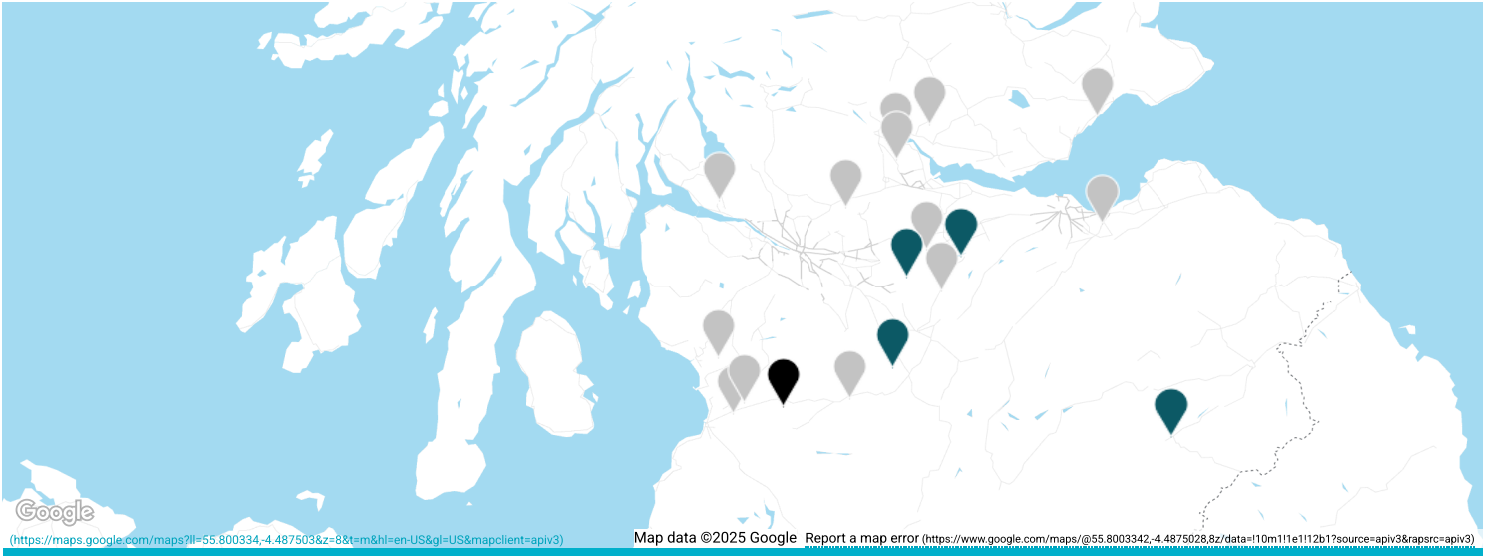




Catrine

EAST AYRSHIRE

POPULATION **2,117**

Catrine in East Ayrshire was established in the late 18th century when a cotton mill was established. The mill was successful and expanded in the early 1800s adding bleaching. It became increasingly mechanised and a new mill was built in the mid 20th century. It closed in the 1970s. Today Glen Catrine Bond have a whisky and vodka bottling plant in the town.

