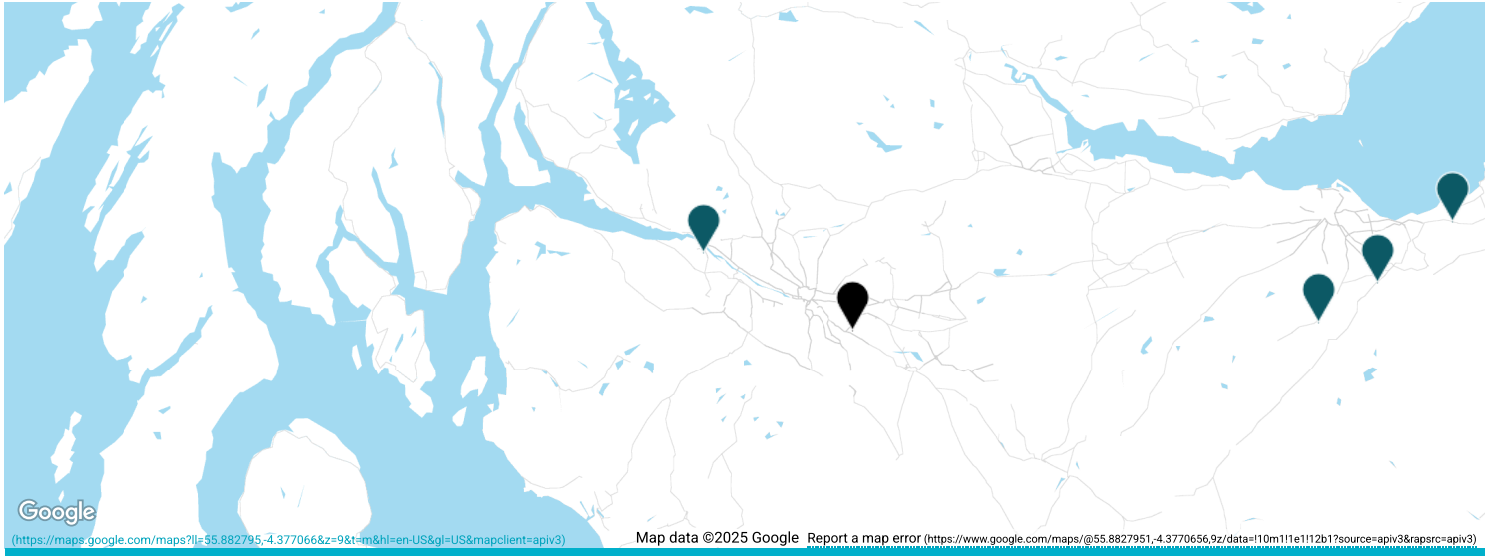




Cambuslang

Cambuslang in South Lanarkshire was a handloom weaving town in the 18th century. It is on an Iron Age site. The 20th century saw it become dominated by heavy industry including the Clydebridge Steelworks and Hoover. Today distribution and service industries are important. It is also known for its religious engagement in revival.

