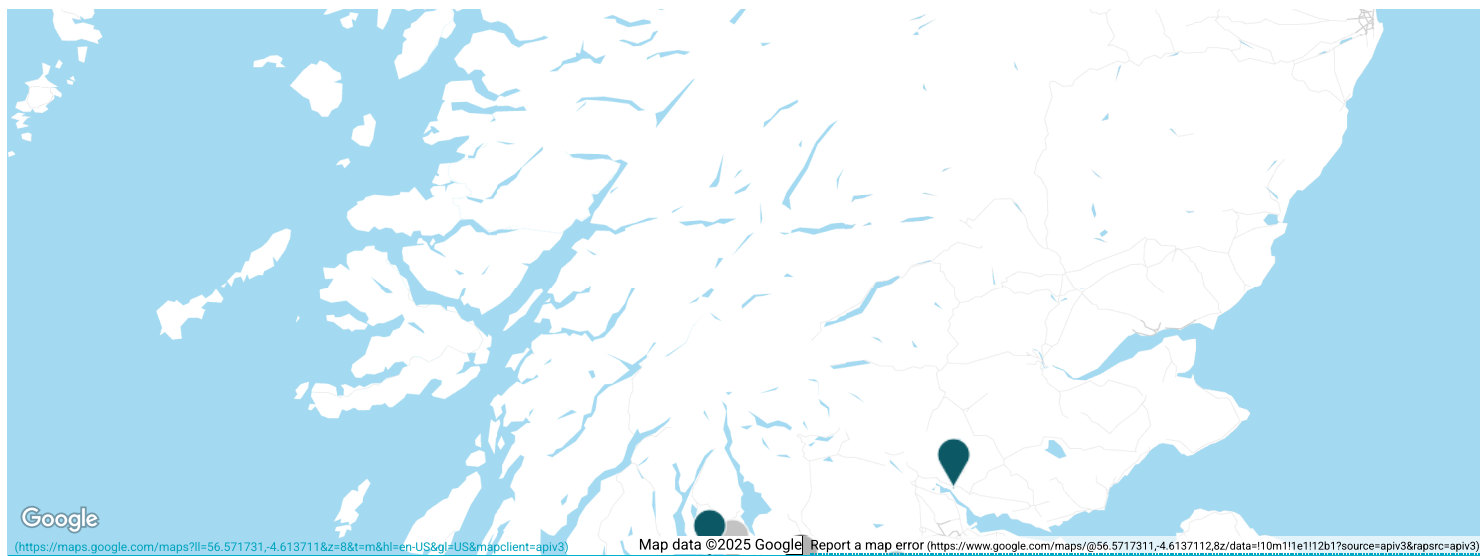




Clydebank

WEST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **26,221**

Clydebank in West Dunbartonshire has a long history as an industrial town. In the 1870s a major shipbuilder was moved from Glasgow port down the Clyde setting up at Clydebank. The company provided housing for the workers. Further industrial and manufacturing jobs arrived thereafter including the Singer sewing machine factory. In WWII the Clydebank blitz destroyed much of Clydebank including industrial buildings. An armaments factory was located in Clydebank. Shipbuilding continued in Clydebank (first as John Brown, then as Upper Clyde Shipbuilders and latterly with a series of owners), closing in 2000. It is associated with Red Clydeside socialist movement.

