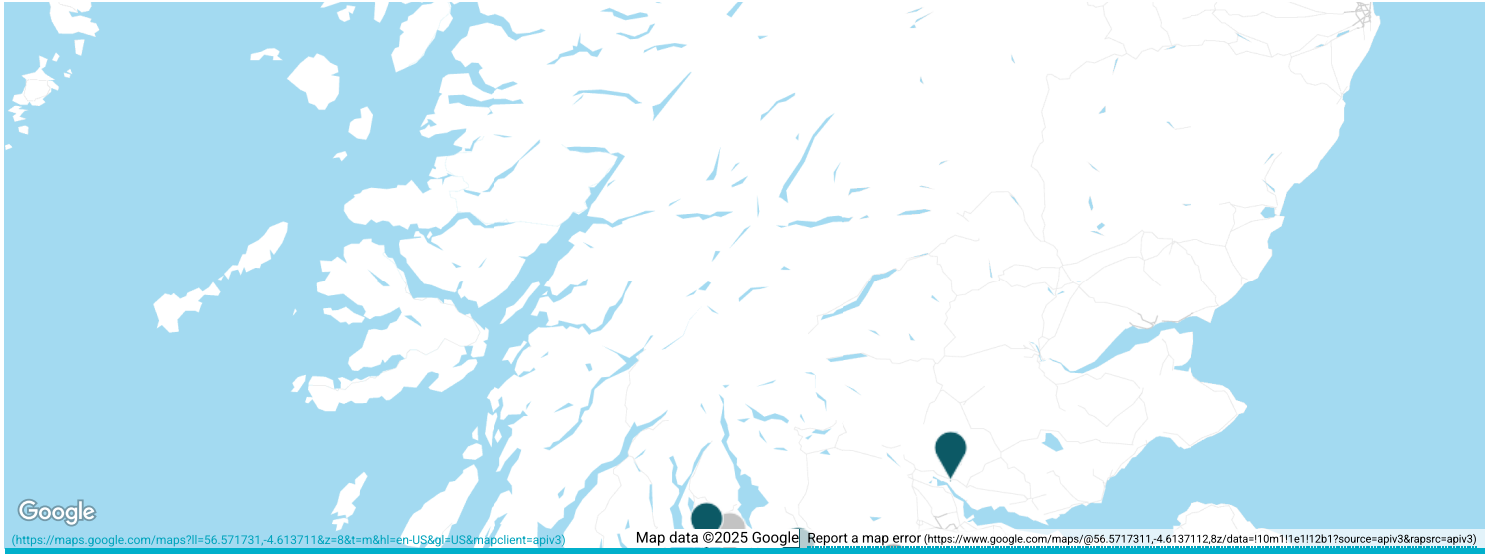




Coatbridge

NORTH LANARKSHIRE

POPULATION **42,264**

Coatbridge in North Lanarkshire developed as an industrial town sometimes called the 'Iron Burgh'. It was known for its blast furnaces in the 19th century and early 20th century but the plant moved to Corby and shipbuilding demand for iron was declining. The remaining furnace closed in the late 1960s. Today it is a post industrial town benefitting from its proximity to Glasgow for employment.

