Cullen is an historic town in Moray. The Earl of Seafield built a new planned village higher than the oldest part of the settlement. It is primarily a tourist town today and is famous for Cullen skink.

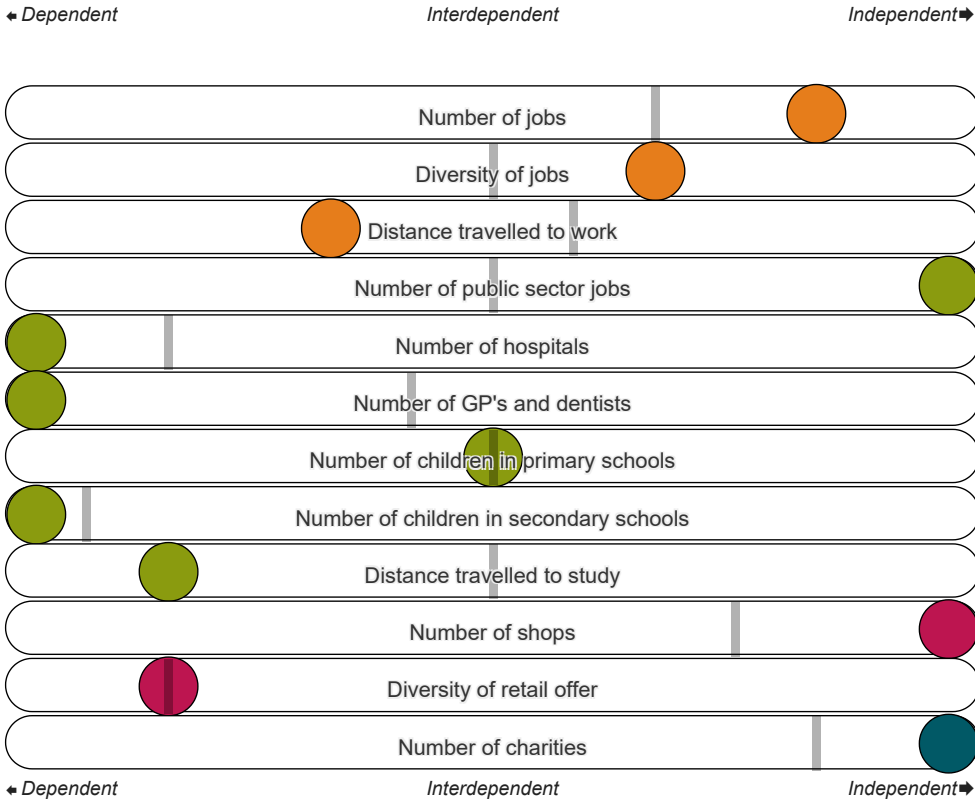
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Cullen is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Cullen is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Cullen is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Cullen differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

