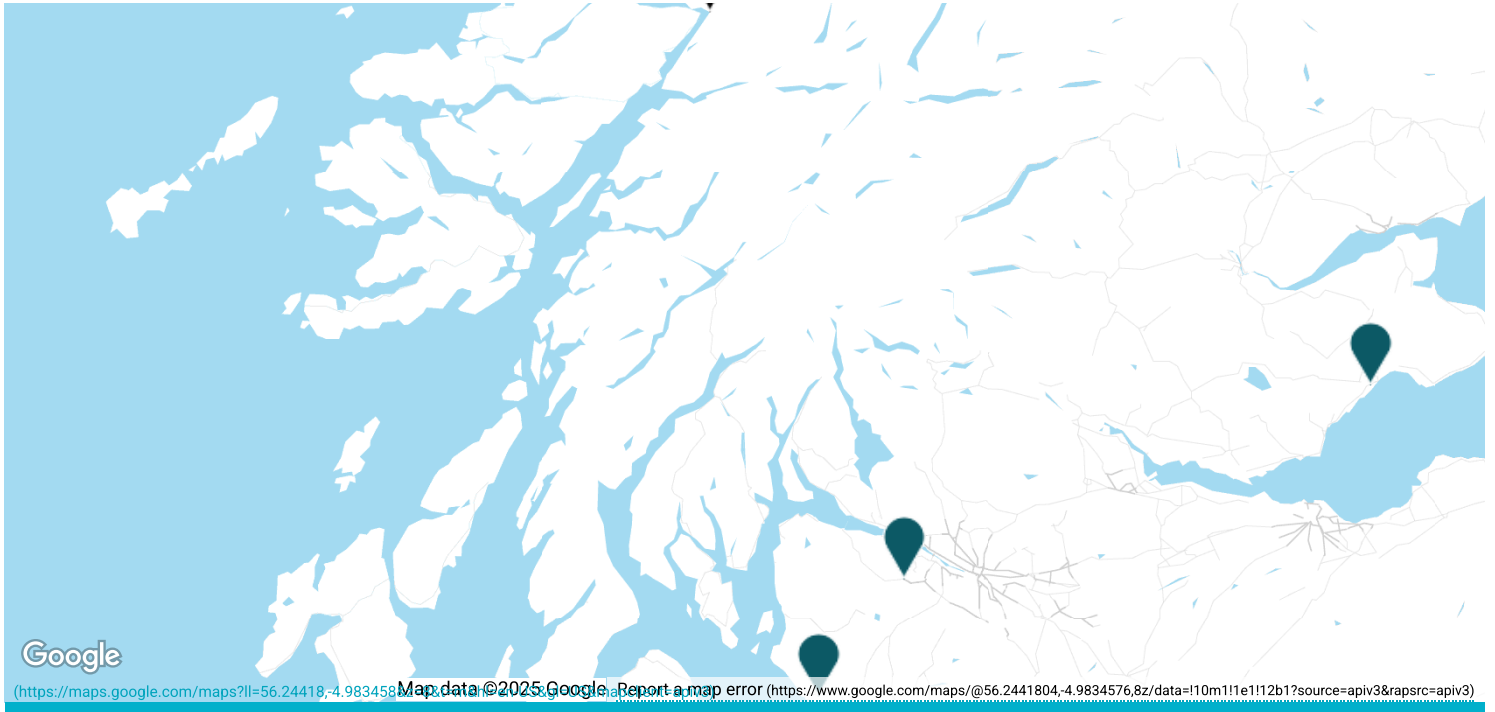

Caol in Highland is located at the western end of the Caledonian Canal and forms part of the residential area of Fort William.

