Crail in the East Neuk of Fife was an early burgh. It was known for its harbour and fishing trade. Today it is popular with tourists and as a retirement town.

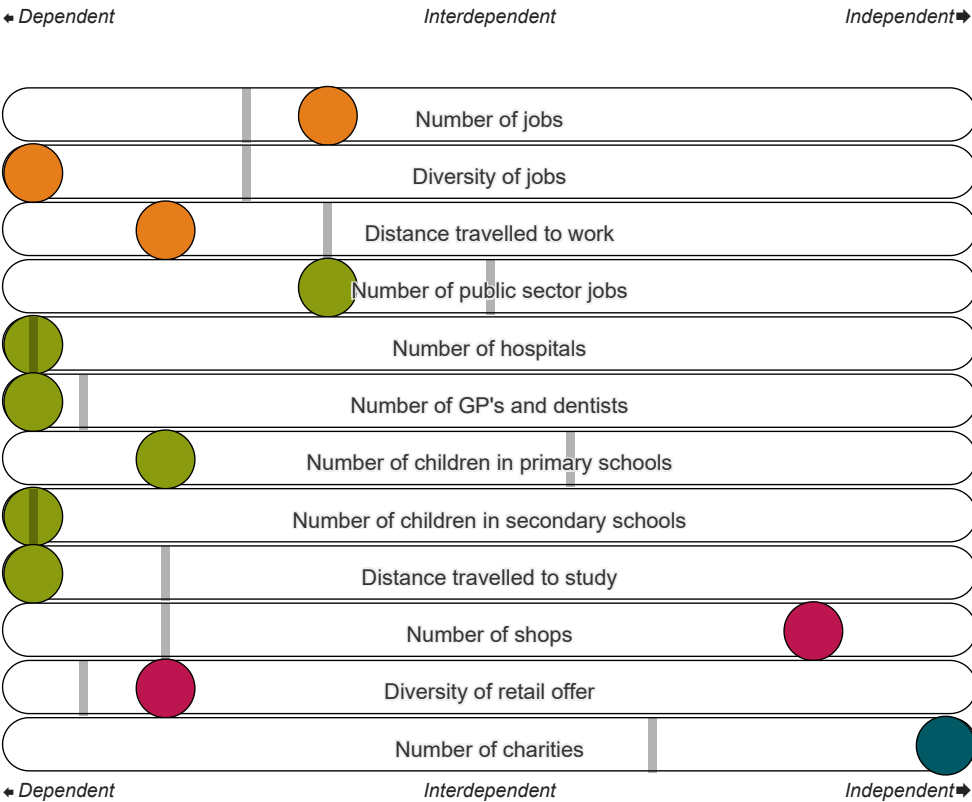
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Crail is a dependent to interdependent town.

Crail is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Crail is grouped with 19 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, and shops. Crail differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

