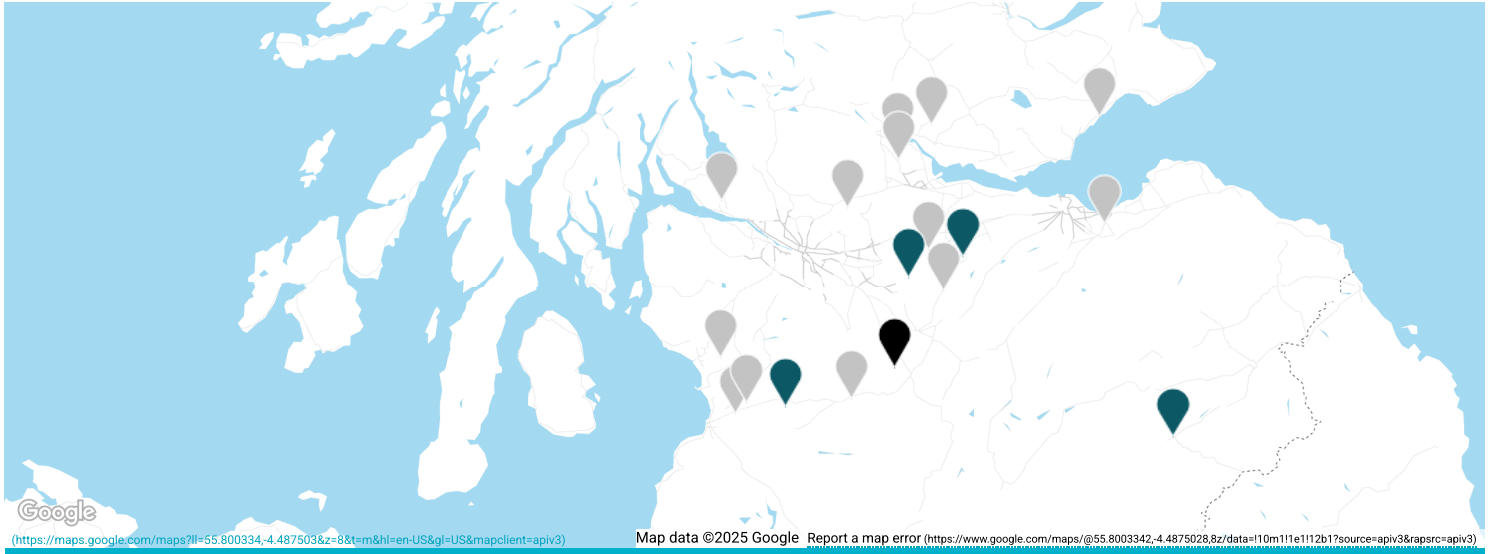




Coalburn

Coalburn is in South Lanarkshire. It developed as a railhead for the surrounding coalfield. Following the closure of the rail link and the mines it fell into decline.

