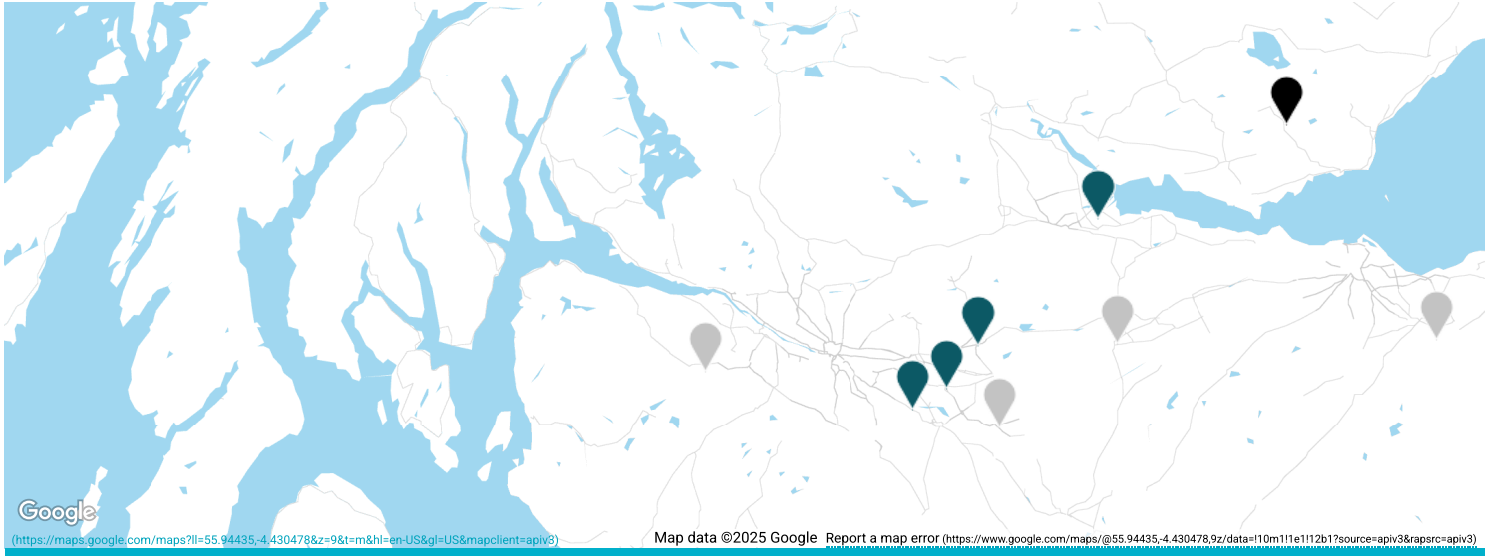




Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans

Cowdenbeath in Fife was a coaching stop on the road from Edinburgh to Perth. In the late 19th century mining was key to the local economy. Today light industries in the food processing and construction sectors offer local employment.

