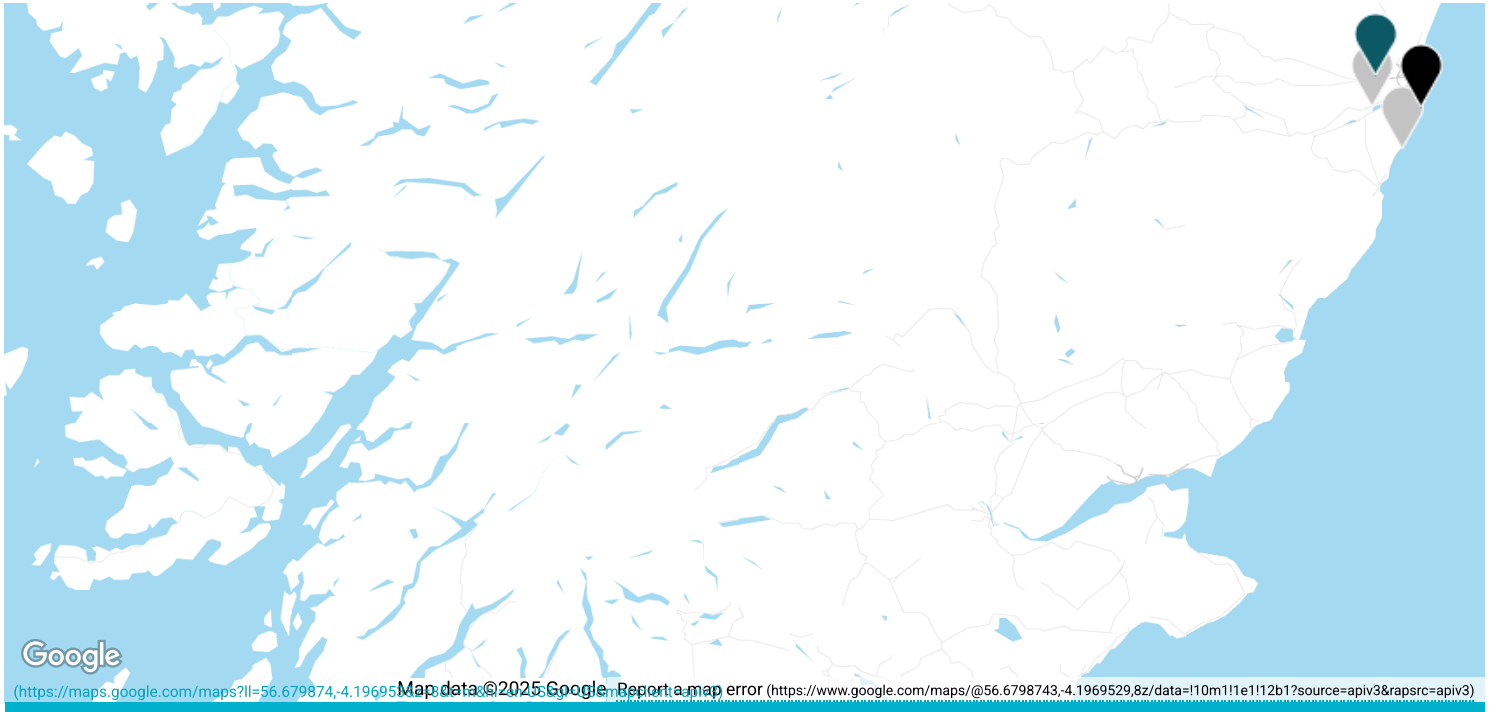




Cove Bay

Cove Bay is within Aberdeen City and is effectively a suburb of Aberdeen. It grew substantially as a residential area during the 1970s oil boom.