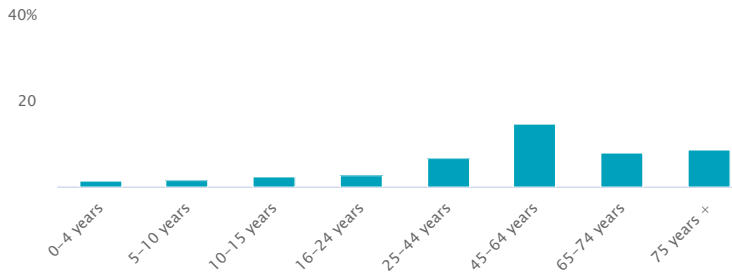

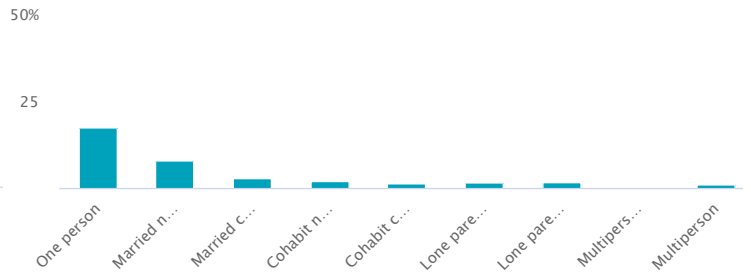

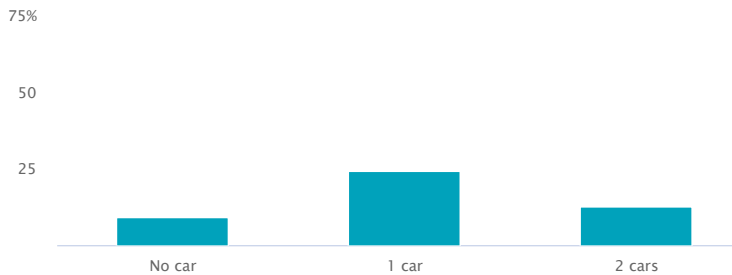

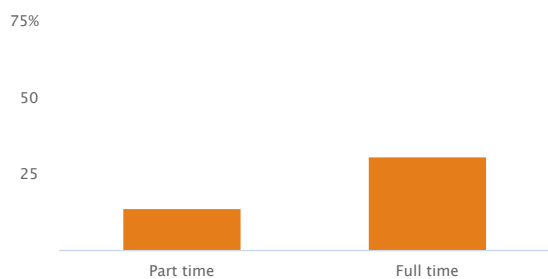

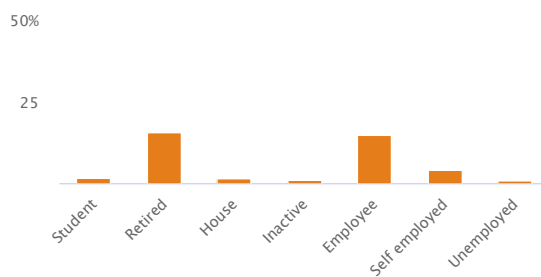
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



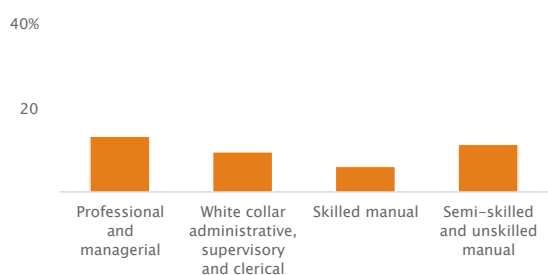
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

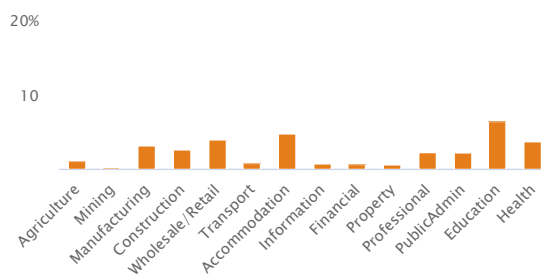

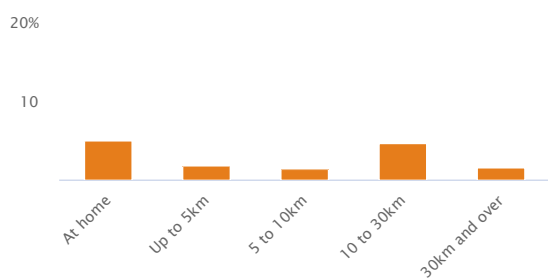
(% households aged 16-64)

Distance travelled to work

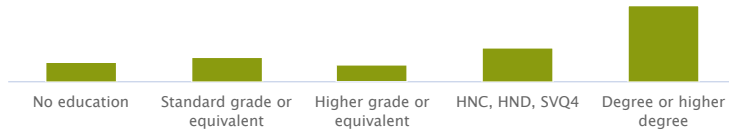

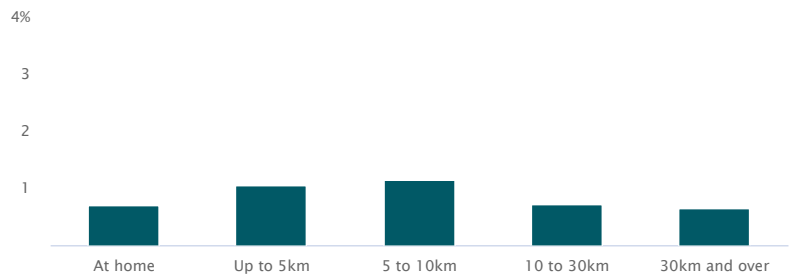
