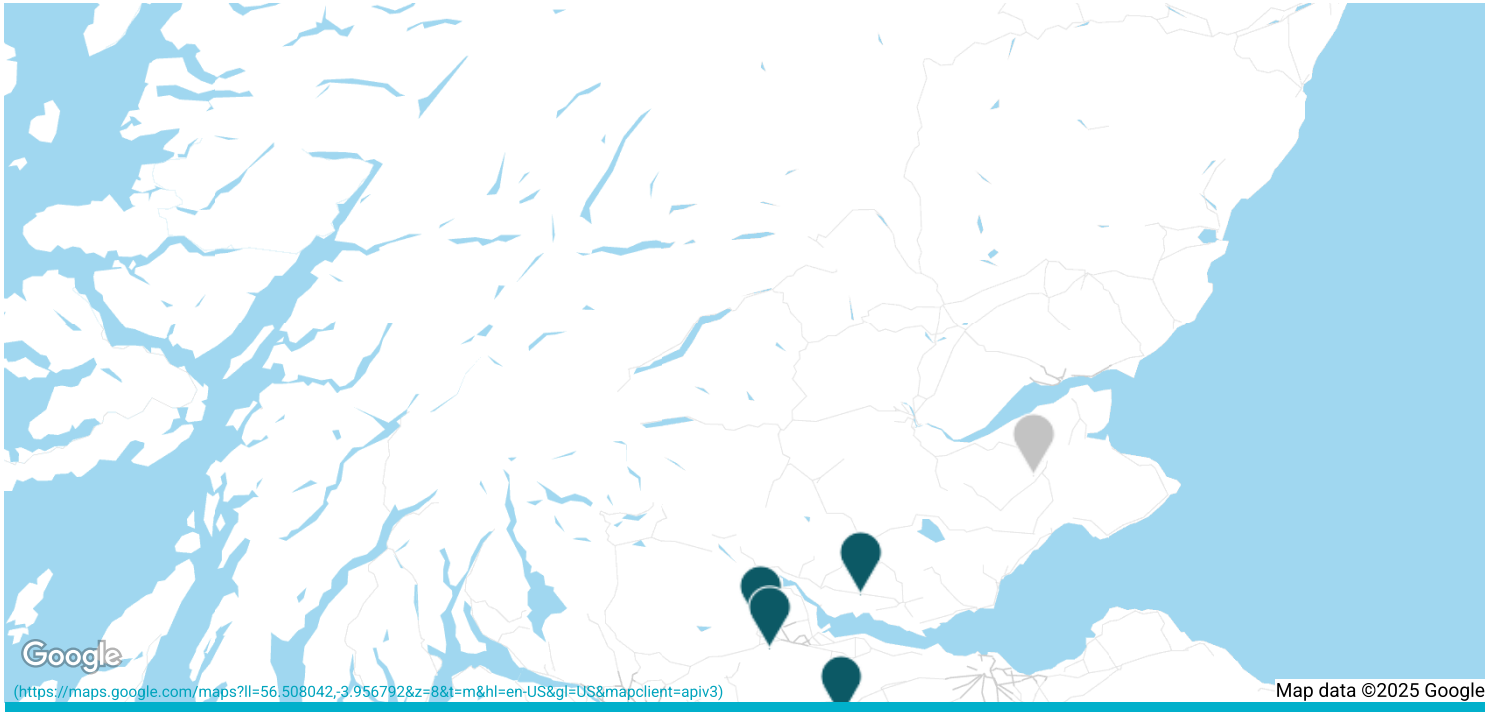




Countesswells

Countesswells has emerged since 2014 as a greenfield suburban town in an agricultural area close to Aberdeen. There is a variety of new housing and building is ongoing.

