Coupar Angus in Perth and Kinross was a northern Roman outpost but owes much of its early development to the Cistercian abbey. The town was lined by rail and turnpike road boosting trade associated with passing traffic. Today it acts as a service centre for the surrounding agricultural area with food processing, agricultural chemical production and agricultural machinery works.

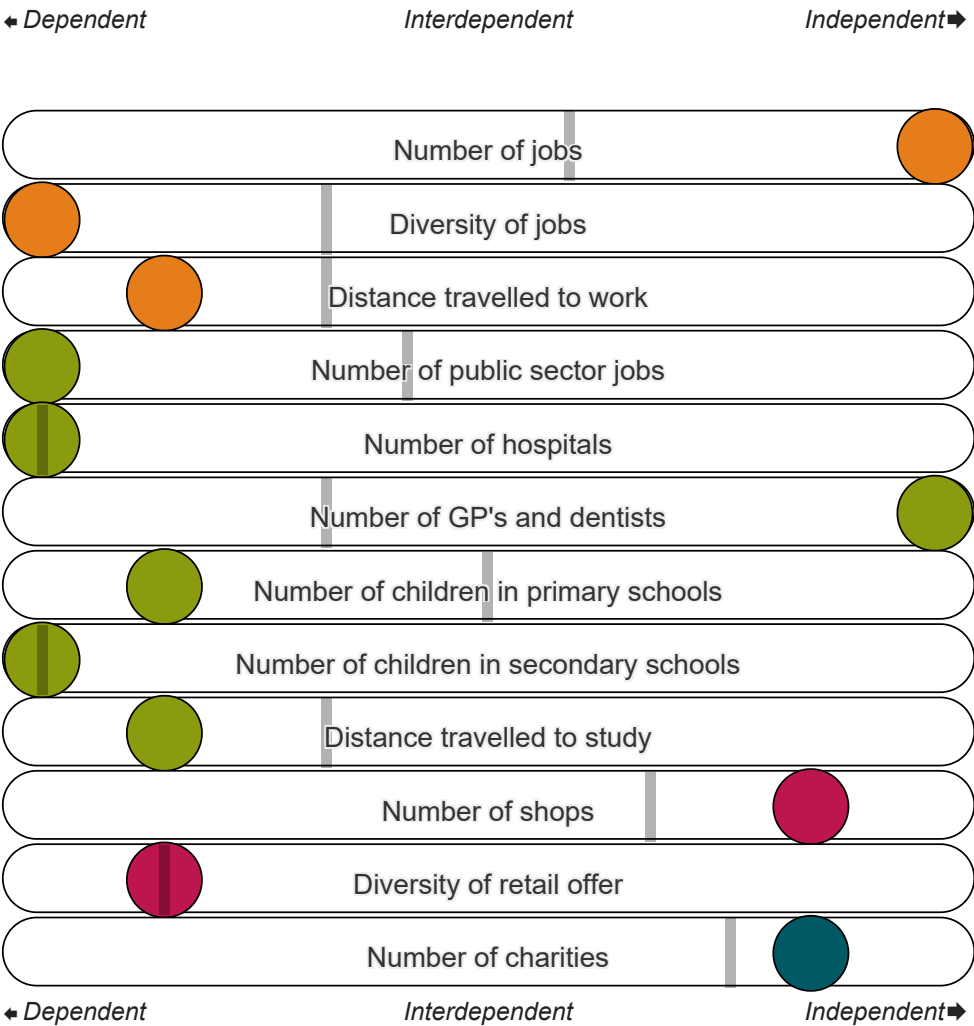
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Coupar Angus is an interdependent to dependent town.

Coupar Angus is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Coupar Angus is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, jobs, and GP's and dentists. Coupar Angus differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

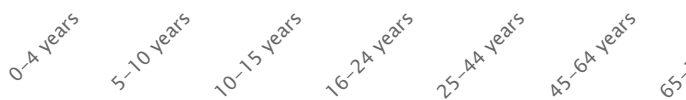

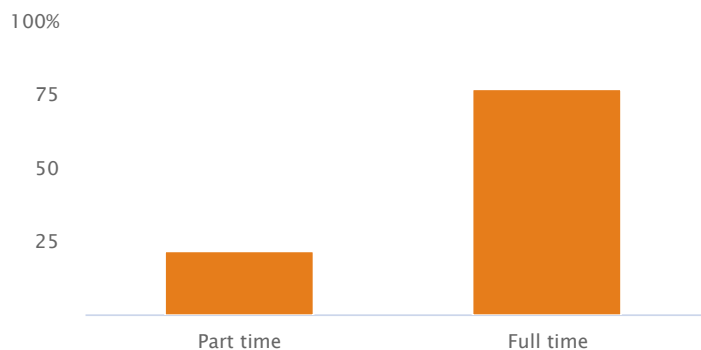

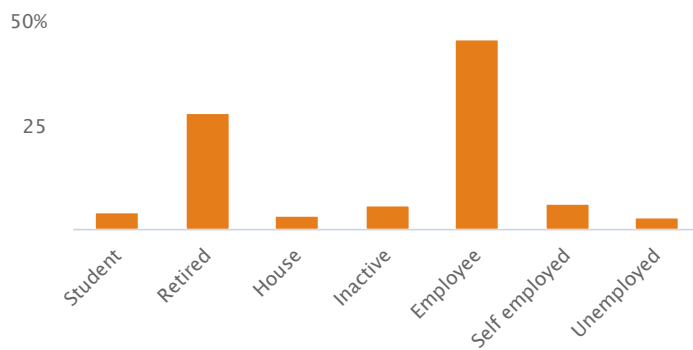
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



