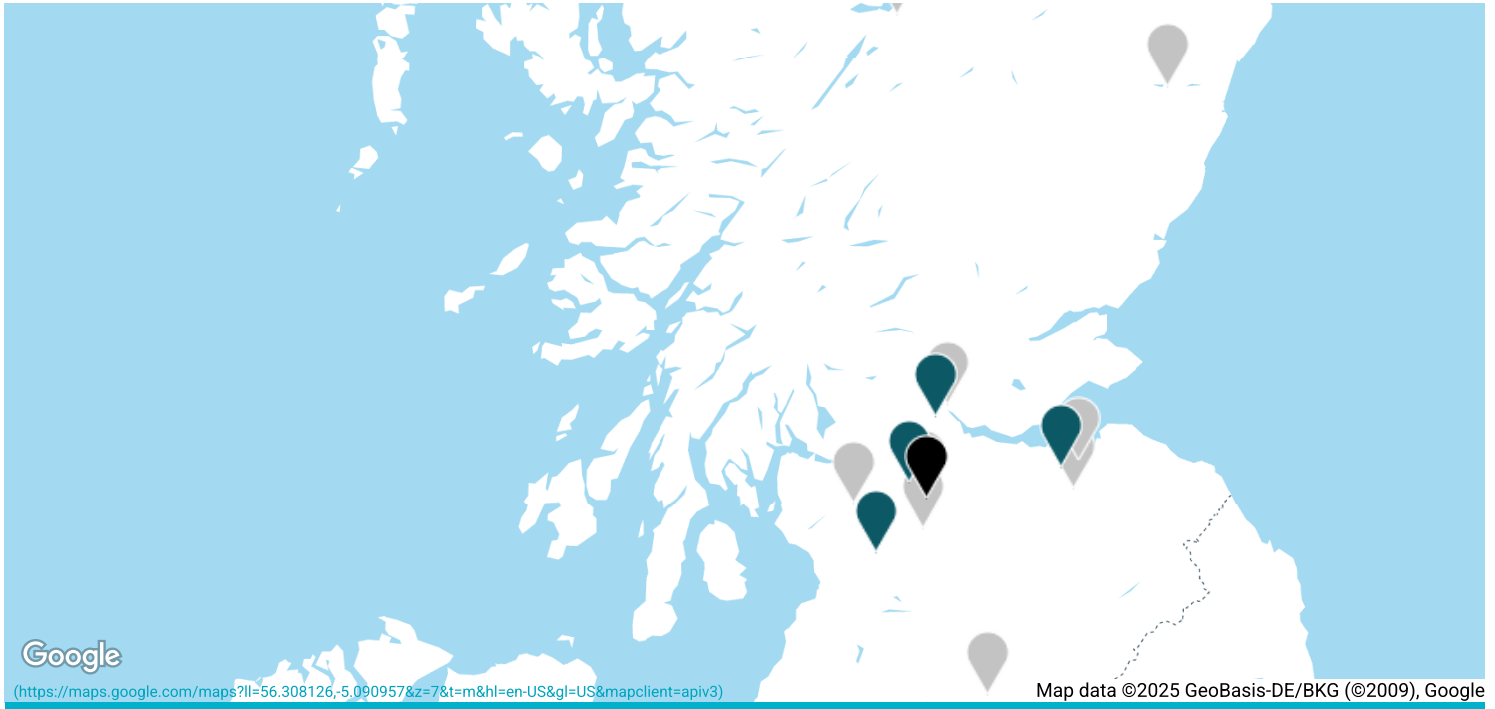




Carfin

Carfin in North Lanarkshire is a former mining settlement associated with Motherwell. In the 1920s it was established as a place of Catholic pilgrimage.

