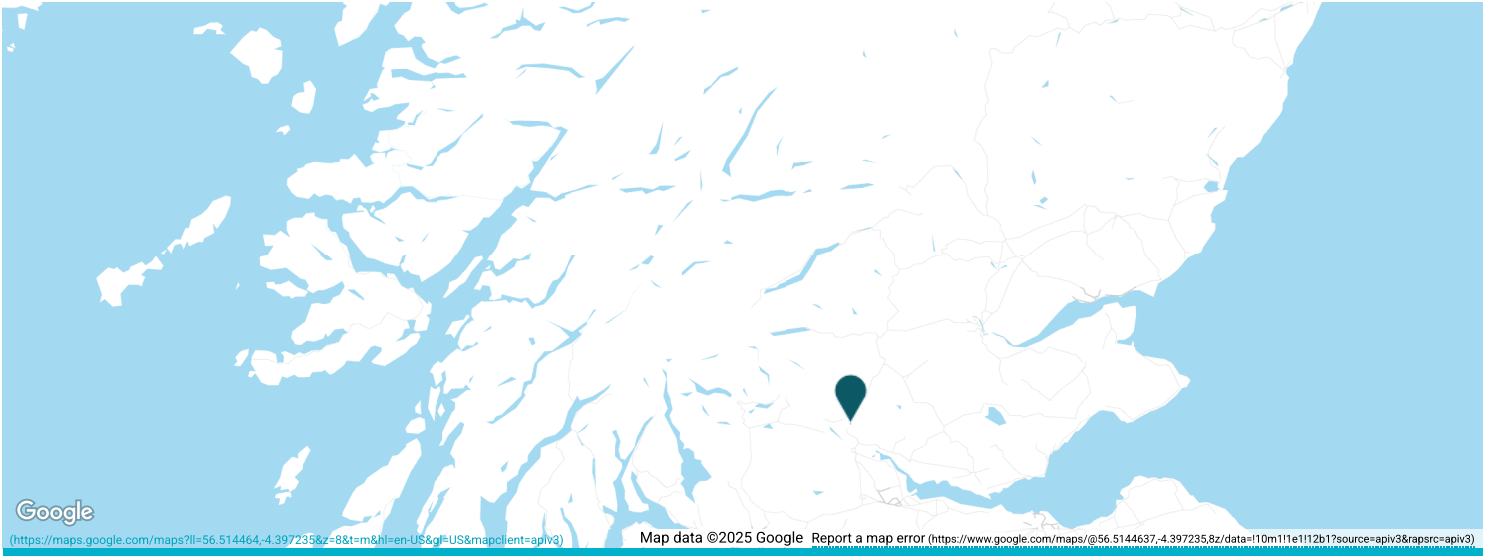




Clarkston

EAST RENFREWSHIRE

POPULATION **9,497**

Clarkston is a suburb of Glasgow although it is located in East Renfrewshire. Its name derives from that of the man who looked after the toll house on the Glasgow to Kilmarnock road. The arrival of the railway in 1866 and the Glasgow tram in the 1920s encouraged its establishment as a suburb.