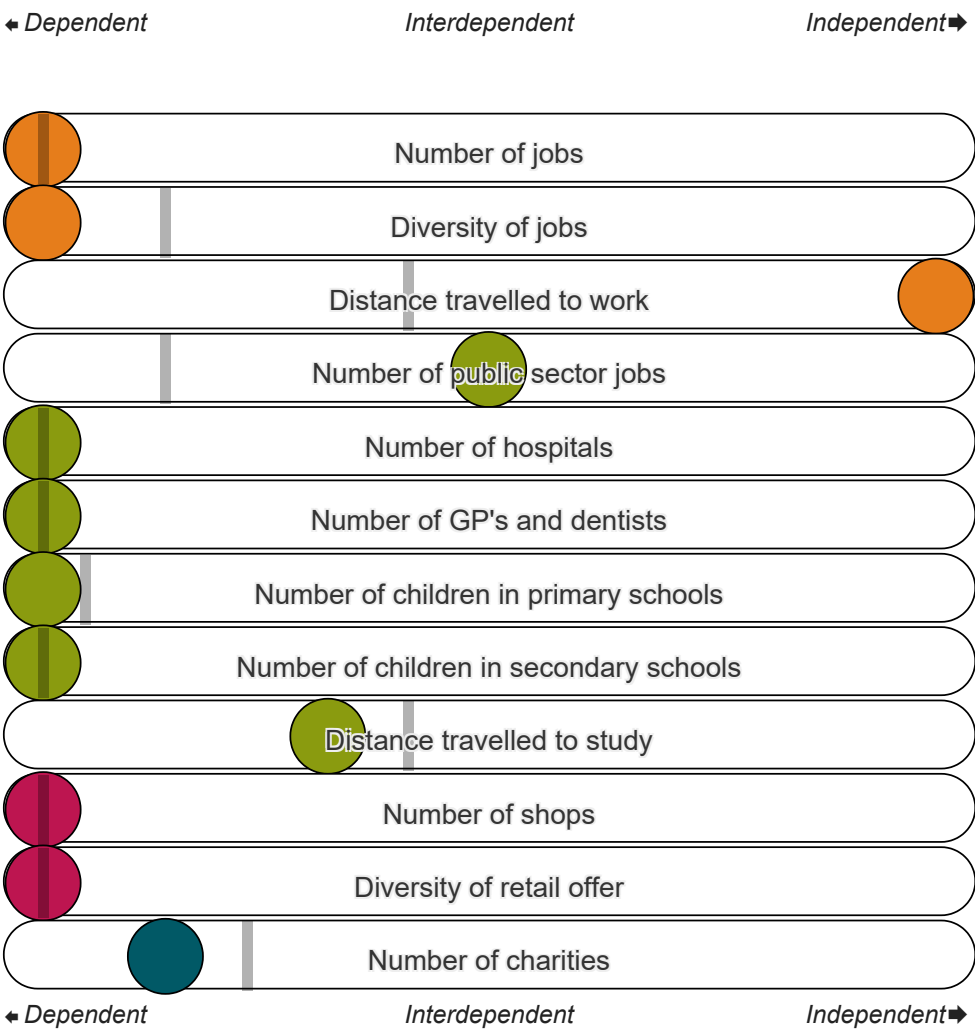
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

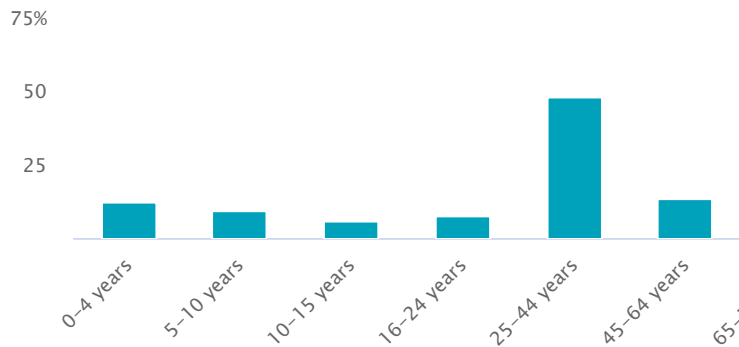
It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work. Countesswells differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