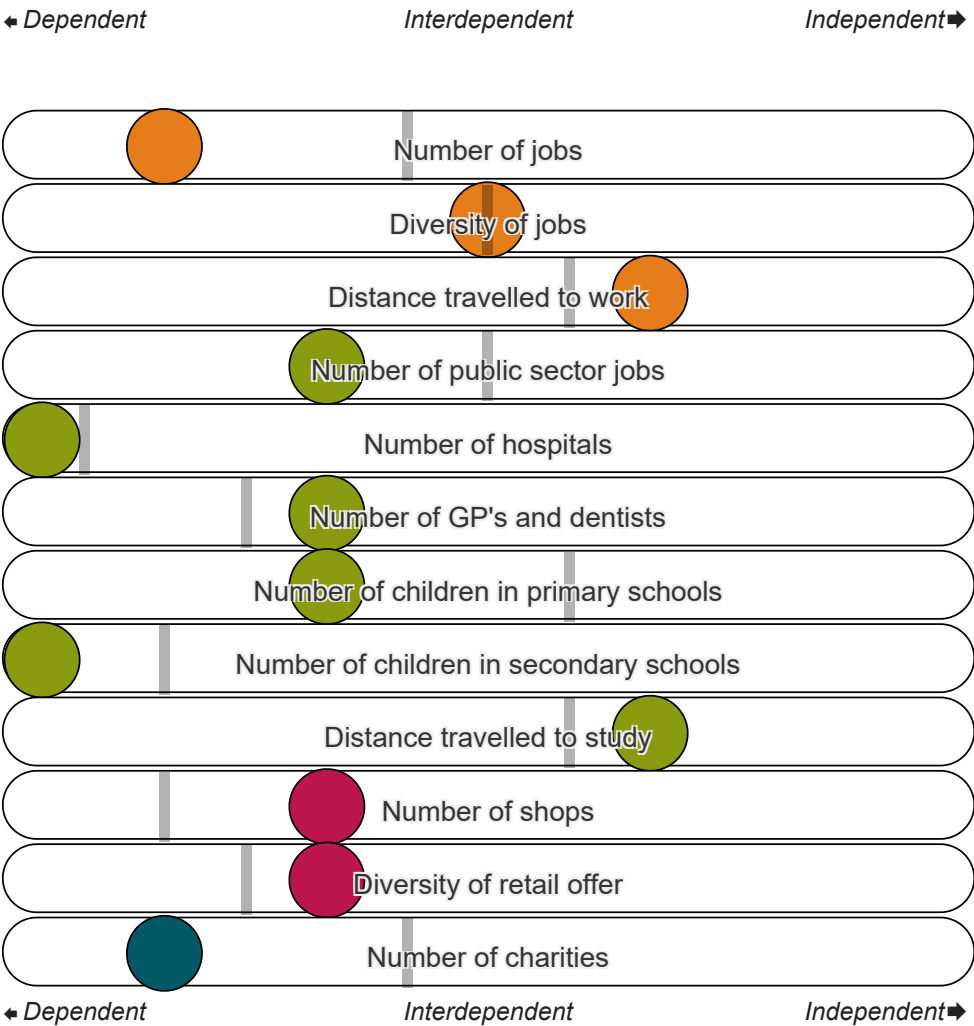
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Carfin is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Carfin is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Carfin is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. Carfin differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