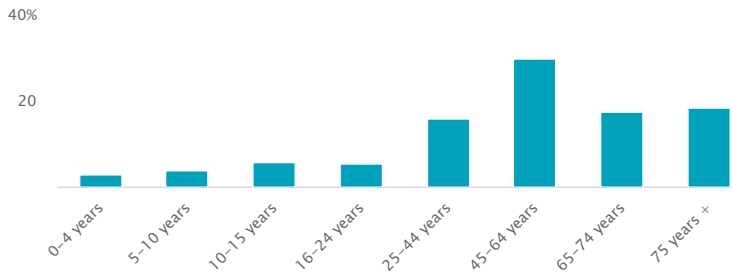

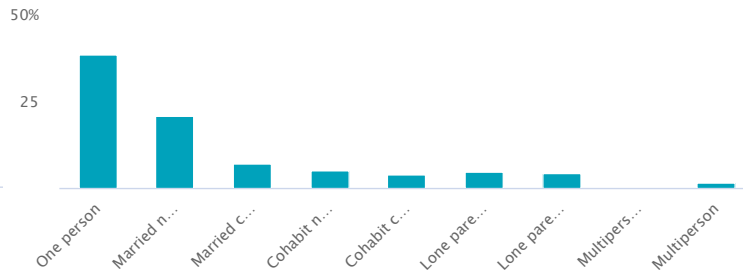

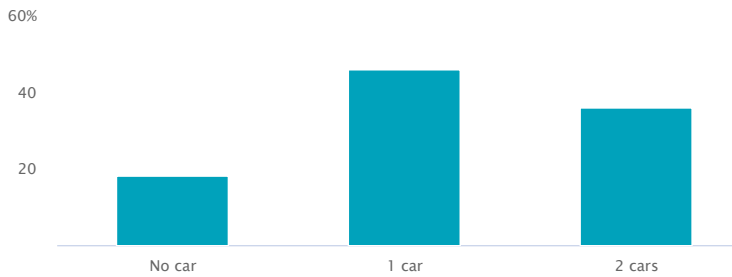

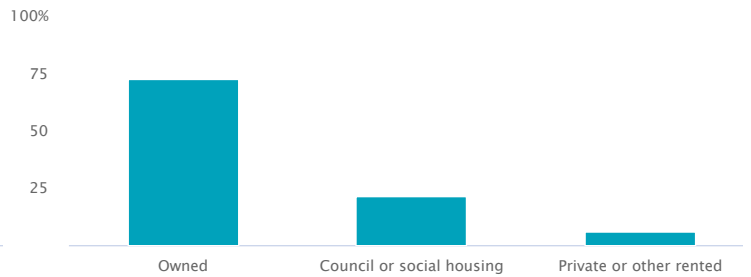
Household composition

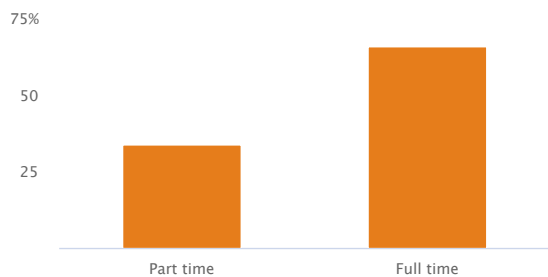

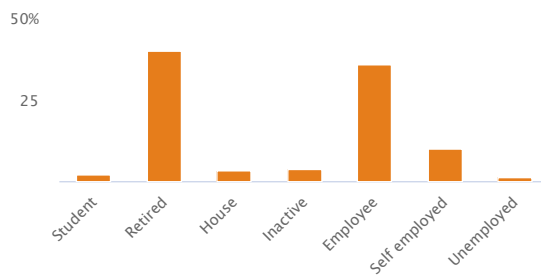
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



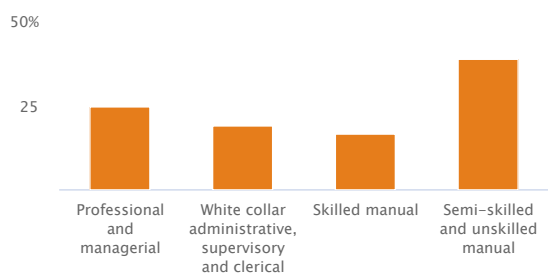
Occupation

Social Grade

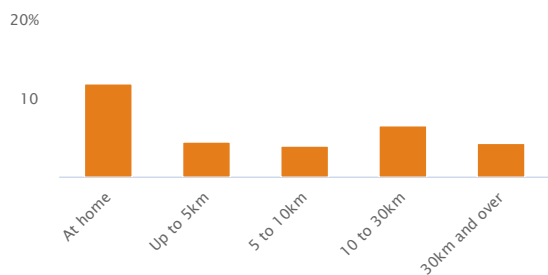
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

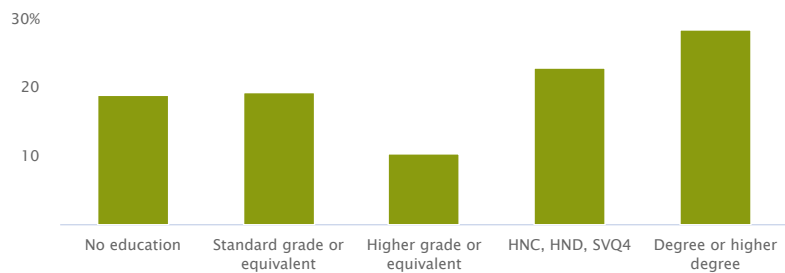


Distance travelled to work

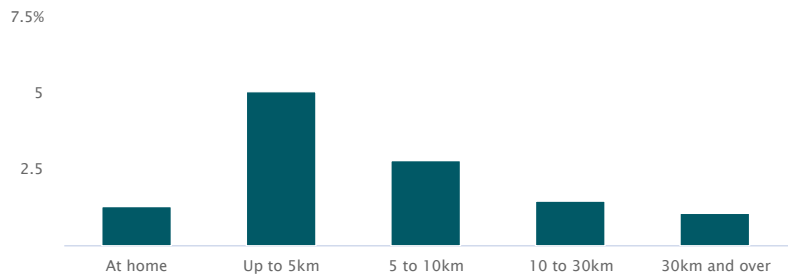
