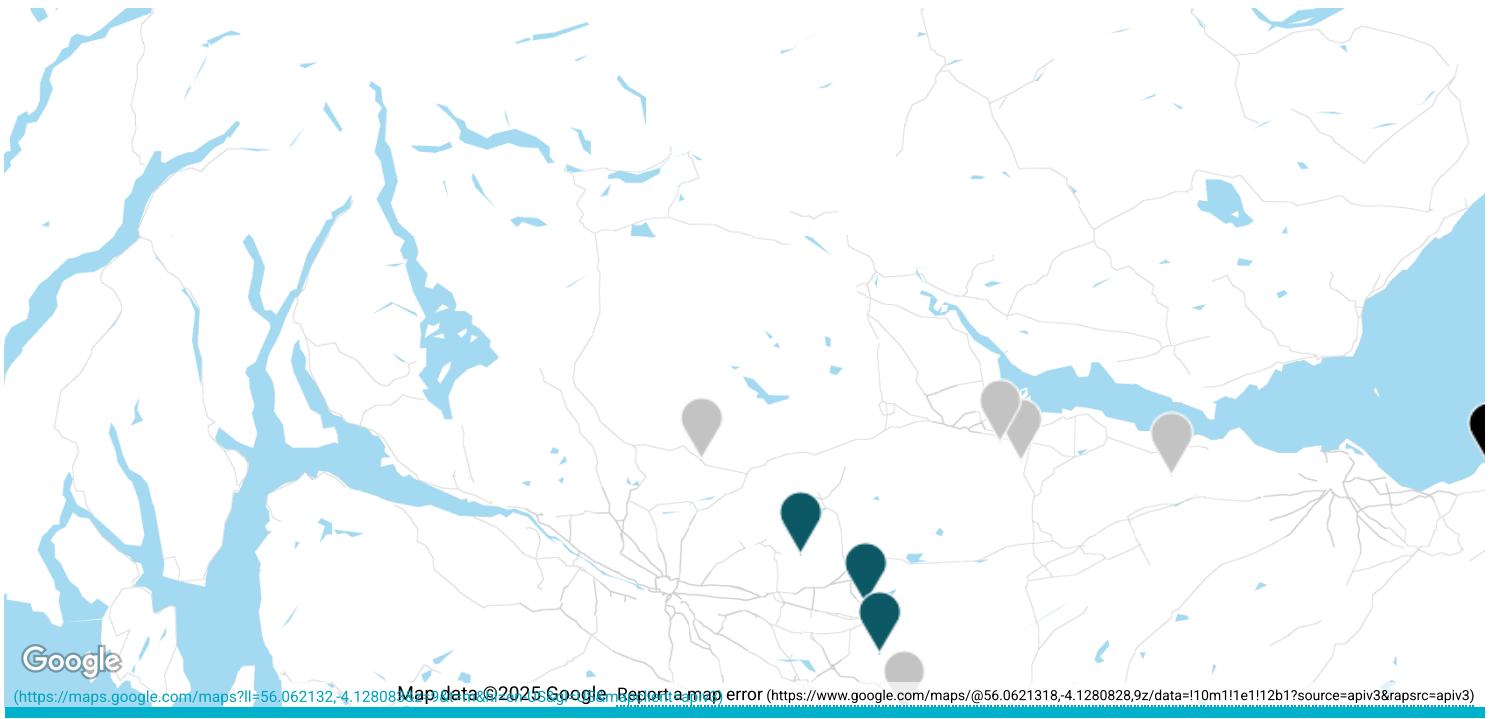




Cockenzie

Cockenzie in East Lothian was a 17th century fishing and whaling village with the port known as Port Seton. Mining saw the town expand. The coal fired Cockenzie power station closed in 2013. Today the town is a commuter settlement for Edinburgh.

