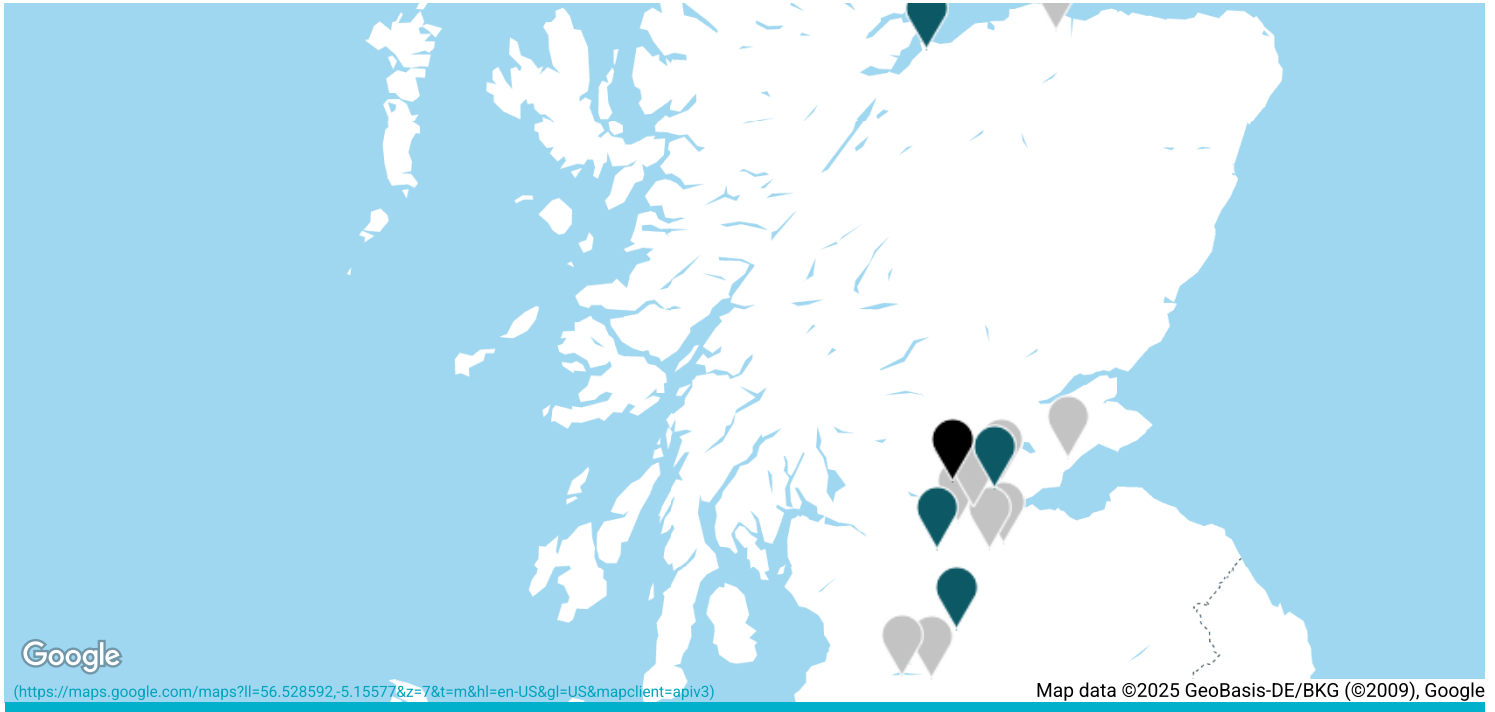




# Cowie

Cowie is in Stirling Council area. It was a former mining and quarrying town. Today it has small scale industries, including the wood and timber trade.