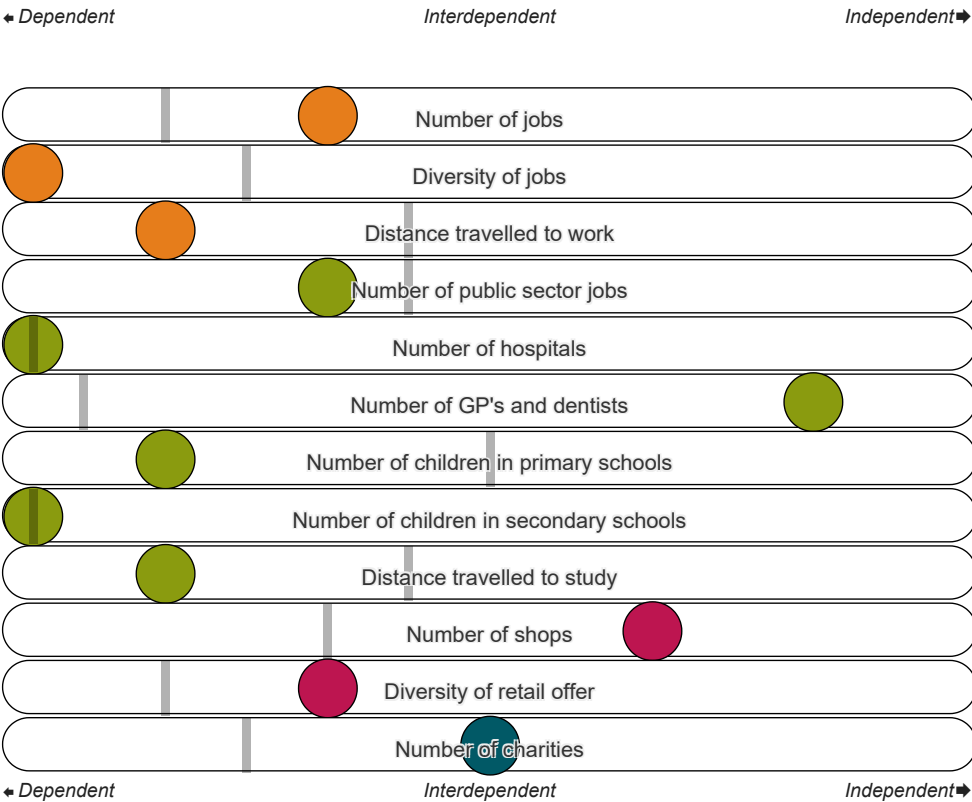
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Catrine is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Catrine is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Catrine is grouped with 17 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, and public sector jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of shops, and GP's and dentists. Catrine differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools; and the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