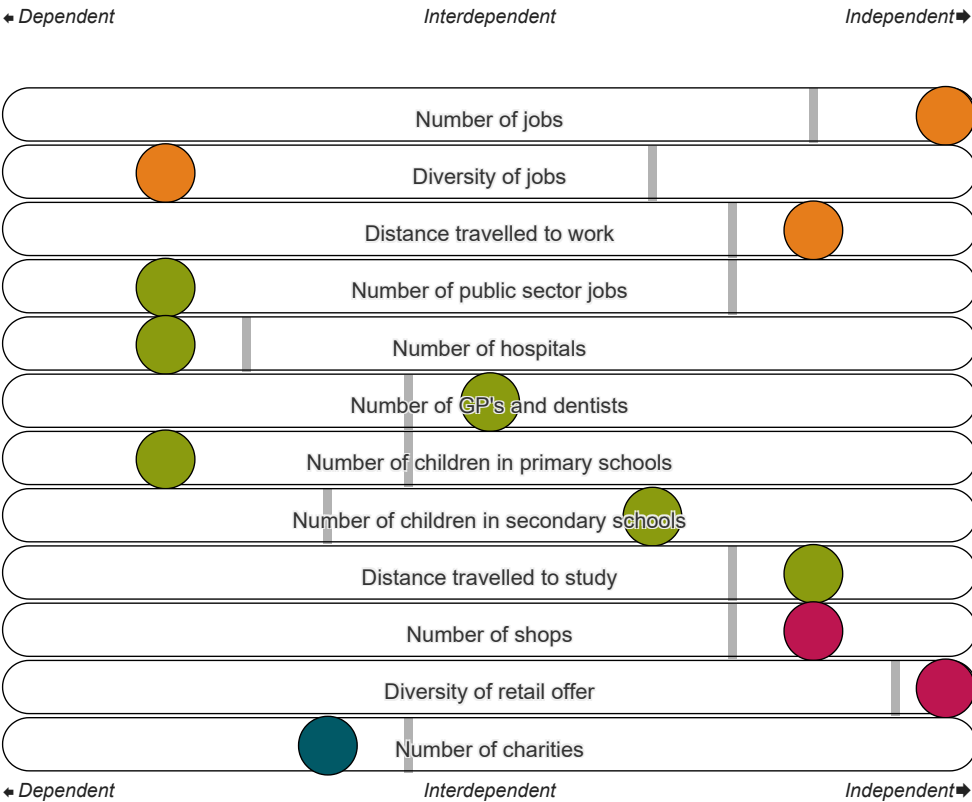
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Clydebank is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Clydebank is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Clydebank is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools. Clydebank differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

