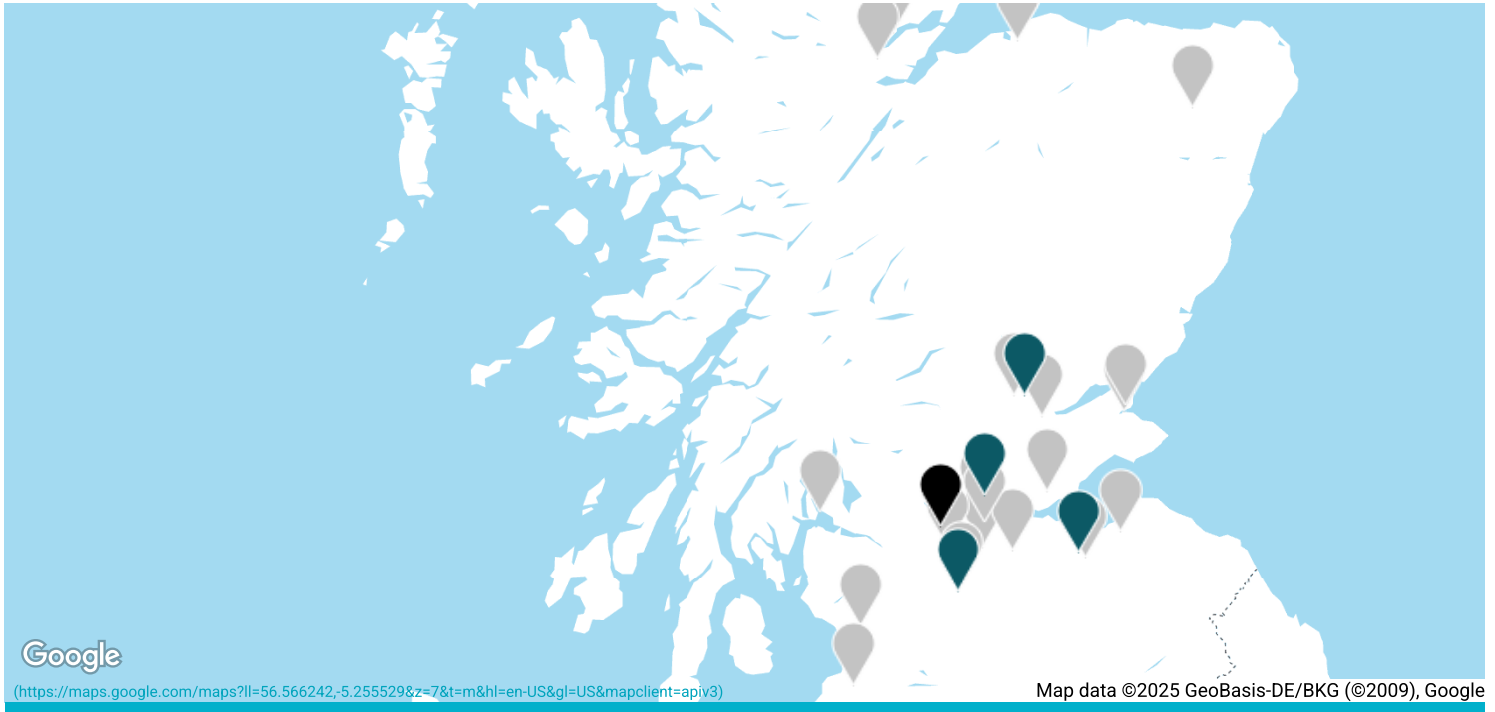




Croy.

Croy in North Lanarkshire lies on the Antonine Wall. It developed in the mid 19th century when mining provided local employment. Croy railway station makes it an attractive commuting settlement. It is known for its quartz dolerite quarry which was a source of aggregate.

