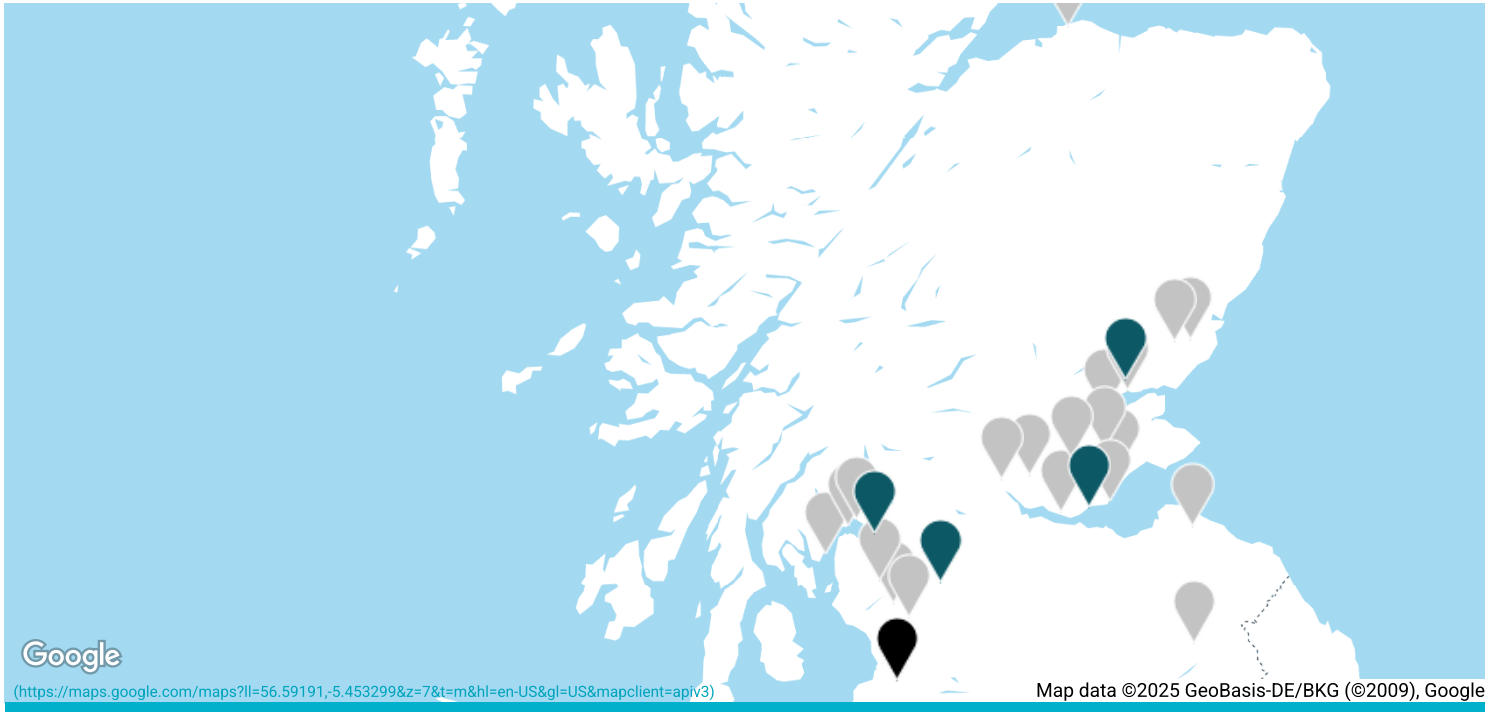




Coylton

Coylton in South Ayrshire grew as an unplanned settlement. It is now a commuter town for Ayr.

