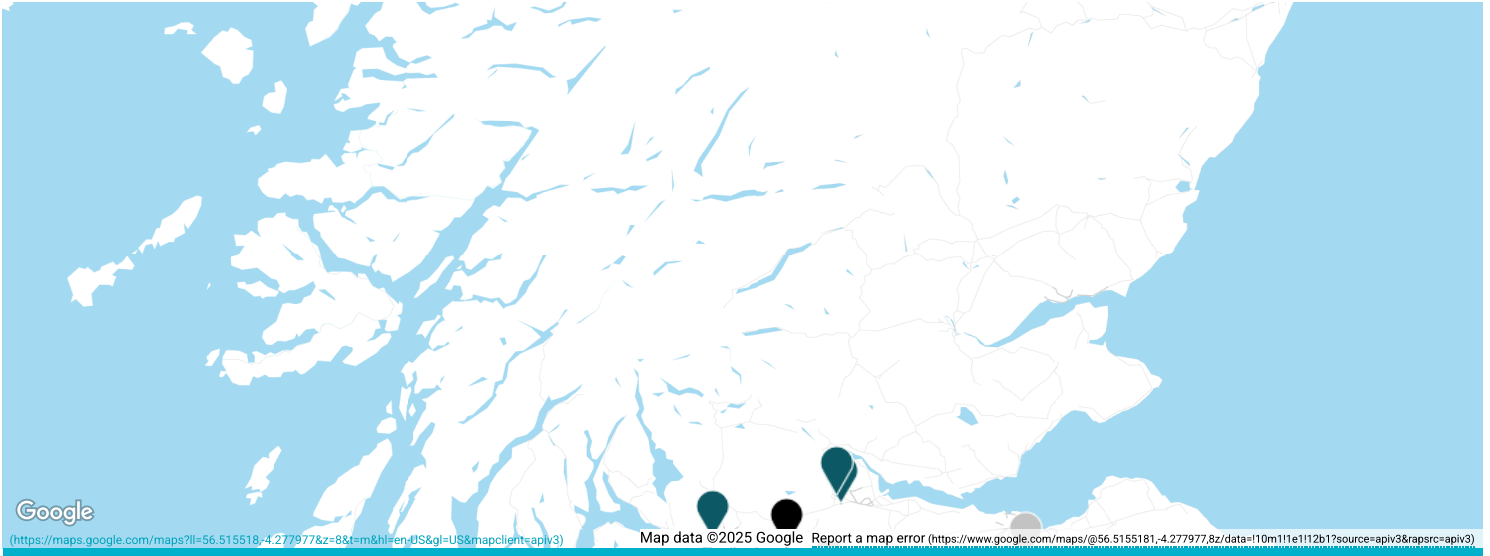




Chryston

Chryston is in North Lanarkshire. Chryston and Muirhead run into each other. Chryston was a former mining town but today is a commuter suburb.