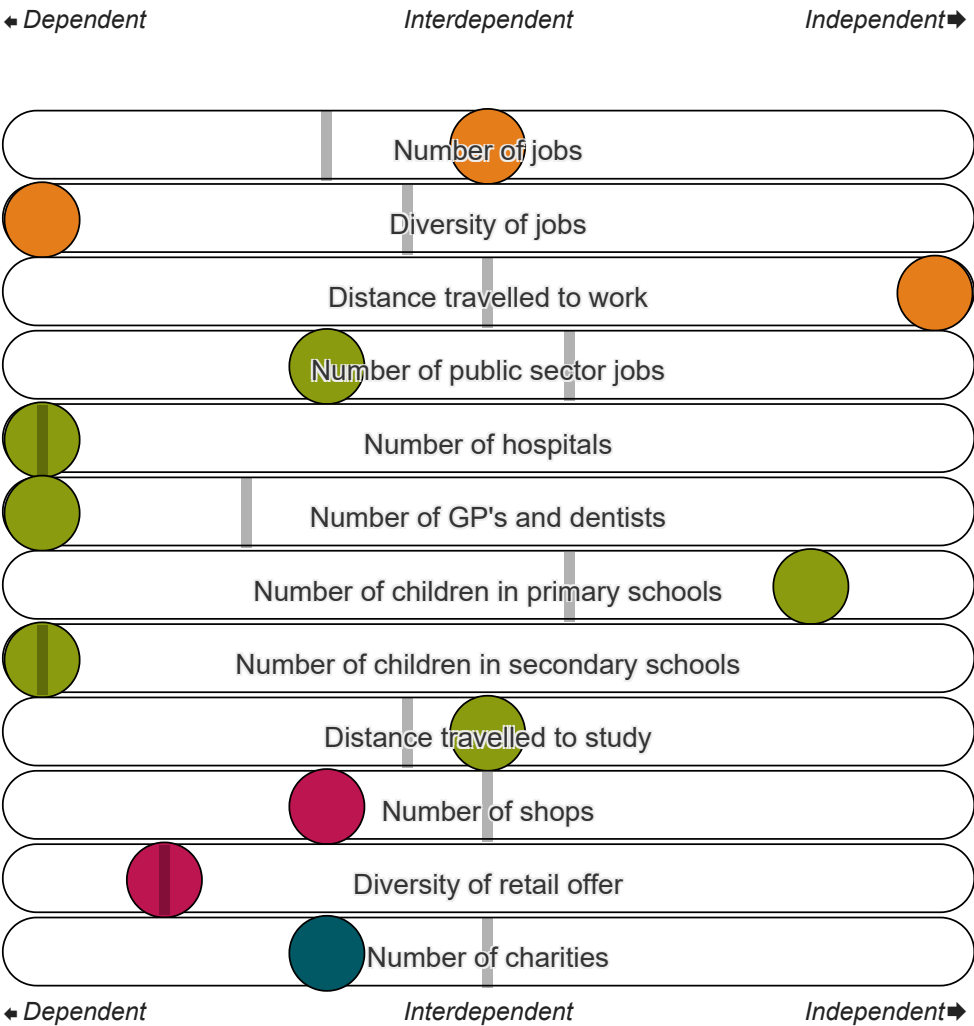
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Cowie is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Ardersier](#), [Calderbank](#), [Douglas](#), and [High Valleyfield](#), [Low Valleyfield](#) and [Culross](#).

# Inter-relationships



Cowie is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Cowie is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work. Cowie differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