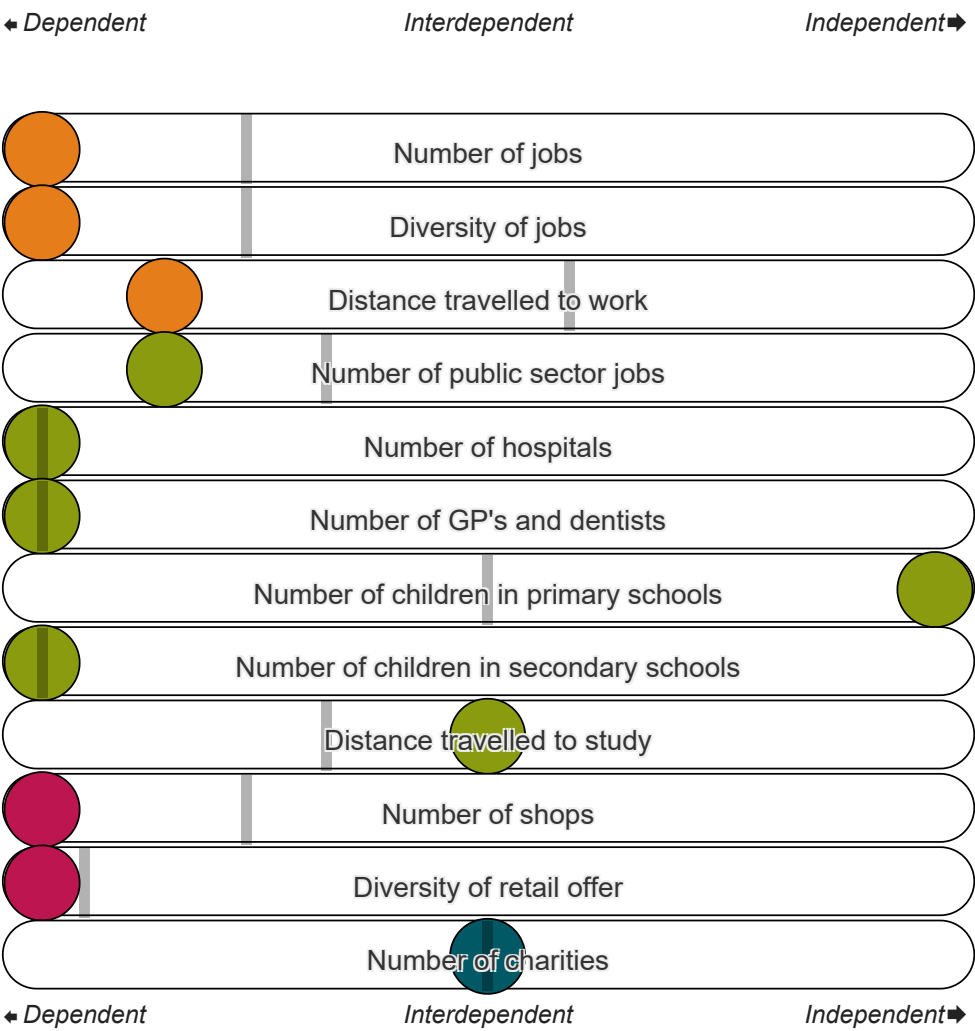
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Croy is a dependent to interdependent town.

Croy is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Croy is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Croy differs most from its group in the number of jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

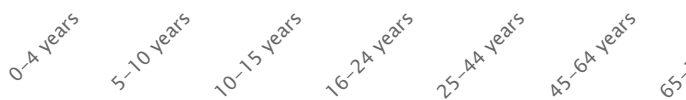

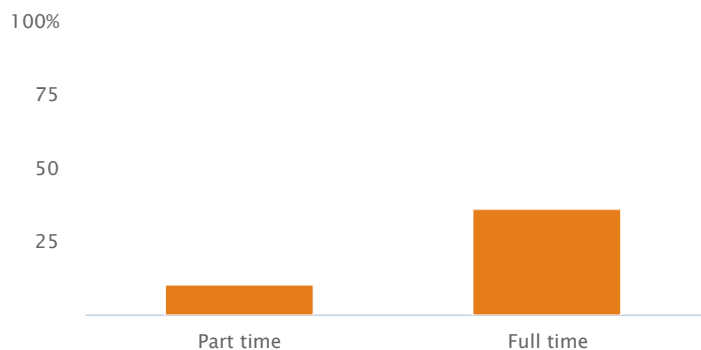

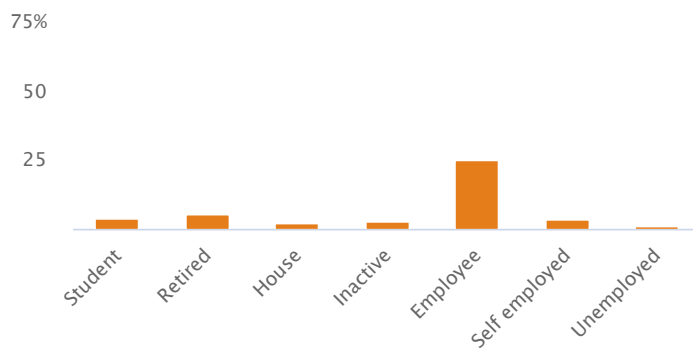
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



