Dalbeattie in Dumfries and Galloway is a planned estate village. Granite quarrying was important in the 19th century. Today it is largely a commuter settlement.

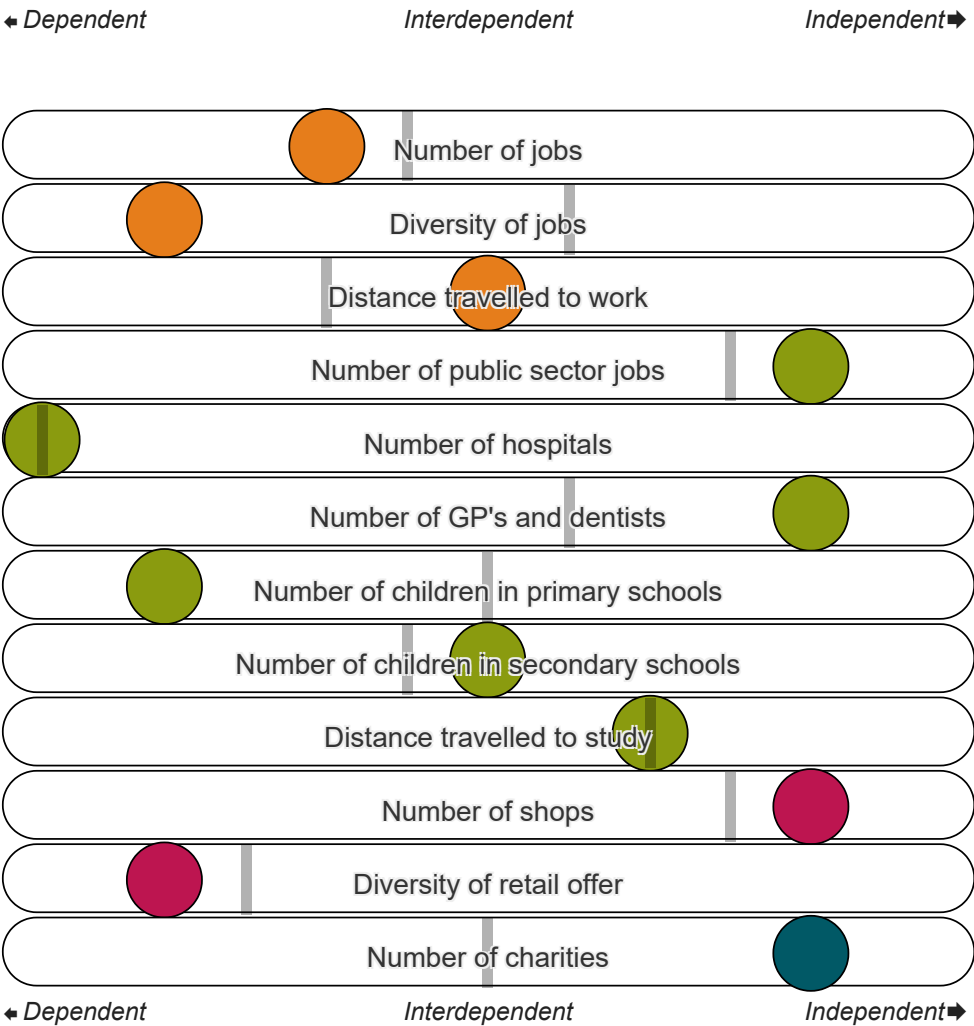
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Dalbeattie is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Dalbeattie is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dalbeattie is grouped with 5 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and GP's and dentists. Dalbeattie differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools; and the diversity of jobs.

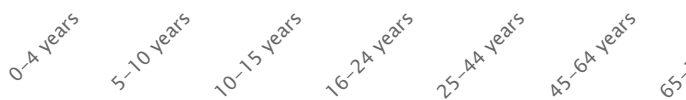

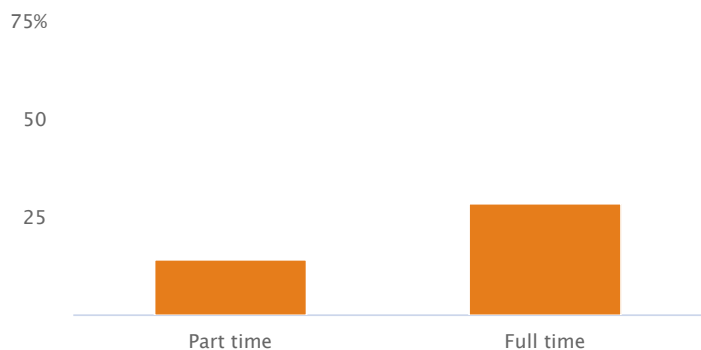

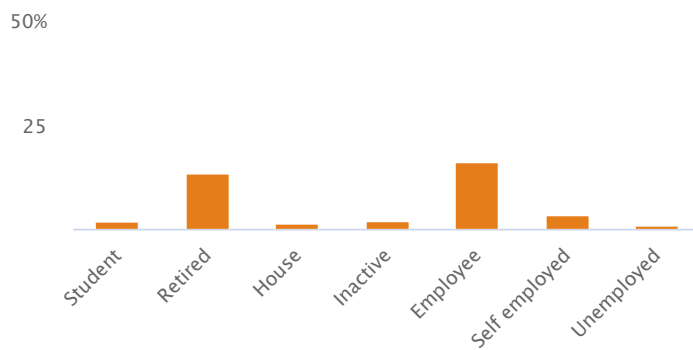
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