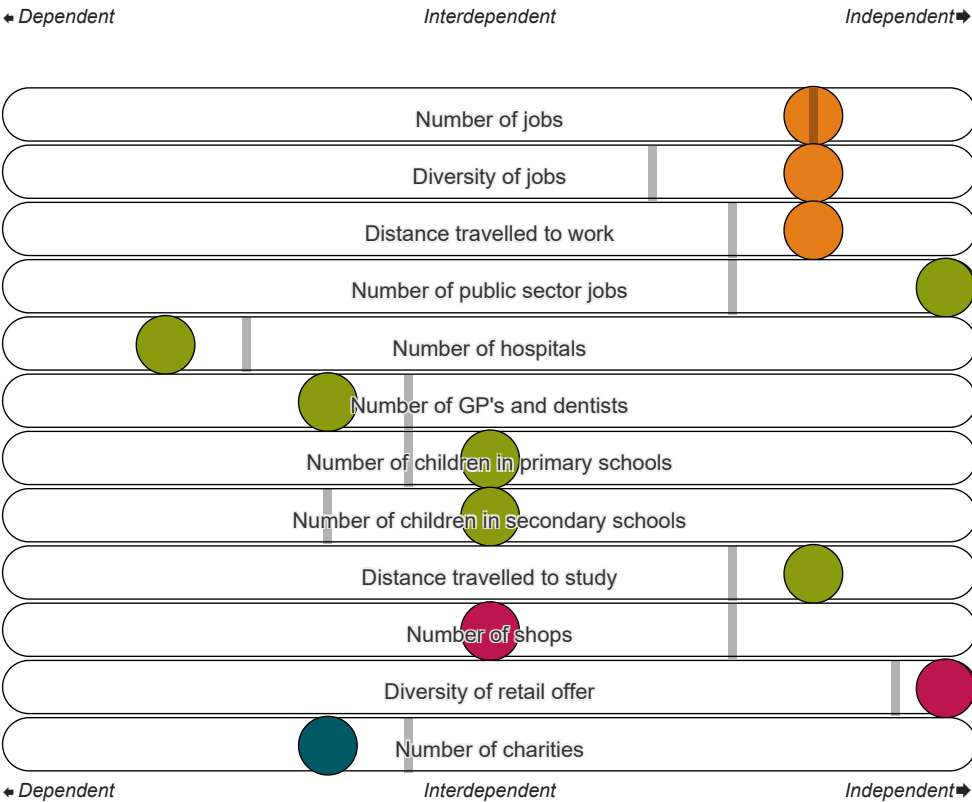
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Coatbridge is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Coatbridge is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Coatbridge is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