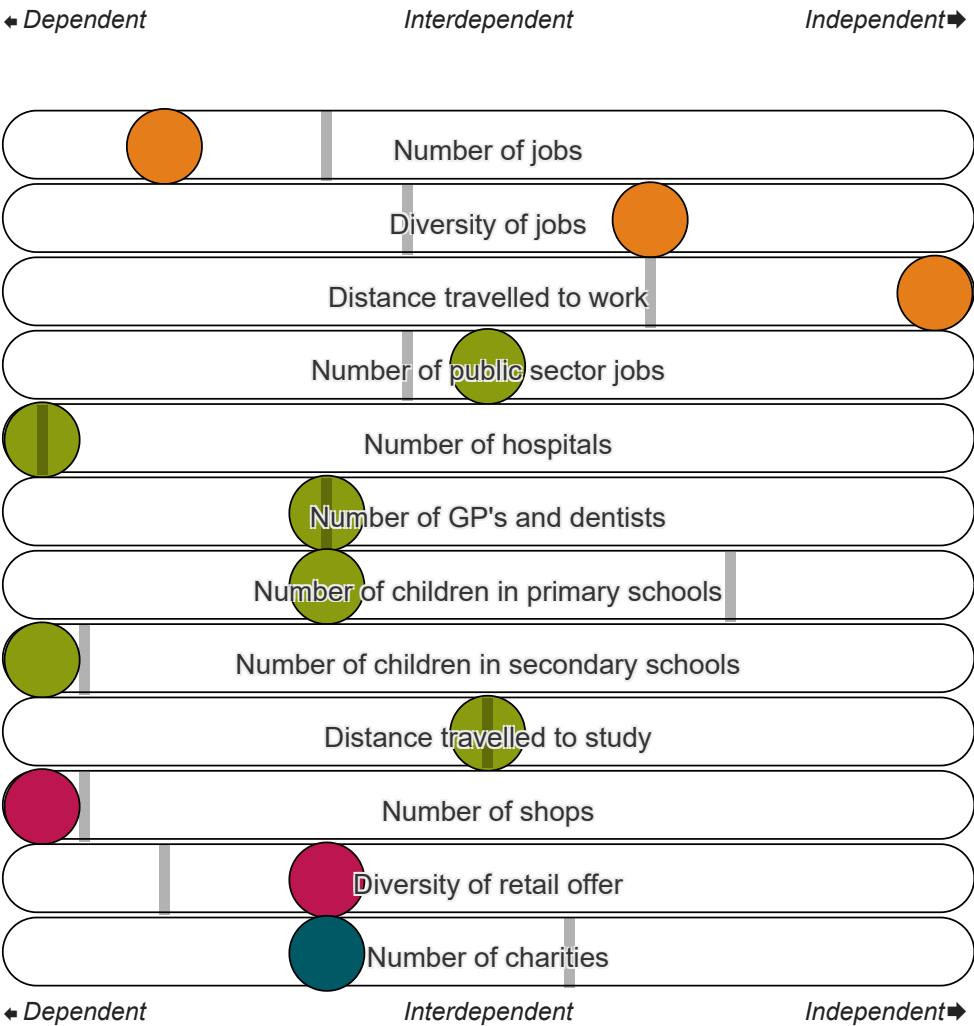
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Cove Bay is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Cove Bay is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work. Cove Bay differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

