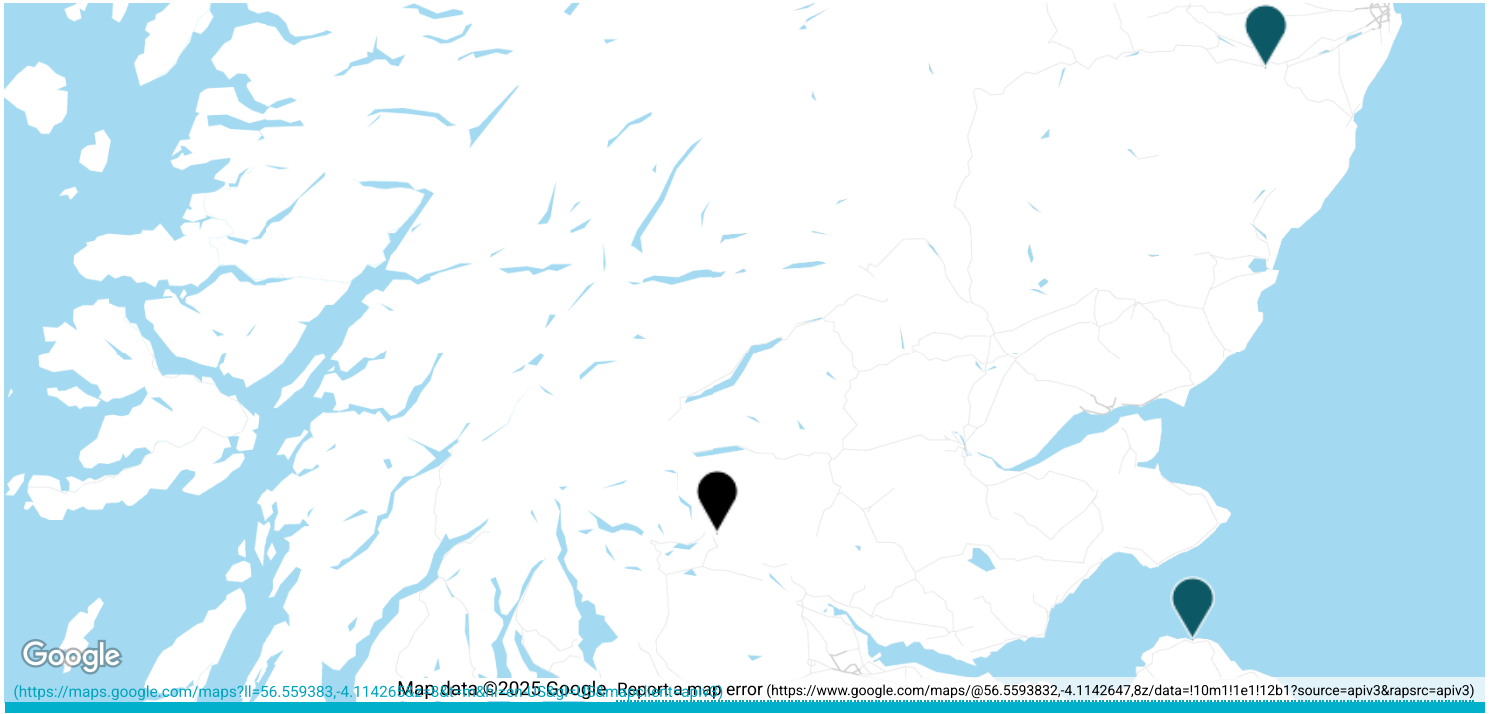




Callander

Callander in Stirling Council is an 18th century planned town on a forfeited estate. It is a gateway to the Trossachs and has been an important tourist centre since the time of Sir Walter Scott.