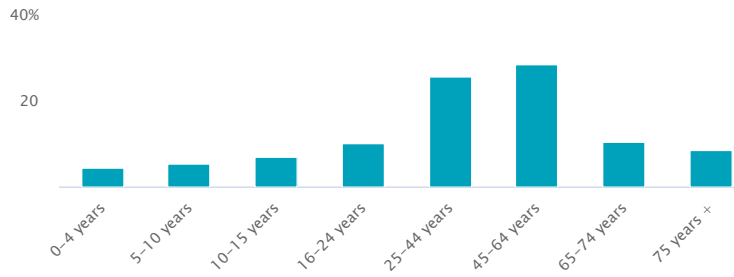

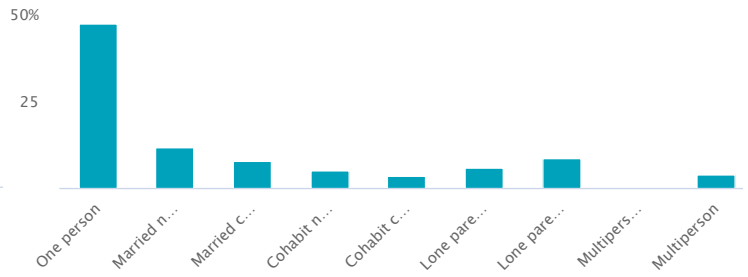

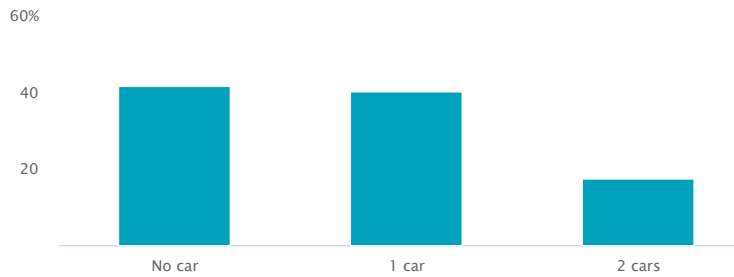

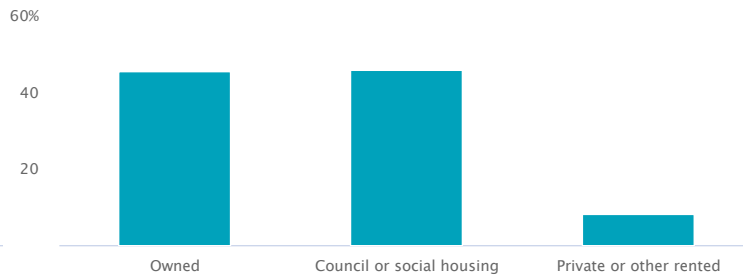

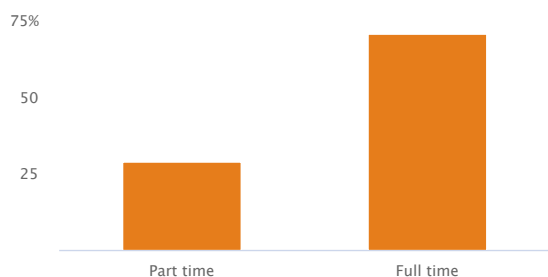

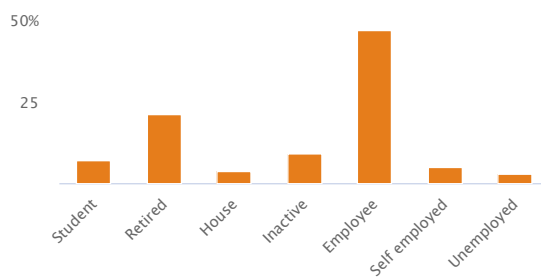
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



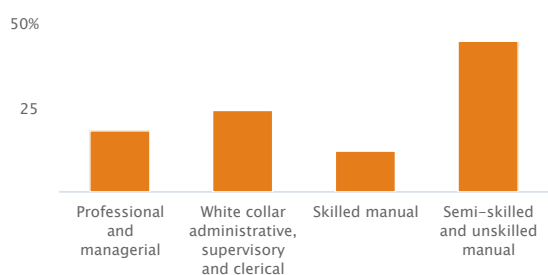
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

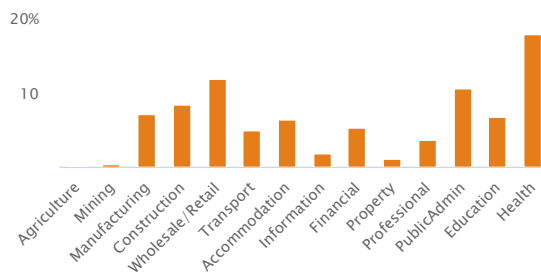


Social Grade

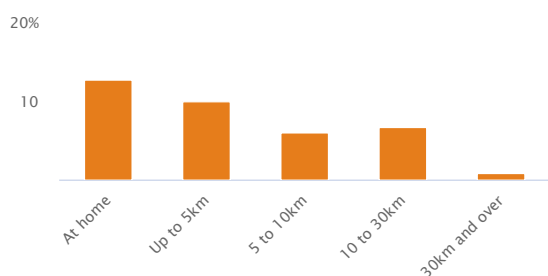
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

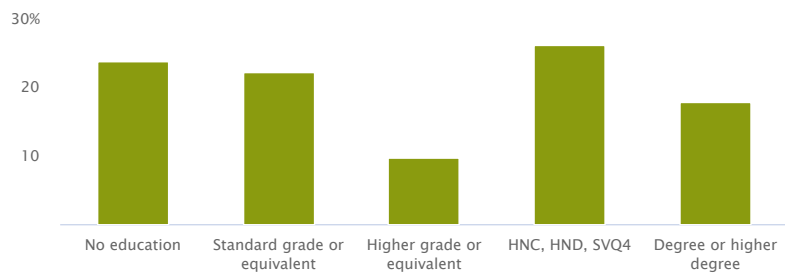


Distance travelled to work

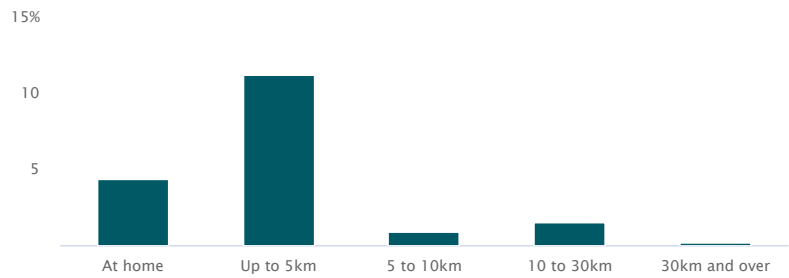