**Population change 2011 to 2022****2%**

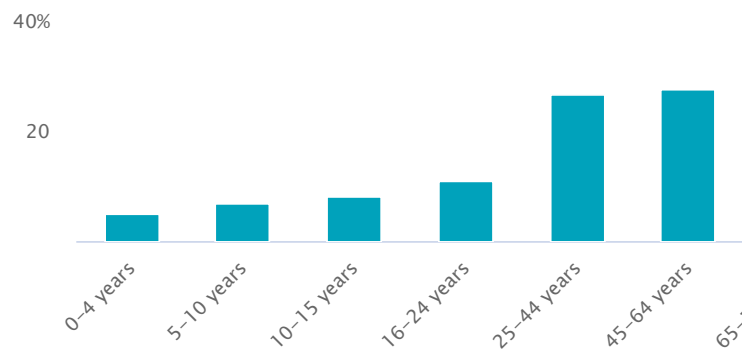

**Household change 2011 to 2022****2%**

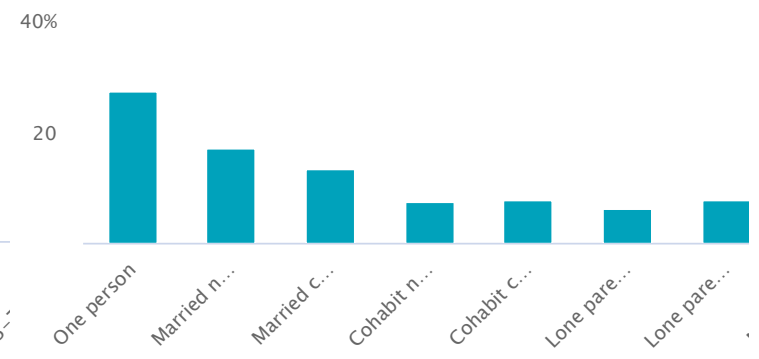

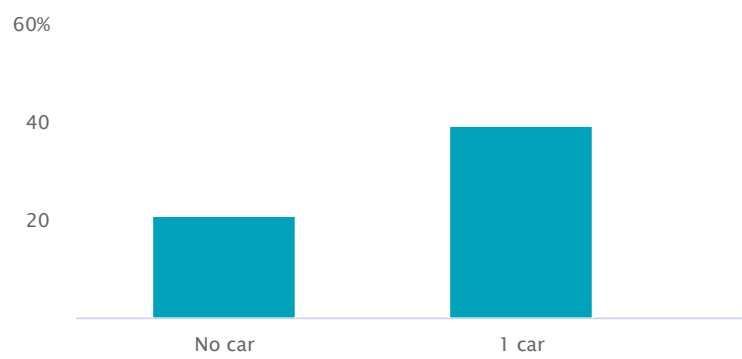

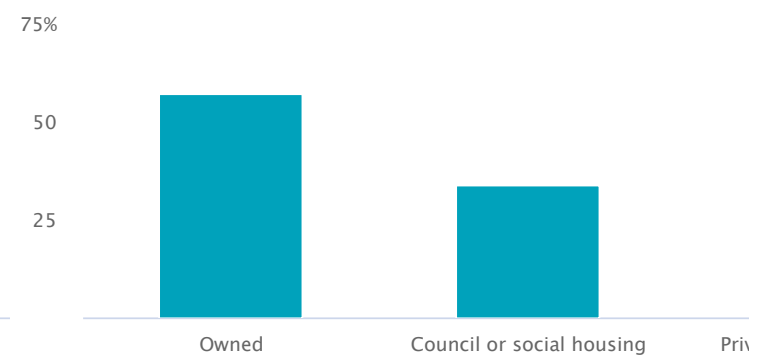

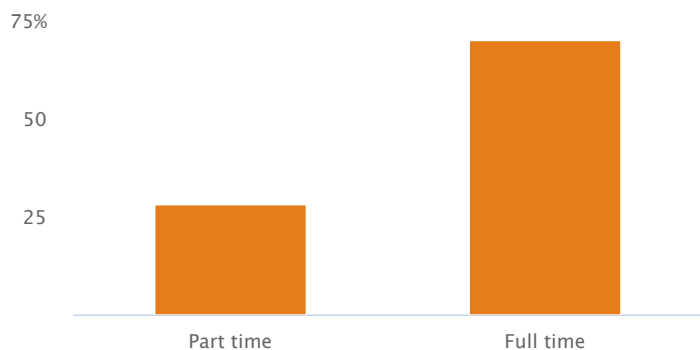

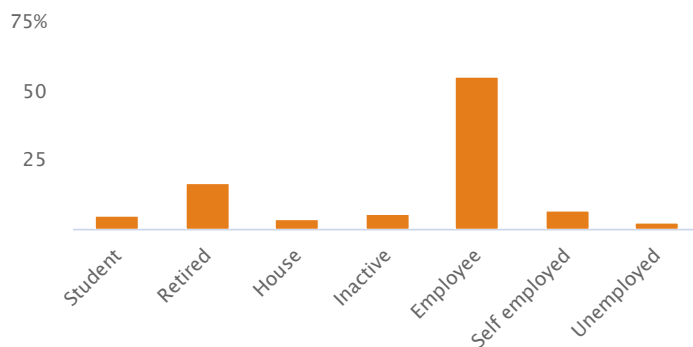
## Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



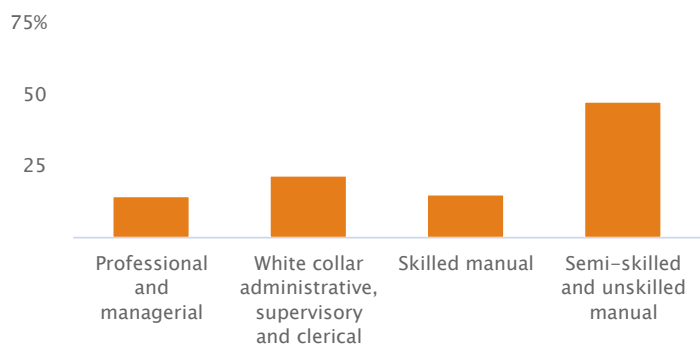
## Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