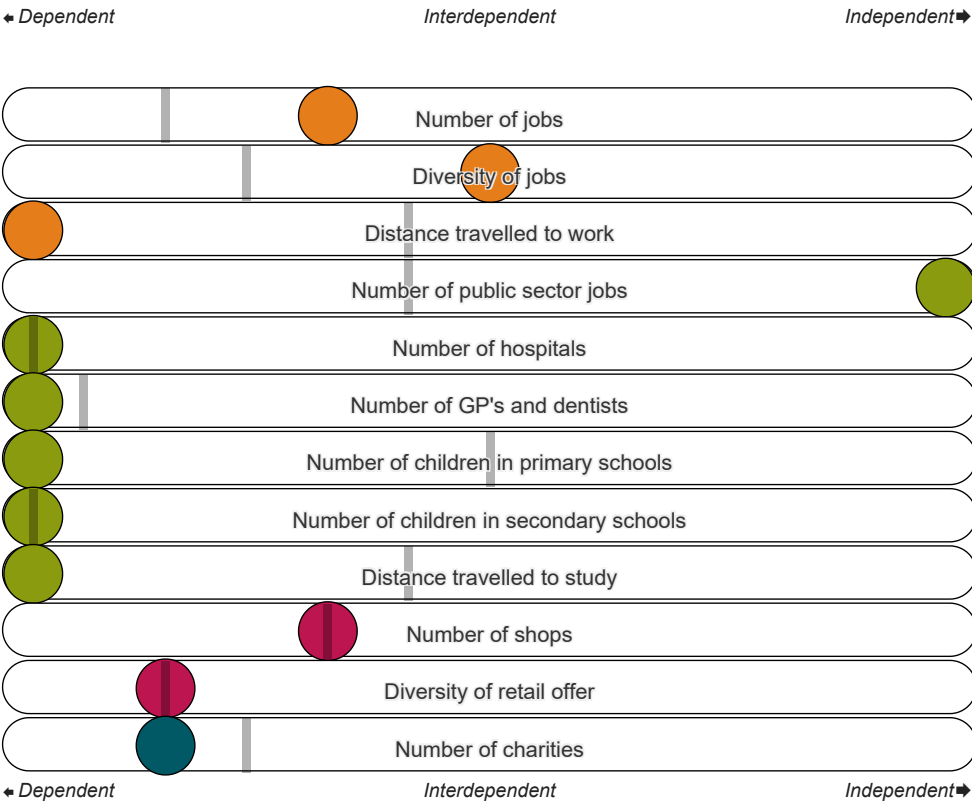
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Coalburn is a dependent to interdependent town.

Coalburn is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Coalburn is grouped with 17 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Coalburn differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools; and the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

