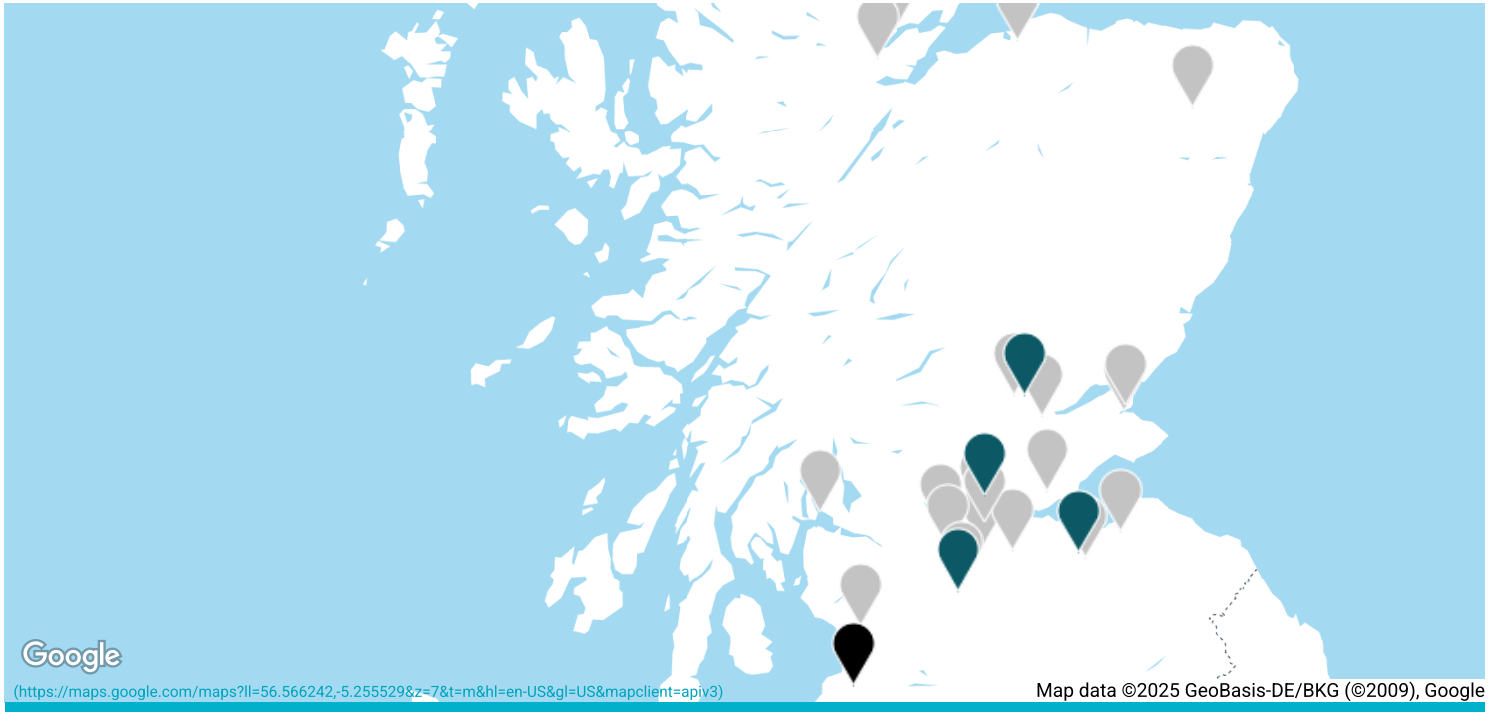




Dalrymple

Dalrymple is located in East Ayrshire. It dates from the early 1800s. It was sustained by coal mining and in the late 20th century new council housing was built to house families from areas where mining had declined.

