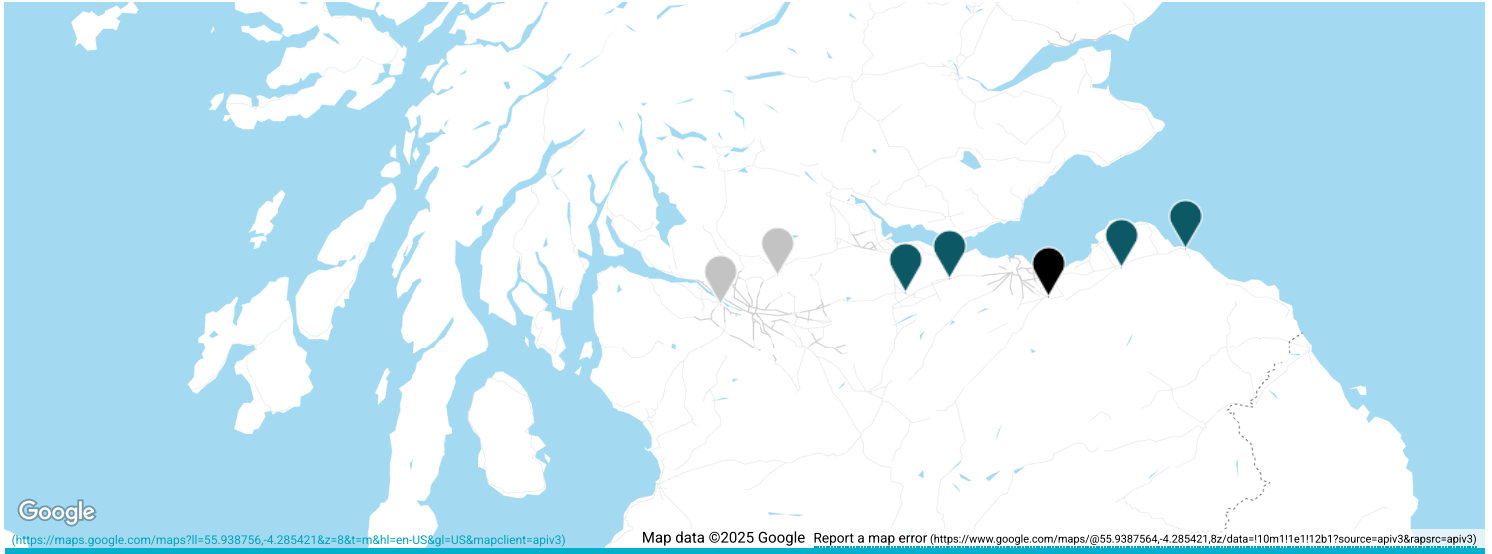




Dalkeith

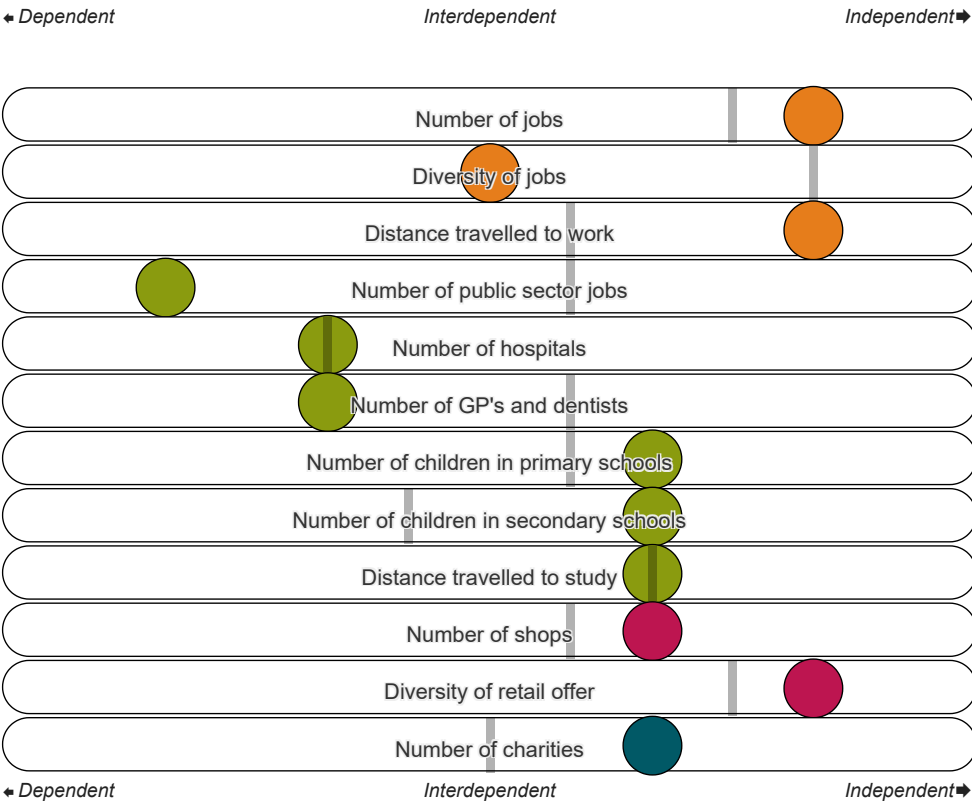
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dalkeith is grouped with 6 other towns. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Dalkeith differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