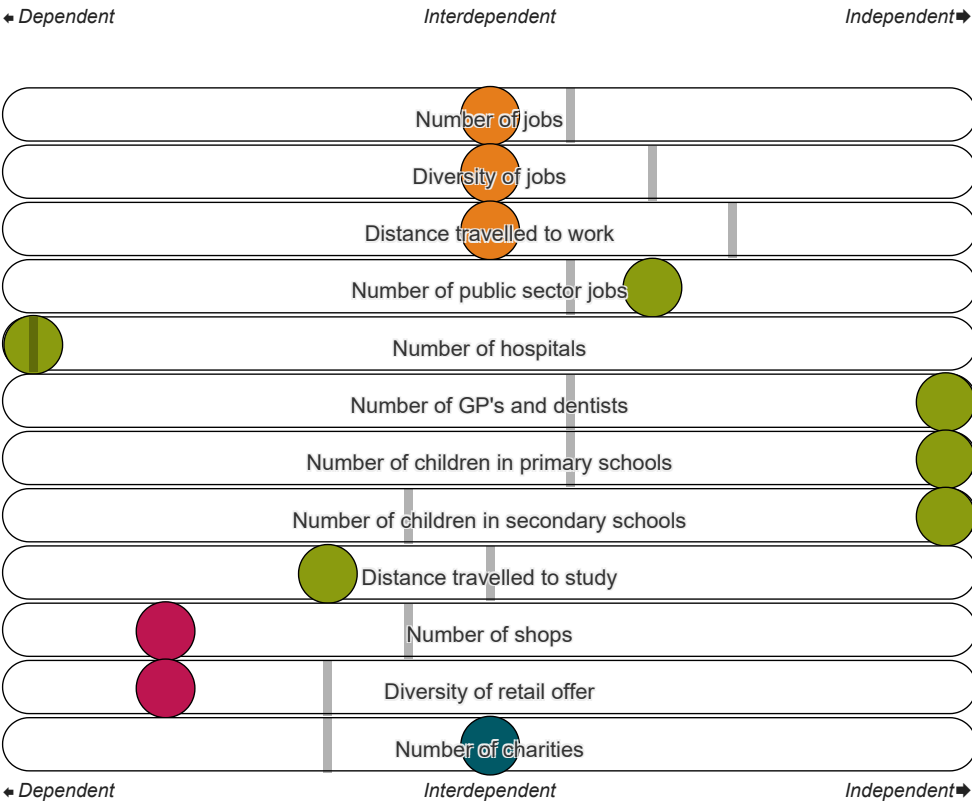
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Chryston is an **interdependent** town.