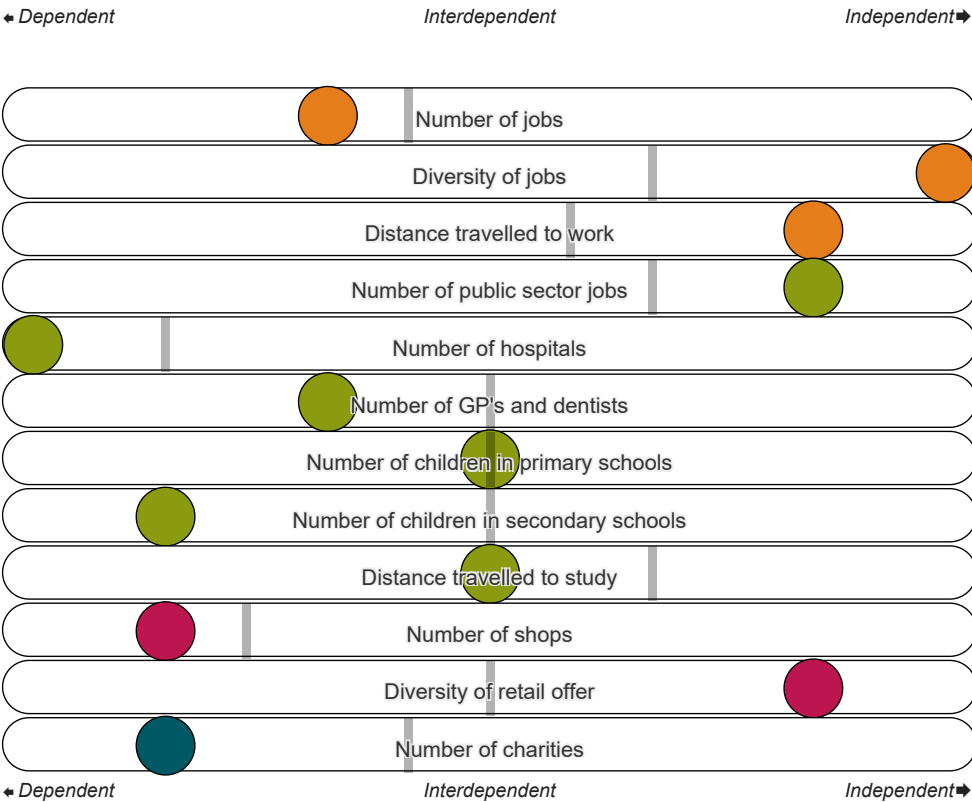
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Cambuslang is an **interdependent** town.