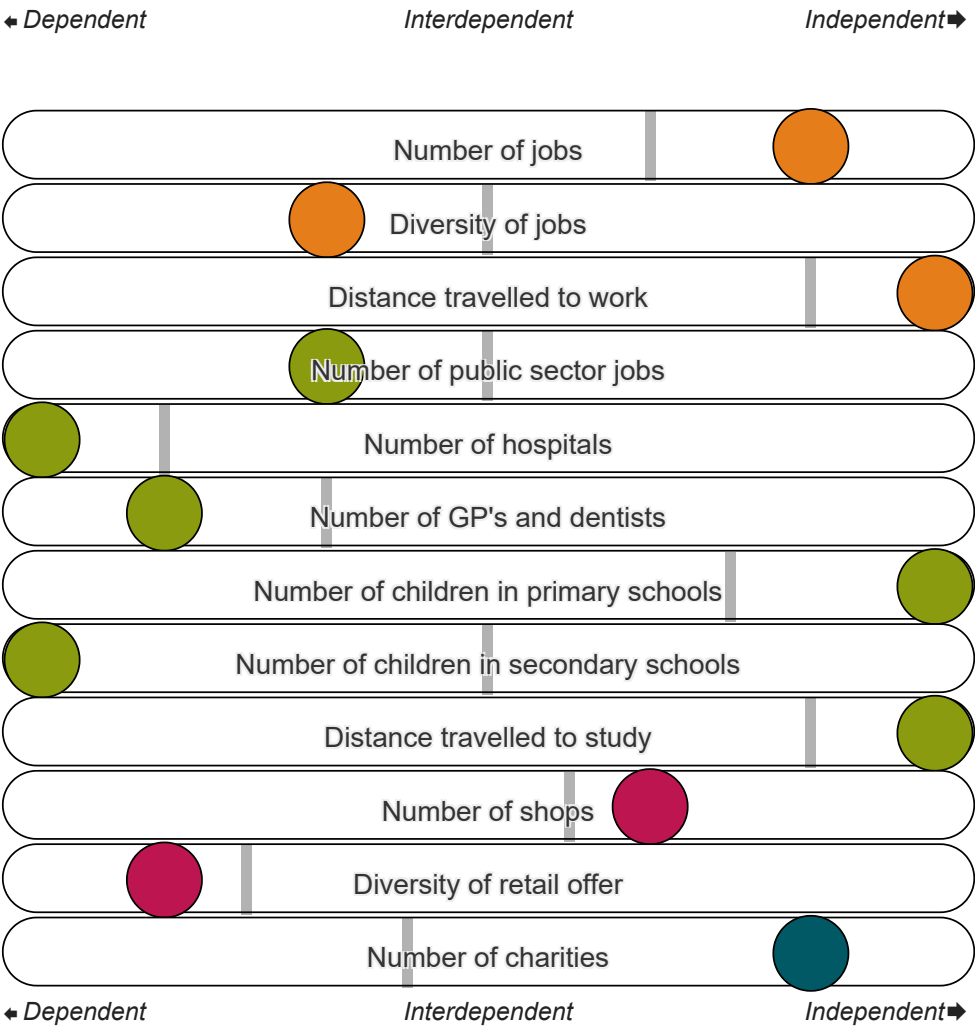
In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Caol is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Caol is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and children in primary schools. Caol differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools.

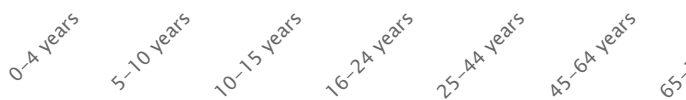

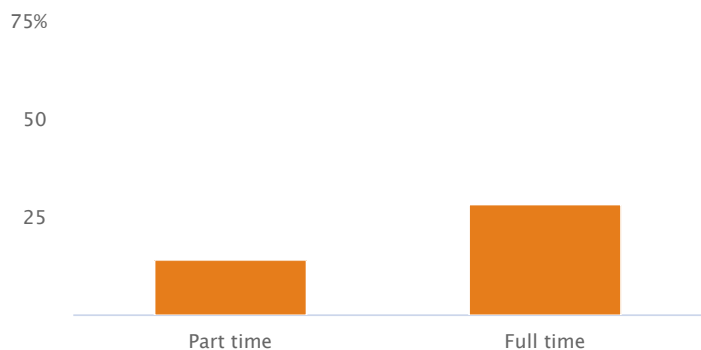

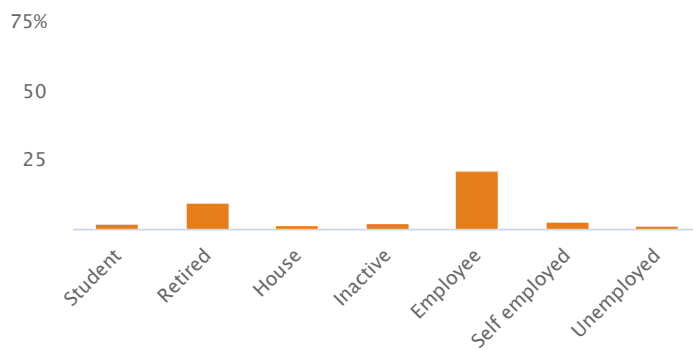
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