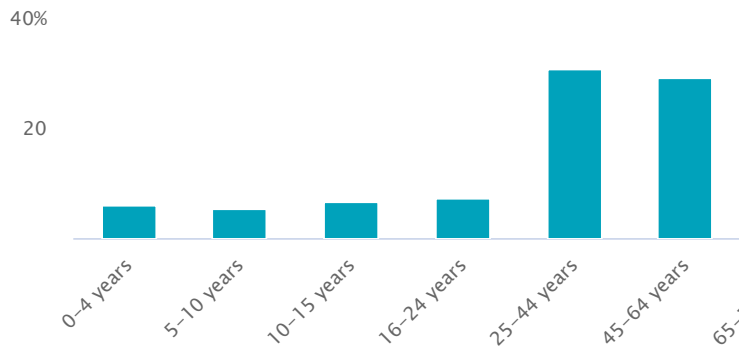

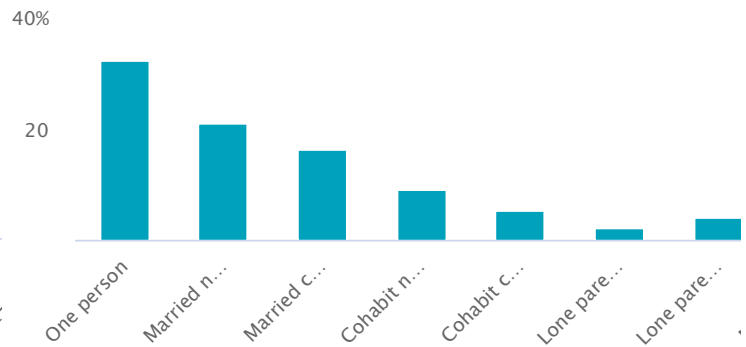

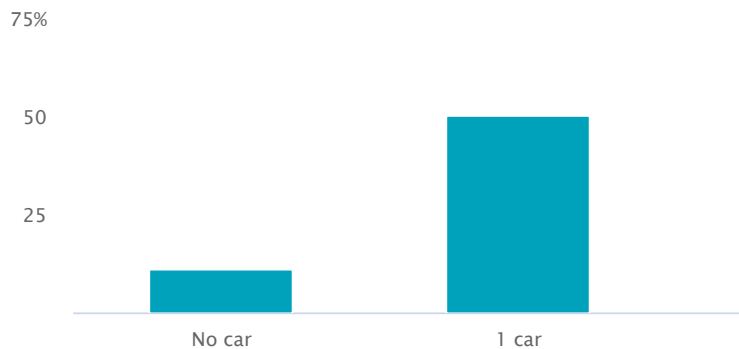

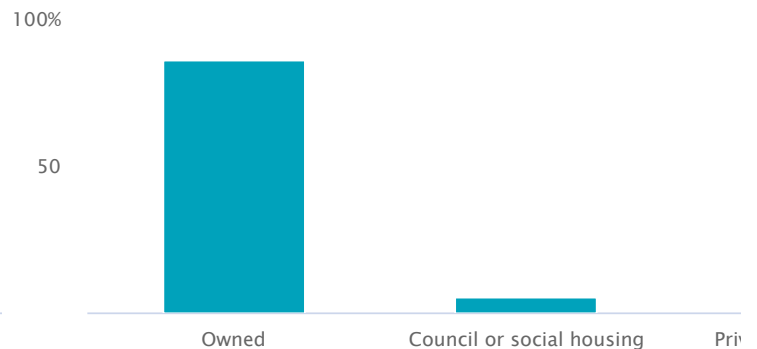

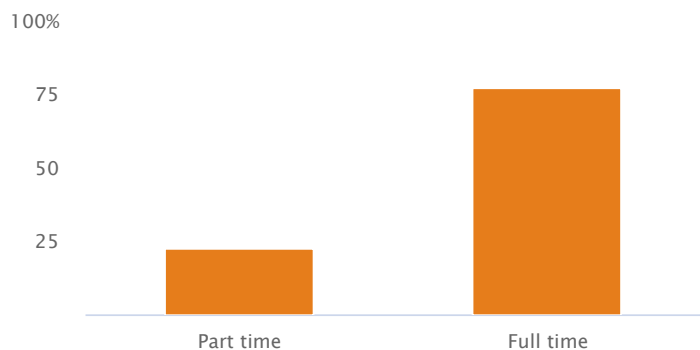

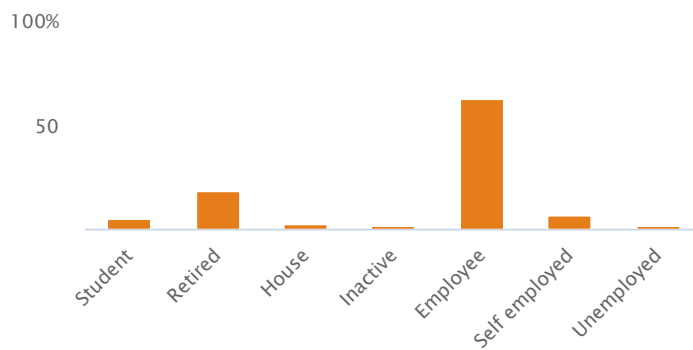
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



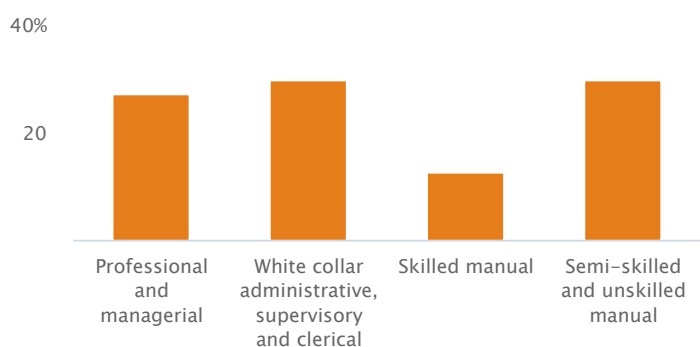
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