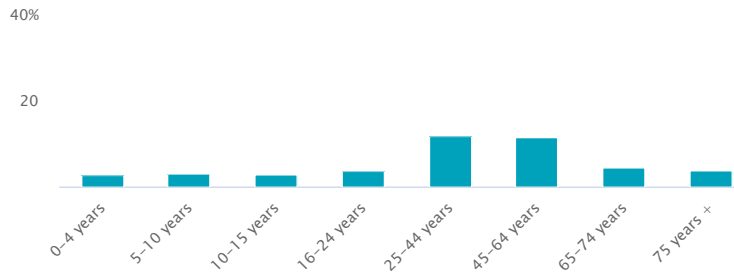

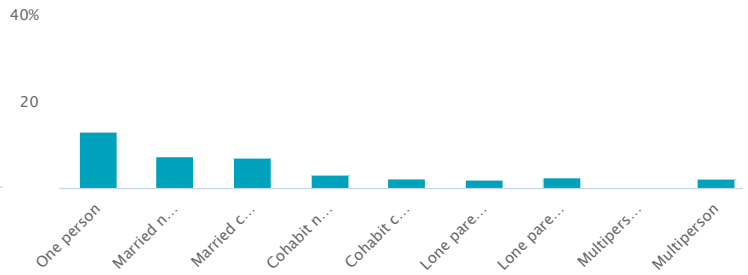

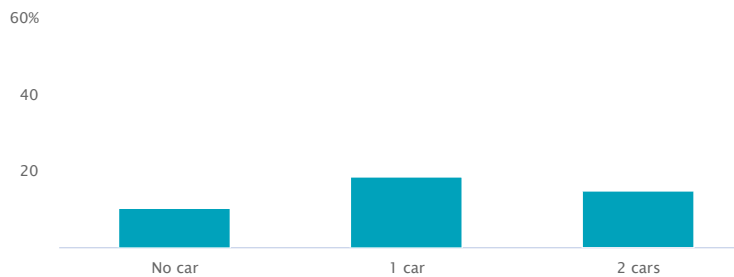

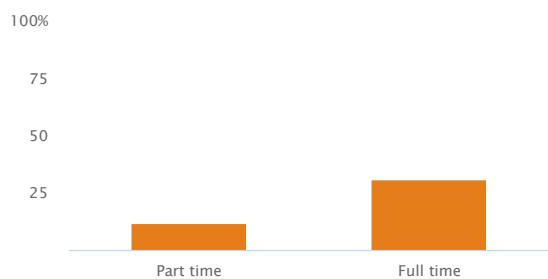

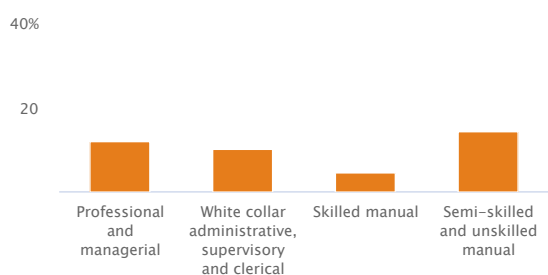
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



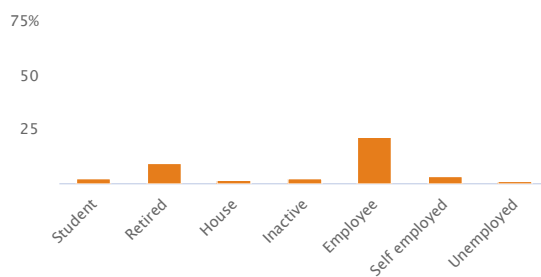
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

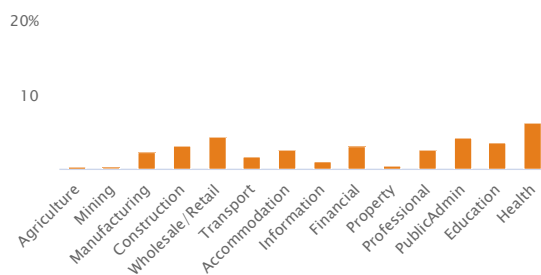

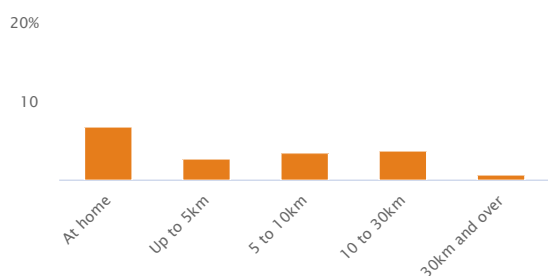

Sector Diversity

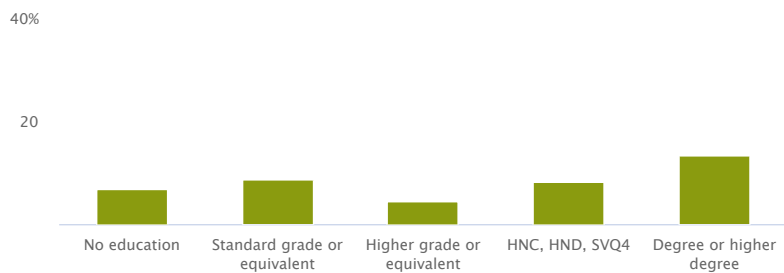


Distance travelled to work

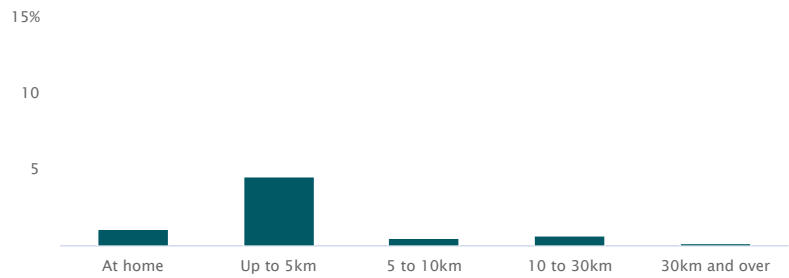