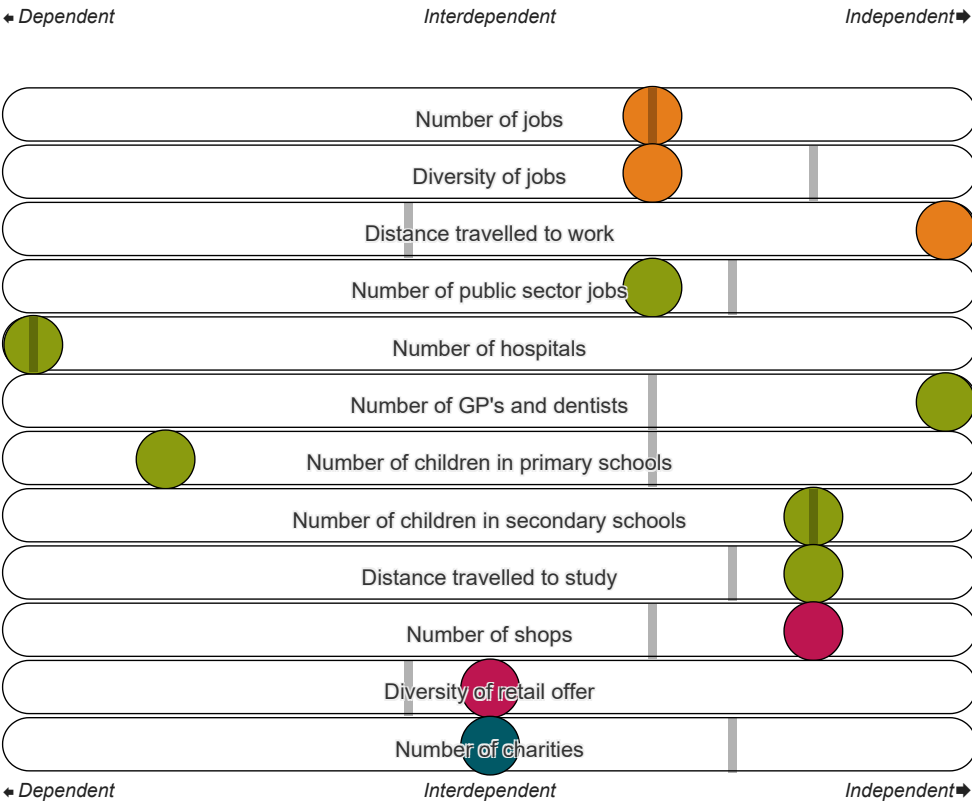
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Clarkston is an interdependent to independent town.

Clarkston is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Clarkston is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Clarkston differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