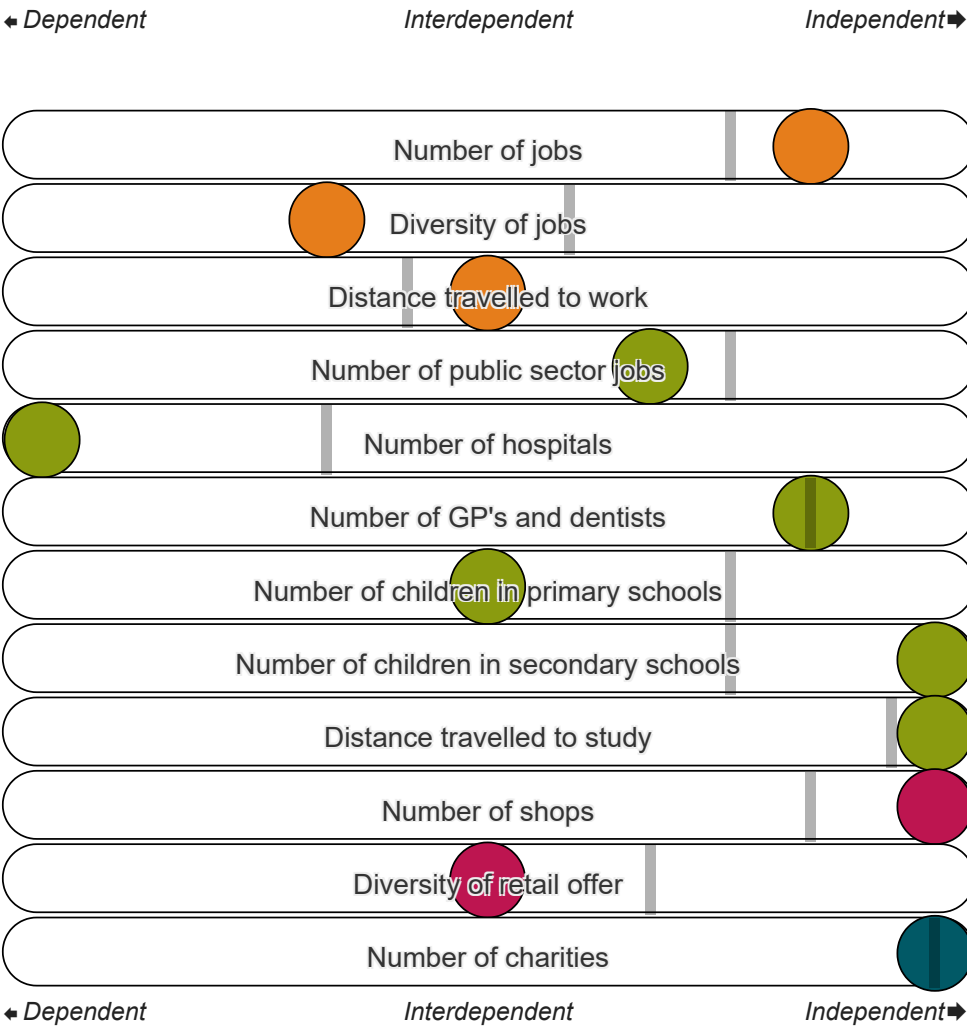
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Callander is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Callander is grouped with 2 other towns. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