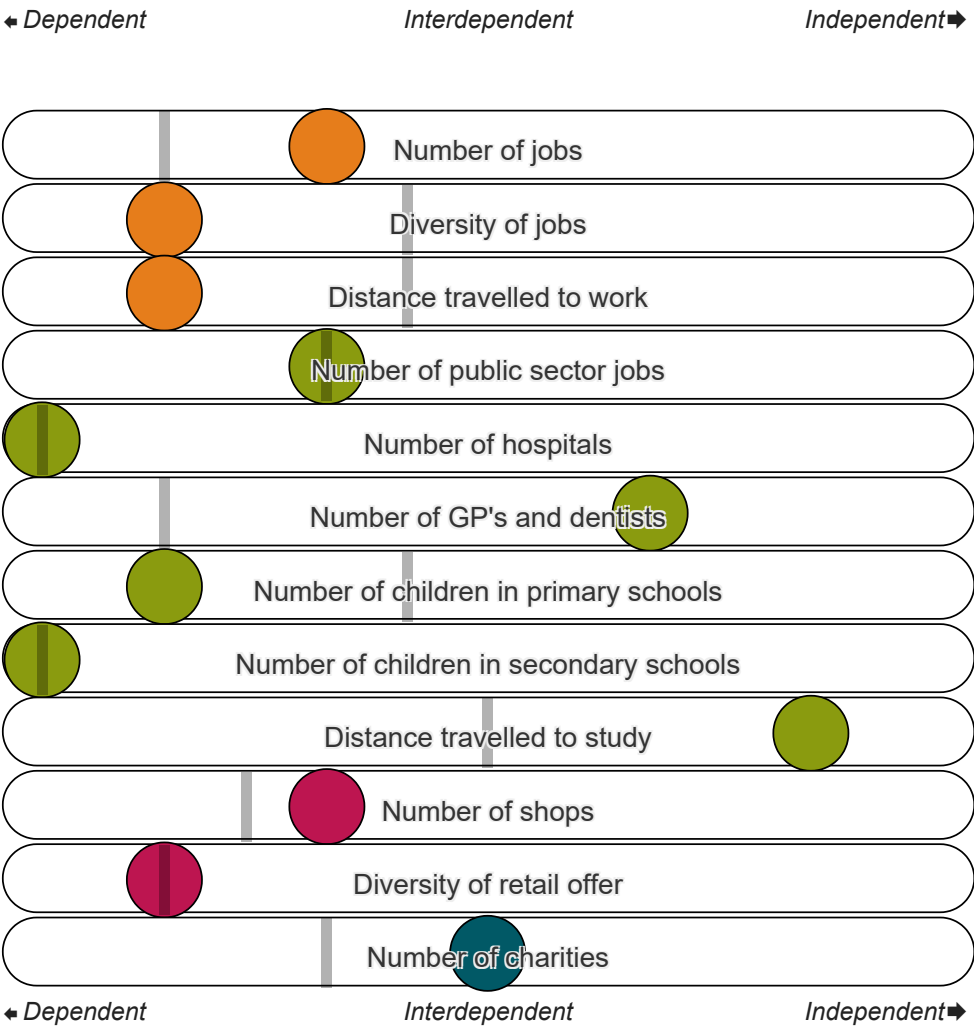
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Cockenzie is a dependent to interdependent town.

Cockenzie is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Cockenzie is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Cockenzie differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