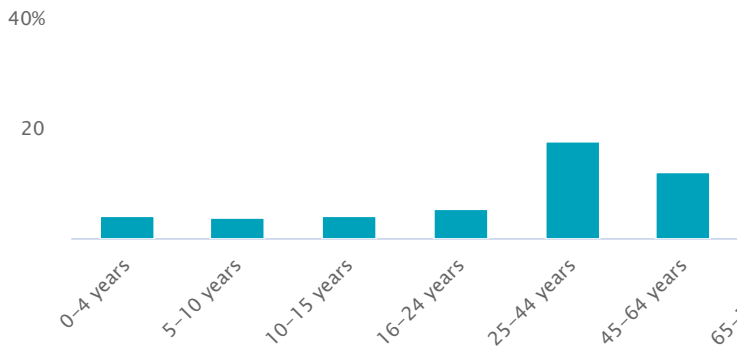

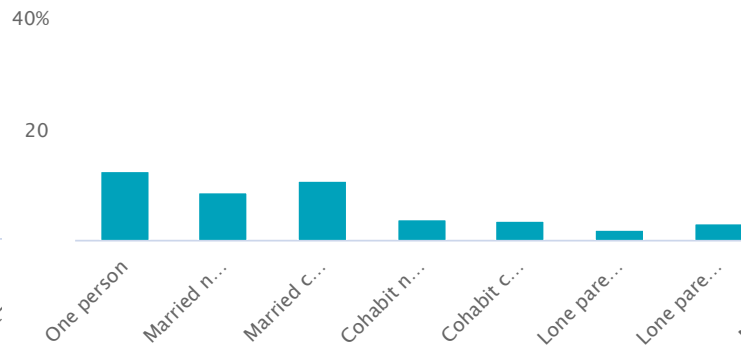

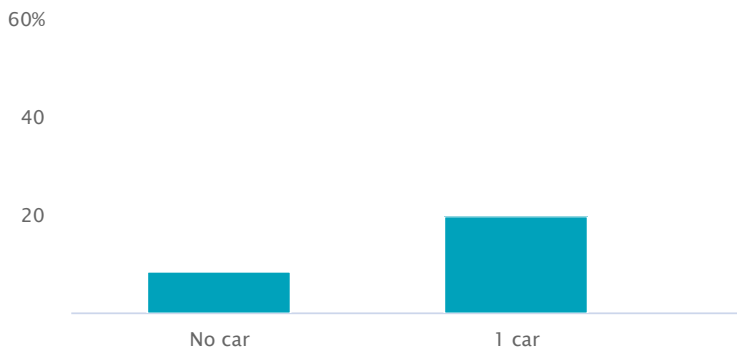

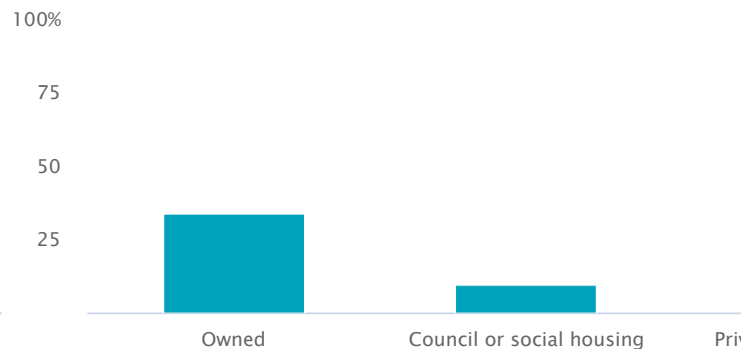

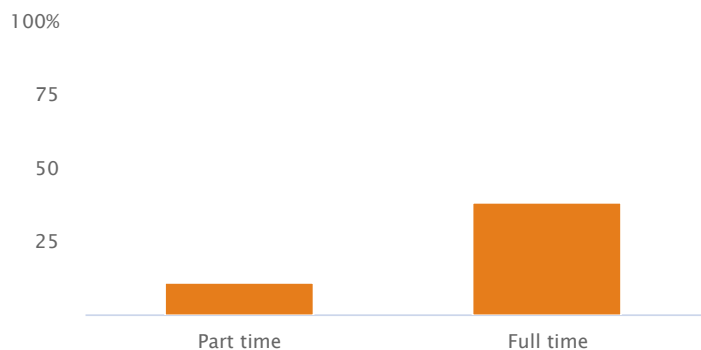

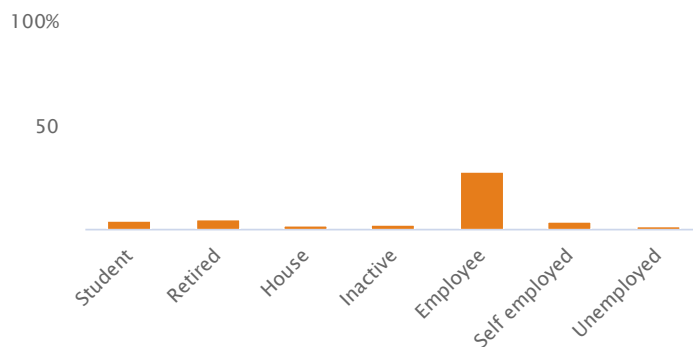
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



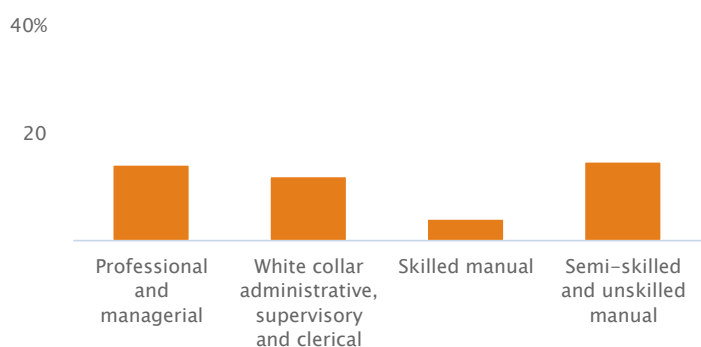
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

