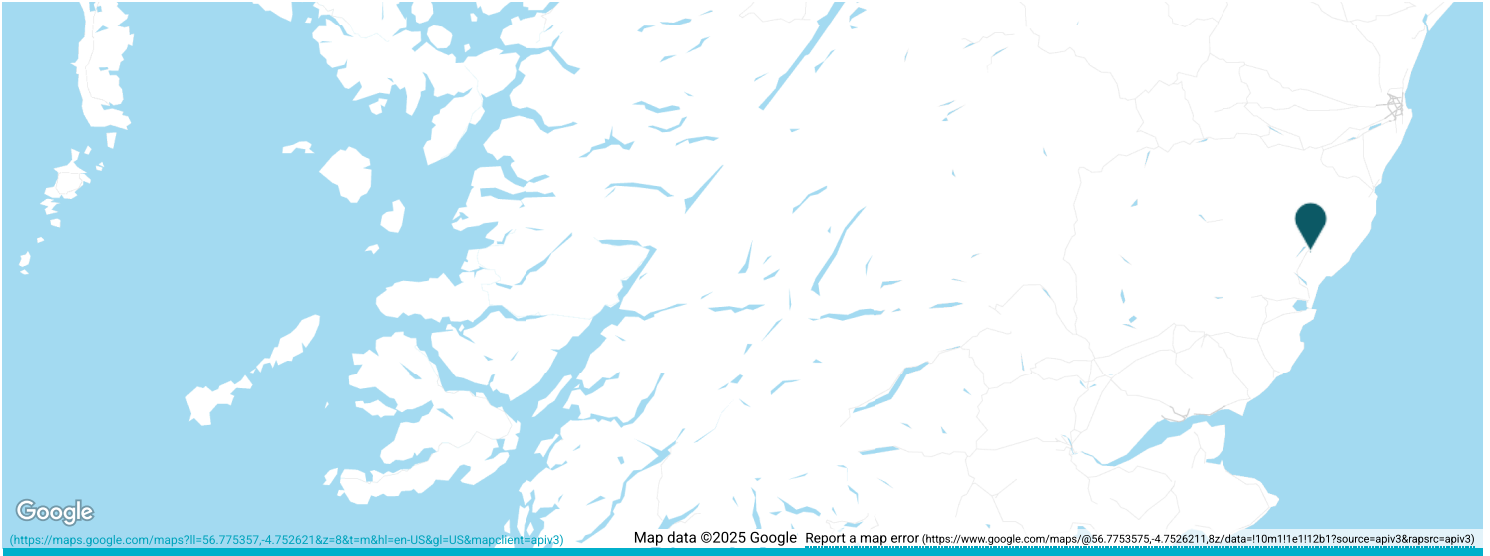




Culloden

Culloden in Highland is , of course, the site of the famous battle of the same name in 1746. It is close to Inverness and a popular commuter town.