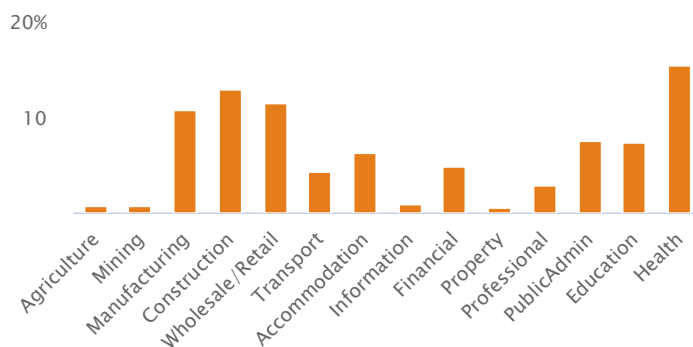


## Social Grade

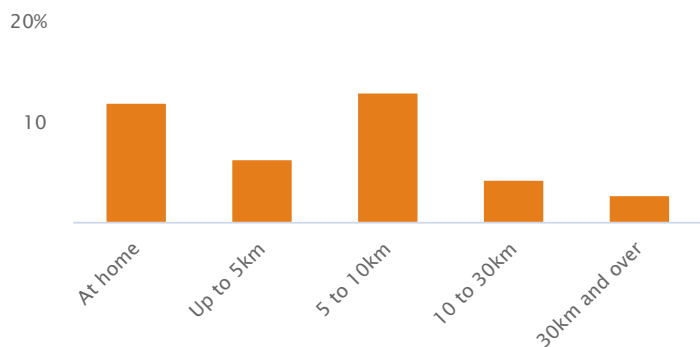
(% households aged 16-64)

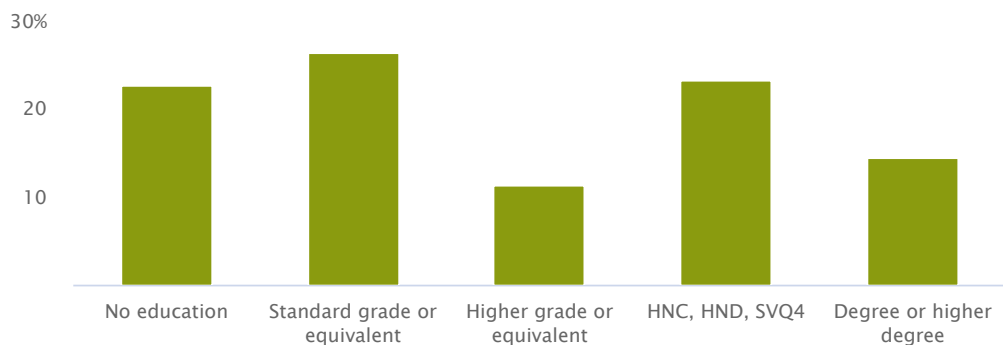

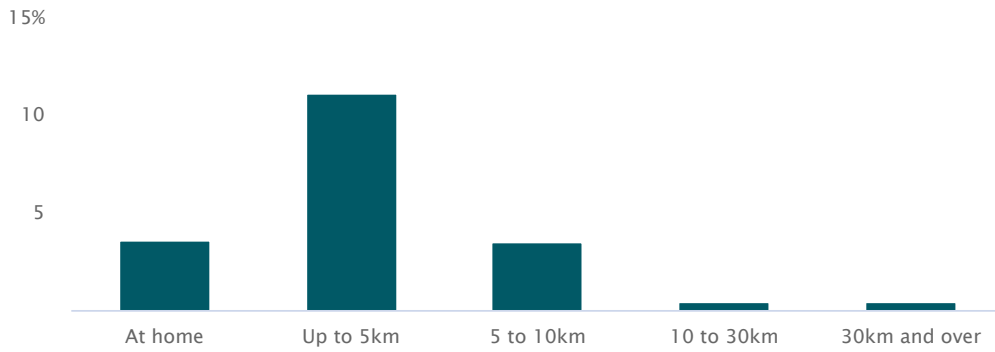
## Diversity of retail offer (%)