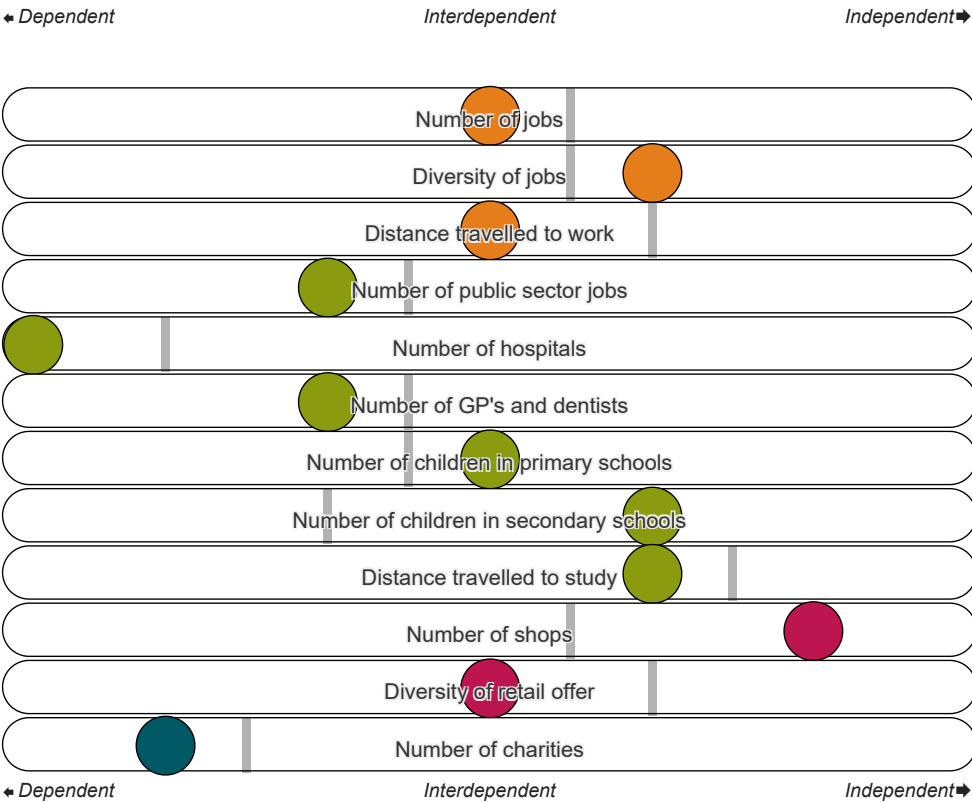
In large towns, people in this group experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

Cowdenbeath and Lumphinnans differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools.