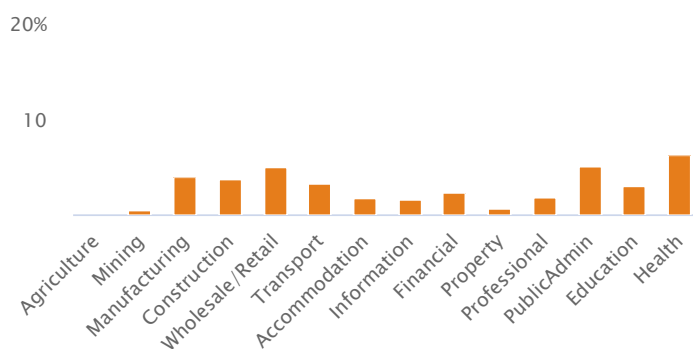

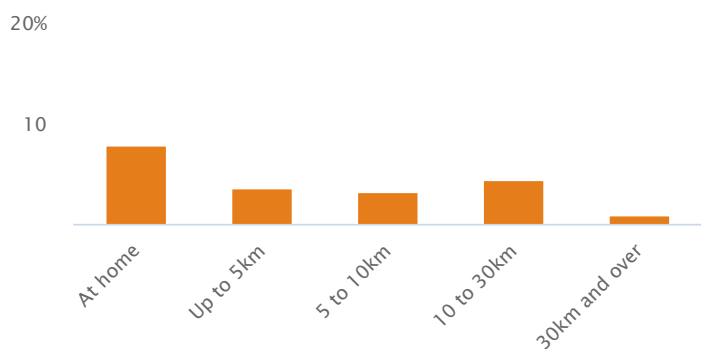
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

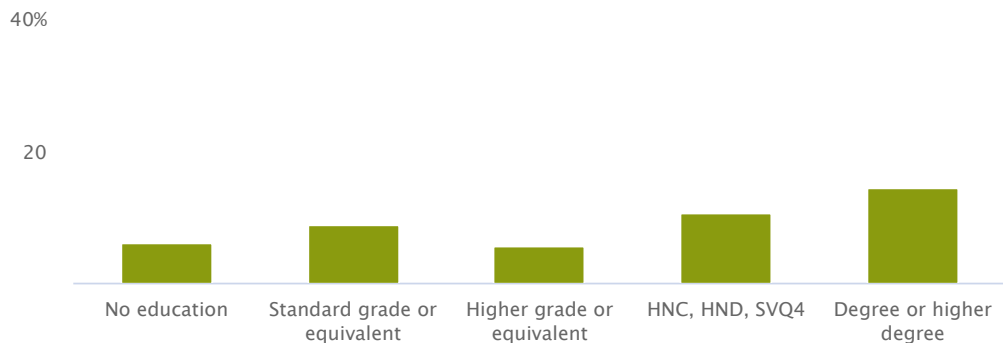


Distance travelled to work

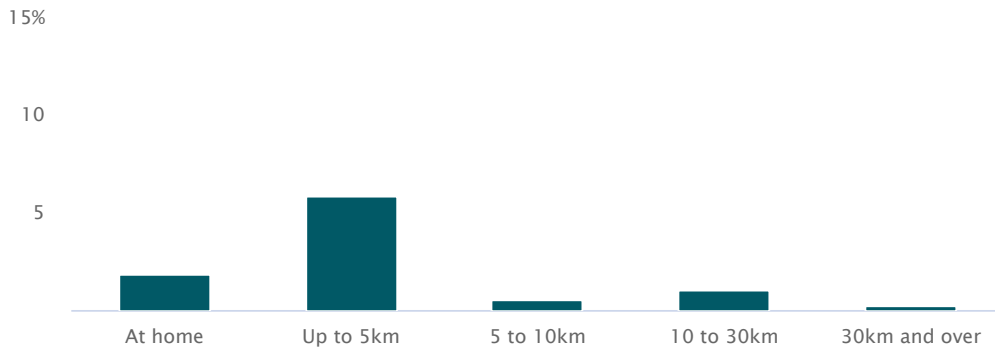