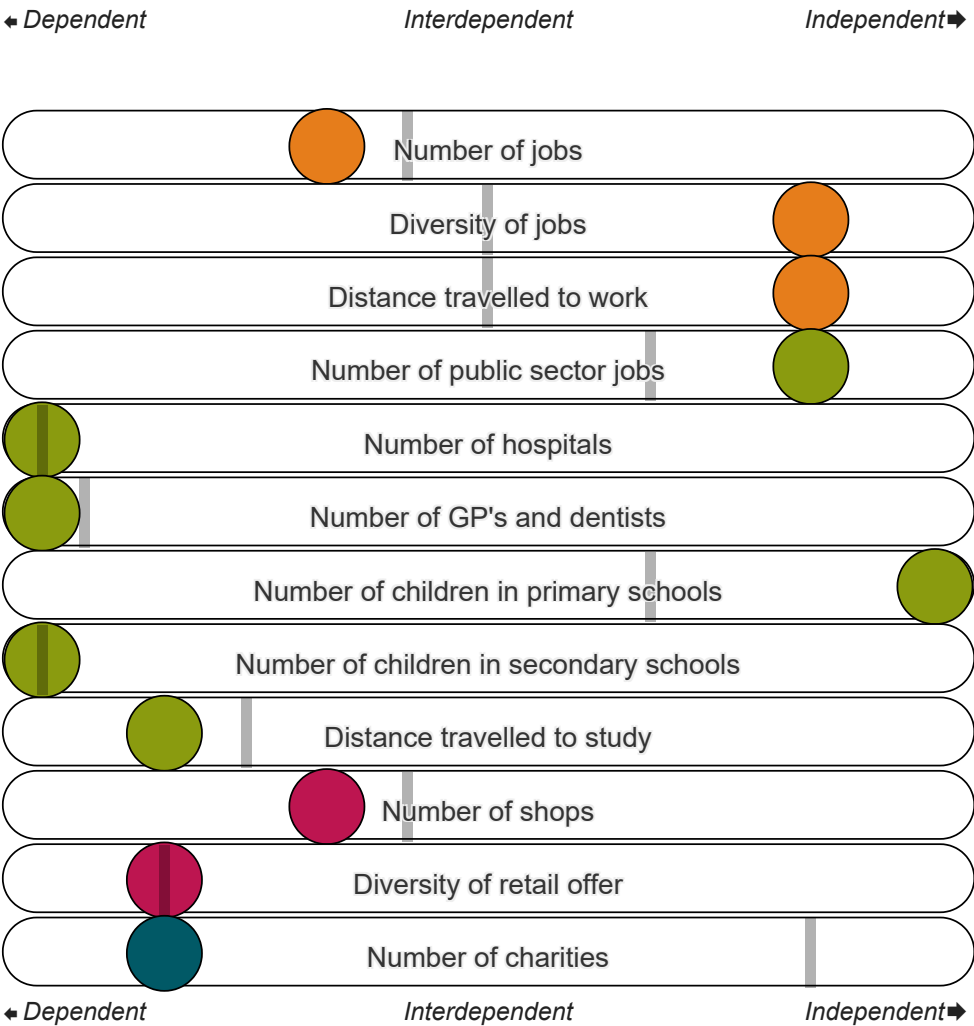
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Coylton is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Coylton is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Coylton is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work. Coylton differs most from its group in the number of charities.

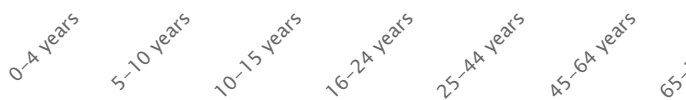

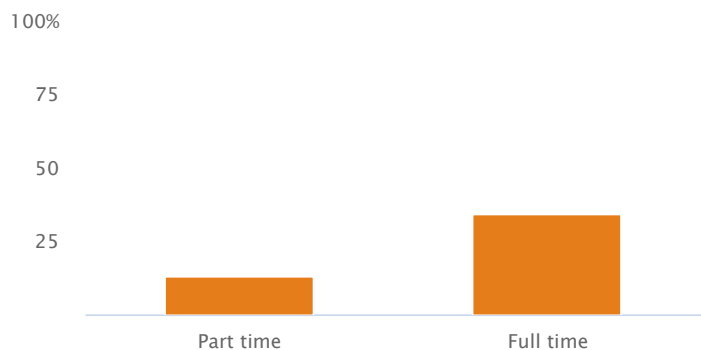

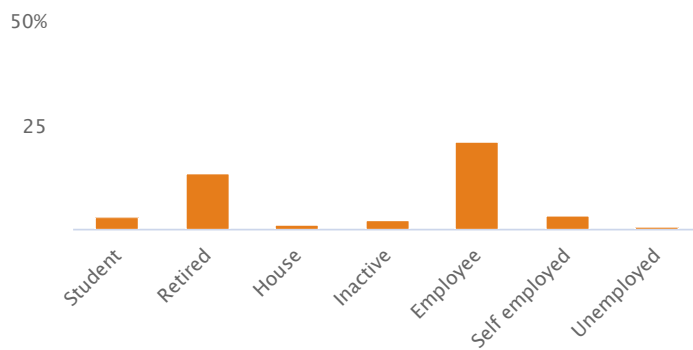
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