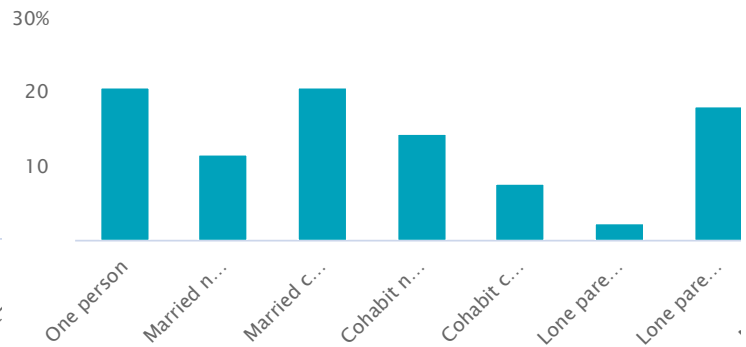

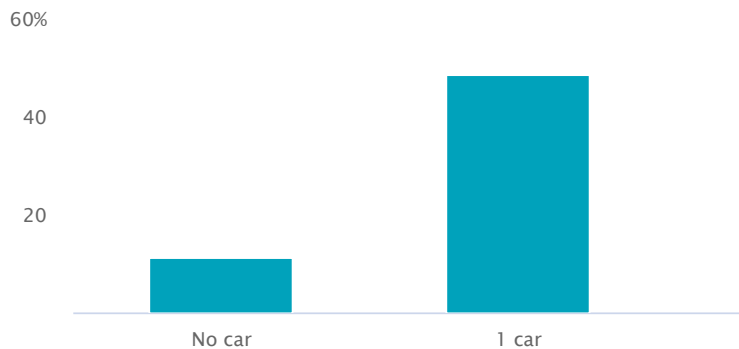

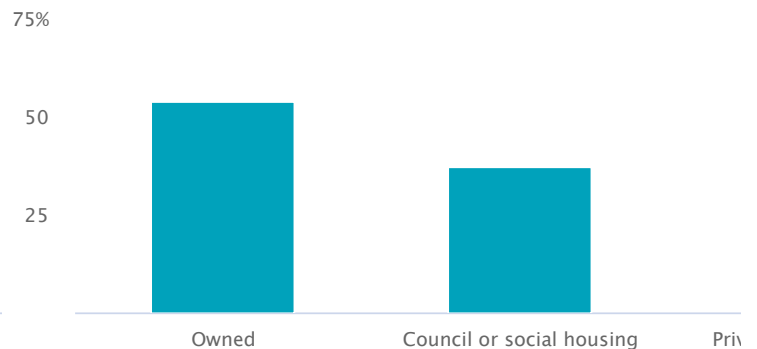
Household composition

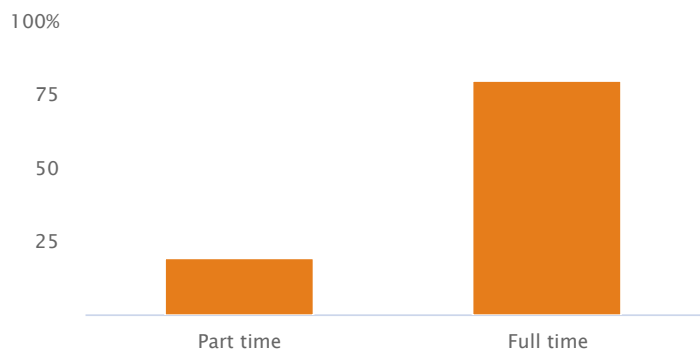

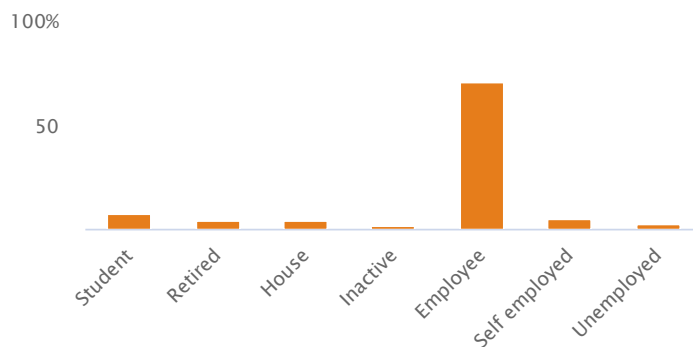
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



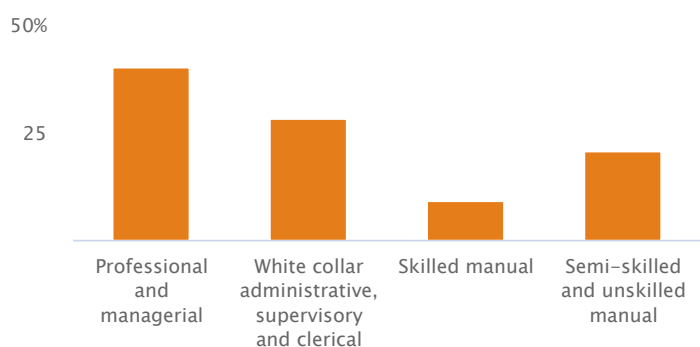
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

