Crossford in Fife as its name suggests was a fording point on the road between Culross and Dunfermline. It has extensive housing estates with most commuting to work.

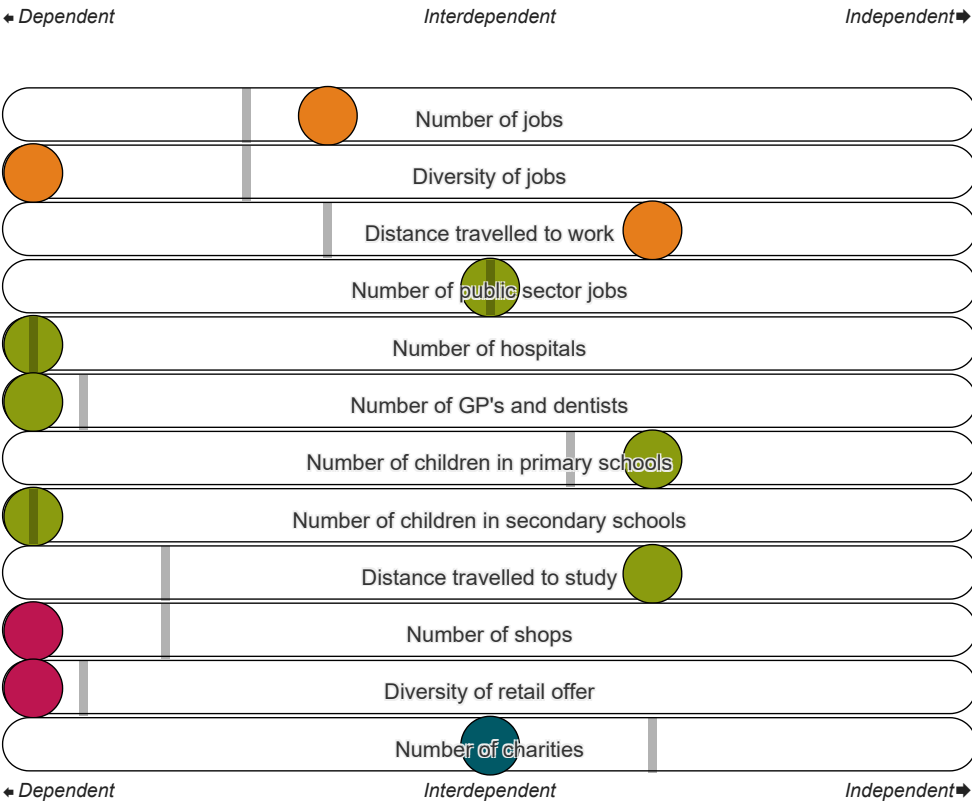
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Crossford (Fife) is a dependent to interdependent town.

Crossford (Fife) is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Crossford (Fife) is grouped with 19 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Crossford (Fife) differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