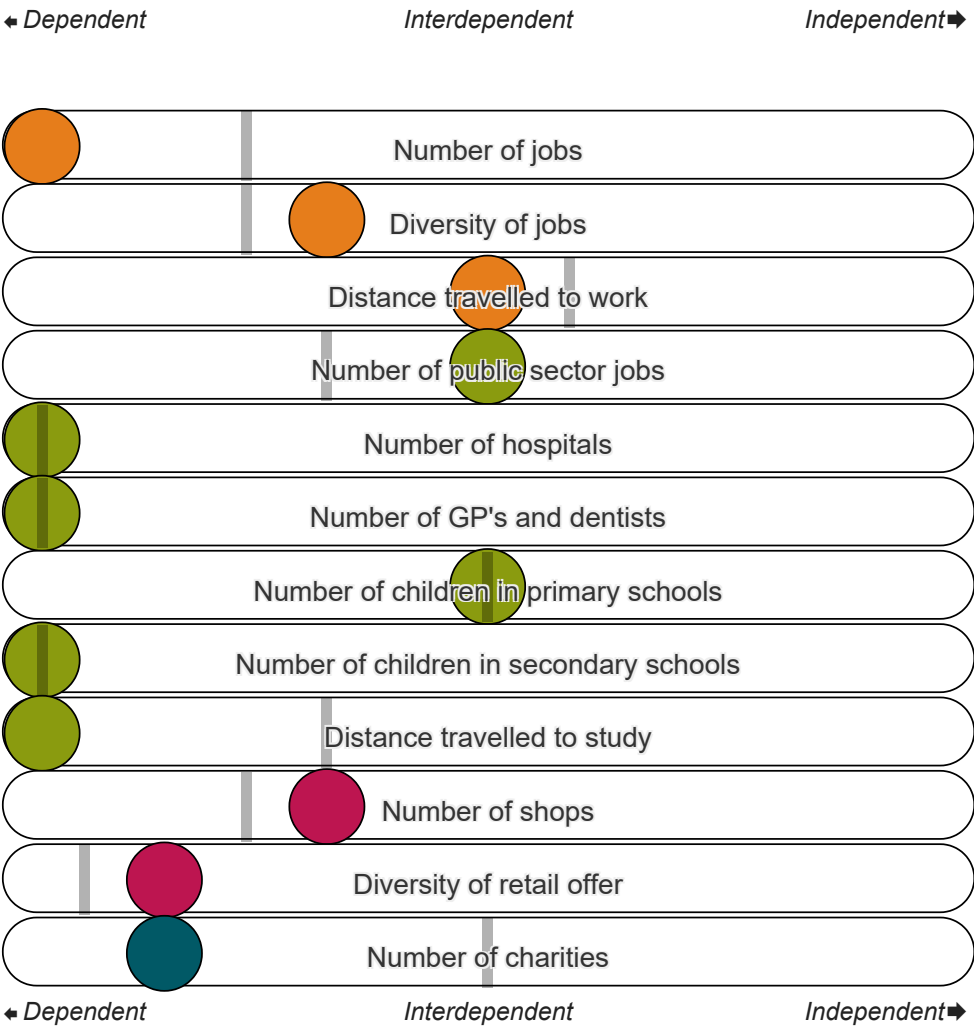
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Dalrymple is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Dalrymple is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Dalrymple is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. Dalrymple differs most from its group in the number of jobs; and the distance travelled to study.