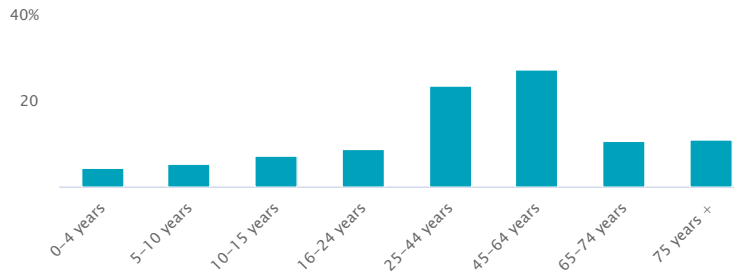

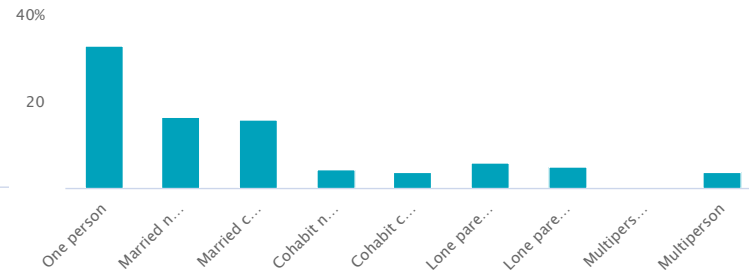

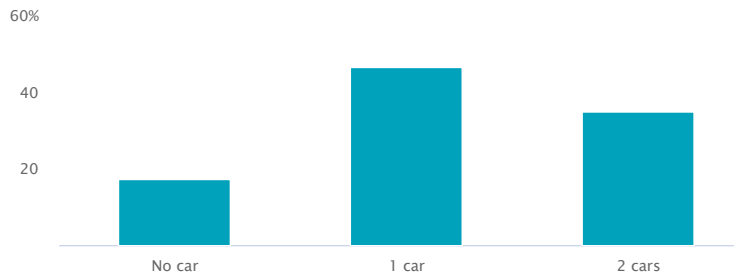

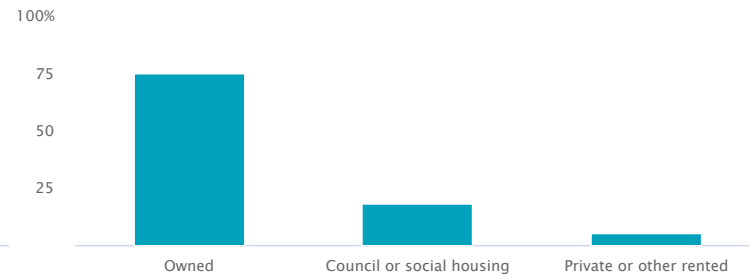

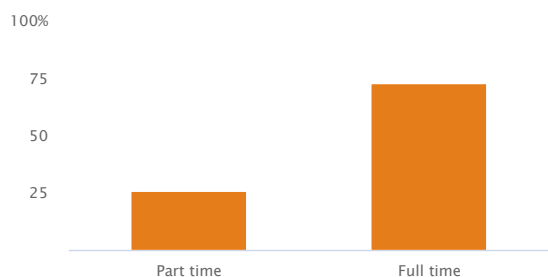

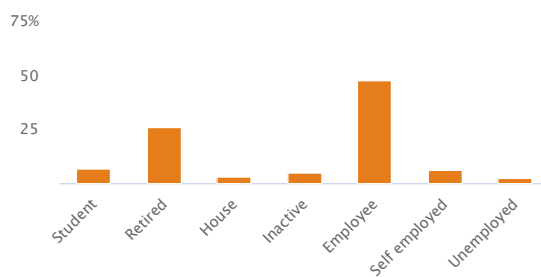
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



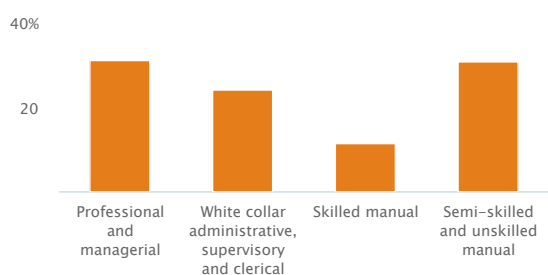
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

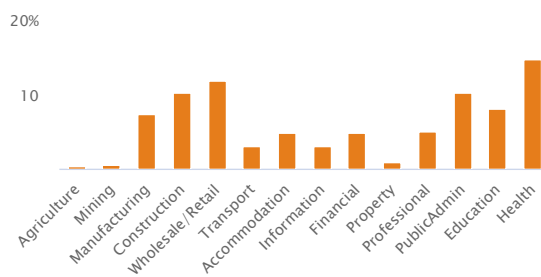

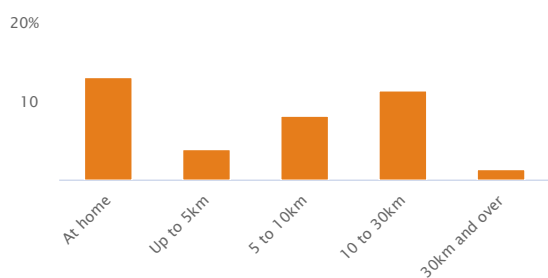
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

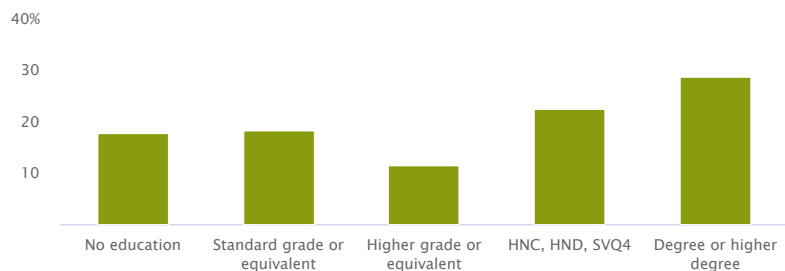


Distance travelled to work

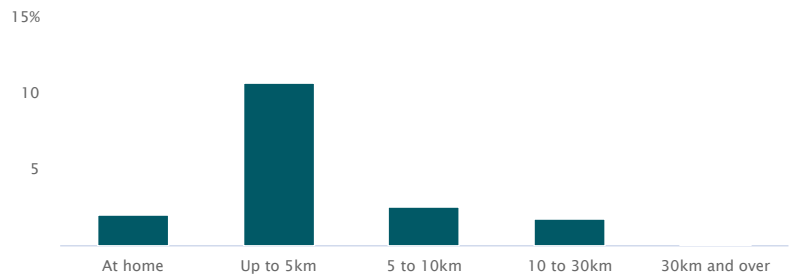