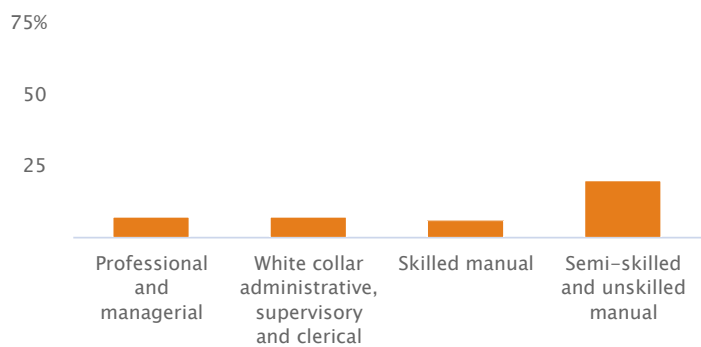
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

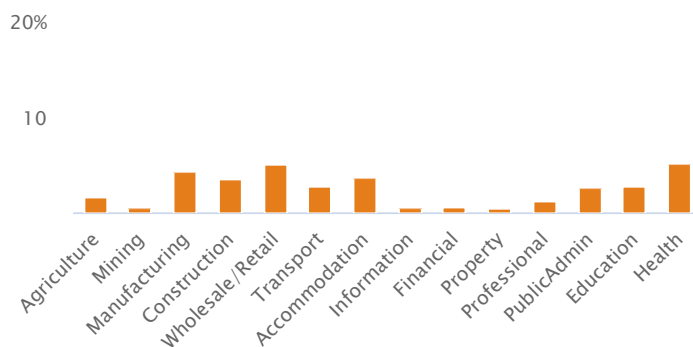

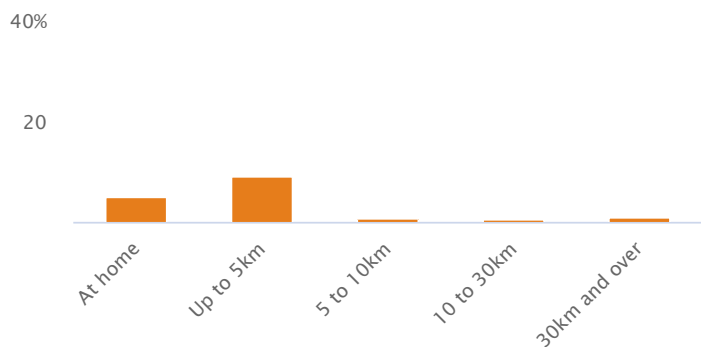
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

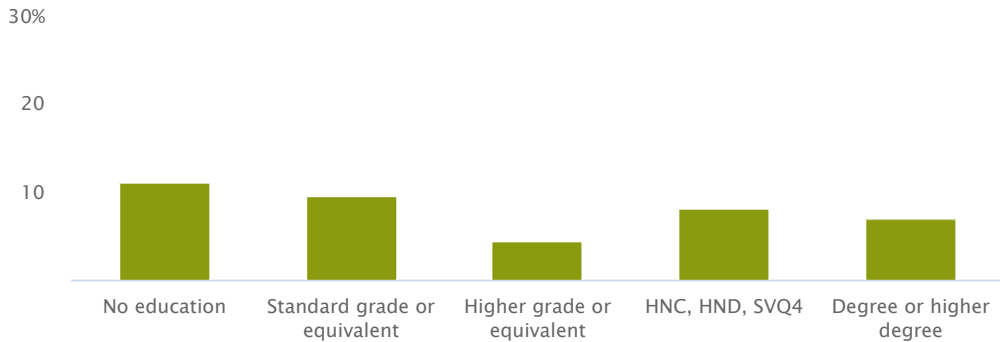


Distance travelled to work

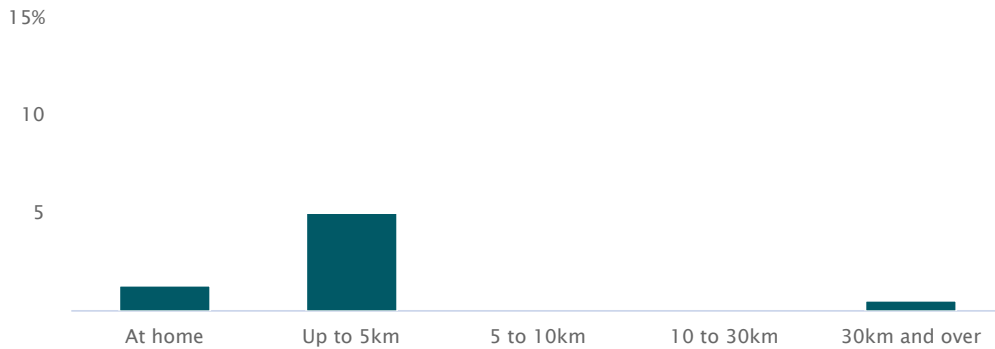
