Crieff is in Perth and Kinross. It was an important droving centre, a tradition still celebrated today. In the 19th century it became a tourist resort. It remains popular with tourists but also caters as a market town.

In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Crieff is an independent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Banff](#), [Buckie](#), [Cupar](#), and [Dingwall](#).










Household composition



(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)





(% aged 16-74)




(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity




Distance travelled to work