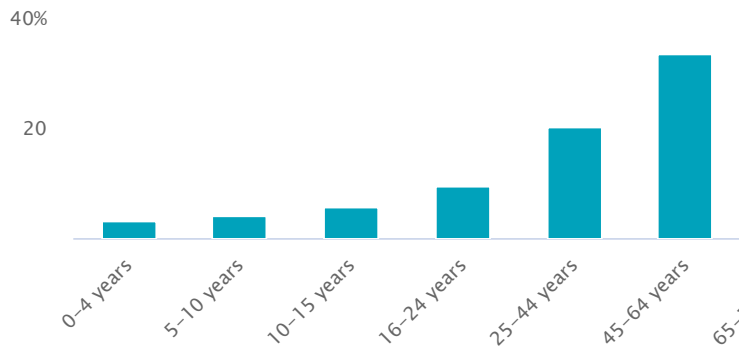

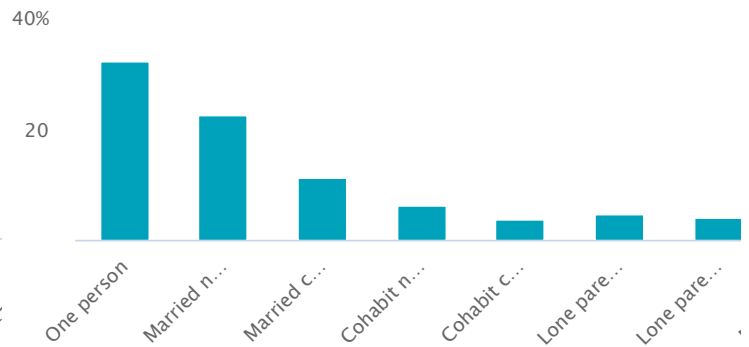

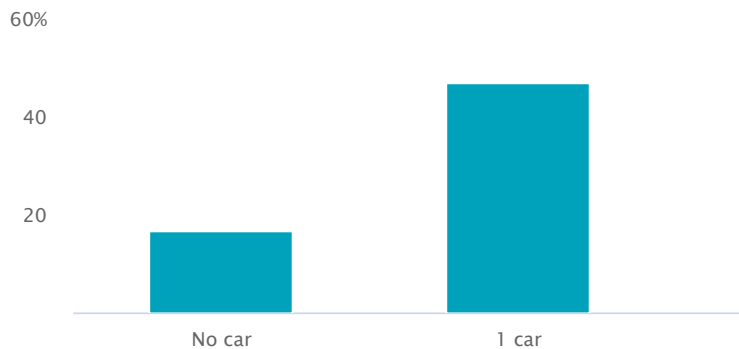

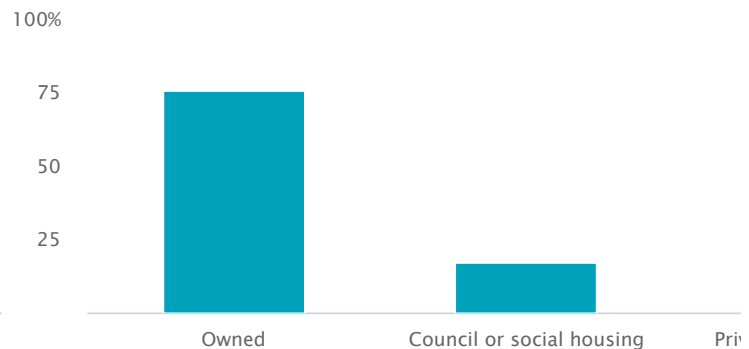
Household composition

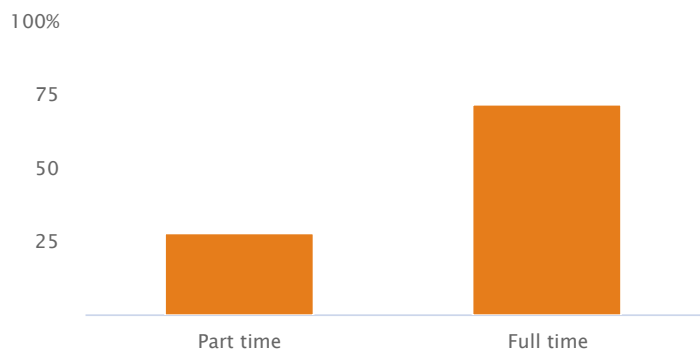

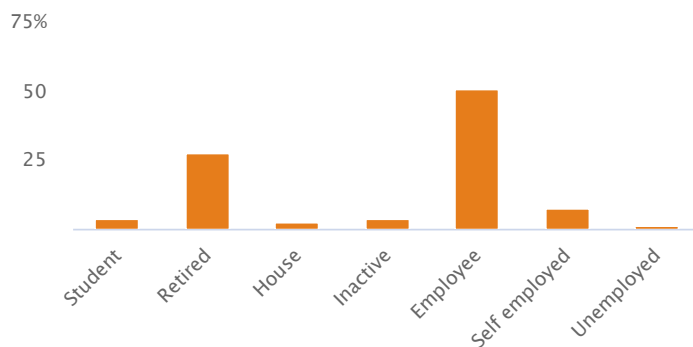
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



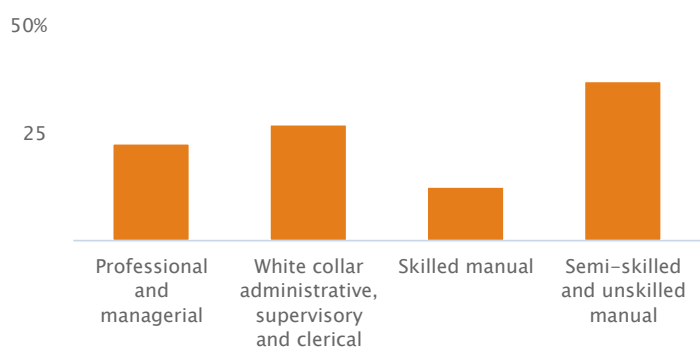
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