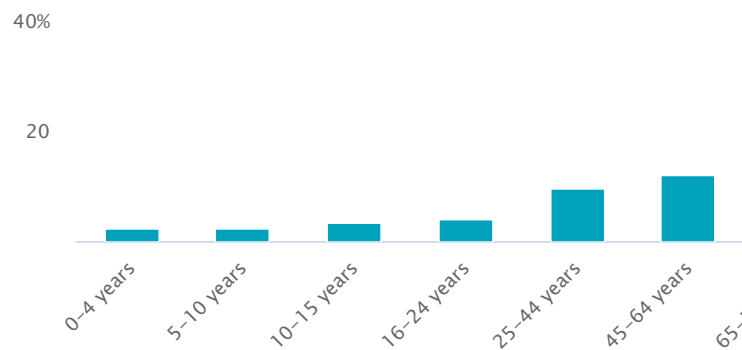

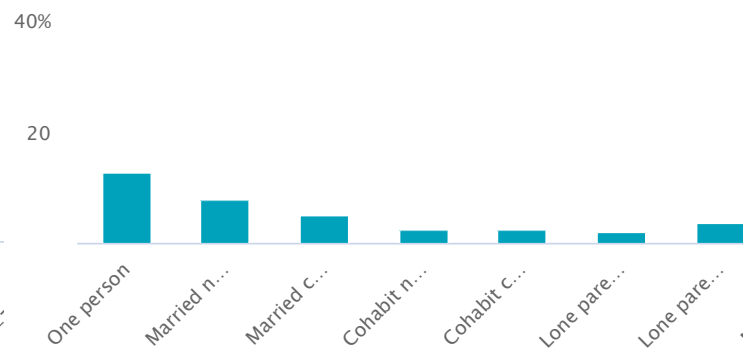

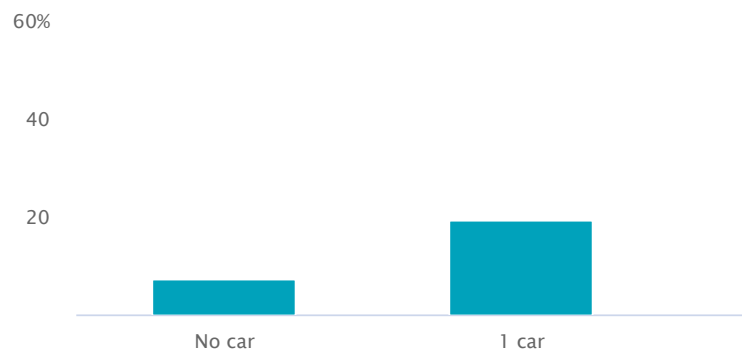

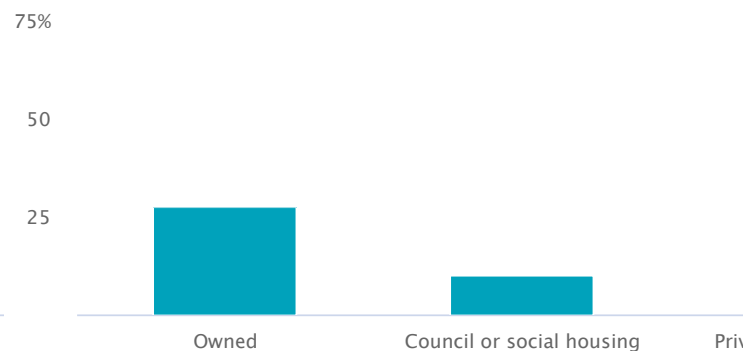

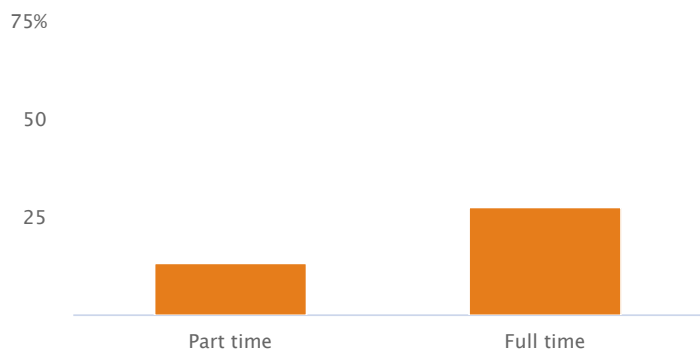

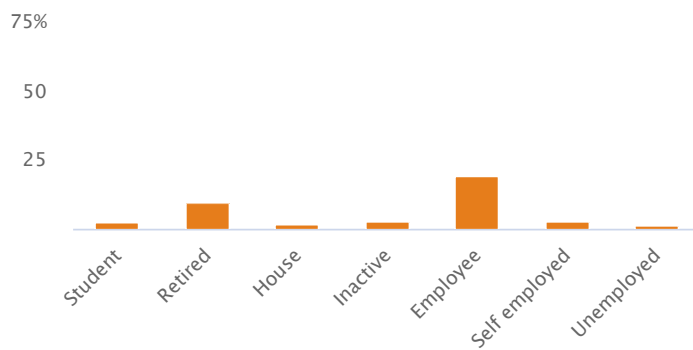
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



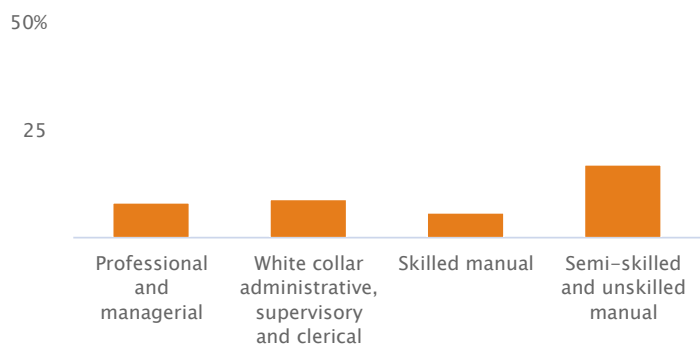
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