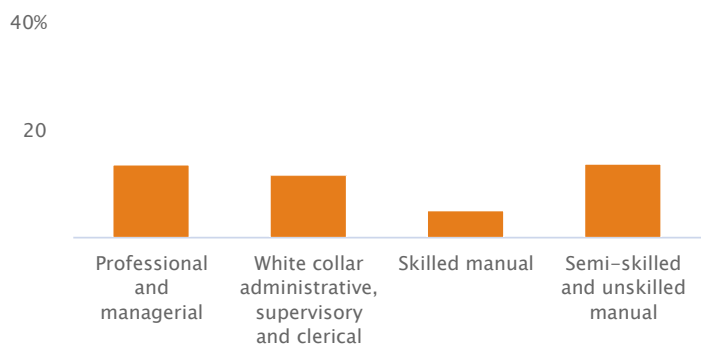
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

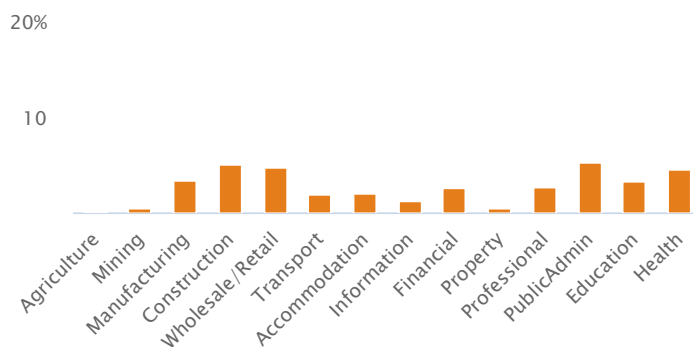


Social Grade

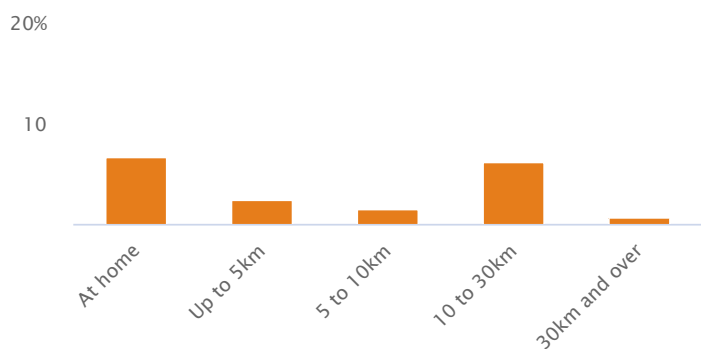
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

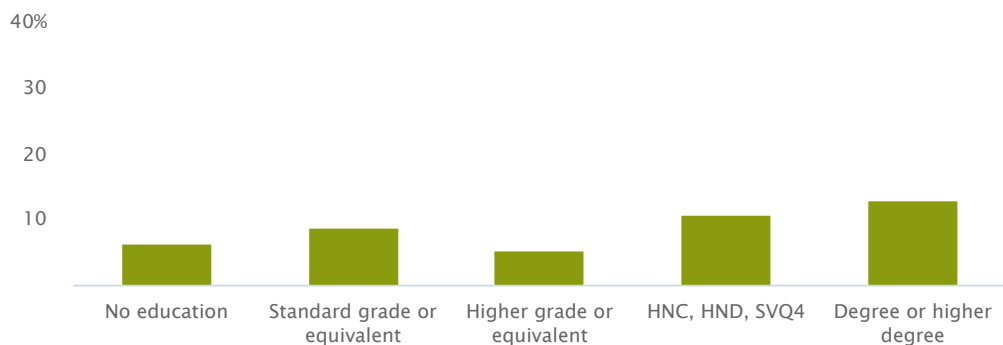


Distance travelled to work

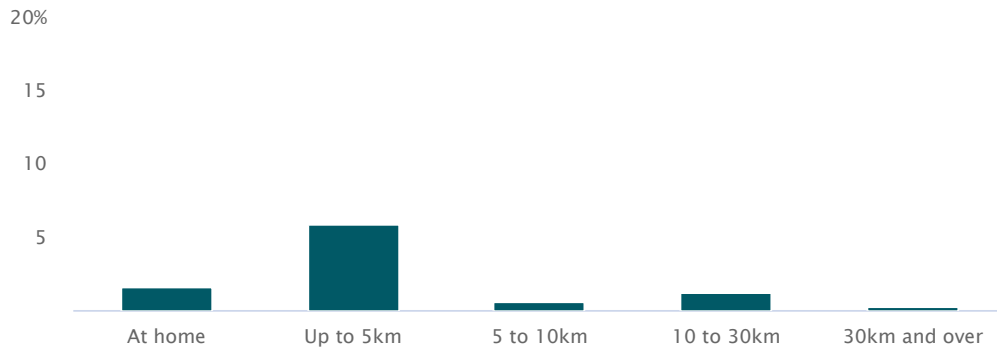