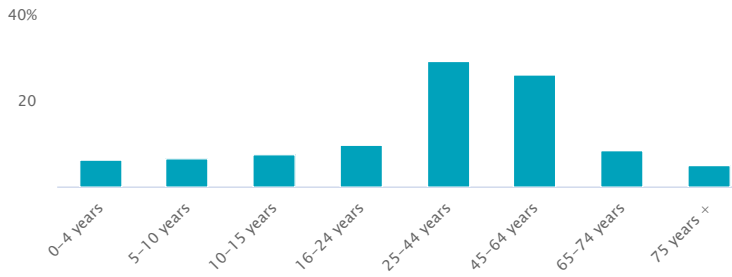

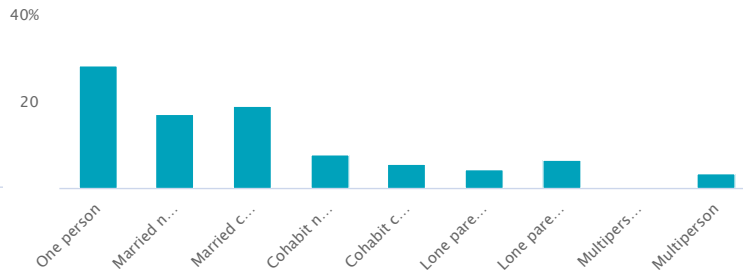

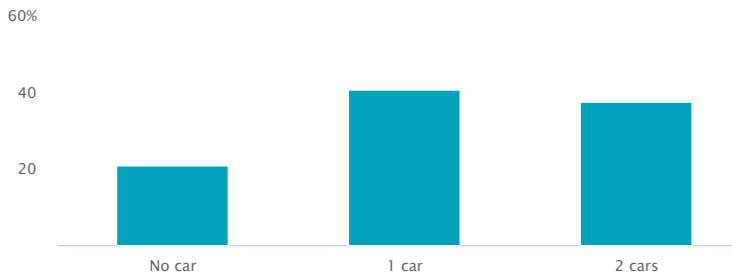

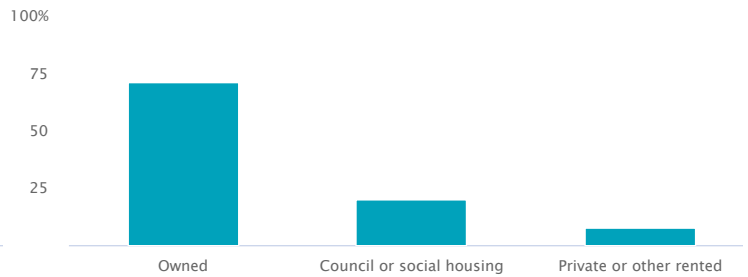

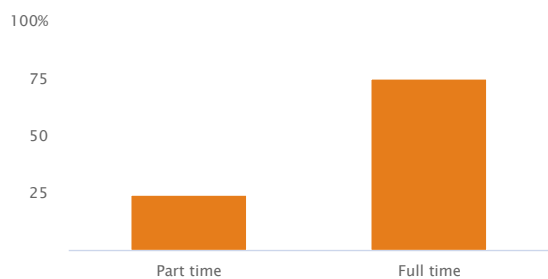

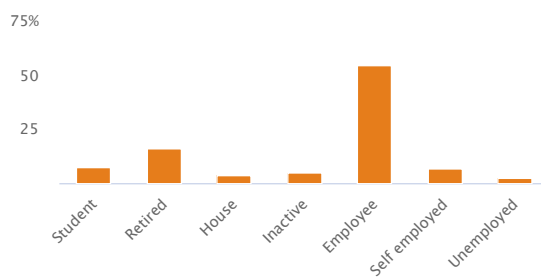
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



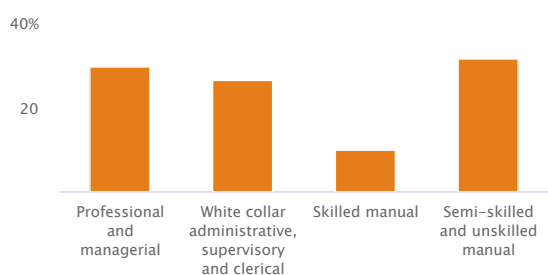
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

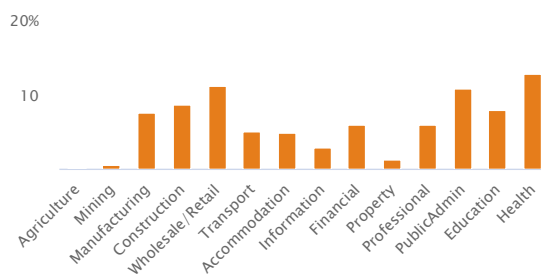


Social Grade

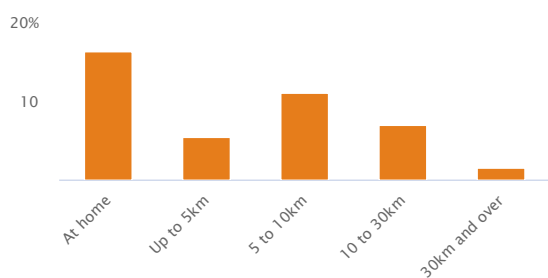
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

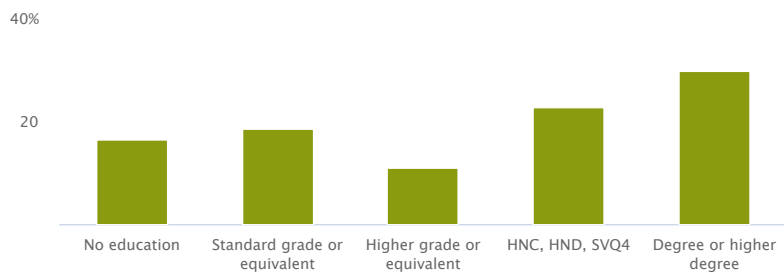


Distance travelled to work

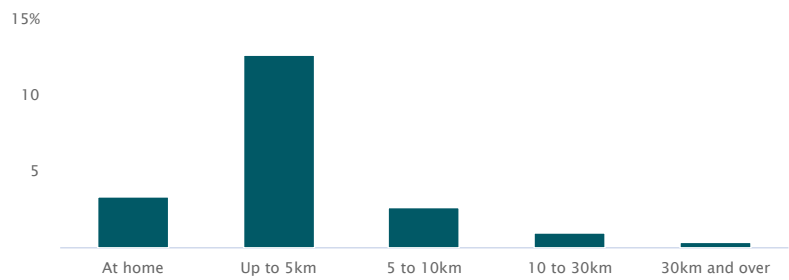