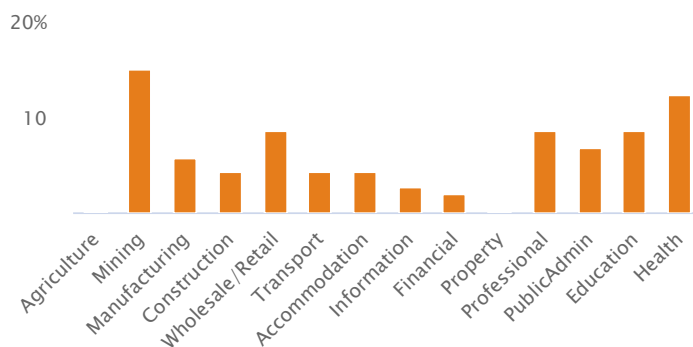

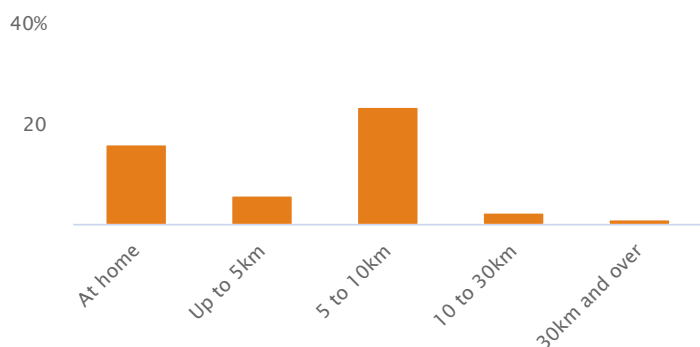
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

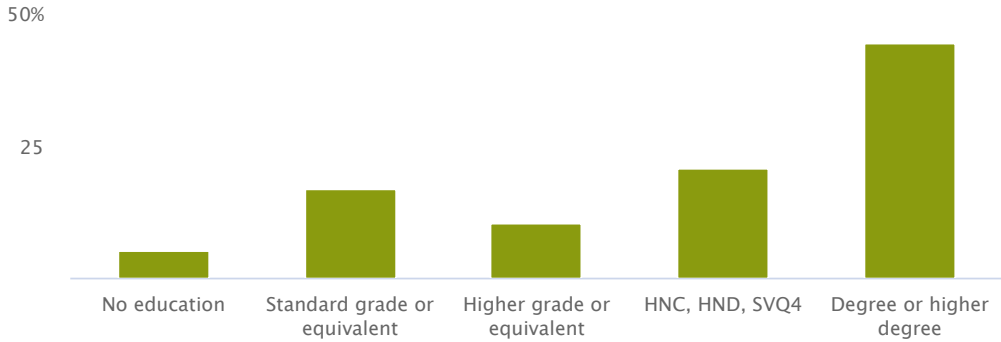


Distance travelled to work

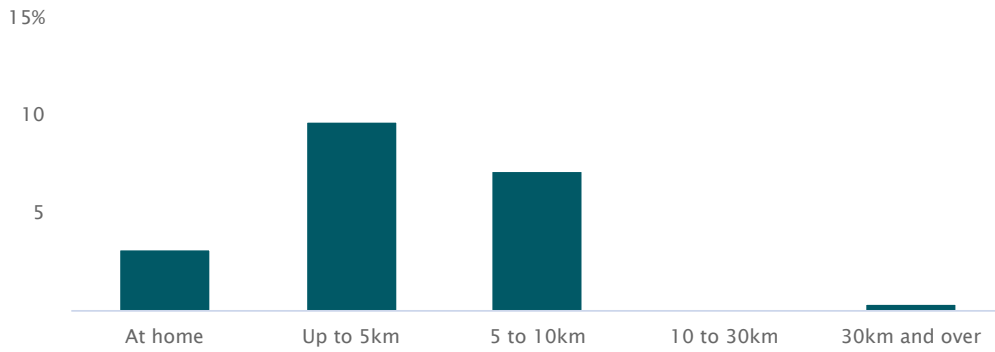