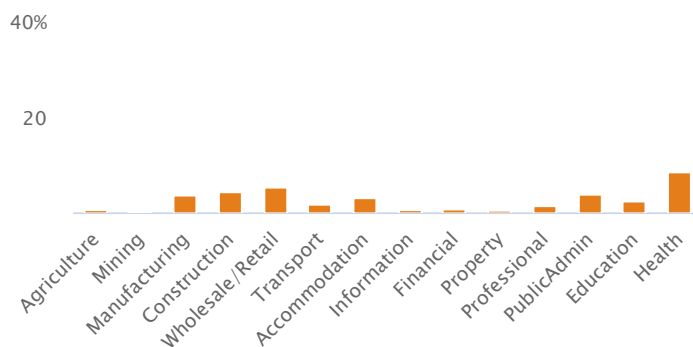

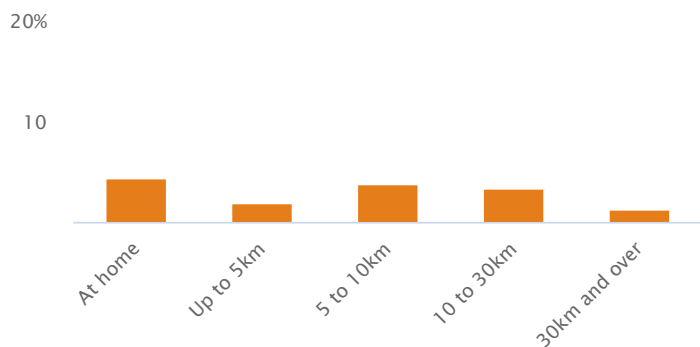
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

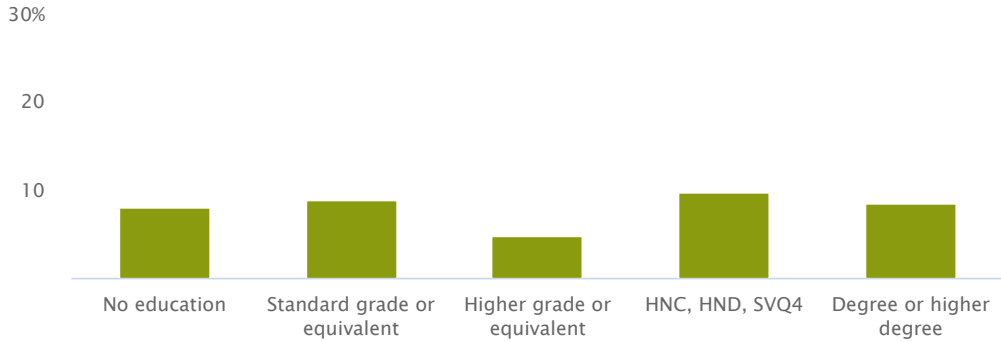


Distance travelled to work

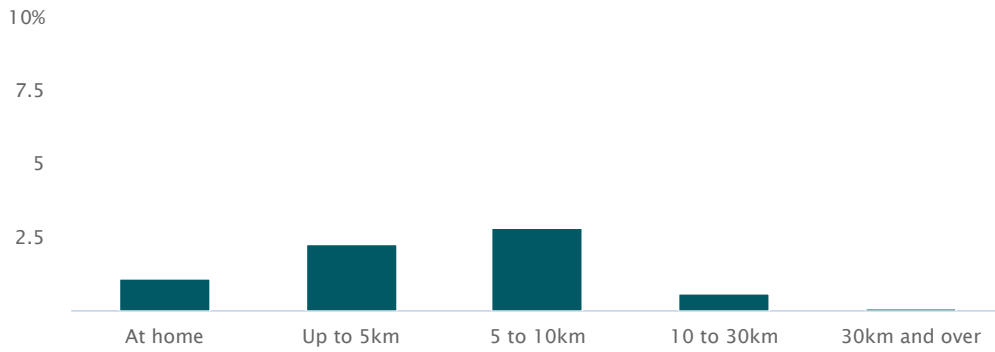