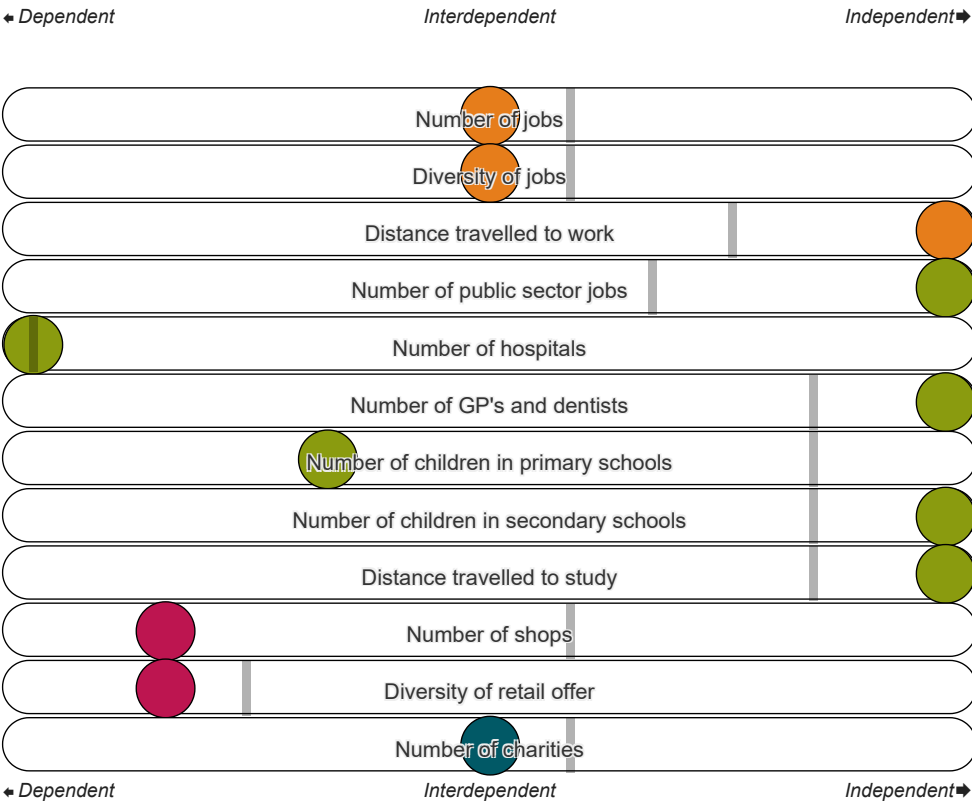
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Culloden is an interdependent to independent town.

Culloden is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Culloden is grouped with 4 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs. Culloden differs most from its group in the number of shops.