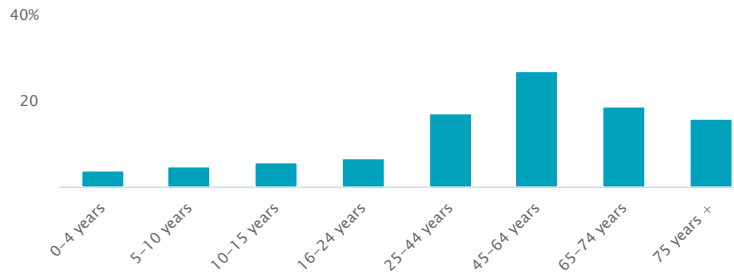

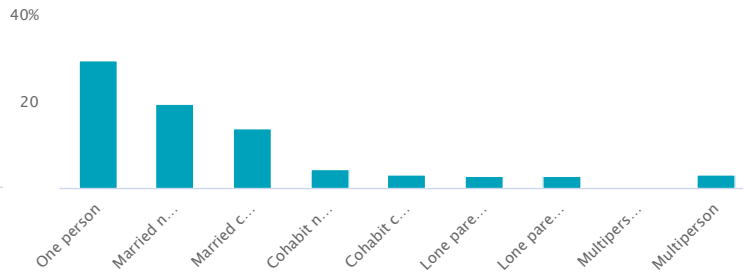

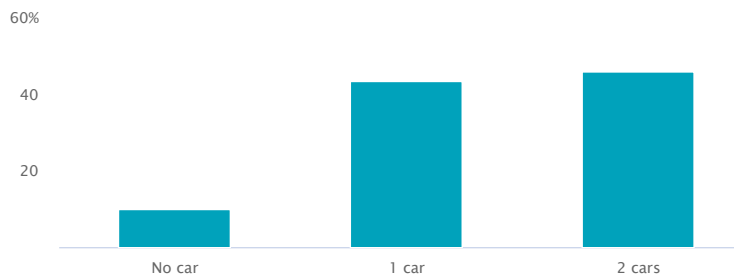

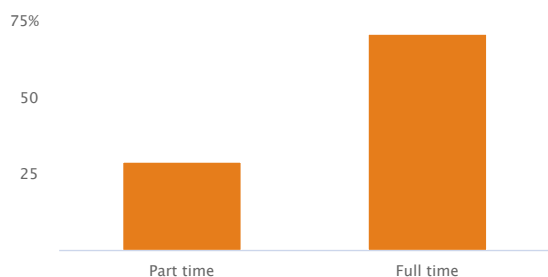

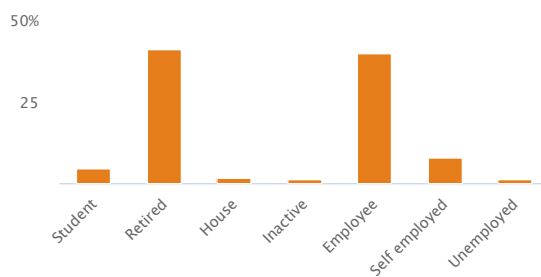
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



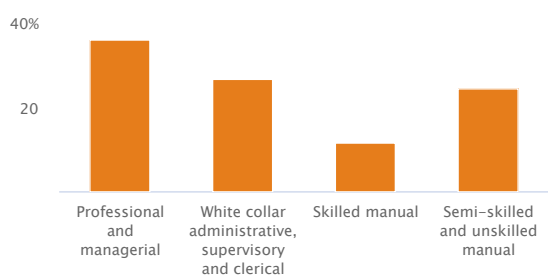
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

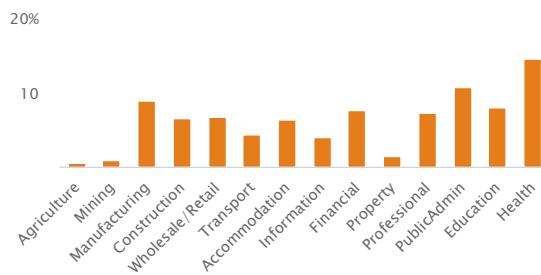

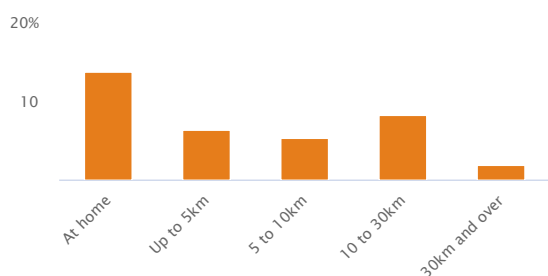
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

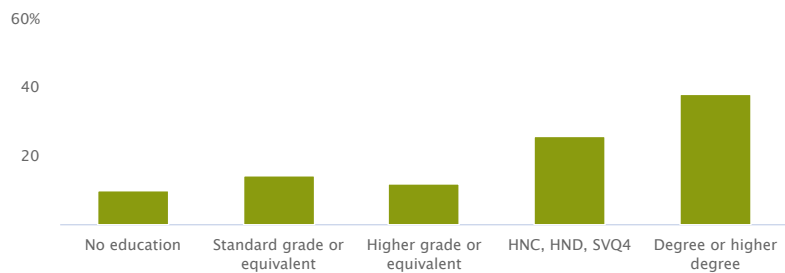


Distance travelled to work

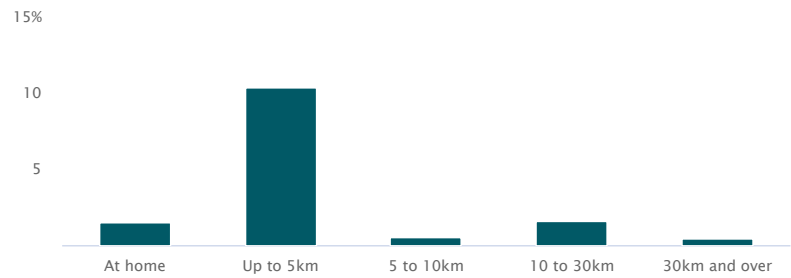