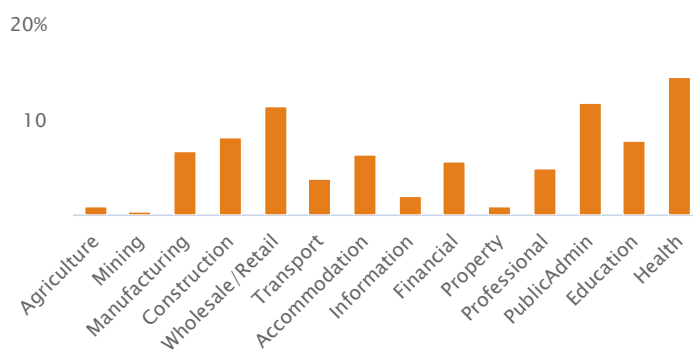


Social Grade

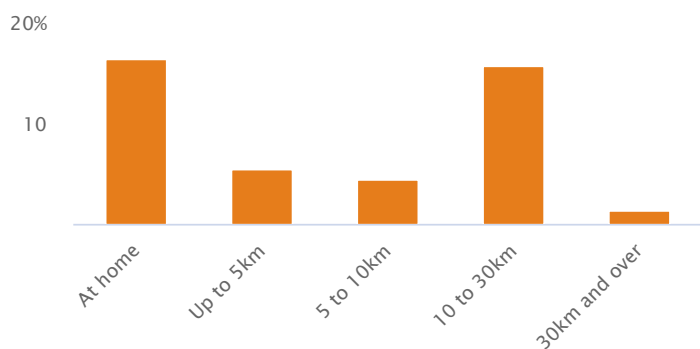
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

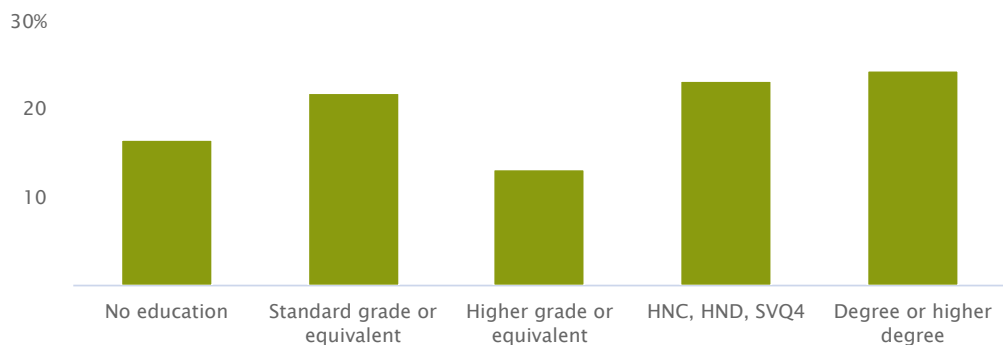


Distance travelled to work

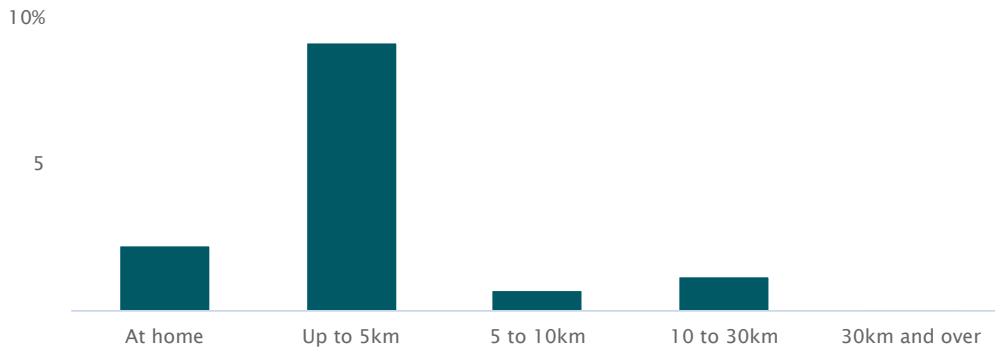