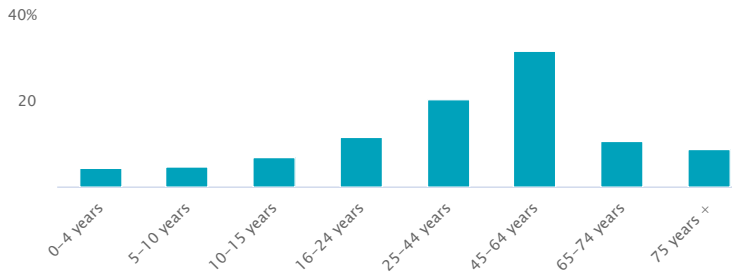
Population change 2011 to 2022

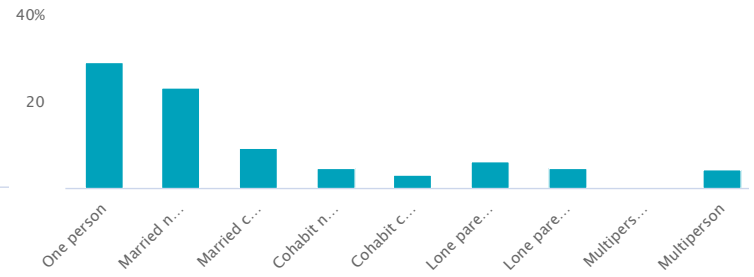

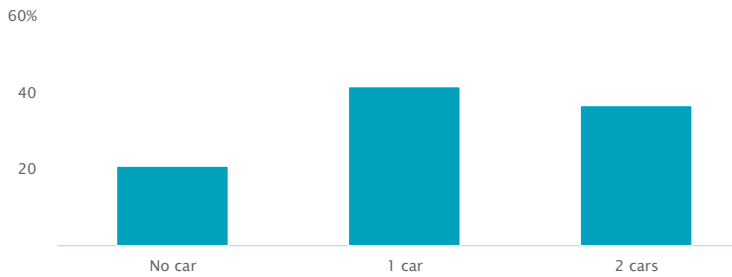

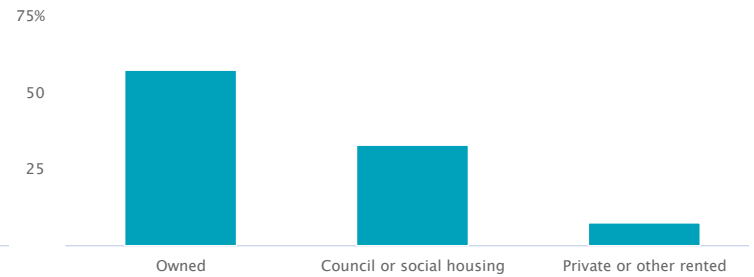
Household composition

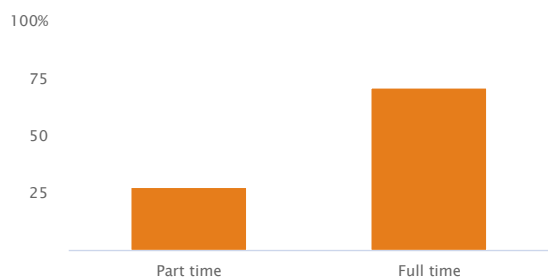

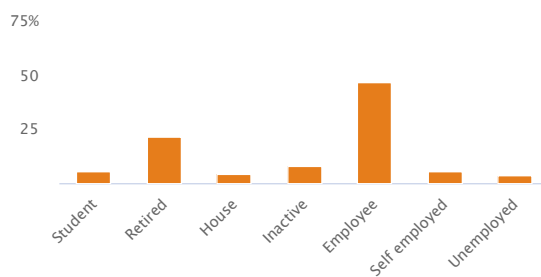
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



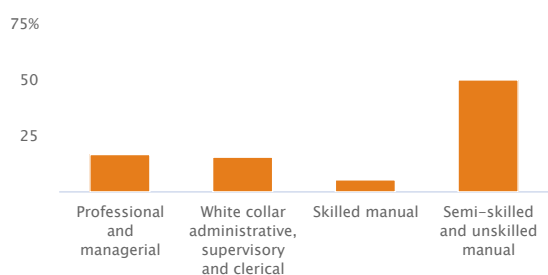
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

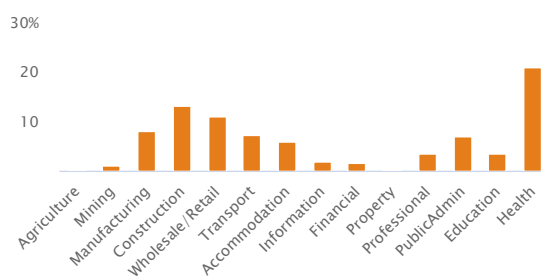


Social Grade

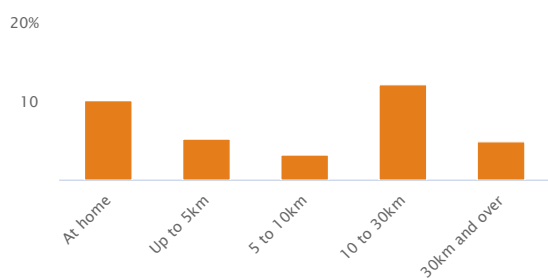
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

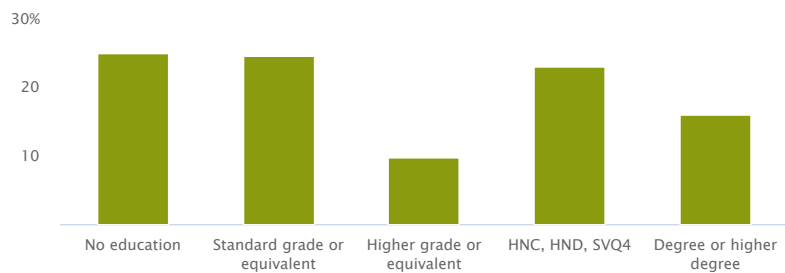


Distance travelled to work

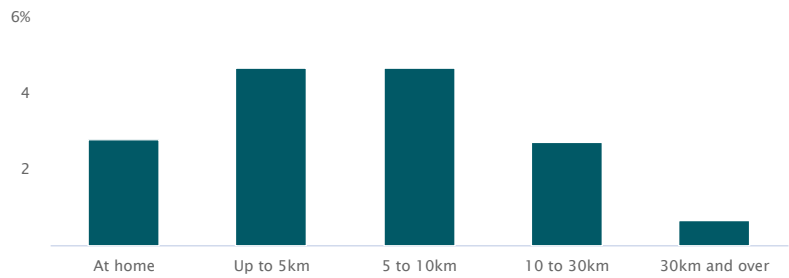