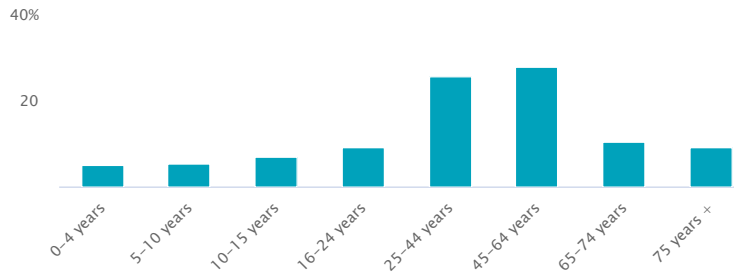

Population change 2011 to 2022**5%**

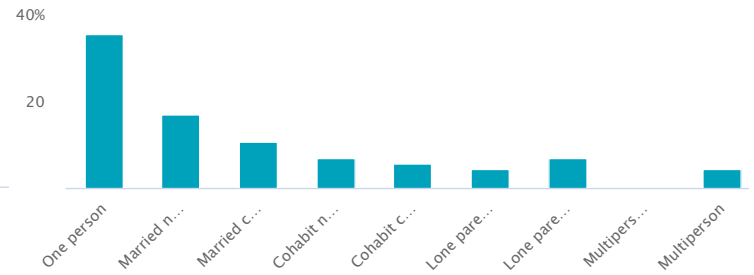

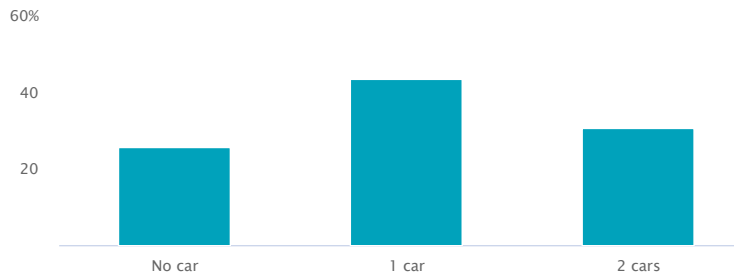

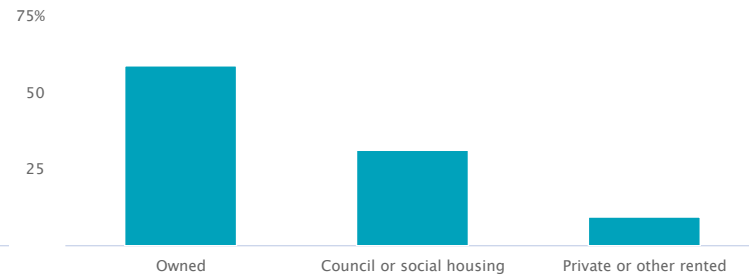
Household composition

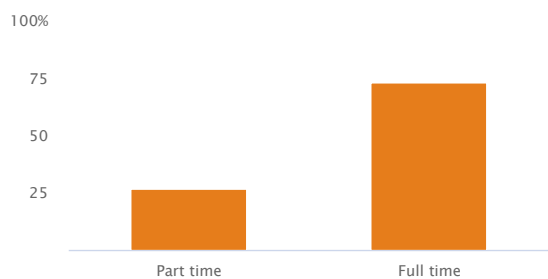

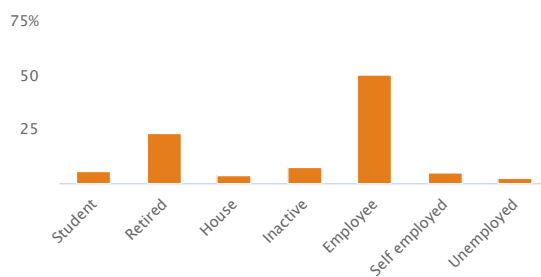
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



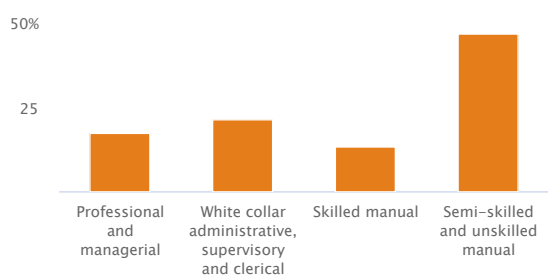
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

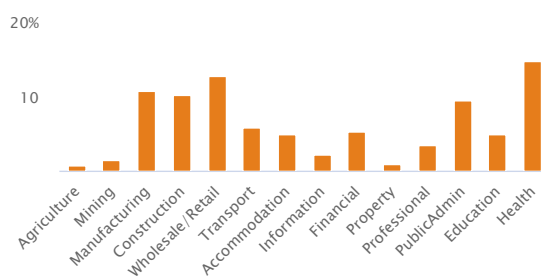


Social Grade

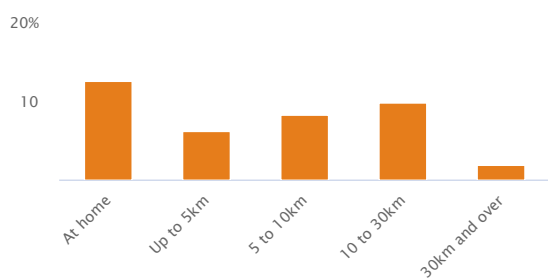
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

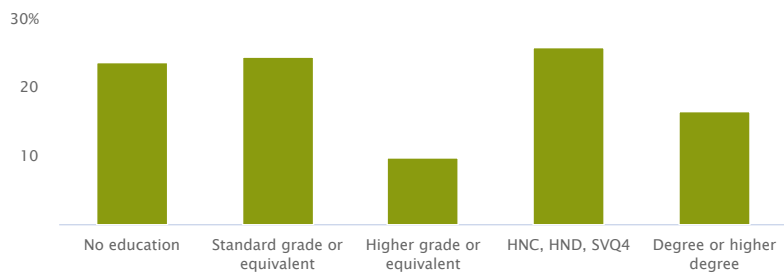


Distance travelled to work

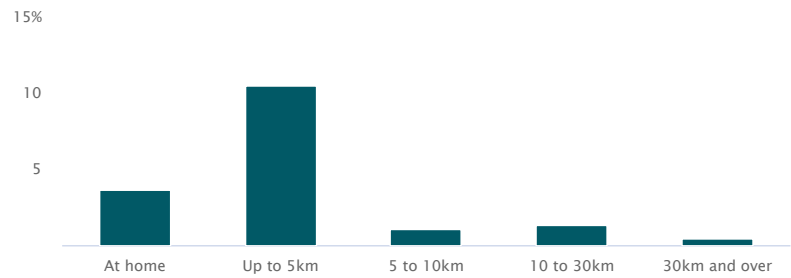