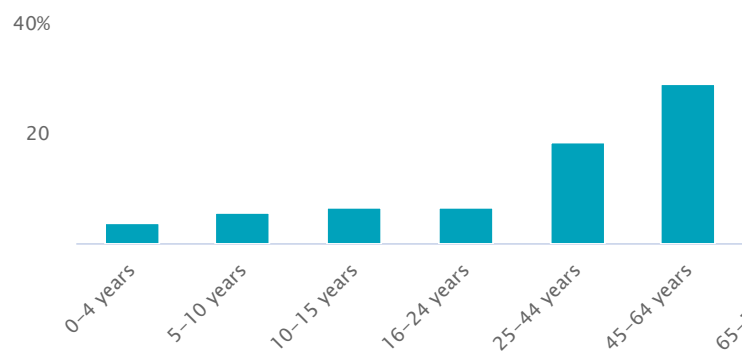

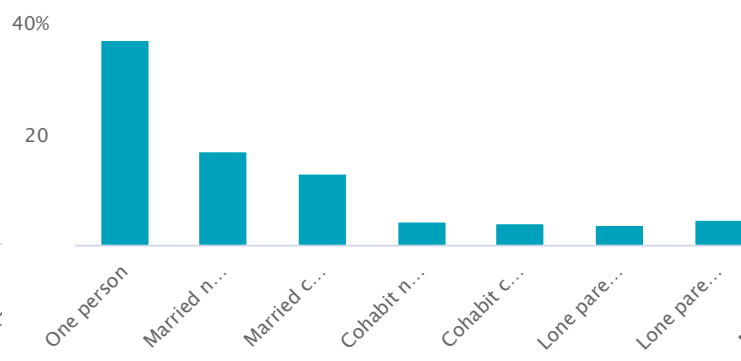

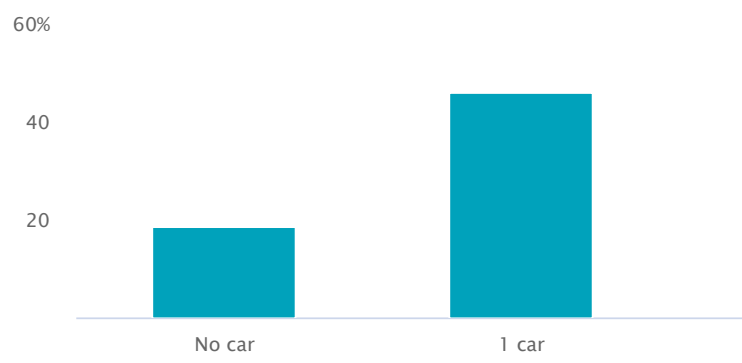

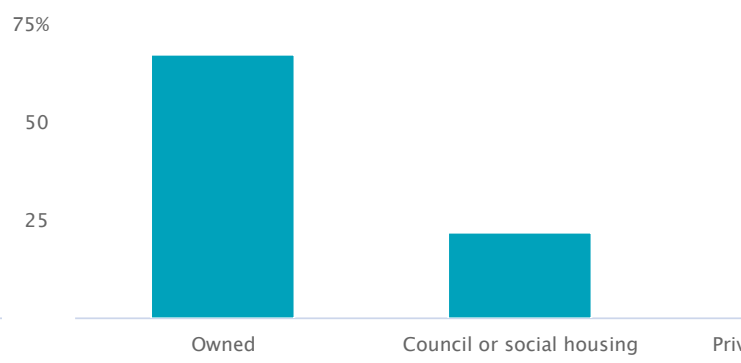

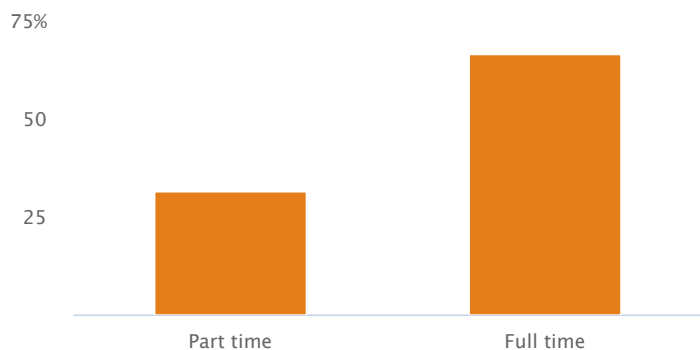

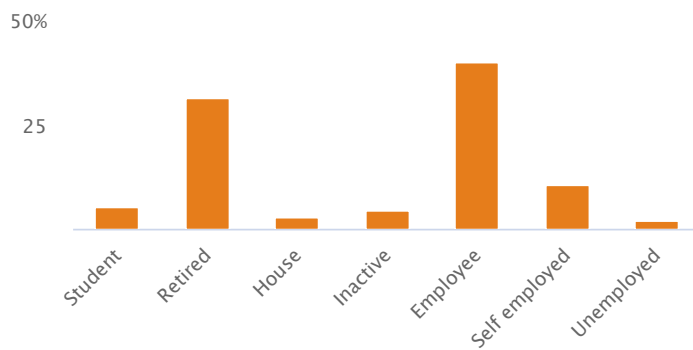
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



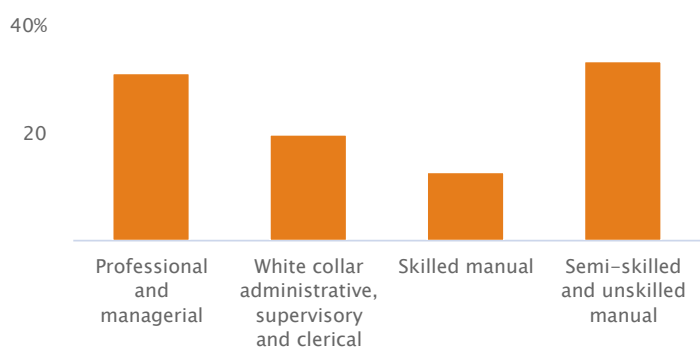
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