Coatbridge differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

Population change 2011 to 2022**-4%**

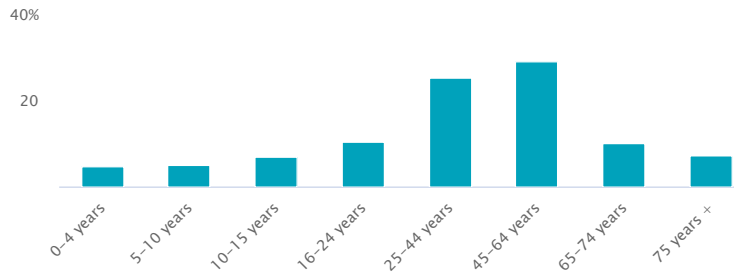

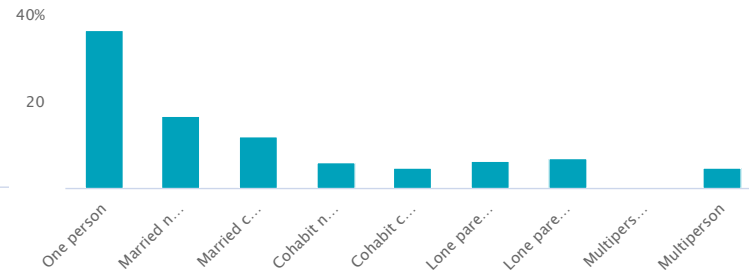

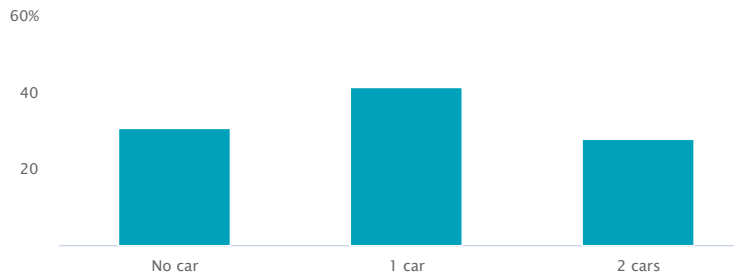

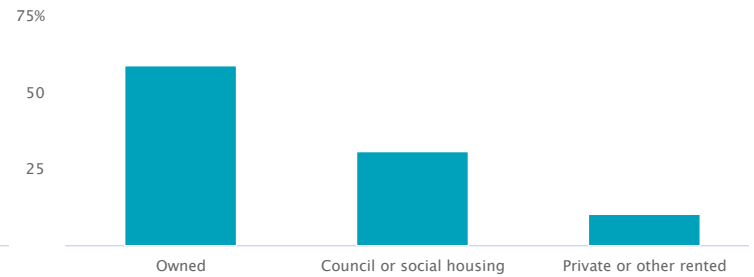
Household composition

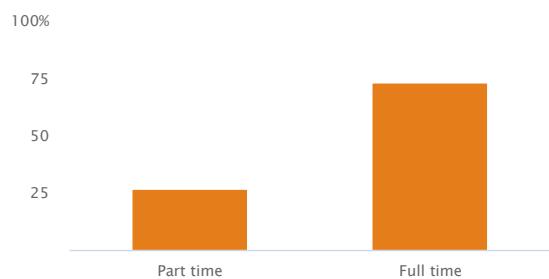

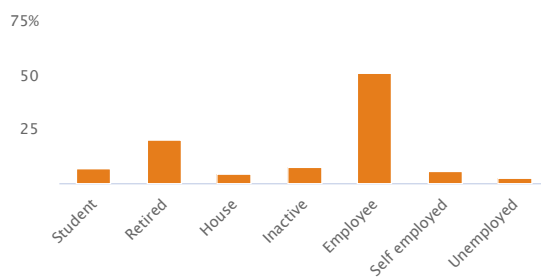
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



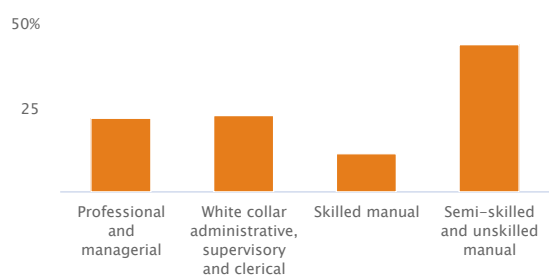
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

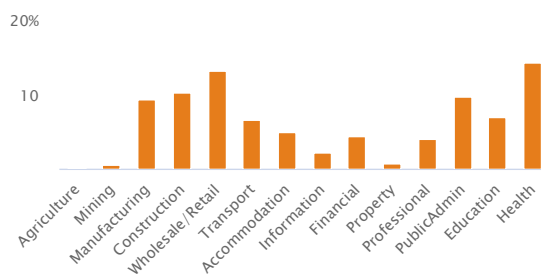


Social Grade

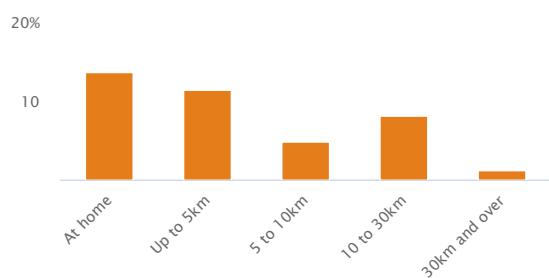
(% households aged 16-64)



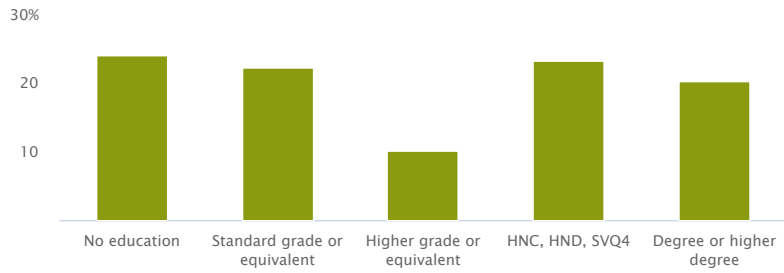
Sector Diversity

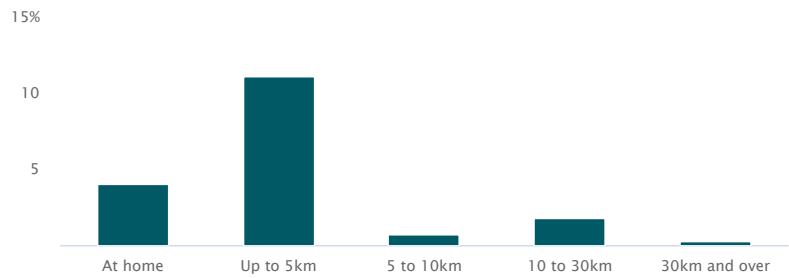