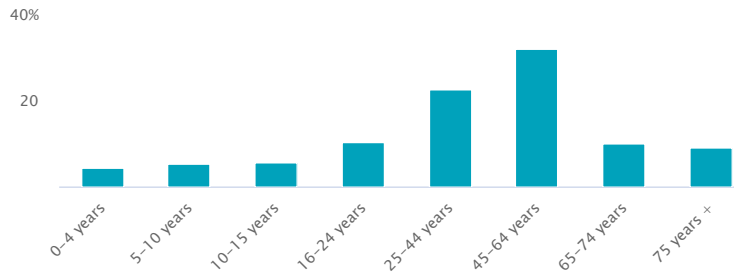

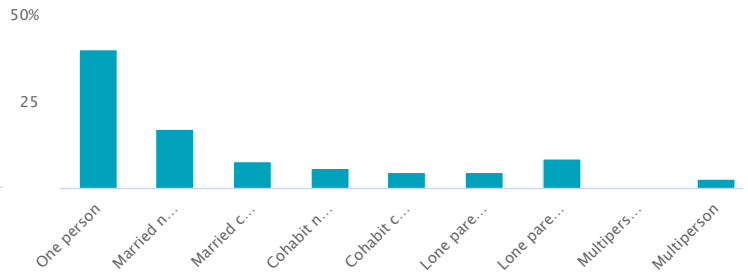

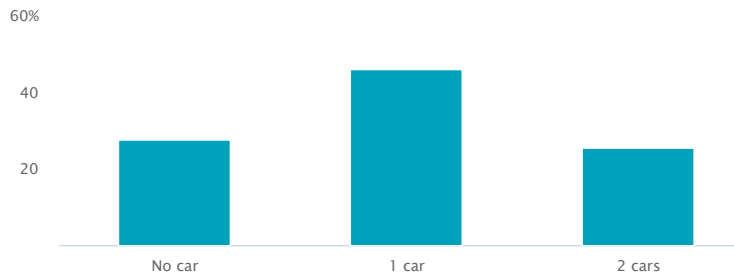

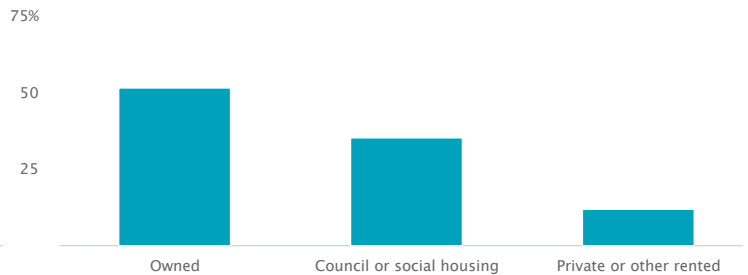

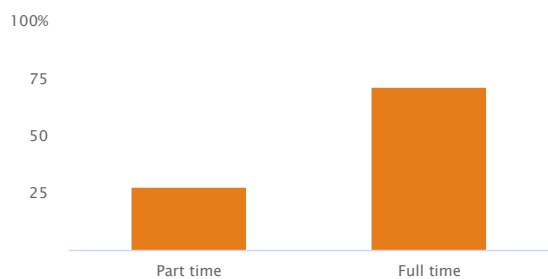

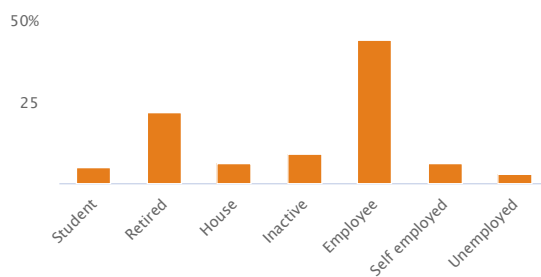
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



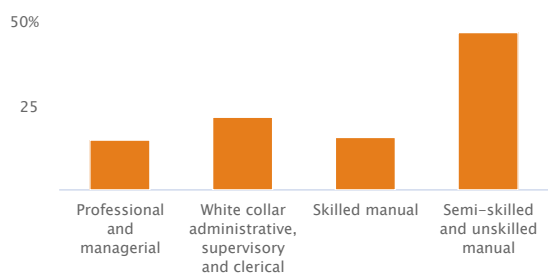
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

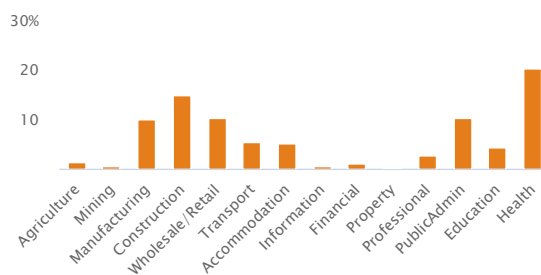

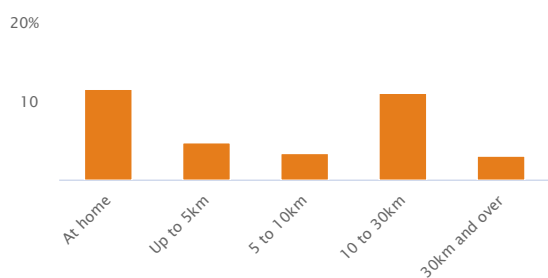
(% households aged 16-64)



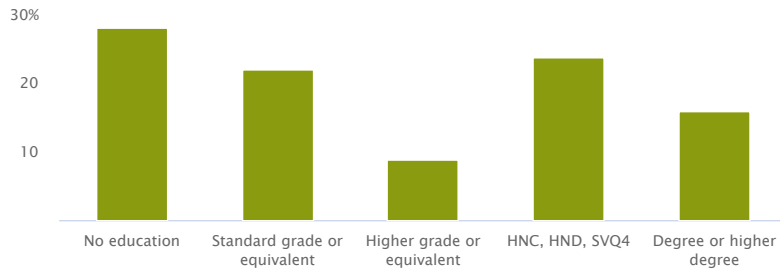
Sector Diversity

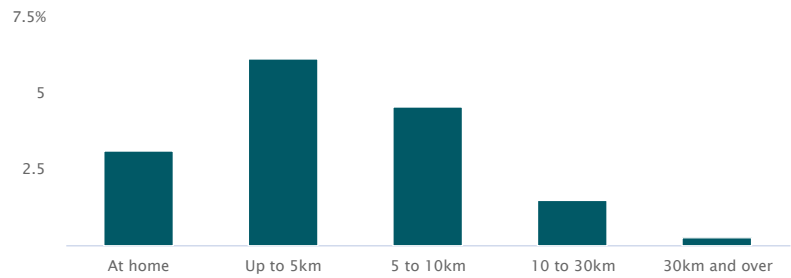