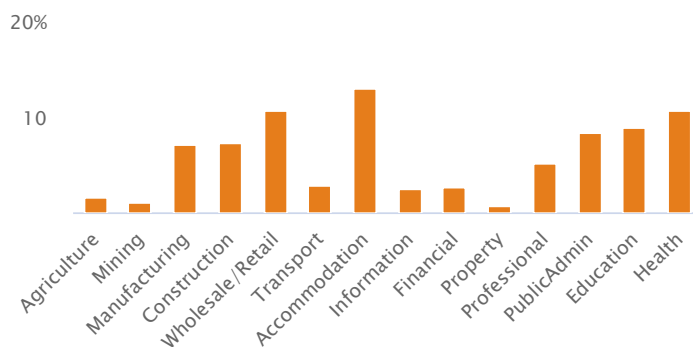


Social Grade

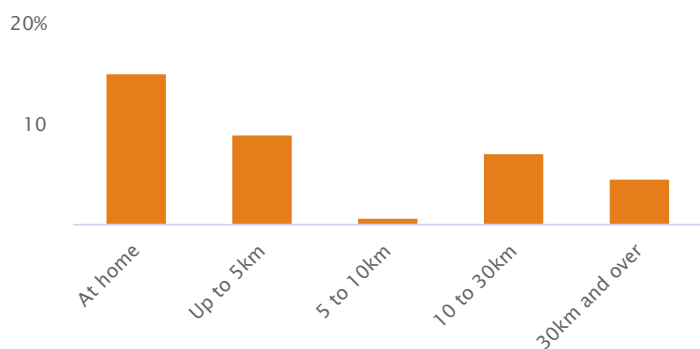
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

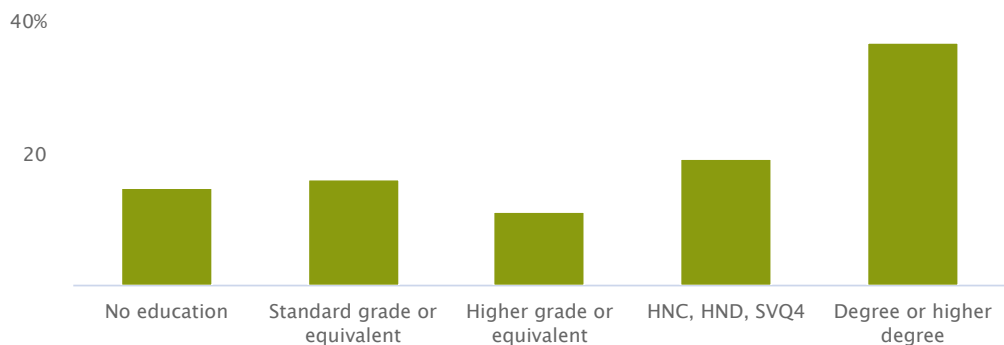


Distance travelled to work

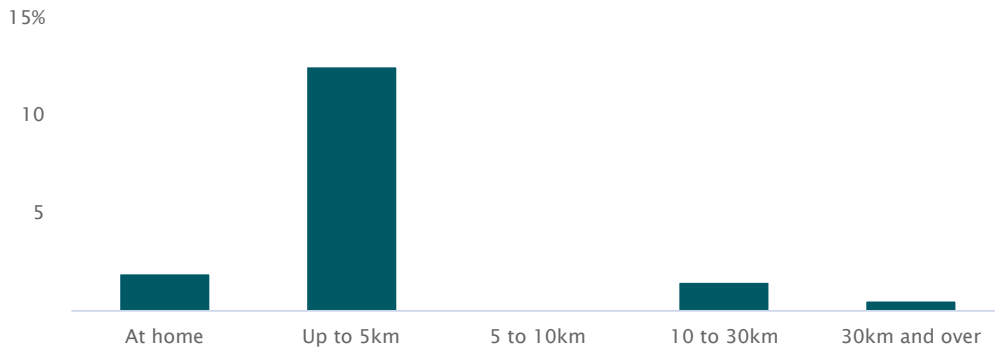