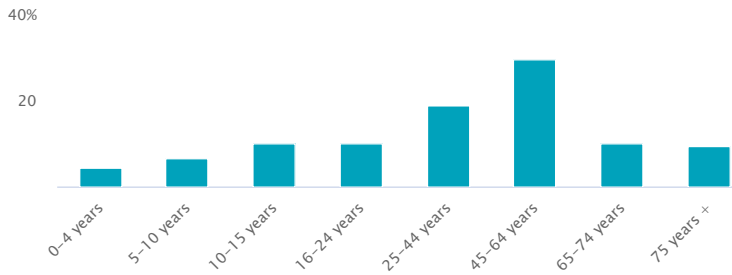

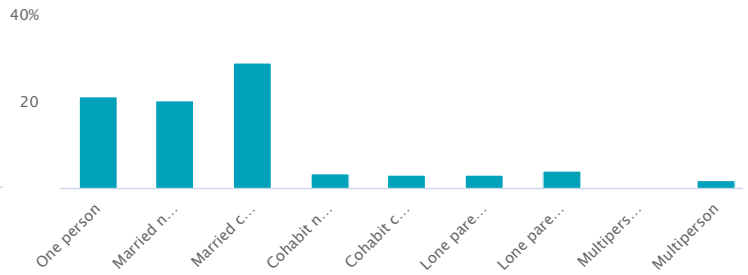

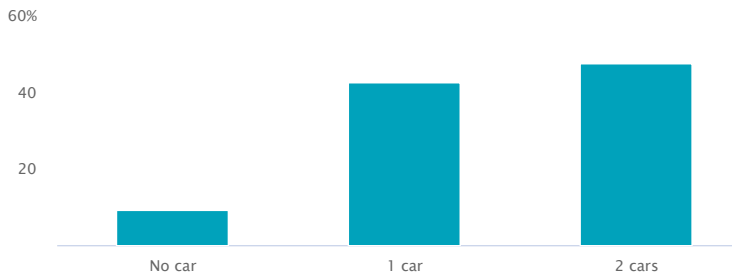

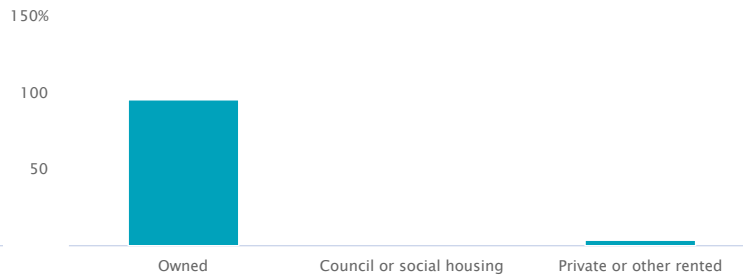

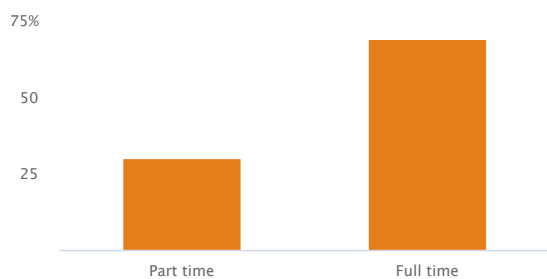

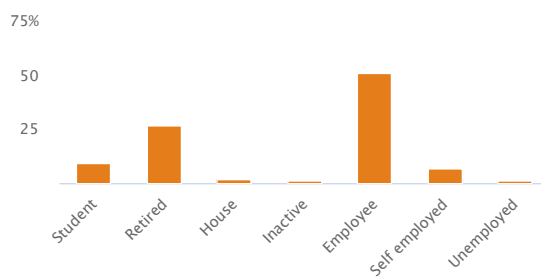
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



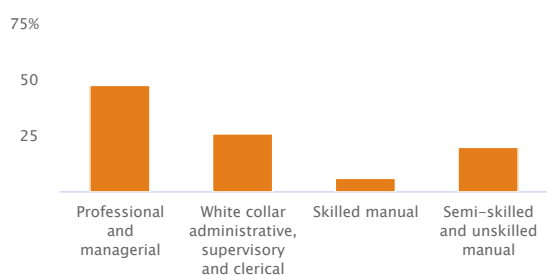
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

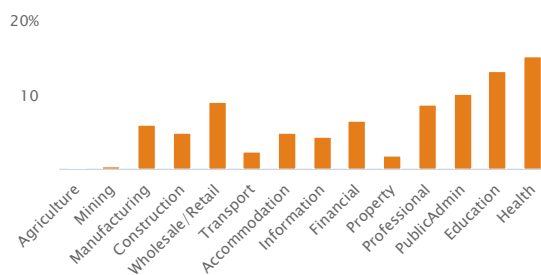


Social Grade

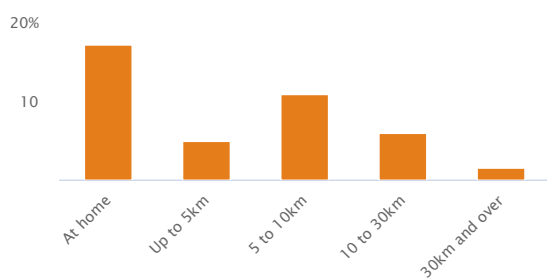
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

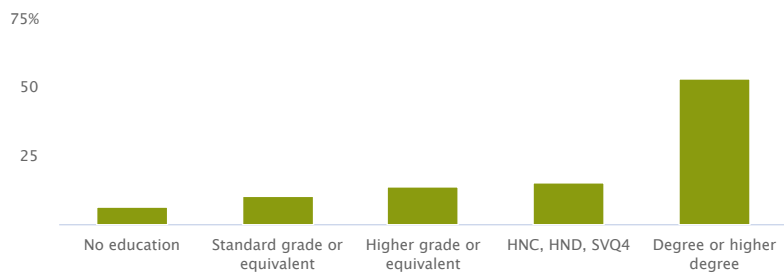


Distance travelled to work

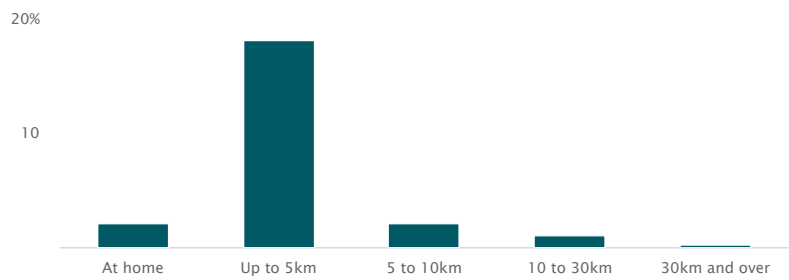