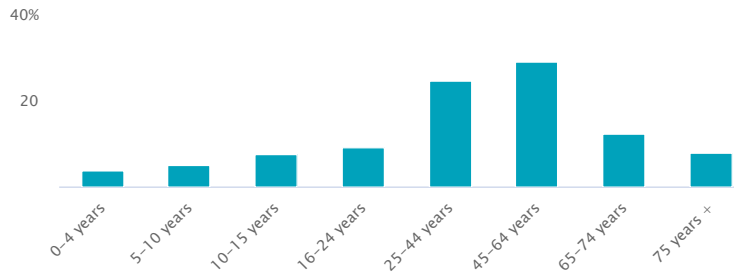

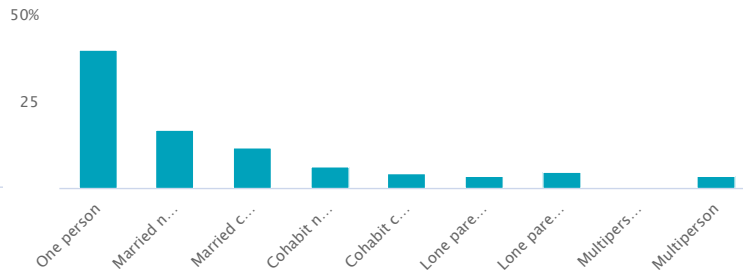

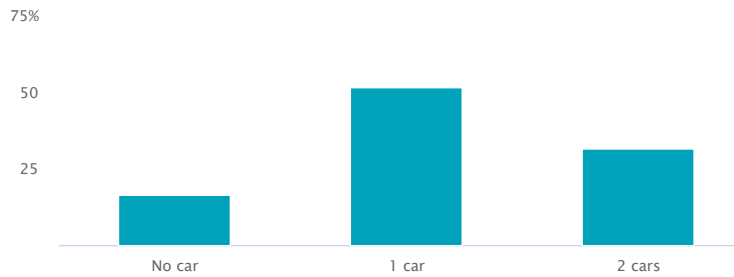

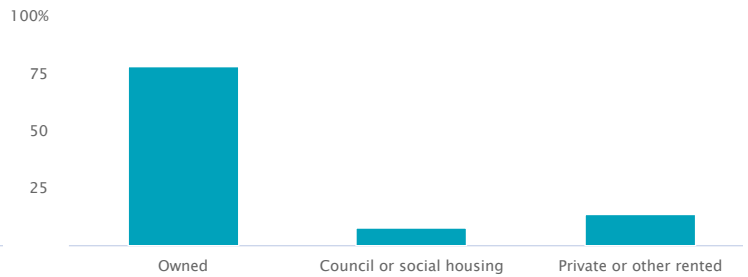
Household composition

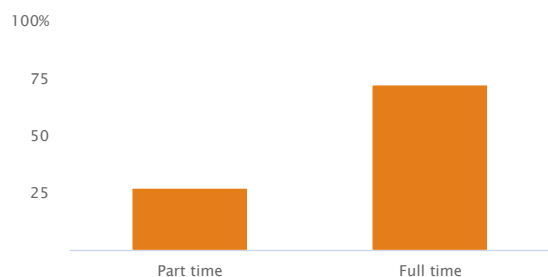

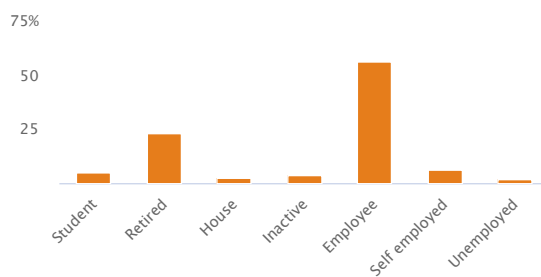
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



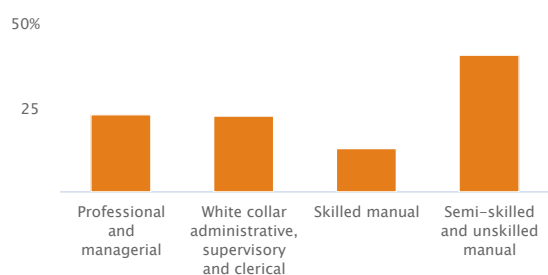
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

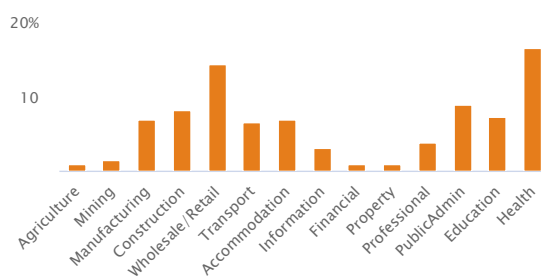

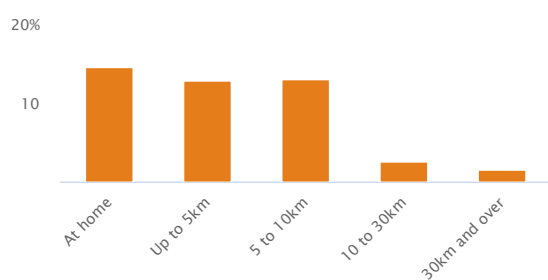
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

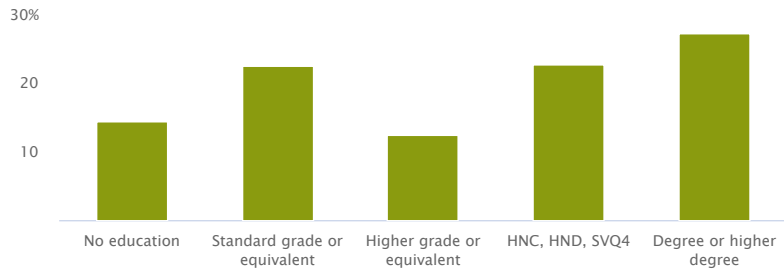


Distance travelled to work

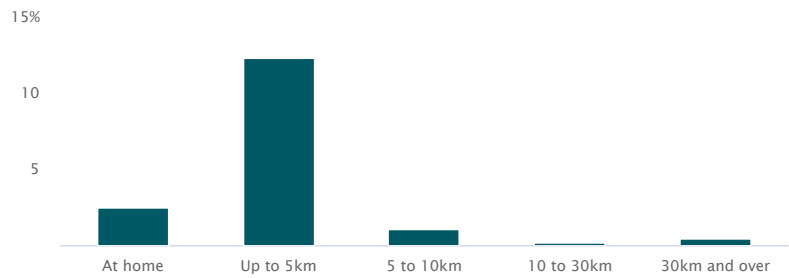