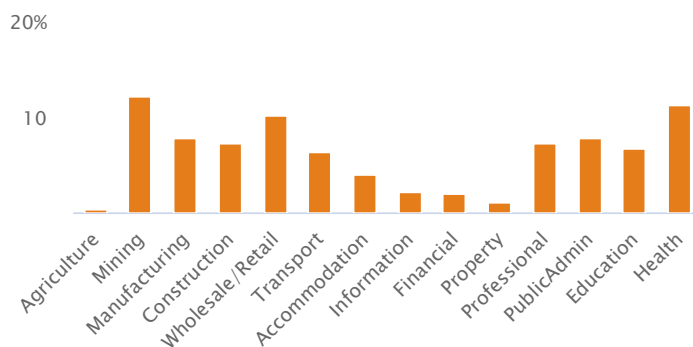


Social Grade

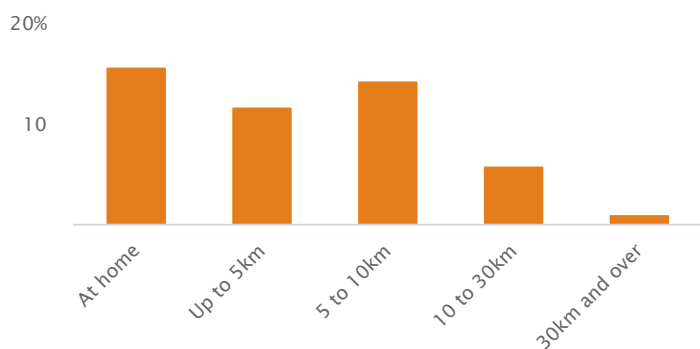
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

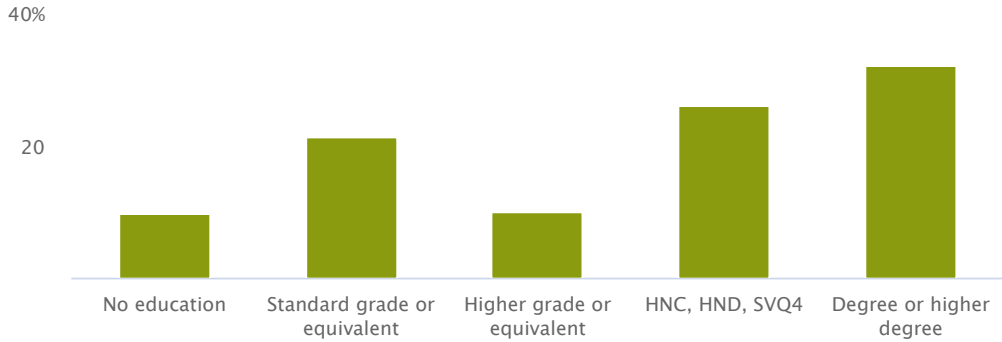


Distance travelled to work

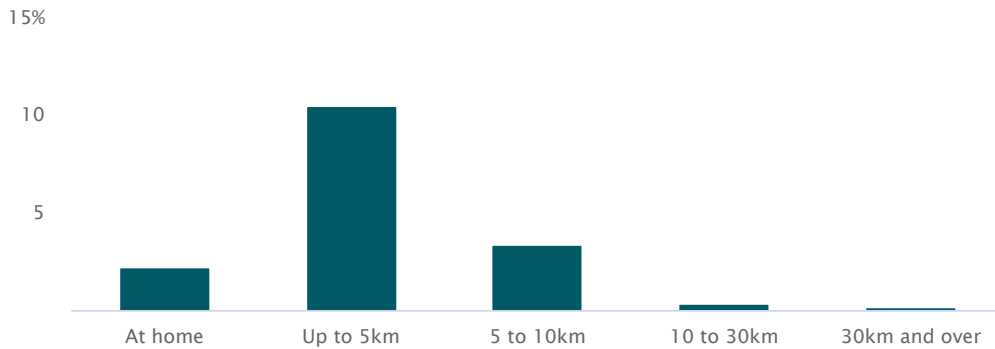