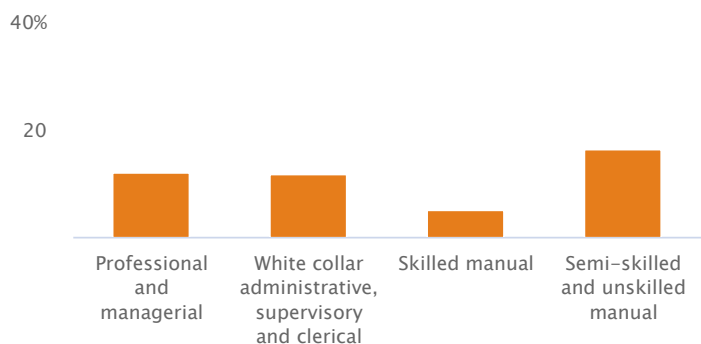
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

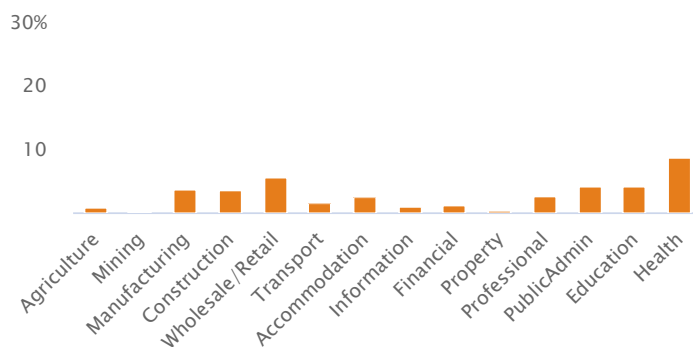


Social Grade

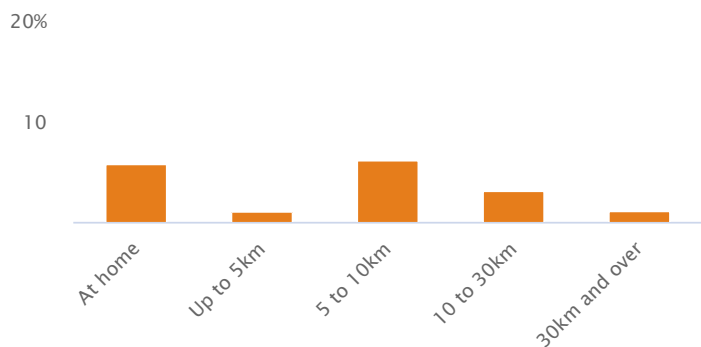
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

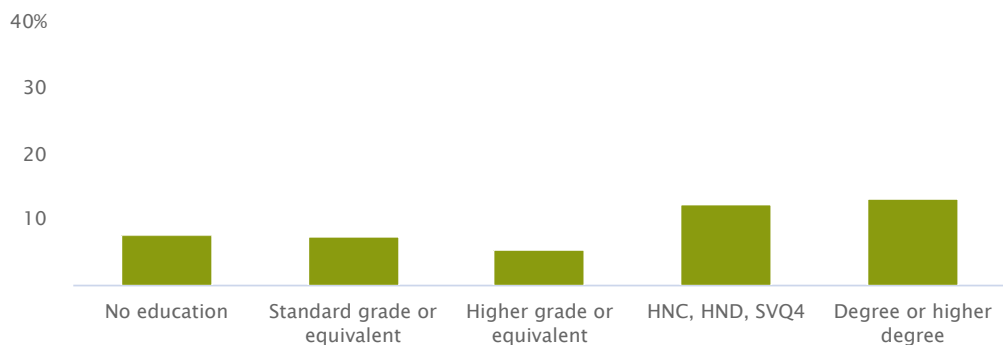


Distance travelled to work

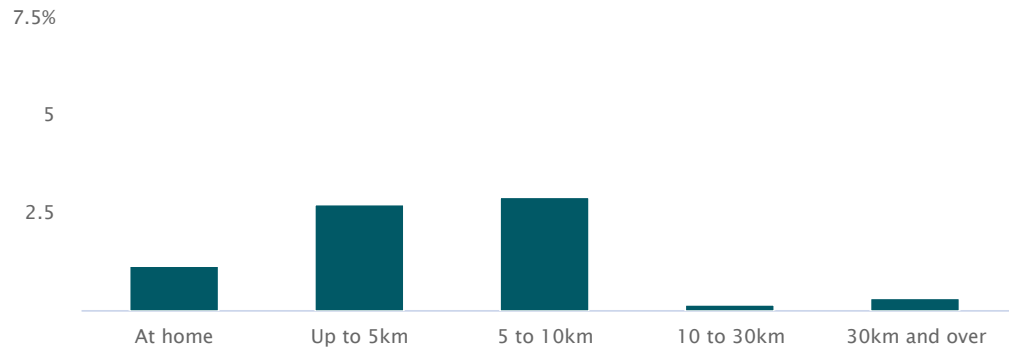