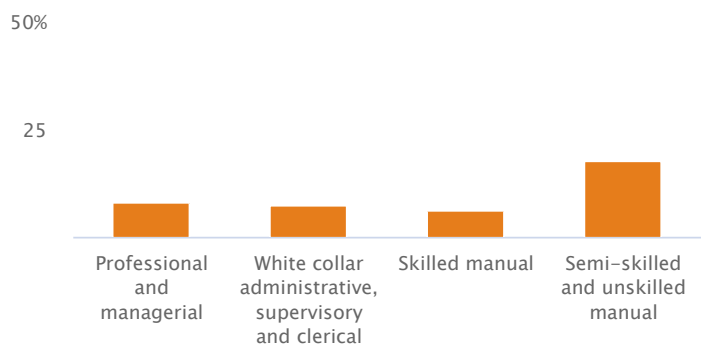
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

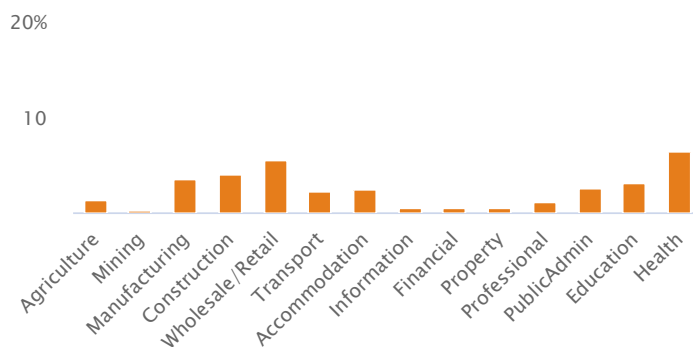

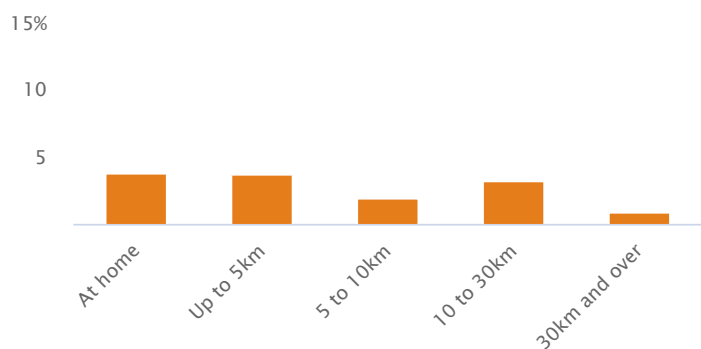
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

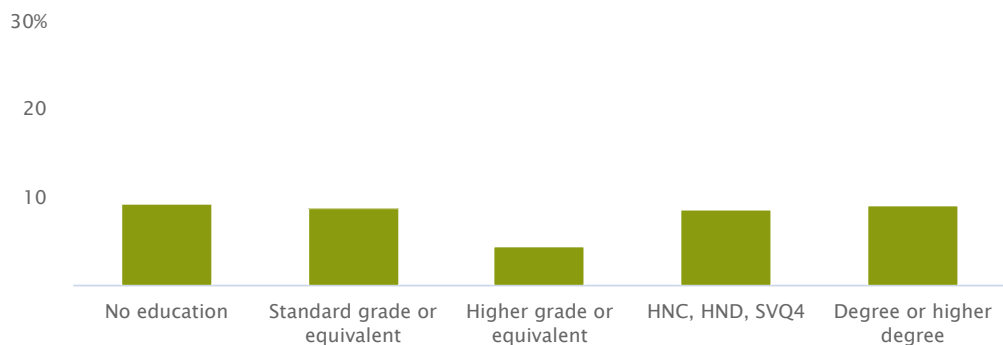


Distance travelled to work

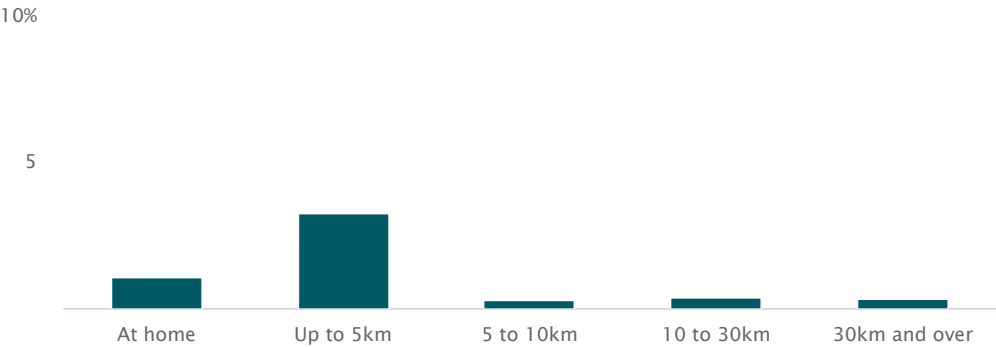