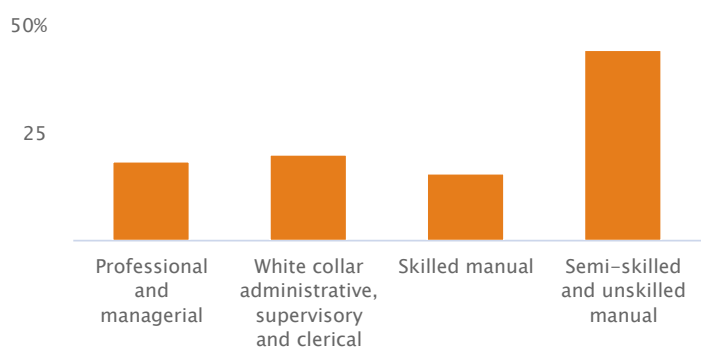
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

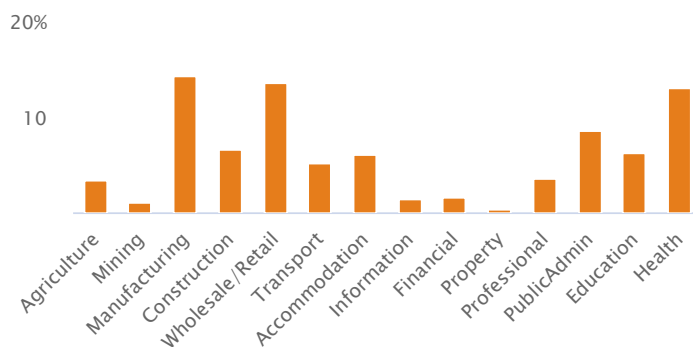


Social Grade

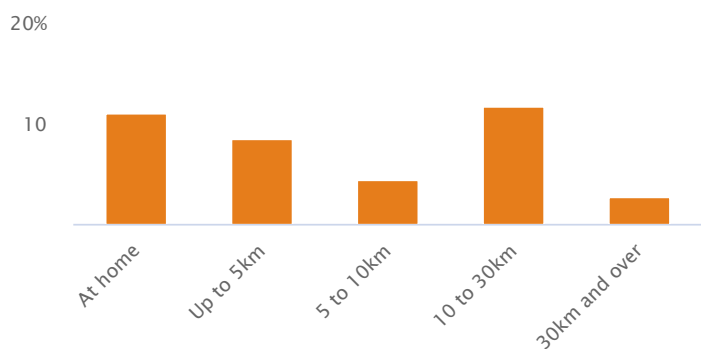
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

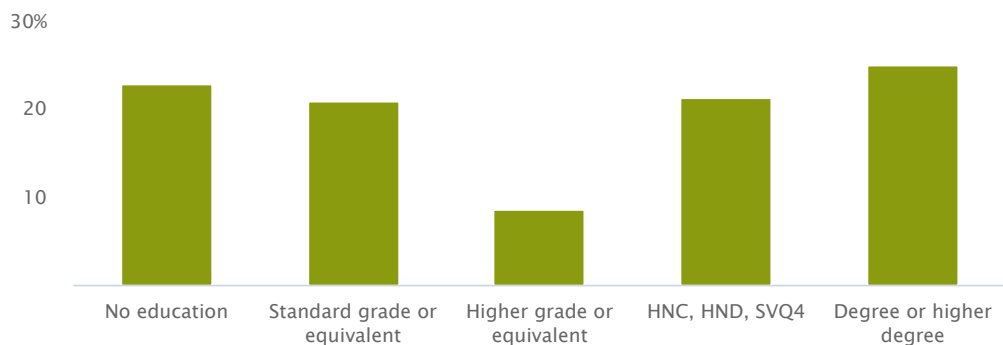


Distance travelled to work

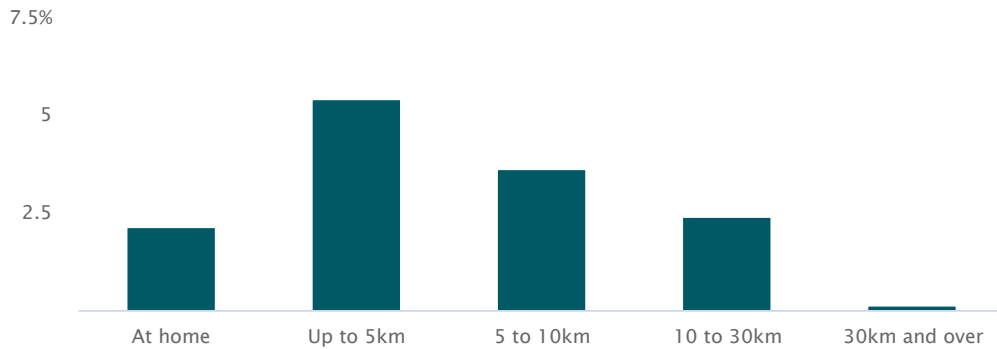
